COMMONWEALTH CENSUS.

THE second Commonwealth Census will be taken as at mid-night between Sunday, 3rd April, and Monday, 4th April next.

The Census returns will furnish much more than the mere data of numerical strength; they will present a picture of national life and development.

The modern Census is taken mainly for administrative, sociological, economic, and hygienic purposes. Without a Census everything of this nature is based upon conjecture and estimates, often ill-founded.

Whether a community is rapidly or slowly increasing, whether its members are aggregating themselves in the towns or distributing themselves over the country, whether existing or proposed expenditures of public moneys are justified by existing or anticipated local populations, whether the production of wealth in any locality represents benefits to few or many; these are problems which can be solved only by means of a Census.

It may be seen also that, apart from its immediate value, the Census furnishes the basis of that derivative knowledge without which the legislation and administration of a community would be carried on in the dark. It is this knowledge which makes possible the review of the affairs of a nation, which enables an estimate to be made of the success or failure of an administration, and discloses whether those affairs indicate success or disaster. In short, without statistics obtained by the aid of the Census, any satisfactory review or forecast of national affairs is an impossibility.

The scope of the Census in most countries is seriously limited by the difficulty of obtaining intelligent and accurate answers to Census inquiries. The intelligence, co-operation, and good-will of the people enumerated on the one hand, and the actual collectors of the returns on the other, are the links in the chain upon which the success of Census largely depends.

THE Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Geelong Harbor Trust Acts, make the alterations and additions in and to the Regulations of the Trust, which Regulations were approved by the Governor in Council on the 15th day of June, 1909, altered and added to by Regulations similarly approved on the 16th day of December, 1912, and further altered and added to by Regulations similarly approved on the 2nd day of April, 1917.

TONNAGE RATES.

Regulation No. 286.—The First Schedule.

The tonnage rates specified and particularized in the First Schedule of the Regulations being the schedule referred to in Regulation 286 are hereby revoked and in lieu thereof there shall be paid to the Commissioners by the master owner or agent of a vessel berthed at or moored either directly or indirectly to a wharf such of the rates specified in Parts A and B of the First Schedule hereunder as may be applicable to the same vessel and the said First Schedule shall be the First Schedule referred to in the said Regulation No. 286 and everything contained in the said First Schedule hereunder shall be deemed to be part of the said Regulation No. 286.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

Part A.—Excluding Vessels included under Part B.

A rate of three-sixteenths of a penny (3-16d.) per ton gross tonnage for every six hours or fraction of six hours.

Vessels plying solely between ports of the Commonwealth one-half of the above-stated rates.

Vessels plying solely within Port Phillip one-fourth of the above stated rates.

The minimum charge in each case to be not less than a charge equal to 2s. 6d. for twenty-four hours calculated from time of berthing and for every fraction of twenty-four hours after the first twenty-four.

Part B.

Vessels used in Inter-State State or port trade only, when laid up and out of commission, and moored directly or indirectly to a wharf, the following rates according to gross tonnage:—

Not exceeding 200 tons per month or part of a month—5s.

Exceeding 200 tons and not exceeding 500 tons per month or part of a month—10s.

Exceeding 500 tons and not exceeding 1,000 tons per month or part of a month—£1.

Exceeding 1,000 tons per month or part of a month—£1 10s.

The Harbor Master may at any time order the removal of any such vessel, or himself remove the same, at the cost of the owner or agent.

WHARFAGE RATES.

Regulation No. 292.—The Second Schedule.

The wharfage rates specified and particularized in the Second Schedule to the Regulations being the schedule referred to in Regulation No. 292 are hereby revoked and in lieu thereof there shall be paid to the Commissioners in respect of all goods unshipped within the port unless exempted as appears by any Act of Parliament or hereby the rates hereunder specified and particularized which shall be the rates referred to in the said Regulation 292 and specified and particularized in the said Second Schedule and everything contained in the schedule hereunder shall be deemed to be part of the said Regulation No. 292.

Coal transhipped from a collier, lighter, coal hulk, or barge into a vessel in course of being loaded or which is under charter to be loaded for an overseas destination, such coal being for use in the course of the intended voyage, shall not be liable to wharfage rates, but before such coal is transhipped notice must be given to the Harbor Master, stating the name or designation of the collier, lighter, coal hulk, or barge, and of the owner or agent thereof; the name of the vessel into which the coal is to be transhipped, and of the owner or agent thereof, and the quantity to be transhipped.

Goods which have been produced or wholly manufactured within the Commonwealth and shipped from a port of the Commonwealth shall be liable to one-half only of the full wharfage rates appointed to be paid as above.

Goods which have not been produced or wholly manufactured within the Commonwealth although shipped from a port of the Commonwealth shall pay the full wharfage rates appointed to be paid in respect of similar goods shipped from a port outside the Commonwealth.

Goods shipped within Port Phillip or at any place within the port of Geelong and unshipped within the port of Geelong shall be liable irrespective of the place of production or manufacture to one-fourth only of the full wharfage rates appointed to be paid as above provided that such goods are not transhipped goods.

Transhipped goods shall be liable to the full wharfage rates appointed to be paid as above subject to modification according to place of production or manufacture.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1921.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Eighteen pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound ten shillings sterling per annum.

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Eighteen pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

For all tenements in the said district in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation by such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within a mile thereof, Six shillings and threepence per annum.

The charge for water supplied from and after the first day of January, 1921, shall be as follows:—

- (a) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.
- (b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be:—

- (a) For domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessable rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) If for other than for domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police stations, churches, Court house, post-office, State school, show grounds, bowling green, shire hall, sale yards, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to carriers and livery stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Seven shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be used as a stable.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1921. Such rates shall be paid by equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and on the first day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly on the first day of July and on the thirty-first day of December, 1921.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for such purposes shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

All the water troughs to be fitted with the approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1921. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable, in advance, on the first day of January, 1921, but the Trust may accept

payment of the same by four quarterly instalments, payable on the first January, first April, first July, and first October of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. That is to say:—

2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Two shillings in the pound on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

5. On every steam engine (not including any steam engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.

6. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement paying the ordinary rate herein imposed shall not exceed one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Five shillings shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, and such service-pipe shall not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch in diameter.

8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering shall be made; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or on amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do.

Cases where Water is not Laid On.

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Fifteen shillings.

10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any above-mentioned tenement, and facing a street or land in which a water main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Five shillings.

11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water Supplied by Measure.

12. The charge for water supplied to market and other gardens and nurseries over one-quarter of an acre in area shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the customer after being approved by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be (20,000) Twenty thousand gallons. The service-pipe for the supply of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter.

13. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the Secretary of the Trust, who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same. The fee for such permit shall be £1 10s. for each one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) or part of one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) of an acre to be irrigated. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains more than one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an acre of any land unless a meter be attached to the service-pipe supplying such land. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. The charge for water supplied to any "bowling club" shall be £10 per annum, such supply to be by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust.

15. The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deem the same necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

16. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

17. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each (100) One hundred gallons.

18. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

19. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

20. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1921; the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement" as used herein shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

Such rate is hereby made payable, in equal moieties, on 1st January and 1st July, 1921, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charges for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

3. For Government buildings, other than the railway buildings, and all church, charitable, and other properties not rated, and on any vacant allotments that are rated, requiring to be supplied with water, such may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council.

4. Water troughs, with ball tap, connected with hotels and erected on the public highway, £1 per annum.

5. Fixed steam-boilers, exceeding two horse-power (excepting for flour mills), £3 per annum; and portable steam-boilers, exceeding two horse-power, £2 10s. per annum.

6. Steam-boilers, used only in the manufacture of sausage meat, at the rate of £1 10s. per annum.

7. Water from the stand-pipe, for every load of 400 gallons or less, 3d. per load.

8. Flour mills requiring water for milling purposes, a charge of 3d. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

9. Victorian railways, requiring water, a charge of 1s. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

10. On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 5s. per annum.

11. The rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance, namely, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1921, and the charges for the supply of water shall also be payable in like manner, or as may be demanded in the case of the service being by meter.

12. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

RE-DEFINITION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE KNITTERS' BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Municipal District of the Borough of Portland of the particular classes to be acted, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act* 1915) within the Municipal District of the Borough of Portland shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act* 1915.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday.
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday.
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

"BAG" LIMIT FOR WILD DUCKS AND TEAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated the twenty-second day of January, 1918, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of January, 1918, re "Bag" Limit for Wild Ducks and Teal, and do (in respect of wild ducks and teal) hereby prescribe fifteen birds as the maximum number of birds whether wild ducks or teal of any kind either alone or together which any person may kill or destroy or have in possession on any one day during the open season for such native game other than the first day of such open season, and for the first day of such open season I prescribe twenty-five as the maximum number of birds, which may be so killed or destroyed or had in possession; and I do also hereby prescribe a sum of not less than £2 nor more than £10 as the penalty for any contravention of this Proclamation.

CITY OF ESSENDON.

REGULATION No. 37.

A Regulation of the City of Essendon (numbered 37) made under Part IX. of By-law No. 12 of the City of Essendon, for regulating bathing in the open.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon make the following Regulation:—

1. Regulations numbered 18 and 36 are hereby repealed.

2. No person shall bathe in the Maribyrnong River outside the area allotted for bathing by the Essendon City Council.

3. No person shall bathe in the Maribyrnong River between the hours of one o'clock p.m. and ten o'clock p.m. on any Sunday.

4. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

5. No person shall bathe unless dressed in a "Canadian" bathing costume, which shall effectually cover the body from the neck to the knees, so as to observe proper decency; such costume to be similar to the sample on view at the Town Hall, Essendon.

6. No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on or run along the beach, strand, or river bank, but shall proceed in a direct line between the dressing place and the river.

7. No person shall play games in, loiter in, misconduct himself in, commit a nuisance in, bring any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter into, or damage, or disfigure, or write upon any of the dressing sheds or enclosures set apart for bathers by the Council.

8. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language or behave in an indecent manner on any part of the beach, strand, or river bank, river, dressing sheds, or enclosures.

9. Except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident, no male over the age of ten years shall trespass in any dressing shed, latrine, or other enclosure reserved for the use of females, and except as aforesaid no female shall trespass in any dressing shed, latrine, or other enclosure reserved for the use of males.

10. This Regulation shall apply to and have operation within the municipal district of the City of Essendon, or within 300 yards of the boundary thereof and not within any borough.
