BY-LAW No. 19.

A By-law of the Shire of Buln Buln, made under the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 19, for the purpose of prescribing the Fees for the Registration of Premises, and the Renewal or Transfer of such Registration.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and all other power thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Buln Buln order as follows:—

1. The following fees shall be payable for granting or annual renewal of registration of the following premises respectively:—

- (a) Cattle sale-yards—In township of Drouin, Three pounds (£3); elsewhere, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.)
- (b) Offensive trade premises—One pound (£1).
- (c) Boarding-houses—Five shillings (5s.).
- (d) Common lodging-houses—Five shillings (5s.).
- (e) Eating-houses—Five shillings (5s.).
- (f) Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings (5s.).
- (g) For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

2. Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of this By-law, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Buln Buln.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Lowan.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds nor more than Twenty pounds.

4. In addition to any penalty as provided for in the last preceding clause, any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law shall be paid by the person or persons committing such breach.

Within the township boundary north of the Grange Creek commencing at the south-west corner of section 61A township of Hamilton parish of North Hamilton, county of Dundas thence by a line running in a northerly direction along the Mount Baimbridge-road to the north-west corner of the Friendly Societies Reserve in the said township of Hamilton thence by a line running easterly along King-street to the north-east corner of section ninety-two of the said township of Hamilton thence by a line running one hundred and eighty degrees fifty-eight minutes in a southerly direction till it meets the Grange Creek thence following the Grange Creek in a southerly and westerly direction till it meets the Digby-road near the point of commencement thence by a line bearing easterly across the Mount Baimbridge-road one hundred and fifty links to the point of commencement.
