REGULATIONS.—STORES AND TRANSPORT.

CHAPTER XV.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter XV. of the Public Service Regulations as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

Clause 34—

LICENSING OF ELECTRIC WIREMEN.

RULES AMENDED.

THE State Electricity Commission of Victoria, incorporated under the State Electricity Commission Acts, under the powers in that behalf by the said Acts vested in such Commission to make rules for or with respect to the examination and licensing of wiremen, doth, with the approval of the Governor in Council, amend the "Licensing of Electric Wiremen Rules 1921," which were approved by the Governor in Council on the 26th April, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th April, 1921, page 1509, as follows:—

The following rule shall be added after Rule 13:—

14. In any prosecution of any person for an alleged breach of any of these Rules, it shall be presumed that—

- (a) any wiring work which the holder of a licence under these Rules is proved to have carried on or in which he is proved to have been engaged was carried on or engaged in by him for gain or reward unless the contrary is proved or unless it be proved that at the time when such work was performed the land and premises on which it was performed were owned by or in the *bona fide* occupation of the person accused;
- (b) Any wiring work which the holder of a "B" grade licence under these Rules is proved to have carried on or in which he is proved to have been engaged was carried on or engaged in by him otherwise than under the supervision of the holder of an "A" grade licence, unless the contrary be proved.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 18 of the *Education Act 1915* (No. 2644), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby approve of the following Regulation being added to the Regulations under the *Education Act 1915*, that is to say:—

REGULATION XII. (B)—TRAINED TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE—
COMMERCIAL SUBJECTS.

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, establish a course of training to be conducted at the Teachers' College and the Essendon High School, or such other institutions as the Director may determine, for persons desirous of qualifying as teachers of commercial subjects. This course will be under the supervision of the Principal of the Teachers' College, the Head Master of the Essendon High School, and such other officer as may be appointed.

2. Studentships will carry with them the salary to which the applicants would be entitled as junior teachers in State Schools, and will be awarded under the following conditions:—

- Applicants must be junior teachers in the service of the Education Department, and must be not less than 17 years of age on the date of commencement of the course.
- They must have passed the School Intermediate examination or some higher examination of the Melbourne University, or must hold an approved equivalent qualification.
- They must produce satisfactory evidence of having undergone sufficient preliminary preparation in commercial subjects to enable them to enter on the course.
- They must furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character, of sound bodily health, and of freedom from defects likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.

3. Students who satisfactorily complete the course of training mentioned in clause 1 above will be awarded the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Commercial subjects.

4. For the purpose of classification, appointment, and promotion, the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Commercial subjects—shall be regarded as equivalent to the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate under Regulation XII. (A); and the conditions specified in that Regulation with regard to agreement to serve, failure to pass examinations, and discipline shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to students under this Regulation.

5. This Regulation shall come into force as from 1st January, 1922, and shall expire on 31st December, 1922. Provided, however, that, in a special case, a student who does not complete his course during the year 1922 may have his studentship extended during the whole or portion of the year 1923.

A By-law of the shire of Walpeup made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, with the approval of the Governor-in-Council, and numbered 11, for carrying out certain of the purposes of the said section, viz.:—Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections, and for requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and for selling the materials and applying the proceeds to reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and any fees and penalties due by the owner thereof and appointing fees to be charged and received by the Council of the shire of Walpeup for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council, and for other purposes in connexion with the foregoing purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Council, and Ratepayers of the shire of Walpeup, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the 30th day after publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the areas described in Schedules A, B, C, D, and E, townships of Ouyen, Walpeup, Underbool, Cowangie, and Murrayville, and to such other areas in the shire as the Council may from time to time by resolution declare.

2. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

Preliminaries to be Observed.

3. Notice of intention to build and payment of fees. No person building shall commence any building or any addition or alteration to any building, or move, place, or raise any building or do any building operation referred to or provided for in this regulation, without first obtaining written permission of the Council so to do, and without first delivering at the Building Surveyor's office a written notice thereof seven days before commencing and lodging at the same time plans and specifications of such buildings, addition or alteration, or other operation herein before mentioned in this regulation, which will show to scale the boundaries of, and the positions of, the buildings existing and proposed on such land, and details of construction referred to in this regulation.

No person building shall commence any building, addition, alteration, move, or place any building, or call upon the surveyor to examine any building, settle any dispute, inspect or report upon any party wall, or perform any special or other duties, without first paying to the shire secretary a fee of £1 1s. for inspection of plans. In cases where the value, in the opinion of the surveyor, of additions or alterations is less than £50 (fifty pounds) sterling, and special duties are not performed, no fees will be required, but the notice and the regulations shall be complied with, though the former may be given not less than 48 hours before commencing work.

Generally.

Modification of Regulations in Additions and Alterations. 4. In cases of additions or alterations to buildings now built upon special inspection and approved by the Building Surveyor and in some cases where he may deem it necessary for the applicant to obtain the written consent of the owner of the adjoining land, the Building Surveyor or person appointed may recommend that such modification of this regulation be allowed, providing that they shall entail no risk of mischief to the town by fire, no injury to the adjoining owner, and providing that they be not contrary to the general tenor and purport of this regulation. All such special applications shall be made in writing to the Building Surveyor and submitted by him to the Council of the shire of Walpeup for consideration, approval or otherwise.

5. Except as hereinafter provided no building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house and no addition with an external wall of wood to any building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house shall be built, constructed, or erected—

- (a) within a distance of 3 feet measured horizontally of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of any such building.
- (b) within a distance of 3 feet measured horizontally of land not in the same possession or occupation.
- (c) within a distance of 6 feet measured horizontally of another building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation.

Provided always that such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of such building or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom or from land not in the same possession or occupation or from a building or erection with an external

wall of wood in the same possession or occupation used or intended to be used wholly or partially as a dwelling provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance such street, road, lane, right-of-way, land not in the same possession or occupation of building or erection as the case may be shall be concrete of approved thickness or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness projecting in all cases, at least one inch beyond the wood-work front and back at least two feet through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same.

6. The roof of every building or erection which is intended to be or shall be used as a dwelling house, shop, hotel, hospital, or other business place shall be covered on the outside with incombustible coverings and approved sound boards shall be used for any external wall or walls thereof if of wood.

7. Stables, coach-houses and outbuildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are hereinbefore imposed in regard to dwelling houses by clauses 5 and 6 hereof, except that clause 5 (a) shall not apply to them as far as it relates to any lane or right-of-way.

8. (1) The main rooms in every dwelling house, hotel, and hospital hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than 11 feet in height from floor to ceiling.

(2) Provided nevertheless that the main rooms in every dwelling house, hotel and hospital of more than one storey hereafter built or rebuilt except rooms on the ground floor shall not be less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling. Main rooms on the ground floor shall be subject to the preceding sub-clause hereof. Living rooms wholly or partly in the roof shall not be less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling throughout not less than one-third of the area.

(3) For the purpose of this clause the expression "Main Rooms" shall be deemed to mean rooms used or intended to be used as bedrooms, dining-rooms, ordinary living rooms, but not kitchens. The decision of the Council or of the Building Surveyor subject to review by the Council as to whether a particular room comes within the scope of this clause or not shall be final and conclusive.

(4) In all wooden buildings of more than one storey in height, hereafter built or rebuilt and used for the purposes of a dwelling house, hotel, or hospital, an outside staircase or staircases centrally situated and not less than 4 feet wide in the clear must be provided in addition to the ordinary inside stairs and such outside staircase must be constructed entirely of jarrah timber or of a similar construction of a non-inflammable material.

(5) In all wooden hotels, hospitals or public halls, approved fire extinguishing facilities must be provided and kept in efficient working order.

9. (a) The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used or shall or may be used as a shop, warehouse, and hotel or business premises shall be constructed of lath and plaster, fibrous cement, sheet steel, or approved fire resisting materials.

The above applies to a building the walls of which are externally covered with weather-boards or other woods. If the external walls be of brick, then the ceiling shall be of the materials aforesaid.

(b) The interior of all walls and ceilings of every building which or intended to be used or shall be used as a dwelling house only shall be constructed of wood but no exception will be taken if more substantial or up-to-date materials are used in the construction.

10. Every building with the exception of buildings used for business purposes only hereafter built or rebuilt, must have an enclosed back yard, or open space at the rear of the building of at least 500 square feet exclusive of any buildings thereon.

11. Every wall of brick or stone (including party wall) shall have an approved damp-proof course or courses of asphalt or other impervious materials above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor, and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same materials.

12. In no cases will floor timbers be allowed nearer the earth than 6 inches, and a proper through current of ventilation below floor levels shall be provided by means of galvanized iron and other approved air-bricks built into walls, also ventilation of timbers between floors in the case of two-story buildings must be provided.

13. Two or more buildings or houses may be erected together in one block provided that they shall be separated from each other by a wall of concrete of approved thickness or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness projecting in the case of wooden houses at least 1 inch through the woodwork front and back and in all cases projecting 2 feet at least through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same whether belonging to the same owner or not.

14. Clauses 5 and 6 hereof shall apply to any building which is intended to be or shall be used as a shop or combined shop and dwelling provided nevertheless that with the consent of the Council the said clauses or either of them may be modified in the case of any such building by permitting the same to abut wholly or partially on the building line of the street or road in front or to be less than the prescribed distance therefrom.

16. No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure, dimensions and materials as set forth on the plan and specifications adopted by the Council, but the lowest part of such portion or verandah shall in no case be of less height than 8 feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

17. No opening shall be made in the roof of any such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such openings be properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with a fine mesh wire netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

(a) It will be compulsory for all persons storing petrol or other inflammable matter to store same only in a building having walls and floors of brick, stone or concrete and with ceiling of fibre cement or other improved fire resisting materials and that such buildings must be kept at a suitable and approved distance from any other building.

18. No fowlhouses shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any building used as a dwelling, on the same allotment or allotments adjoining. No building of the description referred to in this clause of this By-law shall be erected, except to the rear of any dwelling house on the same allotment.

19. No privy, closet or urinal shall be erected unless it complies with the regulations made by the Council of the said shire approved of by the Commission of Public Health for the time being in force and operation within the area herein referred to.

20. The distances mentioned in clauses 5, 18 and 19 of this By-law shall be respectively measured from the verandah or any other projection nearest to the point at which such building may be from such other building, street, lane, right-of-way, or boundary line.

21. The Building Surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and during fourteen days next after the completion of any building or addition to any building affected by any of the provisions of this By-law may and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition, and the owner or builder thereof shall produce to the Building Surveyor or Shire Secretary for the time being for his inspection the original plans and specifications approved by the Council for the building demanded by him.

22. If any building shall be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law the Council by its Shire Secretary, Building Surveyor, or other authorized agent may give to the owner or builder or leave upon the site of such building fourteen days' notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building and if default shall be made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the said Council by its Building Surveyor or other authorized agent to enter upon such building, and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and for that purpose to break down any fence surrounding the land on which such building is situated and to demolish and pull down the said building or any part or parts thereof and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purposes and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Shire Secretary, Building Surveyor or other authorized agent in demolishing and pulling down the said building or any part thereof or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same and in doing other acts as aforesaid and all fees and penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale and the Council shall restore any surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner or builder or other person legally entitled thereto on demand.

23. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, fernery, aviary, or to temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding twelve months.

24. Whenever the Council shall deem it necessary for sanitary reasons it may, in writing, require the owner within a given time to cover the surface enclosed or about to be used with a coating of concrete cement, asphalt, or other suitable material so as to be impervious to water or foul exhalations.

(a) Permission will not be granted for the erection of any building to be used as a hotel, hospital or dwelling house on any land which by reason of its position

is not, in the opinion of the Building Surveyor of the Council, capable of being efficiently drained, or on any land on which garbage or other offensive matter has been deposited.

Rules concerning Chimney Stacks, &c.

25. Generally to be built of brick or other incombustible material. Jambs shall not be less than 9 inches wide on either side of the opening breasts and partitions of flues not less than 4½ inches thick, interior of flues to be pargetted, no flues ordinarily to be less than 9 inches x 9 inches, and in case of washhouse copper and the like not less than 9 inches x 4½ inches. No timber shall be built or let into any part of chimney stack or flue. Hearths to be in all cases of incombustible material.

Chimney stacks of greater height than 25 feet in a single story building or 40 feet otherwise to be submitted to Council, and special permit obtained for same.

Chimney Pots, Tubes, Funnels, &c.

26. As to earthen or metal chimney pots, tubes, tunnels or cowls of any description whatever:—

If such pot, tube, funnel, or cowl be higher than 6 feet above the brick or stone work of the flue on which the same shall be placed, then it must be fixed 2 feet at the least into the brick or stone work of the flue on which it shall be placed, and be stayed with iron stays or ties, and no chimney shaft, tube, funnel, &c., shall be less than 3 feet in height above the roof.

Rules concerning Roof Coverings.

27. If the external parts of any roof, flat or gutter of any building, or any projection therefrom, and of any turret, dormer, lantern light, verandah or portico or other erection on the roof or flat of any building be hereafter built or rebuilt, stripped, ripped or uncovered, then every such part (except the door frames and doors, window frames and sashes of such turrets, dormers, lantern lights or other erections) must be covered with slates, tiles, lead, galvanized iron, glass, artificial stone, or cement, and such excepted parts may be made of such wood as shall be necessary.

Construction.

28. All roofs must be constructed so as to throw no lateral thrust on the walls, and so that the only thrust from them to the walls is in a truly vertical direction, except in the case where buttresses are built out to resist the lateral thrust directly.

Underground Rooms and the Lighting thereof.

29. Plans and specifications, must be submitted and the construction of such rooms and the lighting thereof will be permitted subject at all times to the approval of the Council and Building Surveyor.

Drains.

30. All drains in or upon any allotment within the boundary hereinafter referred to and across the footpath to street channel shall be so constructed to the approval of the Council with brick, stone, concrete or earthenware or some such impervious material laid jointed and grouted as the case may be with Portland cement mortar and to a fall of not less than 1 inch in 20 feet, proper inspection openings, vents and traps being provided as may be found necessary.

31. This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria, the shire of Walpeup, nor to the building or construction of any building or addition in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Council that a material amount of work has been done on the site thereof before the date of the coming into operation of this By-law and which building or addition shall be completed within 12 months of such date.

32. Penalties.—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence is a continuing one to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

33. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary the Council may under special circumstances and for special causes declare that clauses 5 and 12 hereof either in the whole or in part shall not apply to any particular building.

34. In this By-law save where the context is inconsistent therewith "Council" means the Council of the shire of Walpeup.

"Secretary" means the Shire Secretary or Acting Shire Secretary for the time being of the said shire.

"Building Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor or Acting Building Surveyor for the time being of the said shire.

"Approved" means approved by the Building Surveyor, subject to review by the Council.

"Dwelling House" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

"Hotel" shall mean any building especially licensed to sell spirituous liquors under the Licensing Act in force for the time being.

"Hospital" shall mean any building especially registered under the Health Act by the Commission of Public Health as such.

"Shop" means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment and also includes the saloons or shops of barbers and hairdressers and offices of solicitors, barristers, agents and auctioneers. A *bona fide* private boarding house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied to persons other than boarders.

"Street" or "Road" means and includes "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.

"Lane" or "Right-of-way" means a street or road less than 33 feet wide.
