THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

BY-LAW No. 1.—SPECIAL RATE.—THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE DISTRICT.

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915* (No. 2761), doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following Special Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915* (No. 2761), and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District:—

(1) Of any land or tenement situate within The Ballarat Sewerage District a rate of Twopence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable properties within the said district.

(2) Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1922; and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1922, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1922; at the office of the Authority, situate Water Supply Office, Ballarat.

(3) For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a Police Magistrate.

(4) Such person or persons as The Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate and charges.

The Resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by The Ballarat Sewerage Authority on the 24th day of November, 1921, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the 16th day of December, 1921.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 25 FOR MAKING AND LEVYING RATES.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements within The Ballarat Water Supply District:—

(a) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) of the net annual value of £20 and under situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

(b) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) above the net annual value of £20 and not exceeding £300 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.

- (c) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 10s. per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.
- (d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.
- (e) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the municipal valuation of such tenement.
- (f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £3 10s. per cent. in the pound of the municipal valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store as aforesaid.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1922, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1922, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1922, at the office of The Water Commissioners at Ballarat.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipalities in which such lands and tenements are situate in The Ballarat Water Supply District shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements valued at £20 and over shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied otherwise than by measure by the Commissioners in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such persons as The Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

BY-LAW No. 32.

A By-law making rates and charges for water supplied within the Water Supply District of the Borough of Creswick.

THE Council of the Borough of Creswick doth hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (Nos. 2747 and 2852), make the following rates upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Creswick, such rates to come into operation for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1922, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1922, and the said rate shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, viz., on the 1st day of January, 1922, and the 1st day of July, 1922:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £9 and under, the annual sum of £10 per centum on the annual valuation, provided that such rate in respect of any one house or tenement shall not be less than 10s. per annum.
2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £12, the annual sum of £1.
3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £13 and not exceeding £20, the annual sum of £1 5s.
4. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £21 and not exceeding £30, the annual sum of £1 10s.
5. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £31 and not exceeding £50, the annual sum of £2.
6. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £51 and not exceeding £75, the annual sum of £2 10s.
7. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £76 and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of £3.
8. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £101 and not exceeding £150, the annual sum of £3 10s.
9. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £151 and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of £4.
10. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £200, the annual sum of £5.

Hotels.

11. On every hotel of the annual value of £50 and under, the annual sum of £2 10s.
12. On every hotel of the annual value of £51 and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of £3 10s.
13. On every hotel of the annual value of £101 and not exceeding £150, the annual sum of £4 15s.
14. On every hotel of the annual value of £151 and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of £6.
15. On every hotel above the annual value of £200, the annual sum of £7.
16. Livery and coach-horse stables and other premises where horses are constantly kept (in addition to the above) to be charged at the rate of 6s. per stall per annum.
17. In hotels, one stall allowed for every £50 annual value; every additional stall to be charged at the rate of 6s. per annum.
18. Charge for water troughs, £1 per annum.
19. Charge for water supplied by meter, 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.
20. Charge for water supplied at stand-pipe, 6d. per load of 180 gallons.

SHIRE OF TALBOT.

TALBOT WATER SUPPLY RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1922.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1922 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the shire of Talbot which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District, also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1922 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) municipal value and under, the sum of One pound six shillings and eightpence (£1 6s. 8d.).
2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) in the pound.
3. For every hotel, a rate of Eight pounds (£8) per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.
4. Government Departments, railways and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Two shillings and eightpence (2s. 8d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made.
5. Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Council the following shall be the charges made:—

Post Office, Two shillings and eightpence (2s. 8d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 20,000 gallons per annum.

Police Station, Two shillings and eightpence (2s. 8d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 30,000 gallons per annum.

State School, Two shillings and eightpence (2s. 8d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for each load of 400 gallons or less.

7. For every water-trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory, mill, tenement where steam machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound on the annual municipal value of each property, or the water may be supplied and charged for by agreement whichever the Council may decide on.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter the charge shall be Threepence (3d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 180,000 gallons per acre and 90,000 gallons per half-acre or less area.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards a charge of Threepence (3d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 180,000 gallons per acre where supplied from open race, with a minimum charge of One pound six shillings and eightpence (£1 6s. 8d.).

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For the water supplied to mining companies, dredges, &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

The before-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1922, and the 1st day of July, 1922, and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges.

AVOCA TOWNSHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 12.

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1922 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

1. On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.
2. Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal value.
3. Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be ten thousand gallons (10,000).
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per thousand gallons (1,000).
5. Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum per engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
6. For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter.
7. On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the charge shall be Five shillings per thousand gallons (1,000), and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owner, or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings and Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided; or they may by special agreement with the Trust pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings per annum, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, payments in either case to be made in advance.
8. Supplies of water not specified herein must be paid for at such a rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
9. In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to make a special charge.
10. For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show-grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
11. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such hose is used.
12. For all tenements in the said district situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, shall be one quarter the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with water from the service pipes.
13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1922.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

COBRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

By-law No. 18.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1922 for water within the boundaries of the Cobram Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1922.
2. The minimum rates for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as dwellings, shall be Thirty shillings (30s.)
3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land fronting Station-street; Queen-street, from Station-street to High-street; Main-street, from Station-street to High-street; Punt-road, from Station-street to High-street; Bank-street, from Punt-road to High-street; and High-street, from Queen-street to Pine-street—a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.
4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.
5. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land not served with a water main, situated within half-a-mile of the Trust's stand-pipe, a minimum rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be charged.
6. The foregoing rates are hereby made, payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1922.
7. Where, in the opinion of the Trust, it is necessary that a meter be affixed to the water pipe supplying any allotment, house, or tenement, the same may, in the discretion of the Commissioners, be supplied by the Trust, and the cost of same shall be repaid by the owner of such allotment, house, or tenement, but the Trust may submit such repayment to be made at the rate of Thirty-two shillings (32s.) yearly, payable by quarterly instalments, with interest added.
8. The Trust may require an approved meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any allotment, house, or tenement, in any case where it may deem necessary.
9. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.
10. For water supplied by measure a charge of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made.
11. For water supplied to bowling greens or other public or semi-public grounds the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.
12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Hepburn Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for the year 1922 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say:—

The rates and charges shall be payable by the occupiers and owners of the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Hepburn Waterworks District, as follows:—

1. On all properties of an annual valuation of £16 or over, the sum equivalent to a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling per annum.

On all properties of an annual valuation under £16, the sum of £2 minimum per annum.

Vacant lands shall be rated at Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the annual valuation, provided the sum paid shall not be less than 10s.

2. The charge for water by measure shall be Two shillings for every one thousand gallons.

3. The rates payable on properties not abutting on streets on which mains have been laid shall be as follows:—

On properties within quarter of a mile of any main, one-half of the above rate.

On properties more than a quarter of a mile and not more than half-a-mile from any main, one-quarter of the above rate.

4. Such before-mentioned rates and charges shall be based on the municipal valuation of the shire of Glenlyon for the time being, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1922.

5. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Hepburn Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st December, 1922, and the rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1922.

7. Such person or persons as the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

3. Such rate is hereby made payable in one instalment and shall be due on the 1st day of January, 1922.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1922.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1922 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Traralgon Waterworks Trust, which district has, for the purpose of the Water Acts, been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges of the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate for the shire of Traralgon, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound five shillings (£1 5s.).

For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land the municipal value of which does not exceed Five pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.); when such value is over Five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

When the water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charges shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during the year ending on the 31st of December shall be 10,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand of the Trust.

The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make special provision as may be deemed necessary.

The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the owner or occupier shall, in every instance in which any damage is caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be guilty of an offence.

If any person neglect to repair any such service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from the proper officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected.

The Trust may at any time, when found necessary, repair or renew any pipes and stop-cocks laid for conveying a supply of water to any tenement, and may charge the owner thereof with the cost of expense of providing and laying, repairing, or renewing the same, and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such owner to the Trust, and shall be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

The foregoing rates are made payable on the 1st of March, 1922.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST THE DETERMINATION OF THE PLUMBERS BOARD.

WHEREAS the Wages Board appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed either inside or outside a factory or workroom in the process, trade, or business of a plumber or gasfitter;
- (b) whosoever employed in any plumbing work (including electrical or gas fittings) in connexion with the erection or repairing of buildings

(hereinafter referred to as the Plumbers Board), did by a certain Determination made on the twenty-sixth day of August, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the ninth day of September, 1921, determine the lowest prices and rates to be so paid: And whereas a group of employers who employ not less than twenty-five per centum of the total number of the workers in the trade to which the Determination aforesaid applies has in the prescribed manner appealed against the said Determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the Factories and Shops Acts: Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts, that a Court of Industrial Appeals consisting of the President, His Honour Mr. Justice McArthur, and Alfred Ernest Atherton, of 383 Latrobe-street, Melbourne, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in the trade concerned for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination, duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employers on the Plumbers Board to represent the employers, and Alfred C. Mitchell, of 9 Hosie-street, Richmond, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in such trade for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination, nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employees on the said Board to represent the employees, be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the Determination of the said Plumbers Board and to revise or alter the said Court's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF BET BET.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Borough Riding of the municipal district of the shire of Bet Bet of the particular classes to be affected, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the Borough Riding of the municipal district of the shire of Bet Bet shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday,
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday,
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Thursday.

WHEREAS by the Education Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulations X. and XI. under the Education Act 1915, and doth substitute the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION X.

JUNIOR TEACHERS AND SEWING MISTRESSES.

A.—JUNIOR TEACHERS.

1. The conditions for appointment as junior teachers in elementary schools shall be:—
 - (a) Except as hereinafter provided, candidates must be not less than 16 years of age, and must hold the School Intermediate Certificate or an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
 - (b) They must furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character;
 - (c) They must produce a certificate from an inspector of schools or from a headmaster of a district high school or higher elementary school that they possess aptitude and general suitability for the work of a teacher;
 - (d) Before appointment as junior teachers, candidates must submit a certificate from a schools medical officer or medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director that they are of sound constitution and are free from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.
 2. Candidates who comply with the conditions of clause 1 and who have completed an approved course of study in a district high school or a higher elementary school, and who have qualified for a School Leaving Certificate or a School Intermediate Certificate of the University of Melbourne, or who hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification shall be eligible for appointment to such vacancies as may exist for junior teachers.
 3. Candidates other than pupils of a district high school or a higher elementary school who have qualified as in clause 1 may be recorded for appointment to such vacancies as may exist for junior teachers.
 4. Where a vacancy for a junior teacher exists and there is no candidate qualified as in any clause above, the vacancy may be filled by the appointment of the candidate having the highest qualifications who in the opinion of the Director is qualified for such an appointment. If it is considered necessary the appointment shall be determined by competitive examination.
 5. Candidates who have qualified for appointment as junior teachers under this regulation shall be appointed in the following order of precedence:—
 - (a) Those who have qualified under clause 2 above, and who hold a School Leaving Certificate or an approved equivalent qualification;
 - (b) Those who have qualified under clause 2 above, and who hold a School Intermediate Certificate or an approved equivalent qualification;
 - (c) Those who have qualified as in clause 3 above, and who hold a School Leaving Certificate or a School Intermediate Certificate or a qualification approved as equivalent to either of these;
 - (d) Candidates qualified as in clause 4 above.
- The number of subjects in which a candidate has passed in the examinations prescribed for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class, and the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, shall determine the order of precedence of appointment, within these divisions, provided, however, that the Director may determine in each division the proportionate number of males and females to be appointed, and provided also that holders of scholarships for candidate teachers under clauses 12 to 16 of Regulation XXI. who hold the qualifications set out in clause 1 of this regulation shall have a preferential right of appointment over other qualified candidates.
6. Junior teachers shall be divided into three grades—
 - (a) Candidates qualified as in clause 8 below shall be classified as junior teachers of the First Grade.
 - (b) Candidates qualified as in clause 2 or in clause 3 above who hold a School Leaving Certificate or an equivalent qualification, shall upon appointment be classified as junior teachers of the Second Grade.
 - (c) Candidates qualified as in clause 2 or in clause 3 above who hold a School Intermediate Certificate shall upon appointment be classified as junior teachers of the Third Grade.
 - (d) Candidates qualified as in clause 4 above upon appointment shall be classified as junior teachers of the Third Grade.
 7. The conditions necessary for promotion of junior teachers to the Second Grade shall be as follow:—
 - (a) To have completed a year as junior teacher of the Third Grade and to have received satisfactory annual reports from the district inspector, and half-yearly reports from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed.
 - (b) To have passed a satisfactory examination in at least six of these subjects prescribed for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, as mentioned in Regulation XI.; and
 - (c) To have passed a satisfactory examination in drawing, Part I., and in the theory and practice of teaching, as prescribed for junior teachers of the Second Grade in the Instructions appended to this regulation.
 8. The conditions necessary for promotion of junior teachers to the First Grade shall be as follow:—
 - (a) To have completed a year as junior teacher of the Second Grade and to have received satisfactory annual reports from the district inspector, and half-yearly reports from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed.
 - (b) To have passed in all the subjects prescribed for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, as mentioned in Regulation XI.
 9. (a) The course of training prescribed for junior teachers shall be completed by serving a year as a junior teacher of the First Grade.
 - (b) On completion of the course, each junior teacher shall be recorded in the Employment Register, and may be required to take up a position as assistant teacher or head teacher.
 - (c) In the event of any First Grade junior teacher refusing to take up such a position, the services of such junior teacher shall be dispensed with unless such junior teacher is a female and satisfies the Classifiers that the position she is required to take up is one which it would not be fit and proper for a female teacher to accept or that there are good and sufficient reasons for not requiring her to take up such position, or unless such junior teacher is a male and satisfies the Classifiers that in his case there are exceptional circumstances under which he should not be required to take up such a position, and in any case where the Classifiers are satisfied as aforesaid they shall furnish to the Minister a written report of their decision stating the reasons for such decision.
 10. During their course, junior teachers may be required to attend such classes of instruction as the Director may from time to time determine.
 11. (a) The appointment of all junior teachers shall be on probation during the full term of the course of such junior teachers.
 - (b) The services of any junior teacher may be dispensed with for misconduct or for repeated failure to pass annual examinations prescribed for promotion or for failure to obtain satisfactory reports from a district inspector. The services of any junior teacher appointed subsequent to 1st July, 1920, who at the end of his fourth year of service has not passed in all the subjects for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, as prescribed in Regulation XI., may be dispensed with.
 - (c) Each junior teacher will be examined from time to time by a medical officer approved by the Director, and, if the medical report is not satisfactory in any case, the services of such junior teacher may be dispensed with.
 12. All junior teachers who have been appointed not less than a year will be required to attend the annual examinations prescribed for junior teachers.

13. To enable junior teachers to pass their examinations for promotion and for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class, head teachers and assistant teachers are required to give to the junior teachers in their schools instruction outside of the ordinary school hours as follows:—

In a school having but one junior teacher, two hours per week; in a school having more than one junior teacher, at least three hours per week. Of this instruction, a satisfactory proportion shall be given by the head teacher. The time for such instruction, and the names of the teachers giving the instruction, must, in all cases, appear on the time-table.

The time actually given to the instruction shall be entered in the teachers' time-book by such head teacher or assistant as the case may be. The exercise-books kept by the junior teachers, showing the work done under the direction of the head teachers and assistants, shall be dated from day to day, and shall be produced to the district inspector at his half-yearly visits.

14. Special classes for the instruction and training of junior teachers may be formed in the principal centers of population. Junior teachers employed in schools situated at convenient distances from the places in which these classes are held will be required to attend such classes at such times as the Director may from time to time determine. Head teachers shall supervise the work done by junior teachers for these special classes, and supplement this instruction.

15. At least once in each year, the district inspectors shall include in their reports on head teachers reports on the character of the instruction of the junior teachers, and on the arrangements made for their practical training in the art of teaching.

16. Candidates for appointment as junior teachers in district high schools and higher elementary schools, in addition to holding the qualifications mentioned in clause 1 must have passed the School Leaving, the Senior Public, or some higher, examination of the University of Melbourne, and must also have had at least one year's experience as junior teachers in elementary schools and have passed in the theory and practice of teaching, Part I., as prescribed in the instructions appended to this regulation.

17. A junior teacher who for any reason has left the service of the Education Department may be re-appointed as a junior teacher and placed in such grade and paid such salary under the fifth schedule of the *Public Service Act 1920* as the Director may determine.

INSTRUCTIONS.

1.—APPOINTMENT OF JUNIOR TEACHERS.

Persons desiring appointment as junior teachers in the service of the Education Department should forward with their applications evidence that they hold the qualifications mentioned in clause 1.

Exit pupils from district high schools or higher elementary schools should forward their applications through the head masters, who will place the applicants from each school in order of merit as shown by the school record of pupils. When the number of qualified pupils from district high schools and higher elementary schools exceeds the number of vacancies for junior teachers, appointments cannot be guaranteed. Qualified pupils not appointed as junior teachers by reason of there being an insufficient number of vacancies shall be recorded for vacancies which may arise during the year next succeeding the annual examination at which they qualified for appointment.

2.—COURSES OF STUDY AND EXAMINATIONS.

(a)—Before Appointment as Junior Teachers.

The course of study to be undertaken by pupils in high schools and other secondary schools who desire appointment as junior teachers shall be at least eight of the subjects of the School Intermediate examination of the University of Melbourne, including the following compulsory subjects:—English, a second language or History and civics, one branch of Mathematics and one branch of Science.

In addition to the above, candidates are required to complete approved courses in—

- (1) Manual work (first and second years)—
Boys—Woodwork or sheetmetal work or modelling.
Girls—Needlework, and cookery or modelling.
- (2) Music.
- (3) Physical training.

The details of manual work, music and physical training are as set forth in the Courses of Study for High Schools, or as may be prescribed from time to time. Modelling may be taken as an alternative only where facilities for teaching woodwork or sheetmetal work or cookery are not provided.

Where practicable, candidates should complete the courses in manual work and in nature-study before entering on the Third Year of the High School Course.

(b)—After Appointment as Junior Teachers.

After appointment, junior teachers will be required to pass in the subjects, if any, of those mentioned above in which they have not passed before appointment, and also to qualify for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, before they can be classified as junior teachers of the First Grade. (See Regulation XI.)

3.—PROMOTION OF JUNIOR TEACHERS.

The details of requirements for promotion to the two higher grades of junior teachers are as follow:—

Second Grade.

Before being eligible for promotion to the Second Grade junior teachers must—

- (a) Have completed a year as junior teachers of the Third Grade, and have received satisfactory reports from the district inspector and from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed.
- (b) Have obtained a pass in at least six of the subjects prescribed for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class; and
- (c) Have passed a satisfactory examination in drawing, Part I., and in the theory and practice of teaching as prescribed below.

Drawing, Part I.—

- (a) To draw to scale from dimensioned sketches, from actual measurement, and from given data, simple objects, such as a box, a table, a chair, and the like in easy positions. Easy working drawings of such objects in orthographic and isometric projection.
- (b) To design and construct simple decorative geometric patterns—borders, diapers, panels, and the like. To analyse given patterns, such as the "fret," the "scale," the "zig-zag," and the like. The questions will be based upon a knowledge of elementary practical plane and solid geometry embraced in the following:—

To bisect a line, an arc, and an angle; to draw lines perpendicular and parallel to each other by construction and with the ruler and set square; the equal and proportional division of lines; the construction and use of plain scales, diagonal scales, and scales of chords; to make an angle equal to a given angle, or containing a given number of degrees; to find the center of a circle; to describe a circle to pass through two or more given points; to divide a circle into any number of equal sectors; the construction of triangles, quadrilaterals, and polygons under simple conditions; to draw a straight line tangent to a circle or a circle tangent to a straight line; to describe circles or arcs and rectilinear figures within and about others; to describe the ellipse, under simple conditions; plans and elevations of geometric solids and objects of simple form; simple isometric projection.

- (a) Elementary linear perspective: To draw in perspective, freehand, or with instruments, simple objects composed of straight lines, such as a cube, a square prism, a triangular prism, a door, a fence, and the like.
- (d) Drawing from models or objects. (Such models as the cube, cone, cylinder, and pyramid, and such objects as a flower-pot, a bowl, a jug, a teapot, and the like will be given.) The exercise will consist of not more than two models or objects in combination. Candidates must show a knowledge of the effects of perspective in modifying the appearance of objects.

- (e) Drawing plant forms from nature. (Such plants as the eucalyptus, the pittosporum, the ivy, and the geranium will be selected.) The work may be executed with the brush and water-color, in monochrome or in color, in silhouette or in outline, or with the lead pencil in outline.

NOTE.—Junior teachers who have obtained a pass in drawing in the School Intermediate or the Junior Public examination or who hold an approved equivalent qualification will not be required to present themselves in sub-clauses (a) (b) (c) and (d) above.

- (c) Practice.—To give a satisfactory class lesson in model drawing from a single object, explaining and illustrating such terms as "vanishing," "eye-level."

Theory of Teaching, Part I.—

- (a) Content of and methods of teaching the subjects set out in the Course of Study for Grades I., II., III., and IV. in State elementary schools, and the notes thereon.

- (b) Circulars of Information.—*Arithmetic for Infants and Class I., Drawing for Infants and Junior Classes; Dr. Smyth's Guide to a Modern Infant Room.*
- (c) Method of preparing notes of lessons, and the preparation of such notes in the case of the subjects indicated under (a) above.
- (d) Method of criticizing lessons.
- (e) Directions for filling in the *Attendance Roll*.
- (f) Class drill and physical and breathing exercises, as for Grades I., II., III., and IV.
- (g) Phonics, voice production, and blackboard writing.

Practice of Teaching—

To give a class lesson in any of the work prescribed in theory of teaching, Part I. (a) (f) and (g) above.

First Grade.

The conditions necessary for the promotion of junior teachers to the First Grade shall be as follow:—

- (a) To have completed a year as junior teachers of the Second Grade, and to have received satisfactory reports from the district inspector and from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed.
- (b) To have completed a pass in the subjects prescribed for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, as set out in Regulation XI.

Drawing, Part II.—

- (a) Drawing from models and objects. As in Part I., but of more advanced character; not more than three models or objects in combination will be employed. A perspective or a geometric analysis of one or more of the models may be required.
- (b) Drawing from memory common objects, natural forms (including those studied under drawing, Part I. (a) above), and simple animal forms; illustrating such terms as "mountain range," "river flat," "mandible," "web-footed," and the like.

In practising for the examination, the blackboard should be largely employed.

- (c) Modelling from nature. Plant forms similar to those given under drawing, Part I. (b), above, will be selected. The examination exercises will be executed in plasticine, but, in practising for the examination, both clay and plasticine should be employed where possible, in order to acquire facility in the use of a plastic medium.
- (d) Practice.—To give a satisfactory lesson in drawing plant forms from nature.

Penmanship.—Half-text and running hand, speed test.

Needlework (for girls)—

Sewing.—A calico sampler should be worked showing that the teacher possesses the skill to work all the stitches and processes of needlework used—

- (i) In the making and mending of calico garments. These should include tacking, running, hemming, top-sewing, hemfolding (a) as for the bottom of a shirt, (b) as for a pillow case, (c) as for a towel, (d) false hem on the cross, hemstitching, five methods of making seams, pleating, gathering, stroking and setting into a band, back-stitching, sewing on of tapes (6 methods), feather-stitching (2 methods), buttonholes, sewing on of buttons, eyelet holes and loops, tucking, whipping and setting on a frill, gusset, strengthening tape, piping cord, a calico patch, marking.
- (ii) A flannel sampler showing the stitches and processes used in making and repairing flannel garments. This should include—Two methods of making seams, herringbone stitch, hemming, feather-stitching, chain-stitch, buttonholing (scallop), button holes, pleating, tucking, marking, knotting flannel binding (2 methods), strengthening tape, formation of a placket hole as for a petticoat, the front opening of a flannel shirt, sewing on of tapes, sewing on of buttons, darning as for a thin place, flannel patch (2 methods).
- (iii) Also a garment which may be handsewn and machined in combination.

Darning.—A hole in a stocking, the hole to be at least 1 inch in diameter.

Knitting.—One specimen of the following:—Intake, heel, and toe, or 1 pair of booties, a hood, or jacket.

Music.—Candidates have the option of taking either Part I. (tonic sol-fa notation) or Part II. (staff notation).

Part I.—Tonic Sol-fa Notation.—(i) Simple practical tests in singing from the tonic sol-fa notation in (a) time exercise, including whole, half and quarter pulses, and their combina-

tions in 2, 3, 4, or 6 pulse measure; (b) tune exercise, containing only tones of the major scale and no divided pulses; (c) ear exercise—any three tones of the major scale in step-wise succession.

(ii) A written paper on the elementary theory of the tonic sol-fa notation, including (a) the common scale; (b) the mental effects of tones; (c) the different kinds of measure; (d) the lengths of tones; (e) signs and terms in common use relating to force, speed, and expression.

(iii) To pitch and conduct a school song suitable for a senior class.

NOTE.—The Elementary Practice and Theory Certificates of the Tonic Sol-fa College will be accepted in lieu of the requirements set out in paragraphs (i) and (ii) above respectively.

Part II.—Staff Notation.—(i) Simple practical tests in singing from the staff notation in (a) time exercise, including minims, crotchets, and quavers, and their combinations, in $\frac{2}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{4}{4}$, or $\frac{6}{8}$ time; (b) tune exercise, containing only tones of the major scale, and no divided beats; (c) ear exercise—any three tones of the major scale in stepwise succession.

(ii) A written paper on (a) notation: all the details of notation, staff, leger lines, clefs (treble and bass), notes, rests, dot, tie, bars, sharps, flats, &c. Transposition of a melodic passage from treble to bass clef, and *vice versa*. (b) Tonality: A thorough knowledge of major and minor scales (harmonic and melodic forms), and their signatures, including intervals and their inversions. (c) Time: Signatures of duple, triple, and quadruple (simple) and duple (compound) times.

$$\frac{2}{2}, \frac{2}{4}, \frac{3}{4}, \frac{3}{8}, \frac{3}{4}, \frac{4}{4}, \frac{4}{4}, \frac{4}{8}, \frac{4}{4}, \frac{6}{8}, \frac{6}{8}$$

(d) Terminology: Signs and terms in common use relating to force, speed, and expression.

(iii) To pitch and conduct a school song suitable for a senior class.

NOTE.—A pass in Grade V. Theory of the Australian Music Examination Board will be accepted in lieu of the requirements set out in paragraph (ii) above.

It is recognised that there is a small proportion of persons who, through some physical defect, are unable to sing. Teachers who come under this category will be exempt from the practical tests on passing Grade IV. Theory of the Australian Music Examination Board.

Candidates who wish to be examined in the practical tests should notify the district inspector at his visit to their school.

Nature Study.—A study of common animals and plants; field geographical features of the locality and their mode of formation and everyday natural physical phenomena.

Theory of Teaching, Part II.—

To answer questions on the methods of teaching the subjects of the "Course of Free Instruction in Elementary Schools," as prescribed for theory of teaching, Part I., with the addition of the following—

- (a) Content of and methods of teaching the subjects set out in the Course of Study for Grades V., VI., VII., and VIII. in State schools, and the elementary notes thereon.
- (b) Circulars of Information—*Elementary Experimental Science, Drawing with Special Reference to the Work of the Upper Classes, Composition, and Geography.*
- (c) Method of preparing notes of lessons, and the preparation of such notes in the case of the subjects indicated under (a) above.
- (d) Method of criticizing lessons.
- (e) Directions for filling in the school records.
- (f) Class drill and physical and breathing exercises, as for Grades V., VI., VII., and VIII.
- (g) Phonics, voice production and blackboard writing.
- (h) School hygiene.

Practice of Teaching—

- (a) To give a satisfactory lesson in arithmetic, grammar, composition, or to prepare notes of, and to give a lesson on, a subject approved of by the inspector; phonics and voice production; class drill; physical and breathing exercises; singing.
- (b) Reading and Recitation.—To read with distinct articulation, fluency, and expression, prose and verse from a book or newspaper; to recite a poem.

4.—INSTRUCTION OF JUNIOR TEACHERS.

Head teachers should draw the attention of the district inspector to any marked irregularity, unpunctuality of attendance, or unsatisfactory work on the part of junior teachers.

Junior teachers may be enrolled for instruction in special classes in high schools, to be held at suitable times in the afternoons or evenings, and on Saturdays. Attendance at these classes will be held to satisfy the requirements of Regulation XI., so far as applicable to the subjects taught in the

special classes, but head teachers are required to supplement the work given at a high school by supervising the individual preparation prescribed for the students in any subject.

Special attention is called to the necessity for carrying on systematically the practical training of junior teachers in the art of teaching throughout the year.

To ensure efficient practical training, the following course is considered necessary, and should be followed in schools in which junior teachers are employed:—

- (a) Previous preparation by junior teachers of at least two of the lessons they will be called upon to give next day. Brief notes indicating in outline the matter and the method of presentation should be kept.
- (b) Preparing full notes of ten criticism lessons, and giving the lessons under the supervision of the head teacher or the assistant in charge of a department.
- (c) The giving of ten-example or demonstration lessons by the head teacher or other teachers of experience and skill. These lessons should not be criticized. A list showing the names of the teachers, the subjects treated, and the time of the lessons, should be kept in the office for the inspector's perusal.

Of these (a) may be omitted on those days when the junior teacher attends evening classes.

The lessons under (c) should be given during the year, i.e., one in each month, from February to November inclusive, and the lessons should be given on the first Tuesday in each month, or on some other day in the same week as sanctioned by the district inspector, commencing at 11.45 a.m. On this day, the usual morning recess will be dispensed with in all classes. If, on the day appointed for the example lesson, the school is closed, the lesson should be given on the next school day. On such occasions, the school, with the exception of the class to be taught, should be dismissed for the morning at 11.45; but all members of the staff should be present as auditors while the lesson is being given. They are not to be employed in any other duties while these example lessons are in progress.

Should any teacher find the afternoon a more convenient time than the morning, such lessons may commence after the school has been in session two hours; and, on such occasions, the school may assemble at 1.15 p.m.

A *Junior Teacher Record Book* will be forwarded to each school in which a junior teacher is employed. In this book, the following information should appear:—

- (a) Record number of each junior teacher.
- (b) Name in full.
- (c) Date of appointment.
- (d) Classes taught and period spent with each.
- (e) Quarterly report of head teacher on general progress and teaching proficiency.

These reports of the head teacher will be considered in the case of each candidate (junior teacher) due for promotion.

Before First-class junior teachers may be appointed as head teachers, they will be required to attend an approved school for at least two weeks for training in the management of a small school, and to furnish a certificate of their capacity to manage such a school from the head teacher of the school visited.

First-grade junior teachers in the metropolitan area will visit the rural schools attached to the Teachers' College. Application to attend one of these schools should be made early in each year to the Principal of the Teachers' College. First-grade junior teachers in the Ballarat districts will visit Alfredton School, No. 1091, or such other schools as may be arranged by the district inspectors. First-grade junior teachers in the Geelong district will attend at Flinders School, No. 260, Geelong, or such other schools as may be arranged by the district inspector. First-grade junior teachers in the Bendigo district will attend a small school to be attached to one of the larger schools in Bendigo, or such other schools as may be arranged by the district inspectors.

In other inspectorial districts, the district inspectors will select the schools which first-grade junior teachers should visit for their training. In centers where there are no small schools conveniently situated for the training in country-school management of first-grade junior teachers, a "country" school composed of four or five pupils drawn from each grade may be established temporarily in a large school.

Applications to attend a school for training in country-school management should, except in the case of metropolitan schools, be made to the district inspector, who will inform applicants which school they should visit.

Upon the completion of a satisfactory course of training in country-school management, each first-grade junior teacher will be furnished by the head teacher of the school visited with a certificate that he or she has undergone a course of training for a period—to be stated—and is now capable of conducting a small school in a satisfactory manner.

This certificate should be forwarded to the Education Department (together with an application for appointment as head teacher) immediately on completion of the training referred to.

A junior teacher should, during his course of training, be afforded an opportunity of teaching in each department in the school, and should be required to study and prepare notes upon the program of instruction for each grade. The head teacher should see that all circulars and notices in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid* are studied by his junior teachers.

Teachers and junior teachers who wish to appeal against the result of any examination must lodge such appeal within fourteen days of the date of the notification of such result, and must forward, with their appeal, the sum of 2s. 6d. This sum will be returned if good grounds for appeal are shown, otherwise it will be retained.

Complaints that failure at examination has arisen from curtailment of the time specified or from illness of the candidate will not be taken into consideration unless, at the time, the attention of the inspector conducting the examination is called to the matter.

5.—STUDENTSHIPS AT THE TEACHERS' COLLEGE.

Junior teachers who have the qualifications specified in Regulation XII. (A) are eligible to apply for free studentships at the Teachers' College.

The number of studentships to be awarded is determined each year by the Director.

Awards of studentships will be determined by (a)—the record of the applicant as a junior teacher; (b) the standard and number of the subjects passed in the examinations for the School Intermediate or the Junior Public examinations and the Leaving Certificate or the Senior Public examination; and (c), aptitude for teaching as certified by an inspector of schools or the head master of a district high school.

No award of a studentship shall be confirmed unless the studentship holder shall, during the first year of his studentship, obtain from his head master and from an inspector of schools satisfactory reports as to his conduct, progress, and aptitude for teaching.

The courses of training at the Teachers' College qualify successful students for the following certificates:—

- Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate.
- Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate.
- Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate.
- Trained Teacher's Certificate—Domestic Arts.
- Trained Teacher's Certificate—Manual Arts.
- Trained Teacher's Certificate—Commercial Subjects.

B.—SEWING MISTRESSES,

1. Candidates for appointment as sewing mistresses in State elementary schools shall not be less than 17 years of age; they must hold the Merit Certificate or possess some other qualification approved by the Director, and must furnish, with their applications, satisfactory evidence as to good character and suitability for the work, and, prior to appointment, as to sound health.

2. When there is no person recorded for transfer and only one qualified candidate for any vacancy the Director shall, if satisfied that the candidate is competent to perform the duties of the position, inform the Committee of Classifiers thereof, who shall enter the name of the candidate on the *Employment Register* for that vacancy.

3. When there is no person recorded for transfer and there are more candidates than one, a competitive examination shall be held in English, arithmetic, geography, and history and civics for Grade VI. in the "Course of Free Instruction in Elementary Schools," as provided for by the regulations in force for the time being, in all kinds of needlework required from girls in State schools, in teaching such needlework, and in teaching any other subjects prescribed for Grades I., II., and III.

The inspector shall arrange the names of the candidates in their order of merit as determined by the examination, and report to the Director for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, who shall enter in the *Employment Register* the name of the first candidate, provided she prove duly qualified.

4. Sewing mistresses may be recorded by the Director for transfer, in the following order:—

- First—Sewing mistresses in schools that have been closed or whose services have been discontinued through alteration in the average attendance.
- Second—Sewing mistresses recorded for transfer—
 - (i) In the public interest;
 - (ii) On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence;
 - (iii) For some other satisfactory reason.

REGULATION XI.

B. PRIMARY TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE, SECOND CLASS.

1. The Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, will be granted to candidates under the following conditions:—

- (1) Applicants must produce satisfactory evidence that they are at least eighteen years of age, of good moral character, and free from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.
- (2) Applicants must have successfully completed an approved course of training.
- (3) Applicants must have passed the School Intermediate examination of the University of Melbourne or an approved equivalent or higher examination in at least eight subjects including one branch of science.
- (4) Applicants must have passed in the following subjects in the annual examinations conducted by the Education Department:—

Each applicant must produce evidence of completion of a satisfactory course in manual training (including needlework for women) and in nature-study.

2. The Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, may be awarded to applicants who produce satisfactory evidence that they possess approved equivalent qualifications to those set out in clause 1 of this Regulation.

INSTRUCTIONS.

1. A pass recorded on a School Intermediate Certificate in any of the subjects mentioned in clause 1 (3) above will be regarded as a pass in that subject for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, whether the candidate has passed in Class A or Class B of Division IV. of Regulation I. of the University of Melbourne.

2. Candidates who have passed in agricultural science in clause 1 (3) above or in Nature-study as prescribed for junior teachers in Regulation X. will be regarded as having completed the course in nature-study.

3. Approved courses of training are set out in Regulations X. and XII of the Education Department, and in Regulation 3 of the Council of Public Education.

4. Candidates other than teachers in State schools must, prior to the examination in teaching practice, have undergone a course of training approved by the Council of Public Education. Before holding teaching tests, inspectors should ascertain whether the full time prescribed has been spent in the practice and observation of teaching, and whether the other conditions imposed by the Council have been fully complied with.

5. No Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, will be issued until the candidate has satisfactorily performed the duties of a teacher in an approved school for not less than one year.

6. The details of subjects mentioned in clause 1 (3) will be found in the *Handbook of Public Examinations*, issued annually by the University of Melbourne.

7. The details of subjects mentioned in clause 1 (4) are as follows:—

Drawing, Part I. and Part II., as Prescribed for Junior Teachers (Regulation X.).—A pass in this subject for the School Intermediate Certificate of the University of Melbourne will be regarded as a pass in drawing, Part I., excepting (c) Drawing plant forms from nature.

Penmanship.—Half-text and running hand; speed test.

Arithmetic.—As prescribed for the School Intermediate examination of the University of Melbourne.

Music.—Candidates have the option of taking either Part I. (tonic sol-fa notation) or Part II. (staff notation).

Part I.—Tonic Sol-fa Notation.—(i) Simple practical tests in singing from the tonic sol-fa notation in (a) time exercise, including whole, half and quarter pulses, and their combinations in 2, 3, 4, or 6 pulse measure; (b) tune exercise, containing only tones of the major scale and no divided pulses; (c) ear exercise—any three tones of the major scale in stepwise succession.

(ii) A written paper on the elementary theory of the tonic sol-fa notation, including (a) the common scale; (b) the mental effects of tones; (c) the different kinds of measure; (d) the lengths of tones; (e) signs and terms in common use relating to force, speed, and expression.

(iii) To pitch and conduct a school song suitable for a senior class.

NOTE.—The Elementary Practice and Theory Certificates of the Tonic Sol-fa College will be accepted in lieu of the requirements set out in paragraphs (i) and (ii) above respectively.

Part II.—Staff Notation.—(i) Simple practical tests in singing from the staff notation in (a) time exercise, including minims, crotchets, and quavers, and their combinations, in $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, or $\frac{4}{4}$ time; (b) tune exercise, containing only tones of the major scale, and no divided beats; (c) ear exercise—any three tones of the major scale in stepwise succession.

(ii) A written paper on (a) notation; all the details of notation, staff, ledger lines, clefs (treble and bass), notes, rests, dot, tie, bars, sharps, flats, &c. Transposition of a melodic passage from treble to bass clef, and vice versa. (b) Tonality: A thorough knowledge of major and minor scales (harmonic and melodic forms), and their signatures, including intervals and their inversions. (c) Time: Signatures of duple, triple, and quadruple (simple) and duple (compound) times.

(d) Terminology: Signs and terms in common use relating to force, speed, and expression.

(iii) To pitch and conduct a school song suitable for a senior class.

NOTE.—A pass in Grade V. Theory of the Australian Music Examination Board will be accepted in lieu of the requirements set out in paragraph (ii) above.

It is recognized that there is a small proportion of persons who, through some physical defect, are unable to sing. Teachers who come under this category will be exempt from the practical tests on passing Grade IV. Theory of the Australian Music Examination Board.

Candidates who wish to be examined in the practical tests should notify the district inspector at his visit to their school.

Theory of Teaching.—To pass in theory of teaching Part II. as prescribed for junior teachers (Regulation X.). N.B.—Two papers will be set—a general paper and a paper on the principles and methods of teaching English and arithmetic.

Teaching Practice.—

(a) To give satisfactory lessons on any two or more of the subjects prescribed for Grades I. to VI. in the Course of Study for Elementary Schools (Regulation I.), or to prepare notes of, and to give a lesson on, a subject approved of by the inspector; phonics and voice production.

(b) To give a satisfactory class-lesson in model drawing from a single object, explaining and illustrating such terms as "vanishing," "eye-level"; in class singing; and (for girls) in needlework.

(c) Physical training. The examination will test the ability of the teacher to move, by word of command alone, a class or group of scholars from one place to another; to prepare and to teach suitable tables of exercises.

Nature Study.—A study of common animals and plants; field geographical features of the locality and their mode of formation and everyday natural physical phenomena.

The course in manual training referred to in 1 (4) above is the course in woodwork for boys and bookery and needlework for girls; as hitherto taken in the first and second year of the Course of Study for High Schools.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CITY OF GEELONG.

By-LAW No. 88.

A By-law of the City of Geelong made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and also as Rules and Regulations under Section 6 of the *Police Offences Act* 1915 for regulating street traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the 197th section of the *Local Government Act* 1915 and section 6 of the *Police Offences Act* 1915, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Geelong order as follows:—

1. Clause VI, of By-law No. 18 of the town (now city) of Geelong passed by the Council of the Town of Geelong on the 16th day of May, 1861, for the regulation of carters and drivers within the town of Geelong is hereby repealed.

2. By-law No. 33 of the town (now city) of Geelong made and passed by the Council of the Town of Geelong on the 22nd day of July, 1872, for preventing the danger from the driving of vehicles at night without lights in the said town is hereby repealed.

3. Clauses 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 of By-law No. 68 of the town (now city) of Geelong made and passed by the Council of the Town of Geelong on the 1st day of August, 1898, for the regulation and government of drivers of machines for locomotion or carriage other than perambulators and carriages drawn by animals are hereby repealed.

4. Clauses 1, 2, 4, and 5 of Regulations of the town (now city) of Geelong, made and passed by the Council of the Town of Geelong on the 9th day of October, 1905, for preventing obstruction of the carriage-ways, footways, and public places of the said town are hereby repealed.

5. By-law No. 80 of the city of Geelong, passed by the Council of the City of Geelong on the 22nd day of December, 1913, and confirmed by the said Council on the 27th day of January, 1914, for suppressing nuisances and preventing the making of noises in the streets of the said city is hereby repealed.

6. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

"City" means the city of Geelong.

"Council" means the Council of the city of Geelong.

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the city habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.

"Horse" includes mule and donkey.

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

"Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the city other than a footway.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

7. No person shall feed any horse in a street except by means and out of a nose-bag containing the forage and attached to the head of the horse. No person shall remove the blinkers or bridle of any horse in a street. Every driver of a vehicle to which a vicious horse is attached shall keep the horse efficiently muzzled while it is standing upon any stand in the city or standing in any street.

8. No person shall drive upon any street any vehicle or motor car which is loaded or partly loaded with material of any sort or description unless such material is so packed or stowed by being separated by sacks or bags or by some other appropriate means as to prevent such material from producing a noise calculated to cause annoyance to persons in such street or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto. The employer of any person acting in contravention of the foregoing provisions of this section shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

9. No person shall upon any vehicle or motor car so carry in any street any material, article, or thing which, whether forming the whole or part only of the load, projects more than 2 feet outside the line of the wheels or sides of the vehicle or motor car.

10. No person shall upon any vehicle or motor car so carry in any street any material, article, or thing that any part of the material, article, or thing carried touches or comes in contact with the surface of the street.

Regulation of Traffic Generally.

11. The driver of a vehicle or motor car upon any street and the rider of a horse or other animal upon any street shall, except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause—

(1) Keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.

(2) When meeting a vehicle or motor car, horse, tram car, or pedestrian, keep on the left or near side of the street.

(3) When passing by any vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian going in the same direction go on the right or off side of such vehicle, motor car, horse, or pedestrian.

(4) When passing by a tram car going in the same direction, pass the same on the left or near side thereof.

(5) (A) Before stopping in any street, give ample notice of his intention to do by holding up his whip or his hand in a vertical position above his head—or

(B) Before turning round in any street or turning from one street towards the right into another, give ample notice of his intention so to do by

extending his right arm to the right at full length and parallel with his right shoulder—so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle or motor car) upon stopping so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car he shall upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car, or by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, forthwith remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor car to pass, and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic he shall forthwith remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

- (6) Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another, drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left hand side of the street which he is entering.
- (7) Not leave the same unattended except for one hour only, and except it is left in such a position as not to obstruct traffic.

12. The driver of a vehicle or a motor car on any street shall—

- (1) When stopping for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passengers do so as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.
- (2) Not drive the same in competition with or to the annoyance of any other person so as to block or immediately and closely precede or follow or intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle or motor car.

13. No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street, or permit any vehicle or motor to be upon any street unless good and serviceable lamps suitable to such vehicle or motor car are securely fixed, one at each side of such vehicle or motor car, and are lighted and are so placed that the lights therefrom are distinctly visible to persons in front of such vehicle or motor car as white lights, and to persons at the rear of such vehicle or motor car as red lights. Provided that in any case where a red tail light is used it shall not be necessary that the lights fixed as aforesaid shall be visible from the rear. Provided also that in case of a motor cycle one front white light and one red tail light shall be sufficient, and in case of a bicycle one front white light shall be sufficient.

14. No person shall drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street or permit any vehicle or motor car to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle or motor car is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full and uninterrupted view of the street traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle or motor car, and no person, while driving such vehicle or motor car upon any street, shall occupy such a position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.

15. No person shall drive any vehicle or motor car along any street in such manner or in such order that more than two vehicles or two motor cars are travelling side by side in the same direction. The foregoing provisions of this section shall not apply to vehicles or motor cars which form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

16. No person shall ride any horse or other animal or drive or impel any vehicle or motor car upon any footway. Provided, however, that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

17. Any person obstructing any carriage-way, footway, or public place within the city of Geelong by standing or loitering therein or thereon shall, upon being required so to do by any member of the Police Force, discontinue such standing or loitering.

18. All persons walking along the footways shall keep on their respective right hand side of the footway.

Lawful Directions to be Complied with.

19. Every person in the city shall—

- (1) In respect of all or any of the following matters, that is to say—

- (A) Approaching or departing from any footway or street,
- (B) The manner of taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods in any footway or street, or
- (C) The regulation of traffic in any footway or street,

at all times obey and conform to any notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the Mayor, or in his absence, or in the case of sudden emergency under the hand of the Town Clerk or

the officer in charge of the city police, and shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable order or direction of any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council.

- (2) Upon any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council in order to enforce the due observance of any law, by-law, regulation, or lawful notice, holding up his hand, or giving an order or direction, stop for so long or proceed in such manner and direction as such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council deems necessary to allow free space between any persons, processions, vehicles, or motor cars, or for cross traffic or for any other like purpose.
- (3) If any horse or vehicle or motor car in his charge is causing or likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any street, and if he is directed by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council to remove such horse, vehicle, or motor car, remove the same either from the vicinity or to some such adjacent part of that or some neighbouring street, as is indicated by the member of the Police Force or officer of the Council.
- (4) On the request of any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, produce to him for inspection any order, leave, license, or other written authority relating to traffic in the city held by such person.

Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with, or wilfully disobeys any direction or order or request given or made as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

20. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality of the city of Geelong.

21. Any person offending against this By-law shall for each offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds.

CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BY-LAW No. 81.

BY-LAW No. 81, made pursuant and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* for appointing stands in streets, roads and public places within the City of Williamstown for street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs, for prescribing the charges to be paid for the right to use such stands and other matters relating to the use thereof and for prohibiting the use by hawkers and itinerant traders of certain streets, roads and public places during particular hours.

1. Stands for street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs are hereby appointed in the following streets, roads and public places:—

Garden-street.—On the east side of Garden-street commencing at a point 160 feet from the Esplanade, and extending to Osborne-street.

Victoria-street.—On the east side of Victoria-street commencing on the south side of the Esplanade, and extending to the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay.

2. The Council from time to time, may abolish, enlarge or diminish such stands, and appoint any new stand or stands in such position or positions as the Council may determine, and may abolish, enlarge or diminish any such stand so appointed.

3. For the right to use and occupy any stand appointed under this By-law the Council may charge a licence fee of not less than Five shillings nor more than Ten shillings per diem, and the Council may vary such charge by either decreasing or increasing the same according to the stand used.

4. Every licence issued under this By-law shall be in the form prescribed by the Council and under the hand of the Town Clerk.

5. The times within which such stands may be used or occupied shall be such as shopkeepers selling similar foodstuffs may sell under the *Shops and Factories Act 1915*, or regulations made thereunder, but no person shall use or occupy such stands on any Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or other day or portion of a day which may at any time be fixed by the Council by resolution.

6. Every person licensed to use and occupy any such stand shall at all times keep the same and the footway and roadway contiguous thereto clean and free from rubbish, paper, fruit stems, fruit skins and peelings and other litter.

7. No cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle shall be used upon any such stand unless the same shall:—

- (a) be not greater in length than 10 feet, and in width than 4 feet;
- (b) have been previously approved by the City Inspector or other officer appointed by the Council.

8. The Council may at any time revoke any licence to use and occupy any such stand if the holder thereof:—

- (a) Fails to observe any of the requirements of this By-law.
- (b) Is convicted of assault, drunkenness, or disorderliness, using obscene or insulting language, brawling or riotous or insulting behaviour, or such like offence.
- (c) Is not cleanly in habits and appearance.
- (d) Is convicted of any offence under the Health, Game, Fruit, or Weights and Measures Act or any other Act relating to the sale of food.
- (e) Acts in an offensive or discreditable manner in the conduct of his stand.

9. When a licence is revoked under clause 8 of this By-law, notice in writing of such revocation under the hand of the Town Clerk shall be served on the holder thereof, either personally or by posting the same in a registered letter addressed to such person at his address stated in the licence, and the right of such person to occupy such stand shall then cease, and any moneys which may have been paid in advance by such person may be declared forfeited by the Council.

10. If any stand is abolished and any person is then licensed to use such stand, the Council, through the Town Clerk, may allot to such licensee a new stand in place thereof, or shall, if such licensee so demand, repay to such licensee a proportionate part of any charges which may have been paid in advance by such licensee for the use of such stand, and such repayment shall be in full satisfaction of all claims and demands by such licensee.

11. The licensee shall:—

- (a) Not at any time cause, permit or suffer any nuisance to exist upon or contiguous to his stand.
- (b) Not place any box, package, basket, receptacle or other thing except the cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle used by him and the contents thereof upon his stand, nor upon the footway or roadway contiguous to his stand (or near such cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle).
- (c) Not cause, permit, or suffer any horse or other animal to remain attached to such cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle while upon his stand, or while not so attached to remain upon his stand or upon the street.
- (d) Not at any time clean fish, or permit or suffer fish to be cleaned upon his stand.
- (e) Not cry or shout his goods or wares, or permit or suffer his goods or wares to be cried or shouted by any other person at or near, or while going to or from his stand.
- (f) Produce his licence to the City Inspector or to any member of the Police Force when demanded.
- (g) Have his name and address painted legibly, and in a conspicuous place on the right or off side of any cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle used upon his stand in Roman letters of not less than one inch in the shortest diameter of the same, either in white on a black ground, or in black on a white ground, and at all times have such name legible and plainly visible.

(h) Not use any flap, shelf, or other device on such cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle whereby the length or width thereof is increased beyond the measurement by this By-law specified and prescribed.

(i) Not paint or write on such cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle, or display, affix, or carry thereon or suspend therefrom any trade or other advertisements, or any placard, poster, streamer, flag, or sign of any kind whatsoever if the Council objects thereto.

These rules shall be printed on the back of every licence authorizing any person to use any such stand.

12. No person shall use or occupy any stand save and except a person to whom a licence to use such stand has been granted or transferred under the provisions of and pursuant to this By-law.

13. A licence to use and occupy any stand may be transferred to any street hawker or itinerant trader not already licensed to use or occupy any other stand who shall be approved of by the Council.

(a) Every transfer of any such licence shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council, and shall be signed by the person named in such licence or his executors, administrators, or assigns, and by the transferee.

(b) Where a proposed transferee of a licence is approved of by the Council, the licence and transfer, duly signed and executed, shall be lodged with the Town Clerk, who shall note upon the licence the name of the transferee and the particulars of the transfer, and retain the transfer, and, after the payment of the transfer fee herein provided, deliver the licence so noted to the transferee. Such transferee shall thereafter be the only person authorized to use or occupy the stand named in such licence.

(c) A transfer fee of One shilling shall be charged upon every such transfer, and shall be paid when such licence and transfer are lodged with the Town Clerk as aforesaid.

14. All applications for licences under this By-law shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council, and signed by the applicant.

15. No boy under the age of fourteen years shall manage or occupy any stand (or assist or be employed or take part in selling at such stand).

16. No person shall, either personally or by his nominee, or any other person on his behalf, use or occupy more than one stand.

17. Every person desiring to use or occupy any stand, whether an applicant for a licence so to do or a proposed transferee of such licence, must be, and be certified by at least two ratepayers of the City of Williamstown to be of good character, but the Council may in its absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefor, refuse to issue such licence and to approve of such transfer.

18. No person shall hawk or offer for sale foodstuffs in the following streets between the hours of 10 a.m. and 10 p.m. during the months of November, December, January, February, March, and April:—

Esplanade.—Extending from Victoria-street to Morris-street.

Forster-street.—Extending from Railway-crescent to Esplanade.

Garden-street.—Extending from Railway-crescent to the Esplanade (except at the stand appointed aforesaid).
