### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to provide for divesting certain Land in the city of Geelong out of the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners, and for the Reservation from Sale permanently of such Land as a Site for a Soldiers' Memorial Park and Recreation Ground.”

“An Act to amend the *Pounds Act 1915*.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the twelfth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

A By-law of the Shire of Ferntree Gully made under Part XXXI. of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and Numbered 20, for Preserving Good Order and Decency in all Public Reserves within the Shire which have been purchased or rented or given to or otherwise provided by the Municipality, including any Buildings thereon, and preventing damage to such buildings or to the Furniture or Fittings thereof, and for regulating any Meeting or Gathering held therein and for the Management and Use of the said Reserves, Buildings, Furniture, Fittings or other property or effects used in connexion therewith, and for imposing a penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers Order as follows:—

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset except on such days as the Reserves may, with the consent of the Council, be set apart for cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements.
2. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performance in any of the Reserves and to make a charge for admission thereto.
3. No person shall enter or remain in any Reserve at any time at which it is not open to the public.
4. No person shall reside upon occupy or use or continue to reside upon occupy or use any Reserve except in accordance with the purposes or objects for which the Council has or holds the same.
5. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight in any Reserve or frequent any Park for the purpose of camping, lodging or tarrying overnight therein.
6. No person shall dig or remove or cause to be dug or removed any turf, sand, clay, soil or other material in or from any Reserve.
7. No person shall climb upon get over cut deface injure destroy soil or defile any wall or fence in or enclosing any Reserve or any building or remove or displace barrier railing seat monument work of art ornament decoration or any structure erection property chattel effects or thing or any tree plant or shrub in a Reserve.
8. No person shall throw or deposit any filth rubbish or refuse or cause suffer allow or permit any filth rubbish or refuse to fall or to be thrown or deposited in or upon any Reserve.
9. No person shall remove destroy or displace any implement utensil apparatus appliance or article provided for use or used or adapted to be used in the laying out planting improvement or maintenance of any Reserve or in the care cultivation or protection of any tree or plant therein.
10. No person shall at any time in any Reserve:—
  - (a) Remove or disturb any soil or flower-bed or tree or plant, or
  - (b) Walk or run over or stand sit or lie upon any flower-bed or tree or plant or any ground in course of preparation or cultivation, or
  - (c) Cut or displace any turf or in any manner destroy break damage disturb or interfere with any tree or plant, or
  - (d) Pluck any bud blossom flower or leaf of any tree or plant.
11. No person shall enter or quit any Reserve otherwise than through some one of the gates wickets passages or openings provided as the authorized and proper means of entrance to or egress from the same.
12. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate or tablet or any support fastening or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any Regulation or Notice and fixed or set up by the Council in any Reserve or at or near to any one of the appointed means of entrance to or egress therefrom or in or on any wall or fence enclosing the same.
13. No person shall at any time ride drive or bring or cause to be ridden driven or brought into any Reserve any beast of draught or burden except in such places as are set apart by the Council for that purpose.

Provided that if any Reserve or part thereof is lawfully used for a Show Ground, Sports Ground or Race-course the foregoing provision shall not be deemed to prohibit the riding or driving of any such beast as aforesaid in any portion of such Show Ground, Sports Ground or Race-course for the time being appointed for that purpose.

Provided further that any such riding or driving shall be subject to such conditions as the Council may prescribe.

14. No person shall at any time drive or wheel or cause to be driven or wheeled in to any Reserve any barrow, truck, machine or vehicle other than a wheeled chair drawn or propelled by hand or a perambulator or a chaise drawn or propelled by hand and used solely for the conveyance of children or invalids.

Provided that the foregoing ordinance shall not be deemed to prohibit the driving or wheeling of any bicycle, motor bicycle or motor car or vehicle in any Reserve which is for the time being appointed to be used as a cycling or racing track or carriage road whether such Reserve is for the time being used as a Show Ground, Sports Ground, Race-course or not. Such driving or wheeling shall be subject to such conditions as the Council may prescribe.

15. No person shall affix print post paint or cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing a Reserve or to or upon any tree building barrier railing seat structure erection flagging or path in a Reserve.

16. No person shall throw or discharge in any Reserve any missile to the damage danger or annoyance of any person.

17. No person shall throw distribute deposit or cause to be thrown distributed or deposited in or upon any Reserve any handbill or other printed matter.

18. Persons using a Reserve for any purpose shall prior to leaving the ground collect and remove or cause to be collected and removed all waste material scraps or litter of any kind brought or made by them.

19. No sport game or amusement shall be carried on or conducted in any Reserve on a Sunday.

20. No person shall shoot or discharge any firearms or set off any fire-balloon or throw or set fire to any fireworks or kindle or make any fire in any Reserve.

21. No person shall in any Reserve sell or offer or expose for sale or let to hire or offer or expose for letting to hiring any commodity or article unless in the exercise of a lawful right or privilege granted by the said Council.

22. No person shall in any Reserve erect any post rail fence pole tent booth stand building or structure.

23. No person shall in any Reserve deliver any public address.

24. No person in any Reserve shall play any musical instrument or sing to the annoyance of any person.

25. No owner nor person having the custody of any horse, mule, ass, dog, cow, sheep, goat, pig or any other animal shall permit such animal to trespass upon a Reserve.

26. No person shall in any Reserve use any indecent or obscene language.

27. No person shall be in any Reserve in a state of intoxication or behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance therein or commit therein any act of indecency or obstruct any servant of the Council or interfere (not being a player) with any game or sports therein or use insulting words or gestures or otherwise misbehave.

28. No game which is dangerous or is calculated to interfere with the safety or comfort of the general public or likely to injure the surface of the ground shall be allowed in any Reserve. No person shall except as herein provided play or take part in any game of football, quoits, golf, bowls, hockey, cricket, tennis or any other game which by reason of the rules or manner of playing or for the prevention of damage danger or discomfort to any person in any Reserve may necessitate at any time during the continuance of the game the exclusive use by the player or players of any space in the Reserve.

Provided that where by any notice affixed or set up in any conspicuous position in the Reserve or at or near to any entrance thereto the Council from time to time sets apart for the playing of any such game or games as are specified in such notice such space or spaces in the Reserve as are defined in such notice this By-law shall not be taken to prohibit any

person from playing or taking part in any game or games which may be played in such space or spaces and in accordance with the following Regulations:—

- (a) Every person resorting to any such space for the purpose of playing or taking part in any such game shall in making preparation for the playing of such game and in the manner of playing use reasonable and proper care to avoid unduly interfering with the reasonable and proper use of such space by any other person engaged in making preparation for playing or in playing therein or thereafter resorting to such space for the purpose of making preparation for playing or of playing therein.
- (b) A person resorting to any such space for the purpose of playing or taking part in any such game shall not begin to play at any time when such space is already occupied by such a number of players and in such a manner as to render any addition to the number of players incompatible with the safe and convenient use of such space by the players already in occupation.
- (c) Except in any case where the exclusive use of any such space or of any part thereof has been granted by the Council a player or company of players shall not in making preparation for playing and in playing any game use any part of such space for a longer time than four hours continuously if at or before the expiration of that time any other player or company of players for whose use no other part of such space or no part of any other space set apart for the purpose may be available shall make known to such first-mentioned player or company of players a desire to use for the purpose of playing such part of such space as has been previously used by such player or company of players.

29. The Council may set apart any portion of a Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit the use of the grounds as set apart and authorize the erection alteration and removal by such club of any building thereon but the Council shall have power to revoke such grant and to order the removal of such building and nothing in such grant shall limit or affect the right of entry or control over the said Reserve or grounds by the Council.

30. No person shall in any Reserve wilfully obstruct disturb interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or any part thereof or wilfully obstruct disturb or interrupt any servant or person acting under the authority of the Council in the proper execution of his duty or work.

31. The Council may make such agreements for the use of any Reserves under the control of the Council by virtue of the Act for the depasturage of animals and other purposes as to them may seem fit.

32. No person shall use any such Reserve under the control of the Council by virtue of the Act for the depasturage of animals or for other purposes except with the consent in writing of the Council or some servant thereof duly authorized by the Council in that behalf.

33. No fees or charges shall be made or imposed for entrance to the ground or any part of it or for admission to any sport or entertainment therein without the consent of the council first had and obtained.

34. No intoxicating drink or material of any kind shall be brought into or used or consumed upon the Reserve or any part thereof.

35. Any person or persons acting in contravention of these By-laws or any of them shall be guilty of an offence against the provisions of the Local Government Act.

36. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the Municipal District that is to say:—(a) To that portion of the Bayswater Municipal Recreation Reserve, which has been purchased by the Municipality. (b) the Belgrave Recreation Reserve, (c) the Fern-tree Gully Recreation Reserve, (d) the Fern-tree Gully Shire Hall Reserve, and to every other Municipal Reserve hereafter acquired as hereinbefore mentioned and to which the same is extended by Resolution of the Council.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the fifteenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and confirmed the twelfth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

## CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

### BY-LAW No. 23.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authority conferred upon it by the Water Acts, and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1922, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Three shillings and sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound fifteen shillings.

(b) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Five shillings.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

(d) Occupied or unoccupied land where water is supplied from a stand-pipe shall be charged Sixpence for every 100 gallons.

(e) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power for each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(f) On buildings in course of erection when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of such work or by special agreement; wooden houses shall be charged half rate, payment to be made before supply is given.

(g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such a rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be taken or used.

(h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special rate.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or of land supplied otherwise than by measure.

(j) The rate hereby made shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1922.

(k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

### RATING BY-LAW.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

### By-law No. 12.

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and is hereby levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the year 1922 of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, with a minimum charge of One pound for each separate service to each tenement.

Such rate shall be for the period of one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1922, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1922.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal instalments, and such instalments shall be due respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July of the year 1922.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be hereby duly authorized to demand and collect the said rate.

### MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

#### RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1922.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Mortlake Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust, and with the minimum charges, and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust.

(1) For every house, including not more than  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre of land, and of annual municipal value of £20 and under, the minimum charge shall be Thirty shillings.

(2) For every house, &c., of annual municipal value of £21 to £60 inclusive, a rate of Two shillings in the £ shall be paid, and any such properties exceeding £60 annual municipal value, shall pay a rate of One shilling in the £ for every £ over and above £60 annual valuation.

(3) All shops and places of business, with an annual municipal value below £20, shall be rated at Two shillings in the £. The stationmaster's residence to be charged for only if connected, at the same rate as house and  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre below £20 valuation.

(4) Land adjoining house properties of value not exceeding £20, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for each  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre over and above the  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre allowed with the house, up to a maximum of Ten shillings.

(5) Detached allotments shall be charged for as follows:—Not exceeding  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre Five shillings, not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre Seven shillings and sixpence, not exceeding 1 acre Ten shillings, not exceeding  $1\frac{1}{4}$  acres Twelve shillings and sixpence, not exceeding 2 acres Fifteen shillings, and if more than 2 acres Twenty shillings.

(6) The charge for water supplied by the Trust, by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(7) For water supplied to public buildings, and other similar properties, the charge shall be as follows:—Police Station, State School, Post Office, Railway Station, £2. Mechanics' Institute, Recreation Reserve, £1 10s. Masonic Hall, Temperance Hall, £1 per annum. The water for church and Sunday school grounds shall not be charged for.

(8) For every public water trough, with or without stand-pipe, the charge shall be £4 per annum.

(9) The Trust may in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier, using water for domestic or other purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within 21 days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, and at his own expense, provide and fix an approved meter, failing which the property shall be disconnected until such meter is installed.

(10) Provided that where any person desires to have the service pipe of the Trust extended to his property, and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have the power to make a special arrangement with him regarding the payment of the water supplied.

(11) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

(12) In the event of any dispute which may arise, regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special charge.

(13) The beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the first day of February, 1922, except in the cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be annual and payable on the first day of December in each year.

(14) For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge of 1s. for every 200 gallons or under.

(15) Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law, the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Mortlake Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Mortlake Waterworks Trust on the 9th day of November, 1921.

### ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

#### RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1922.

By-law of the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the urban district of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which all householders, or occupiers, or owners of lands and tenements situated within the urban district of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water by the said Trust for the year 1922:—

(a) For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound fifteen shillings sterling per annum.

(b) For every house or tenement of more than Eleven pounds and not exceeding Thirty-two pounds annual municipal valuation, at rate of Two pounds sterling per annum.

(c) For every house or tenement of the annual valuation of Thirty-two pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.

(d) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district above-mentioned separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.

(e) A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings sterling and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for gardening or stable purposes during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.

(f) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of Two pounds sterling per annum. Provided that the trough or other receptacle is situated within the Trust district, a rate of One pound sterling per annum will be charged.

(g) The charges for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity. Provided that the water used be for manufacturing purposes, the quantity used in excess shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(h) For the temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for brick and plastering shall be made; or, if there is no contract, then upon the value or on the amount charged or paid for brickwork or plastering. Persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention to do so.

(i) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipe shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.

(j) In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

(2) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1922, and the 1st day of July, 1922.

(3) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

## TRENTHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Trentham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-Law:—

## BY-LAW No. 10.

The following rates are those which all occupiers or owners of land and tenements situated in reticulated streets within the urban district of the Trust shall pay in respect of the year 1922:—

1. (a) For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal valuation and under, the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Thirty pence in the pound sterling on the amount of such municipal valuation.
2. For each vacant allotment or piece of land facing a street wherein a water main has been laid, rated for the ordinary municipal rate separately from any building, a rate of Thirty pence in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of same.
3. Each user of water so rated shall be entitled to 1,000 gallons of water for each 2s. paid in rates, and for water in excess of such allowance the charge shall be—For each 1,000 gallons up to 30,000 gallons, 6d. per 1,000; and for all water in excess of the 30,000, the charge shall be 1s. per 1,000 gallons.
4. Such rates shall be payable and collected in two instalments of equal amounts, and shall be due and payable respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1922.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trentham Waterworks Trust from time to time appoints for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and collect and receive the said rate.

## CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

## BY-LAW No. 31.

THE Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose water district has for the purpose of the said Acts been proclaimed an urban district), make the the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements shall pay, in advance, in one instalment, for the period from the first day of October, 1921, to the thirtieth day of September, 1922, in respect of water supplied by the Council (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Thirteenpence (1s. 1d.) for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses occupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the first day of October or the first day of April, shall be charged two-thirds rate.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Thirteenpence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Council shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Council by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, or otherwise provided in this regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons, and the ratepayers shall be charged for quantity of water, which at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from the standpipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Council, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per centum for wooden buildings lined with plaster, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Council, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payment in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of five shillings. With paid meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Council shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Council before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Council shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons is equal to the amount of the assessed rate for the period which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public parks and showgrounds the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (p) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens, the Manifold-street Reserve, and Flagstaff Hill Reserve the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (q) The before-mentioned rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January of the said year, and such charges shall be payable on the fourteenth day of January of the said year.
- (r) Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

6. That the quantity of water assigned to such district is thirty-five (35) cubic feet per second.

7. That the source of supply is to be the Kerang North-West Lakes Works.

8. That the season at which such supply is to be received is to be the whole year.

#### CLASS 3.—NITRO-COMPOUND.

##### Division 2.

Tetra-nitro-methyl-aniline (Tetryl)—commercially pure.  
Tri-nitro-toluol (T.N.T.)—commercially pure.

#### CLASS 6.—AMMUNITION.

##### Division 3.

Detonators—consisting of a capsule or case of such strength and construction, and containing the following explosive of the fulminate class in such quantity, that the explosion of one such capsule or case will communicate the explosion to other like capsules or cases:—

(9) Fulminate of mercury, with or without potassium chlorate and nitrates of cellulose and hexatomic alcohols.

## BOROUGH OF MENTONE AND MORDIALLOC.

BY-LAW No. 49.

A By-law of the Borough of Mentone and Mordialloc made under sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 49, for carrying out the purposes provided for in the Thirteenth Schedule to the Act aforesaid relating to the breaking, displacing, or removing the surface of soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the Council and the laying of temporary crossings.

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Mentone and Mordialloc order as follows:—

1. An authority or a permit may be issued by the proper officer of the Council to plumbers, builders, or other persons or firms requiring to break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any street, road, or footway belonging to or under the control or management of the Council subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) All new or replaced pipes for water, gas, and other services shall be laid at least eighteen inches below the surface level of the road or footway.
- (2) The person requiring a permit shall deposit with the proper officer a sum of Twenty shillings which shall be retained for a period of at least fourteen days.
- (3) After a permit has been issued to break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any road or footway the work shall be proceeded with and completed without any unnecessary delay.
2. The licensee shall complete to the satisfaction of the proper officer the following work:—
  - (1) The earth used for filling excavations or trenches shall in all cases be thoroughly wetted and filled in 6-inch layers and thoroughly rammed with a heavy rammer.
  - (2) In relaying pitches they are to be set on at least three inches of good sand with close joints, properly flushed up with sand and well rammed and back rammed with a fifty-six pounds weight pavior's rammer.
  - (3) All holes required in kerb are to be neatly cut to the size of the pipe or shoot to come through at the joints, one-half of the opening being in each stone.
  - (4) Whenever a metalled roadway is disturbed the trench or excavation shall be filled as described in sub-clause 1 of clause 2 of this By-law and afterwards covered with six inches of good clean metal, properly spread and left clear of all obstruction.

3. A minimum fee of 2s. 6d. shall be made and deducted out of the deposit (even when no repairs have been found necessary) to cover the cost of inspection.

4. The following minimum charges for repairs when a trench or excavation has been left in good order to the satisfaction of the proper officer shall be made and deducted out of the deposit lodged, viz.:—

- 6d. per square foot on metalled roads.
  - 8d. per square foot on tar-paved footpaths.
- Such charges to be in addition to the fee of 2s. 6d. mentioned in clause 3 hereof.

In all cases where the cost of repairs exceeds the said minimum charge a charge to be fixed by the proper officer shall be deducted out of the deposit lodged.

5. In the event of the charges for repairs being in excess of the deposit of Twenty shillings lodged the licensee shall pay such charges within seven (7) days from the date of demand for payment, and if not so paid the same shall be recoverable as a debt due to the Council.

6. An authority or a permit for a period not exceeding 30 days may be issued by the proper officer to any person desiring to cart across a footway subject to the following conditions:—

The licensee shall form a temporary crossing by placing a bridge over the channel and covering the footway with boards not less than one inch thick backed up with feather-edged pieces, lying close on the footpath and securely bound with wire or hoop-iron so as not



to present any obstruction to traffic, and the licensee shall not cart along the footpath.

7. At the expiration of the said period of 30 days the licensee shall pay for any necessary repairs to the footway and the cost and expense of such repair shall be recoverable from the licensee as a debt due to the Council.

8. "Proper officer" for the purpose of this By-law shall mean the engineer for the time being of the Council of the Borough of Mentone and Mordialloc.

"Licensee" shall mean any person or firm to whom a permit or authority has been granted.

## REGULATION No. 1.

A Regulation of the Shire of Colac numbered 1 made under section 48 of Part 10 of the Thirteenth Schedule of the Local Government Act 1915, in force in the Shire of Colac by virtue of a By-law of the above-named shire numbered 98 for prescribing the sums to be paid for Licences for Hackney Carriages, for regulating the manner in which the name of the municipality, and the number of each carriage corresponding with the number of the Licence, shall be displayed thereon, for regulating the conduct of the owners, drivers and conductors of hackney carriages plying within the prescribed place of their several employments, and determining whether such drivers or conductors shall wear any and what badges, for regulating by the nature and dimensions of the carriage the number of persons to be carried by hackney carriages and in what manner such number is to be shown upon such carriage, for fixing the standings of hackney carriages, and for fixing the rates or fares as well for time as for distance to be paid for hackney carriages, and the mode in which such rates are to be painted or marked on every carriage.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac make the following regulations, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Colac.

1. For every licence for a hackney carriage the sum of Twenty shillings shall be paid to the Council of the said shire.

2. The name of the shire, the number of the hackney carriage and the number of the persons to be carried corresponding with the number of the licence issued in respect to such carriage, shall be painted, printed, or marked upon a metal plate, and shall be fixed in a prominent place upon the back of every hackney carriage.

3. The rates and fares to be charged for the hire of every hackney carriage shall be legibly painted, printed or engraved on the front panel of and on the inside of such hackney carriage.

4. The number of every hackney carriage corresponding with the number of the licence issued in respect thereof, shall be painted and displayed on some conspicuous part thereof, and on the front glass of every lamp used upon such hackney carriage in a distinct and legible manner, and in figures one (1) inch in length.

5. No driver of any hackney carriage shall smoke any pipe, cigar, or cigarette while he is driving such hackney carriage under engagement to any person or persons, after an objection taken by any such person.

6. No driver of any hackney carriage under special engagement of contract to or with any person or persons shall ply for hire or take up any passenger or passengers while performing such engagement or contract.

7. No driver shall carry or knowingly permit to be carried in any hackney carriage any merchandise, goods or wares or articles other than the luggage of passengers, and no driver of a hackney carriage shall be obliged to take any such luggage of greater weight than is prescribed in the rates and fares herein, nor unless any such luggage shall be clean and not calculated to injure or damage any hackney carriage or the clothes of the passengers therein.

8. The number of persons to be carried by any hackney carriage shall not exceed the number stated in the licence issued in respect thereof.

9. The driver of every hackney carriage shall wear a badge on which shall be painted, printed or engraved in legible letters as follows:—

and also the number corresponding with his licence, the registration fee of which shall be One shilling (1s.).
