Tactories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CEMENT ARTICLES BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 11th August, 1921, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons (other than persons under the jurisdiction of the Fibrous Plasterers Board) employed in the trade of making portable articles of cement or concrete," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 11th August, 1921, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

⁽³⁾ OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by this Determination shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

⁽⁴⁾ Special Rates.—Time and a half shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
