ANNUAL HOLIDAY IN THE HAY, CORN, OR CHAFF TRADE.

PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

REGULATIONS in connexion with the vote of Three thousand pounds (£3,000) for fencing and improving public parks, gardens, and other reserves under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

A sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the Treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve having a claim on the vote for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve between 1st January, 1920, and 31st December, 1920, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1921. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form "A," and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form "B."

2. The term "Locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1920, and 31st December, 1920, but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to 1st January, 1920.

3. The subsidy, or the balance thereof, last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1920 (*vide* Form "A") and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the city of Melbourne (except the Royal Park) or to the Albert Park, South Melbourne, and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.

HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

Notice to Boatmen, &c.

No. 1 of 1921.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 5th February, 1921, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the River during the day shall observe the following regulations, viz.:-

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme, and the direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers, and no boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boats except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his Deputy.

After sunset motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow.

Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

Rowing boats shall exhibit a white light after sunset.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:-

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Trust District:-

I. For each vacant allotment of land of an area not exceeding one acre in extent, and on which no service-pipe has been laid, but which abuts on a street or road on which a main is laid, a rate of Five shillings shall be paid for the year; and for each such allotment of land of an area exceeding one acre in extent a rate of Three pence for each additional acre shall be paid. Vacant allotments on which a service-pipe is laid shall be charged double the above rate.

II. For all lands and tenements within the Trust District of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

III. For all lands and tenements of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and three pence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the shire of Seymour.

IV. For every steam-boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the year 1921.

V. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:- For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year; and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house yard unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum. For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.

VI. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for the year 1921 shall be 10,000 gallons.

VII. Gardens or orchards using water will be supplied by meter at the following charges:-Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; the minimum amount to be charged for the year 1921 shall be 15,000 gallons.

VIII. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1921, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1921, and such rate shall be payable on the first day of July, 1921.

The charge for water shall be payable quarterly or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.
RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts:-

1. That the water rate for the year 1921 on all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District shall be One shilling and three pence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Borough of Horsham for the year 1920-21, with a minimum of One (1) pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under £13 6s. 8d. (Thirteen pounds six shilling and eight pence) except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 237 of the above-mentioned Acts.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall be the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Trust by measure, in excess of such aforesaid quantity, shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

3. For the water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of Ninepence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) and for water supplied for railway purposes, which shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount payable under the assessed rate as specified in clause 1 hercof.

4. All rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance on the first day of January, 1921, at the office of the Trust, Wilson-street, Horsham, where payments will be received during office hours.

5. Such officers as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

BY-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Rutherglen Waterworks Trust (the Waterworks District of the Trust having been proclaimed an Urban District) do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for the year 1921 upon all lands and tenements within the said Urban District, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or allotment of land by which a main passes, the sum equivalent to a rate of Three shillings in the £1 per annum, with a minimum charge of Two pounds (£2) on every house or tenement, and One pound (£1) on allotments of land.

Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1921, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charge for water supplied by measure outside the Trust's area shall be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of One pound (£1) per annum for each service.

Water supplied to Government Departments of public bodies shall be by measurement or special agreement. The Trust may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for domestic or other than domestic purposes that the supply is to be charged for by measure, and by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within one month from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner within the time specified, at his own expense, shall provide such a meter with a certificate from some approved authority that same is in proper order, and shall so maintain same, and if any person neglect to comply with such notice such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Such occupiers or owners as are supplied with water per meter shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence for 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

The Trust will upon application supply a meter at cost price for cash on delivery.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Poisons Regulations 1921, and shall come into operation on publication in the Government Gazette.

2. In the construction of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Act” means the Poisons Act 1920.

“Board” means The Pharmacy Board of Victoria.

LICENSING OF PERSONS ENTITLED TO SELL POISONOUS SUBSTANCES OR PREPARATIONS SPECIFIED IN THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THE ACT.

APPLICATIONS FOR LICENCE.

Any person in a place where there is no person entitled under Division 1 of Part I. of the principal Act to receive a certificate as a dealer in poisons generally, desirous of obtaining a certificate under the provisions of section 5 of the Act as a seller of the poisonous substances and preparations specified in the First Schedule to the Act shall make application to the Board in the form or to the effect following:—

- (g) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council, by resolution, or by an officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

SHIRE OF BERWICK.

BY-LAW No. 4 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1915.

A By-law of the Shire of Berwick, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1915*, and numbered four, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil and closet pans.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Health Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and operate within the area of the townships of Berwick, Beaconsfield, Officer, Pakenham, Garfield, Iona, and Bunyip in the shire of Berwick, as may be defined by the Council from time to time.

3. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the boundaries aforesaid from the operation of this By-law.

4. Every closet shall be furnished by the Shire Council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the Council.

5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct, in a suitable cart.

6. An annual charge for the emptying and cleaning of cess-pans shall be made by a resolution of the Council, under the provisions of the *Health Act 1915*, such charge to be paid by the occupier of any tenement, and to be payable half-yearly in advance. Failure to pay the said half-yearly charge shall constitute a breach of this By-law, and such charge shall also be recoverable by the Council from such occupier aforesaid in any Court of Petty Sessions.

7. A pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the Council shall be left in place of the one removed.

8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground surface, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, licensed public house, hotel, factory, work-room, or common lodginghouse, shall be paved or flagged with some non-absorbent material, having fall or inclination from the rise of the seat

towards the back of the building of half an inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

9. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.

10. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the Council, or be trenched or ploughed into the ground in such locality as may be provided by the Council.

11. No occupier or person shall use a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing), other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan or lids.

12. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

13. Every occupier or person shall not employ any other person, save those authorized by the Council, for the removal of night-soil, and no other person save those authorized by the Council shall remove any night-soil except in case of exemption.

14. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Council over all premises, which premises may be inspected by the Council or its officers from time to time, or any other person duly authorized by the Council.

15. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling for breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds sterling for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom such penalties are sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

16. That all By-laws hitherto in force within the shire of Berwick made under this Act, so far as they relate to any or all of the several things contained in this By-law, are hereby repealed.
