8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable for watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1921.

THE Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed on Urban District, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

(a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under, (except in the case of land on which there is no buildings), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).

(b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of Five pounds (£5) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

(f) For water supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic purposes, not including garden use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(g) Water supplied by meter and consumed for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate due for the year in respect of the premises supplied, and for all water used in excess the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(h) For water supplied by meter solely for purposes other than domestic, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per half-year. The Trust may, in cases where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.

- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

- (j) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1921, and the first day of July, 1921, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. For every water trough, a charge of Seventeen shillings and sixpence.

5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Seventeen shillings and sixpence for every horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water for each load of two hundred gallons or under, a charge of Two shillings and sixpence, to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of Two shillings and sixpence for every thousand gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be:—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1921.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT, AND FOR THE COLLECTION AND RECEIPT OF TOLLS, ENTRANCE FEES, OR OTHER CHARGES FOR ENTERING IN OR UPON CERTAIN LANDS IN THE PARISH OF HUNTLY.

WE, the Bendigo Creek Trust, the duly appointed Committee of Management of certain lands in the parish of Huntly, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management, and for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181, *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, resident within one mile of the Bendigo Creek reserve, may depasture on the reserve four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such reserve one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every 10 acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. Bulls or entire horses over 9 months old will not be allowed upon the reserve unless by consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

3. All stock depasturing on the reserve must be the absolute property of the person making application to register such stock.

4. The fees to be paid for depasturing stock on the reserve shall be:—

- For each cow or steer over 15 months old—17s. 6d. per annum;
- For each horse over 15 months old—40s. per annum;
- For each calf over 3 months and under 15 months old—10s. per annum;
- For each foal over 3 months and under 15 months old—15s. per annum;

payable quarterly in advance on the first Wednesday in January, April, July, and October, and all stock not paid for within seven days from the commencement of each quarter and found on the reserve will be impounded.

5. Application to register stock must be made within the period above stated at the herdsman's residence and the prescribed fees paid to the person who may from time to time be appointed by the Committee of Management to collect and register same.

6. Owners of stock shall at the time of registering same and paying the fees supply the brands and a written description of every animal they desire to have registered and a copy of same shall be supplied to the herdsman.

7. Cattle will be mustered and checked with the owner's description at such times as may be considered necessary by

the Committee of Management and no notice of such muster will be given to owners, and any stock not registered or not agreeing with the description given will forthwith be impounded.

8. All diseased cattle found on the reserve shall be at once removed by the owner on receiving written notice from the herdsman, and the owner of any stock who neglects or refuses to remove any animal shall be liable for all expenses incurred by the herdsman in removing or destroying such animal.

9. All stock placed on the reserve shall be entirely at the risk of the owner, and the Committee of Management will accept no responsibility therefor.

10. If any animal dies upon the reserve the owner thereof shall within twenty-four hours after notice from the herdsman cause the carcass of such animal to be removed or buried in a spot to be pointed out by the herdsman.

11. If the herdsman shall report any cattle to be a nuisance through straying or damaging fences or otherwise the owners will be held responsible for the payment of any damage incurred, and the Committee of Management may require the owner to remove such cattle and may refuse to register them upon the expiry of the quarter for which they were registered.

12. The herdsman will be required to keep stock depasturing on the reserve from wandering on the roads so far as reasonably may be.

13. Geese, turkeys, pigs, or goats found wandering on the reserve may be destroyed.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
