REGULATIONS—LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

THE Inspector-General of the Insane, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Acts 1915 and 1920 and the Lunacy Act 1915, hereby repeals the Regulations heretofore made under such Acts, and makes the following Regulations, to take effect from the 1st July, 1920.

In these Regulations "Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of the Insane appointed under the Lunacy Act No. 2687.

The Regulations are divided into the following chapters, viz.:—

- Chapter I.—Professional Division, Classification of.
Chapter II.—General Division, Appointment to the.
Chapter III.—General Division, Classification of.

CHAPTER I.—CLASSIFICATION OF THE PROFESSIONAL DIVISION,
LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

Public Service Acts 1915 and 1920 and Lunacy Act 1915.

1. When it is necessary to fill an office in the Professional Division it shall, unless it be absolutely necessary to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service, be filled by the promotion thereto of the officer who, in the opinion of the Inspector-General of the Insane, possesses the particular qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.

2. In the case of appointments, transfers, and promotions the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several officers mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of such office in such Schedule in the "Yearly Rate of Pay."

3. When a minimum rate and a maximum rate of salary are attached to any office, the person holding such office shall be paid such amount, being not less than the minimum nor more than the maximum rate, as shall be from time to time approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Service shall be paid the minimum rate of his office.

4. Any officer transferred or promoted to any office in the Professional Division shall thereupon be the junior officer in such office or grade to which he is promoted or transferred, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto, he shall be paid a salary not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion, provided it be not greater than the maximum rate for such office.

5. The following are the classes of the Professional Division which apply to officers appointed, transferred, or promoted under these Regulations:—

CHAPTER II.—APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION IN THE GENERAL DIVISION.

Public Service Acts 1915 and 1920 and Lunacy Act 1915.
Registration and Examination of Applicants.

1. Every applicant (except for the position of Messenger) must at the date of his application be between the ages of twenty-one and forty-one years, and must forward to the office of the Inspector-General of the Insane an application in his own handwriting, stating his full name and address, the date and place of birth, and the particular appointment or class of appointment which he desires to obtain. He must also send in a certificate of good moral character and industry, as well as a certificate of suitability for employment from either the Inspector-General of the Insane or the Medical Superintendent of one of the Hospitals.

Nurses should be approximately 5 ft. 3 in. in height, and Attendants 5 ft. 8 in., with correspondingly good physical development, and in their form of application they should state what their previous occupation or work has been.

Applicants for the positions of Messenger must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty: Messengers will not be retained after they have reached the age of twenty-one years.

2. Every applicant to be recorded for appointment to any office requiring the exercise of skill usually acquired in some mechanical trade or other occupation must satisfy the Inspector-General, by the production of certificates or otherwise, that he possesses the handicraft and experience necessary for the work of the office.

3. On the production of these certificates applicants may have their names entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment," and will be nominated as vacancies occur. Prior to nomination, however, it will be necessary for applicants to furnish a certificate of good physical health.

4. New appointments, all things being equal, will be made from among those persons whose names are entered in the "Register of Applicants for Employment" according to priority of registration for vacant offices, combined with fitness in each case for the particular office to be filled, and the Educational Test Examination having been passed: but the Inspector-General may nominate any applicant who has special qualifications without regard to his position on the Register.

5. If any person decline to accept an appointment which is offered to him, his name will thereupon be removed from the Register. The name of a candidate may also be removed from the Register if he fail to reply within seven days to any communication from the Inspector-General respecting his nomination to the Lunacy Department addressed to him at his last place of residence known to the Inspector-General.

6. No name of any person shall remain on the Register as that of a person qualified for appointment after he shall have attained the age of forty-one years, or for a longer period than two years from date of registration, except in the case of applicants who, subsequent to registration, joined the Australian Expeditionary Forces.

7. Any person appointed under these Regulations will be on probation for twelve months, and the Attendants will be required prior to their probationary appointment to pass an examination which will prove the sufficiency of their education.

The subjects of examination shall be those specified hereunder:—

- (a) Handwriting: to be tested by copying out at least 200 words from a passage of simple English.
(b) Spelling: to be tested by writing from dictation an extract from a newspaper—not less than 100 words.
(c) Arithmetic: first four rules, simple and money.

Applicants who have passed any examination for candidates for appointment in the Public Service of Victoria, or any like examination, will be exempted from this examination. Persons appointed to positions in the General Division other than those of Attendants will not be required to pass the Educational Examination, i.e., Hospital Trained Nurses, Nurses, Artisans, and Servants.

Applicants for employment as Attendant on the staff of the Lunacy Department who have enlisted in any Expeditionary Force raised in Victoria or (in the case of a person born in Victoria) raised in Australia for naval or military service with His Majesty's Navy or Army during the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged and have served abroad with such Force, may, on their return, have their names recorded in the Register of Applicants and may be appointed on the staff in preference to all other applicants and without being required to pass the Educational Test Examination provided by Regulation No. 7. Military Discharges must be produced in every case.

The appointment of Attendants appointed under this Regulation may be confirmed if the term of probation prescribed by section 72 of the Public Service Act No. 2713 has been satisfactorily served, without the requirements of Regulation No. 8 having reference to passing the First Nursing Examination having been complied with, and the Attendants will be eligible for increments to their salaries as provided by Chapter III. of the Regulations without having passed the Departmental Nursing Examination as required by Regulation No. 11. They will, however, be expected to attend the various courses of lectures and to pass the various Nursing Examinations before being eligible for promotion to the higher grades.

First Departmental Examination.

8. Attendants and Nurses appointed under these Regulations must qualify themselves for retention on the staff of the Lunacy Department and for subsequent increments to their salaries by attending the necessary courses of lectures in Elementary Anatomy and Physiology, First Aid to the Injured, and General Duties.

Failure of an Attendant or Nurse to pass the Departmental Examinations within the times specified will be considered to be evidence of incapacity to discharge the duties of his or her office; and the retention of Attendants and Nurses on the staff will be conditional on their passing these examinations. No Attendant or Nurse will be retained on the staff of the Lunacy Department unless he or she has passed the First Departmental Examination.

9. The First Departmental Examination cannot be undertaken before the Attendant or Nurse has been in the service of the Lunacy Department for a period of one year. In the event of a failure to pass at the first attempt on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of a second opportunity to pass the examination being given.

Second Departmental Examination.

10. The Second Departmental Examination—in general nursing and duties—cannot be undertaken until after the end of the second year of service in the Lunacy Department, but the Attendants and Nurses must present themselves for this Examination before the end of the fourth year of service, dating from the time of appointment on probation. In the event of a failure to pass this second examination at the first attempt, on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent the Inspector-General may approve of other opportunities to pass the examination being given. In the event of a second failure to pass, however, the services of the unsuccessful candidate may be dispensed with.

11. The first increment will only be recommended to the Attendant or Nurse conditional on the First Departmental Examination having been passed, and if he or she is approved of by the Medical Superintendent and the Inspector-General, and on the production of a certificate of good conduct and diligence from the Medical Superintendent of the Hospital for the Insane where he or she is employed. The second increment will not be recommended until the Second Departmental Examination has been passed.

Third Departmental Examination.

12. The Third Departmental Examination in mental disorders, nursing and duties, together with elementary anatomy and physiology of brain and nervous system, can only be undertaken after the third year of service and one year after the passing of the Second Examination. On the passing of this examination a certificate will be given to the successful examinee setting forth that he or she is a Trained Mental Attendant or Nurse. In the event of failure other opportunities will be given to pass on the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent. This Examination will qualify Attendants and Nurses for promotion to the Second Grade. Attendants and Nurses who passed the Second Nursing Examination provided by the previous Regulations will be eligible for promotion to the Second Grade without passing the Third Nursing Examination provided by these Regulations. Before being eligible for promotion to the position of Head Attendant or Hospital Attendant and Chief Nurse or Hospital Nurse they must pass the Third Examination.

13. In determining the claims of officers for promotion, consideration will be given in respect of merit to the following qualifications:—

- (a) Possession of the Departmental Nursing Certificate.
- (b) Ability and knowledge required to fulfil the duties of the superior office, and the possession of the necessary tact and judgment.
- (c) Industrious habits and careful performance of work.
- (d) Good conduct, regular attendance, and prompt and cheerful service on urgent occasions.
- (e) Mental vigour and sound bodily health.
- (f) Performance of valuable services of a special nature.

14. For promotion to the First Grade selection will be made from among those Attendants and Nurses who have passed into the Second Grade, and who have, by reason of their special fitness for the work, as well as by their good conduct and industry, proved themselves capable of taking charge of a large and important ward.

15. Except in a case in which the Inspector-General shall certify that some particular office in the Lunacy Department should be filled by a Hospital Trained Nurse, the person to fill the position of Hospital Attendant or Hospital Nurse may be selected from among the Attendants and Nurses who have demonstrated their capacity for the special work required of them.

16. Officers appointed to any position in the Lunacy Department shall not, until they shall have served for a period of five years on the staff of the Department, be transferred to any other Department or Branch unless such transfer is determined to be in the interests of the Public Service.

Board of Examiners.

17. All Departmental Examinations will be conducted by a Board of Examiners, which will consist of the Inspector-General or a Deputy appointed by the Inspector-General, and one or two Medical Superintendents or Deputy Superintendents as may be considered necessary appointed by the Inspector-General.

18. The subjects for the Departmental Examinations shall be those set forth in the syllabus of lectures adopted from time to time and issued to each Hospital for the Insane, the text-book being as prescribed from time to time.

19. The employees at the Idiot Asylum and the Reception House, so far as is practicable, will be subject to the same rules as the employees in the Hospitals for the Insane.

20. In accordance with the exigencies of the Department, and in order to facilitate the better training of Attendants and Nurses, the Inspector-General may transfer an Attendant or Nurse from one Hospital to another, or from the female side to the male side of the same Hospital where the nursing of male patients is undertaken by female Nurses.

21. All probationers and persons appointed on the staff of the Lunacy Department will be required to sign the agreement hereunder at the time of entry on duty.

LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

I hereby acknowledge to have received and read a copy of rules and instructions appended hereto and marked A and B which are now in force for the guidance of in the Lunacy Department. I fully understand that during my connexion with this Department and in consideration of being employed, I am obliged to obey and carry out these rules and instructions, and all other rules, instructions and orders which may be in force during my employment within the Hospital for the Insane in which I may at any time be employed, and also that I must be careful of the property of the Government of Victoria and must promote so far as I am able the interests and objects of any such Hospital, avoid gossiping about its inmates or affairs, and endeavour generally by my own conduct and demeanour to sustain the reputation of the establishment. I further understand that I am liable to be called upon to perform any duty assigned to me, although not of a nature I usually perform; should I be required to do so by the Medical Superintendent or his representatives; that it is my duty if anything improper is done in my presence or to my knowledge in the Hospital wherein I may be employed, to report it to the Medical Superintendent; and I understand and agree that I am liable to be punished or have my services dispensed with or be dismissed for any transgression of any instruction, order or rule of the Hospital, or of any instruction, order or rule applying to; and further I understand the principles laid down in the Rules and Regulations for promotion by merit, good behaviour and suitability (and, for the Attendants and Nurses, that the possession of the Departmental Nursing certificates), are the only means by which I may expect promotion, and that any attempt to gain promotion by other influences than these will be taken as an acknowledgment on my part of my unfitness for such promotion; further that one month's notice at least is required before an application to be allowed to leave the service of the Lunacy Department will be considered.

CHAPTER III.—CLASSIFICATION OF THE GENERAL DIVISION.

Public Service Acts 1915 and 1920 and Lunacy Act 1915.

1. In the case of appointments, promotions or transfers to any office in the General Division in the Lunacy Department, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule in the column headed "Yearly Rate of Pay."

2. In cases where no minimum salary is entered opposite the name of his office in the said Schedule every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at the maximum rate without addition thereto.

3. In cases where there is a minimum rate and a maximum rate, every officer shall be entitled to receive salary at a rate within the minimum and maximum limits to be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General of the Insane, provided that an officer on his first appointment to the Department shall be paid at not more than the minimum rate of his office.

4. Any officer transferred or promoted to any class or grade shall thereupon be deemed to be junior to any officer already in such class or grade, but notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto he shall be paid an amount not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion. Officers who are transferred to the Attendants' or

Nurses' staff from the Artisans' and Servants' staff, and who are in receipt of salaries at or above the maximum of the Third Grade, may be transferred to the Second Grade on the recommendation of the Inspector-General without regard to their seniority. They will, however, be required to pass the Educational and Departmental Examinations prior to being so transferred.

5. In the case of Attendants and Nurses, promotion from Grade to Grade may be approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Inspector-General, and shall be regulated in accordance with the special regulations for Attendants and Nurses.

6. Increments may be granted to officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the following Schedule, and at the rates set forth in the Schedule.

7. Where an officer previously to his transfer from one office to another has been paid the same salary as in his new office, time served in such former office may be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment.

8. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department and of the Inspector-General that

such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service.

9. If any officer is in receipt of pay greater than the maximum rate, he shall continue to receive such pay until he can be employed upon work equivalent to his salary.

10. Failure on the part of Attendants and Nurses to pass the Nursing Examinations will be taken as inefficient service, and, should the examinations not be passed, increments will not be granted.

11. If any officer be absent from duty on account of illness, no deduction shall be made from the salary of such officer on account of allowances if the officer is under medical treatment at his own home or at a general hospital. In the case of the single men and the members of the female staff, it shall be at the discretion of the Medical Superintendent as to whether the officers shall remain at the Hospital for the Insane for treatment or be allowed to leave the institution. When an officer on sick leave on full pay is drawing his allowances the full charge for these allowances as provided by these Regulations will be made. When the officer is on half pay only, half the charge will be made. No charge is to be made should an officer be allowed leave without pay.

HORSHAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Horsham Public Cemetery hereby rescind the Rules and Regulations previously published in the *Government Gazette*, and substitute the following:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars supplied in form Schedule A, an order obtained, and a certificate from the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of Peace, has been delivered to the secretary or sexton.

2. Before any interment shall be permitted all charges must be paid when the order for the sexton will be given authorizing the grave to be dug and the interment to take place.

3. The order for interment must be given to the sexton before 5 p.m. on the day previous to such interment, but when the interment is desired before noon additional reasonable notice must be given.

4. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time of arrival at the cemetery and such time shall be punctually observed.

5. The usual hours of interment shall be from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on week days and from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sundays, but burials may be permitted outside of these hours on payment of the prescribed fees.

6. The charge for any burial may be remitted on evidence being produced before the Trustees that the relatives or friends of the deceased person are unable to pay such charge.

7. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required or any alteration made thereto, it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees or some person appointed by them. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person the consent in writing of such person must accompany the application.

8. Every coffin placed in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and made airtight.

9. No adult shall be buried within 4 feet nor child under the age of twelve years within 3 feet of the ordinary surface level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

10. A certificate of ground for a burial place within the Cemetery may be granted by the secretary in the form and to the effect set out in Schedule B on payment of fees prescribed.

11. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace, and of the licence for disinterment from the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

12. Before any person commences the erection of any tablet, headstone, monument, tomb, vault, fence, railing, or enclosure the permission of the Trustees must be obtained, also payment made of fees set out in the scale of charges. Persons desiring to make such erections are required to submit designs, drawings, or descriptions, proposed location, also a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph, and such information as the Trustees may require. The Trustees may withhold permission and prevent the proposed erection of anything which may appear to them as inappropriate, unbecoming, or not sufficiently durable.

13. All monuments, vaults, gravestones, graves, fencing, and enclosures around graves shall be kept in proper repair and condition by and at the expense of the owners.

14. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery, and the Trustees may refuse to allow any vehicle conveying such material to enter the Cemetery during wet or unfavorable weather. Stones, refuse, and rubbish or other materials remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the persons employed on the work, and in the event of any such refuse or other material not being removed within seven days after completion of the work the Trustees may have same removed at the expense of the persons or firm carrying out such work.

15. A plan of the Cemetery and register will be kept and may be inspected at the office of the secretary.

16. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or causing to be done any damage to any monument, tombstone or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the Cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and on being convicted thereof is liable to the penalties provided by the Cemeteries Act.

17. No dogs will be allowed in the Cemetery.

18. The Cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

19. These Rules and Regulations may be altered or amended and additions made thereto from time to time by the Trustees with the consent of the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the Cemeteries Act.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-law No. 28.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement above Fourteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound, according to such value.
2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds and not more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two pounds ten shillings shall be paid.
3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-six pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Thirteen pounds municipal value or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.
6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Four shillings per thousand gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

That the above-named rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the first day of January, 1921, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1921.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

OMEOWATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1921 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

- No. 1. On every house, or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

No. 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Ten shillings.

No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds, a rate of Ten per centum shall be charged on the amount of the valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.

No. 4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be made.

No. 5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless, at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1921.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

BY-LAW NO. 24, MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

Part I.

1. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1915* within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council, according to the valuation for the time being of such land and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes other than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

Part II.—The Beaufort Water Supply.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement.

(b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water-pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Goldfields Reservoir, situate to the north and south respectively of the township of Beaufort, and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

Part III.—The Joint Water Supply.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council and which is supplied by the Council with water from the joint water supply, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

5. "The joint water supply" means the race running from the springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

Part IV.—The Waterloo Supply.

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.

7. "The Waterloo supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about 5 miles in a northerly direction from the township of Beaufort.

Part V.

8. Such rate as aforesaid is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of October, 1920, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1921, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Acts.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

DEVIATION OF ROAD IN THE PARISH OF BENDOCK.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2686) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees under the *Land Act 1915*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Bendock: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 477 of the Act aforesaid, doth hereby declare the new road in the parish of Bendock defined in the following description to be a public highway in lieu of an existing road in the town named, of which road technical description is also hereunder given (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the 12th day of July, 1920, under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1890*, and published in the *Government Gazette*, of 20th July, 1910, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra was authorized to construct a tramway within its municipal district: And whereas the Council of the said Shire of Upper Yarra has now made application under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1915* to have the said Order amended so as to provide for increased rate to be charged for the carriage of timber upon the said tramway in lieu of the rate fixed by the Order in Council dated the 12th day of July, 1910: And the said Council having duly complied with the requirements of the said Act and the regulations made thereunder with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objections having been lodged thereto within the time provided by the said rules, and the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the Order in Council of the 12th day of July, 1910.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Upper Yarra shall be and is hereby authorized to charge the rate of Sixpence per ton per mile or any portion thereof for the carriage of timber upon the said tramway, in lieu of rate previously fixed by Order in Council dated 12th day of July, 1910.

And the Honorable Frank Clarke, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BOROUGH OF MENTONE AND MORDIALLOC.

Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management of the portion of the Moorabbin Beach Park, in the Borough of Mentone and Mordialloc, known as "Mentone and Mordialloc Beach Park."

THE Council of the Borough of Mentone and Mordialloc, the duly appointed Committee of Management of that portion of the Moorabbin Beach Park, in the borough of Mentone and Mordialloc, known as the "Mentone and Mordialloc Beach Park" (hereinafter called the Park), having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said portion of the Moorabbin Beach Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Lands and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding three in each year, as may be from time to time determined by the Committee, on which a fee may be charged for admittance to the Park, or any days a fee may be charged for admittance to the Park, or any days a fee may be charged for admittance to the Park, or any days a fee may be charged for admittance to the Park, provided that such fee shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence for each person admitted.
2. No person shall enter or leave the Park except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Park.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. The Committee of Management may provide and build such fireplaces on the Park as the Committee think necessary, and any person lighting or using fires, or causing, or permitting fires to be used on the Park, save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of the Committee of Management, shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.
5. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or other vegetation in the Park.
6. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences in or around the Park, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disclose, injure, destroy, or remove the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or any survey pegs or permanent marks therein.

7. No person shall put, or cause to be put, on to any part of the Park, any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, save as hereinafter set out in clauses 8 and 25, always provided that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. Certain portions of the Park shall be set apart by the Committee of Management for the accommodation of vehicles and horses in the custody and care of those using the same, provided that the owner or user for the time being shall tie up such horse in such a way as not to cause or permit any damage to fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, and the owner or user for the time being of any horse found wandering without restraint on any portions of the Park, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

9. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Park, or in any public or private bathing-box, boat-shed, or other building upon the Park.

10. No person shall use the closets or urinals, or any portion of such closets or urinals, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portions of such closets and urinals as are specially constructed for such purposes.

11. A sum not exceeding One penny may be charged and taken by the Committee of Management, or its officers, from every person for the use of the closets in connexion with the latrines provided in the Park.

12. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first had and obtained, erect any structure or offer for sale any article in the Park.

13. No assemblies for fêtes, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meeting of a like character, shall take place in any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. Certain portions of the Park may be set apart by the Committee of Management for the use of person desirous of swimming or bathing horses in Port Phillip Bay under such conditions as the Committee may from time to time determine, and then only before 10 a.m. on Sundays, gazetted public holidays, and days between 24th December and 31st January, both inclusive, and before 11 a.m. on all other days.

16. No person except workmen employed by the Committee of Management in the Park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or marram grass.

17. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Park, except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

18. No person shall camp on any portion of the Park.

19. No person shall throw any stone or other hard substance within the Park, nor play cricket, or any other game with a hard ball, except in the parts of the Reserve set apart as cricket grounds.

20. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Park, or leave therein on the beach anything which would injure bathers.

21. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-guns in any part of the Park.

22. No person shall erect any bathing-box or boat-shed in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such fees, terms, and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

23. No person shall bathe from the Park unless dressed in Canadian costume, with kilt, which shall effectively cover the body from neck to knee, and no person shall enter or leave the Park in bathing costume only.

24. No person shall use, or cause to be used, any bathing-box or boat-shed for residential purposes.

25. The Committee of Management may from time to time, notwithstanding any regulation herein to the contrary, issue permits, in writing, to such persons, and for such periods of time as they may deem fit, for the purpose of enabling such persons to graze cattle, horses, or sheep on such portions of the Park, and for such periods of time, and under such conditions, and the payment of such fees as the Committee may determine: such conditions, time, and fees to be set out in such permits, and the number of horses, cattle, or sheep permitted to be grazed given in such permits, and the holder of such permits shall not be liable to the penalties incurred under these regulations as regards wandering cattle, so far as the locality fixed in his permit is concerned, during the currency of such permit and the payment of the fees in connexion therewith.

26. Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

27. For the purposes of these regulations, the word "Park" shall mean that portion of the Moorabbin Beach Park as is indicated by pink tint on the plan marked A/26.11.20 attached to Lands file C.71900 (Rs. 1819), which said portion shall hereafter be known as the Mentone and Mordialloc Beach Park.

THE Council of the Shire of Kyneton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve in the township of Kyneton (Barkly Square) for Cricket Ground, Infantry Drill, and Recreation purposes, having framed the following Regulation for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulation to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

REGULATION.

The maximum scale of charges for admission to the third division and grandstand on such days (not exceeding twenty-six in any one year), as the Committee of Management may determine, shall be as follows:—

- For admission of each person to the third division during any cricket or football match or sports, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
- For admission of each person to the grandstand, such a sum as the Committee of Management shall determine, not exceeding Five shillings. Provided always that the Committee of Management shall be at liberty to exempt any person, wholly or partially, from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
