"An Act to alter the Stamp Duties chargeable upon Betting Tickets under the Stamps Acts."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the twelfth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

KOWREE WATERWORKS TRUST. BY-LAW No. 17.

A By-law of the Kowree Waterworks Trust made under section 306 of the Water Act 1915 and the Water Act 1916, and numbered 17.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1915 and the Water Act 1916, the Kowree Waterworks Trust doth order as follows :-

That the following By-law shall be enacted and shall come into force and effect in the area controlled by the Kowree Waterworks Trust from and after the date of its approval by the Governor in Council and its publication in the Government

Whosoever bathes in any stream reservoir conduit aqueduct or other waterworks belonging to the Kowree Waterworks Trust or under the control or management of the said Trust or washes cleanses throws or causes to enter therein any animal whether alive or dead or any rubbish filth stuff or thing of any kind whatsoever or causes or permits or suffers to run or be brought therein the water of any sink sewer drain engine or boiler or other filthy unwholesome or impure water or does anything whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the said Trust or under the control or management of the said Trust are fouled obstructed or damaged shall for every such offence forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

Whosoever being supplied with water by the Kowree

forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds. Whoseever being supplied with water by the Kowree Waterworks Trust from any waterworks belonging to the said Trust or under the control or management of the said Trust or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom wilfully or negligently suffers any water to run to waste from any tap pipe or conduit from or by which he is so supplied or to which he has access or removes water from any tank or waterworks other than in tanks casks or other vessels shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of October, 1921.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria. 1

UNDER the powers conferred by sections six and seven of the Gaols Act 1918 for the several purposes in the said sections referred to, and under all other powers in that behalf him enabling to make rules and regulations regarding the care, nim enabling to make rules and regulations regarding the care, control, and custody of persons imprisoned or detained in default of compliance with an Order made under the provisions of Part III. or Part IV. of the Marriage Act 1915, or committed to prison under the Imprisonment of Fraudulent Debtors Act 1915, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth make the rules and regulations following (that is to say):—

PRELIMINARY.

- 1. These Rules and Regulations may be cited as the "Employment of Prisoners detained as Defaulters Regulations 1921."
 2. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Confinee" means a person imprisoned or detained under Part III. or Part IV. of the Marriage Act 1915 or Part VII. of the Neglected Children's Act 1915, or under the Imprisonment of Frandulent Debtors Act 1915. "Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments for the time being.
"Nursery Camp" means the place of detention appointed by the Governor in Council at French Island and any extension of such place.
"Place of Detention" means any area and buildings thereon at any place or in any locality appointed by the Governor in Council, by notice published in the Government Gazette, as a place of detention under section 4 of the Gals Act 1918.

- 3. The trades and vocations or classes of work at which, pursuant to Part 1, of the Gaots Act 1918, confinees may be employed are as follows:—
 - (1) In, on, or in connexion with any place of detention, any kind of activities, manual or other, concerned with or incidental to-

the preparation or use of land for agricultural, horticultural, pastoral, or dairying purposes;
the working and care of live stock and the use and management of implements, utensils, machinery, and plant;
the up-keep and care of such place and of its inmates, and the performance of any work there carried or or in connexion therewith in the neighbourhood.

(2) Nursery and forestry work, including cutting, grubbing, and clearing trees, stumps, and undergrowth, timber cutting, making roads, constructing firebreaks, draining land, and general manual labour on land or in connexion with the activities referred to.

(3) In the case of confinees detained at the Penal Establishment, Pentridge, any trade or vocation carried on, in, or in connexion with any of the factories or workshops there, or any manual labour at Pentridge.

4. The regulations applicable to the officer in charge and warders and confinees at the Nursery Camp, French Island, shall, as far as practicable and where not inconsistent with any other special regulations which may hereafter be made, apply to the officer in charge and warders and confinees at any other relate of departion.

other place of detention.

5. A confinee, whether in gaol or engaged at the Nursery Camp or at any other place of detentions, shall be subject to the general prison rules and regulations applicable to his class made under the Gaols Act 1915, except so far as they are inconsistent with these or other special regulations.

NURSERY CAMP.

NURSERY CAMP.

6. (a) The officer in charge of the Nursery Camp shall be the officer in charge for the time being of the McLeod Settlement, French Island, and in addition to his own duties he shall be responsible for the good order, discipline, and the proper working of the camp, and for the safe custody of the confinees.

(b) Hé shall have and exercise the same powers and responsibilities as the Governon of a gaol.

(c) Shall keep or cause to be kept such books and records as may be directed or required by the Inspector-General.

(d) Shall make such arrangements, subject to the approval of the Inspector-General, for carrying out the work of the camp and for the maintenance and security of the confinees, the enforcement of discipline, and the general management as may appear to him necessary or desirable.

(e) Shall make an inspection of the camp at least thrice weekly, and shall pay such other visits to the tents, cubicles, and working places as may appear to him necessary or desirable. He, or any officer acting under his instructions, shall be empowered to enter any tent, cubicle, or place within the boundaries of the camp for the purpose of search, inquiry, or for other good reason.

7. The warder or warders resident at the camp shall see that the daily routine as arranged by the officer in charge and approved by the Inspector-General is strictly carried out.

8. Warders will be expected to interest themselves in promoting the smooth working of the camp, to encourage the confinees to be industrious and painstaking, and to see that the instructions of the officer representing the Forests Department in regard to the work at the nursery or elsewhere are strictly carried out.

instructions of the officer representing the Forests Department in regard to the work at the nursery or elsewhere are strictly carried out.

9. A confinee detained at the Nursery Camp shall not go outside the boundaries of the camp without the special permission and authority of the officer in charge.

10. A confinee shall occupy such tent or cubicle as may be assigned to him, and must keep the same in the highest state of cleanliness. He must not enter the tent or cubicle of another confinee without the authority of the officer in charge.

11. A confinee must scrupubusly observe all orders given him for the cleanliness and tidiness of his person, his tent or cubicle, and utensils and the camp generally.

12. A confinee shall perform all duties required of him in connexion with the nursery and with tree planting, such as clearing timber, burning off, digging, planting, &c., and when engaged at such work shall strictly attend to and carry out the instructions of the officer representing the Forests Department. He shall perform such other duties as vegetable growing, fencing, tilling, clearing, cooking, fatigue, &c., as may be required of him by the officer in charge.

13. For a minor breach of the regulations the officer in charge of the camp may stop the indulgence of a confinee, and require him to have his meals in his tent or cubicle.

14. For idleness, inattention to work, disobedience of orders, or conduct considered to be injurious to the discipline and smooth working of the camp, a confinee may be deprived of all indulgences and placed on a reduced ration scale, or be transferred to the Melbourne Gaol, where he will not again be eligible for indulgences. The cost of his removal, including all charges incurred, shall be deducted from his deferred pay.

15. For disorderly and riotous conduct, deliberate disobedience, assults, escapes, attempted escapes, and for repeated acts of idleness, inattention to work, disobedience of orders, or conduct injurious to the discipline and smooth working of the camp, a con

The selection of such prisoners shall be limited to those without criminal records, but who have dependants, and who by their good conduct and steady industry and promise of reform are not likely to exercise other than a good influence at the camp. Such prisoners on arrival at and during detention at the camp shall be subject to such of these regulations as apply to confinees at the Nursery Camp.

19. A confinee detained in a gool shall, as far as practicable, be kept apart from other classes of prisoners.

20. The dress of confinees shall be distinct from that of other prisoners. The clothing shall be of such material and pattern as may from time to time be directed by the Inspector-General, with the approval of the Chief Secretary. Confinees at the Nursery Camp may be permitted to wear their private clothes on Sundays and holidays.

21. A confinee who does not entirely maintain and clothe himself shall not be permitted to do so in part, but shall receive food and wear clothing as prescribed in these regulations.

22. A confinee shall work at some trade or vocation, or be employed in some labour when certified by the medical officer as medically fit for employment.

23. Where desirable and practicable, the Inspector-General may permit a confinee to follow his usual occupation, and perform work for outside employers who may be willing to employ him, provided that arrangements be made for the sumply of necessary tools and materials essential to the proper carrying out of the work concerned. All arrangements for the performace of the work and the payment to be made for the same shall be subject to the approval of the Inspector-General. Payments for the work performed chall be made to the officer in charge of the prison before the work leaves the prison. Such payments shall be applied in accordance with these regulations. The Inspector-General will accept no responsibility in respect of the manner in which the work is performed or the collecting of payment for it.

24. A confinee may be employed at any place of detention or penal establishment either at wage-earning work or at making some article of trade or industry of a kind that will permit of being sold or disposed of. Articles manufactured will be placed in the general store and be disposed of by the store-keeper in fulfilment of private orders, or to meet requirements for the service of the prison.

25. (1) A confinee employed at a trade at which he is proficient, and the products of whose work are sold or disposed of, shall be credited with the net proceeds thereof, which shall be applied as follows :-

(a) Towards the cost of his maintenance and supervision

in the prison;

(b) the maintenance of his wife and family (if any), or of any person dependent upon him; or

(c) in or towards the satisfaction of any order of the Court;

(d) the purchase of indulgences;

(e) towards an amount as deferred pay.

(2) A confinee employed as a skilled artisan or tradesman the products of whose work are not sold shall be credited with the net amount of 2s. 6d. per diem for every day at work, provided hos conduct is good and his work is satisfactory in quality and conditive. and quantity.

(3) A confinee employed in the service of the prison or at gardening or other unskilled work, or in any trade at which he is not a skilled worker, and whose work is satisfactory in quality and quantity, shall be credited with a net amount of 1s. 6d. per diem for every day at work.

(4) A confinee at the Nursery Camp shall be credited for every day at work with a net amount of 2s. 6d. per diem, provided always that his conduct is good and his work satisfactory in quality and quantity.
