## REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

**R**EGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 25th November, 1912, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

*Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.*

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as \_\_\_\_\_, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of \_\_\_\_\_, viz., from \_\_\_\_\_, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of \_\_\_\_\_ years (\_\_\_\_\_ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practice of Surveying.*

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

*Engineering Surveys.*

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

*Use of Instruments.*

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Göikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

## REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

## LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. ## TOLLS, FARES, AND CHARGES.

**BY-LAW No. 4** made by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board pursuant to and under the authority conferred by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918*, prescribing tolls, fares, and charges.

By-law No. 1 made by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board on the 13th day of February, 1920, and By-law No. 2 made by the Board on the 23rd day of July, 1920, are hereby rescinded from the date of this By-law coming into operation.

The tolls, fares, and charges provided in this By-law are prescribed as the tolls, fares, and charges which may be demanded and taken by the Board from the persons hereinafter

specified, in lieu of any tolls, fares, and charges which before this By-law coming into operation might be demanded and taken by the Board.

The word "holidays" in this By-law means New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; or the day on which by Act of Parliament or by Proclamation any of the said holidays is to be observed.

Any special fare hereinafter prescribed as payable upon a holiday shall be payable on the day on which such holiday is observed pursuant to such Act or Proclamation as aforesaid.

The word "adult" in this By-law includes every person above the age of twelve years.

Save as herein otherwise provided, on, from, and after the seventh day of March, 1921, the fares for each adult passenger for each single journey over any of the routes or portions of routes as specified in the following divisions shall be as herein provided:—

The Board shall run at least two workmen's cars each morning upon both "up" and "down" trips (Sundays, holidays, and Cup Day excepted) between the hours of 6 and 7.30 o'clock upon the following cable tramway routes.—Richmond, Fitzroy, Victoria-street, Clifton Hill, Nicholson-street, Brunswick, Carlton, North Carlton, Brighton-road, Prahran, North Melbourne, West Melbourne, South Melbourne, Port Melbourne, and Northcote. The fare on such cars shall be—For each passenger, whether adult or child over three years of age, for each single journey—Three half-pence.

Upon payment of an additional Three half-pence, the passenger shall be entitled to a workmen's return ticket, which shall be available for the return journey upon such route by any car upon the day of issue only.

## SCHOLARS' CONCESSION FARES.

The fares for children under the age of seventeen years attending school shall be the following concession fares by tickets:—

- Upon the cable tramways of the Board other than that portion formerly known as the "Northcote Municipal Tramways" for a through journey at the rate of, per hundred—Seven shillings and sixpence.
  - Upon that portion of the cable tramways of the Board formerly known as the "Northcote Municipal Tramways," for a through journey, at the rate of, per hundred—Five shillings.
  - Upon all electric tramways of the Board, for every one or two sections, per hundred—Five shillings.
- And for additional sections at the rate of, per hundred—Two shillings and sixpence.

## ALL-NIGHT CARS—ELECTRIC TRAMWAYS.

The fares for each passenger (adult or child) for each journey by electric tramway cars which provide an all-night service, and which start from depôts or termini between midnight and 5.30 a.m., inclusive, on week days (holidays included), shall be as follows:—

Each additional section .. ..	Twopence.

## "SPECIAL CARS"—ELECTRIC TRAMWAYS.

The charges to be made for special cars upon any electric tramway shall be as follows:—

- For the hire of a special car with a seating capacity not exceeding 36 persons—2s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.
- For the hire of a special car with a seating capacity exceeding 36 persons—3s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 5s. per car mile after midnight.

The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depôt until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m.,



and the sum of 10s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is used. Provided further that the Board shall have full and complete discretion to grant or refuse any application for a special car.

#### FARES FOR EMPLOYEES OF POSTMASTER-GENERAL AND CHARGES FOR MAIL MATTER, ETC.

The fare to be demanded and taken from the Postmaster-General of the Commonwealth of Australia for the conveyance of letter-carriers and telegraph messengers in uniform travelling upon cable tramway cars for each journey which can be performed without changing cars shall be—Three half-pence, by special ticket only.

Parcels, bags, and other mail matter, when accompanied by an employee of the Postmaster-General in uniform, shall be carried free up to 28 lbs. weight, and for an additional 28 lbs., or part thereof, a further Three half-pence, by special ticket, shall be paid.

#### CHARGES FOR EXCESS LUGGAGE.

The charge to be demanded and taken from each passenger travelling upon any tramway of the Board who shall take with him permitted personal luggage, parcels, or packages exceeding in the aggregate 28 lbs., but not exceeding 56 lbs. in weight, or 36 x 18 x 12 inches in dimension, shall be an additional full fare.

#### MINIMUM CHARGE UPON CERTAIN CARS.

Nothing hereinbefore contained shall prevent or limit the right of the Board to run cars at sectional fares only or through fares only upon any or all of the said routes, provided that every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

#### MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN TRAMWAYS BOARD.

##### BY-LAW No. 3.

BY-LAW No. 3 made by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board pursuant to and under authority conferred by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918* and the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1920*—

##### Unclaimed Goods or Lost Luggage.

1. Every person (other than an employee of the Board) finding goods or luggage which have been left (by the owner or person in charge thereof) upon any tramcar, vehicle, or premises the property of the Board (hereinafter referred to as "lost property"), shall immediately hand same to the Conductor or person apparently in charge of such tramcar, vehicle, or premises, as the case may be.

2. Every driver or conductor of any tramcar or vehicle belonging to the Board shall, at the conclusion of each journey, examine such tramcar or vehicle to see whether any lost property has been left therein, and shall, as soon as possible after the discovery of such property, hand same to the officer in charge of the depot to which he is attached.

3. Every employee of the Board or person finding goods or articles which have been left by the owner thereof in any shelter house or waiting room or other premises under the control of the Board, shall immediately forward same to the head office of the Board, 673 Bourke-street, Melbourne, or to one of the Board's car depôts.

4. Any employee of the Board who finds or receives any lost property as aforesaid shall, within twenty-four hours after the finding or receipt thereof, forward same to the lost property office of that part of the tramway system to which he is attached.

5. A record of all lost property shall be forthwith entered in a book kept for that purpose, showing the description of such property, the name of the conductor, driver, or person finding the same, and the day and place upon which it was

found. Such property shall be restored to the person who shall prove ownership thereof to the satisfaction of the Board upon payment by him of a charge of threepence.

6. All unclaimed property may, at the expiration of a period of six months, be disposed of by the Board by sale by public auction.

7. Subject to any claims to be hereafter made by the owner of property sold, any money or the proceeds of such sale, after deducting the cost of advertising and the expenses of such sale, shall be paid by the Board to such fund for the benefit of employees as the said Board may decide.

8. The Board shall not be responsible for the safe custody, disposal, or protection of any property referred to in this By-law, nor be liable for any loss, damage, or destruction of same.

9. Any person wilfully offending against this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.  
REGULATIONS PROVIDING FOR A LONDON REGISTER AND AS TO  
INSCRIPTION OF STOCK.

Made by the Board the 22nd day of February, 1921.

WHEREAS under Part V. (Borrowing Powers) of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1915* the Board is authorized to make regulations for the issue of inscribed stock and for the conversion of any debentures already issued or which may be issued under its authority into inscribed stock and for the issue of debentures for inscribed stock.

And whereas in connexion with the Board's loans already raised or to be raised and the conversion thereof in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland the Board deems it desirable that a branch register should be established in London for the issue and registration of inscribed stock payable in London and for other purposes as hereinafter appearing.

Now the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf doth hereby make and prescribe the following Regulations that is to say:—

1. In these Regulations unless there be something in the subject-matter or context inconsistent therewith the following words or terms shall have the meanings set against them respectively that is to say:—

"The Bank"—London County Westminster and Parr's Bank Limited, London, England.

"The Board"—Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

"Register"—Shall include any books kept by the Registrar for the purpose of the Board's stock in which the names and addresses of the several persons for the time being entitled to such stock and the amount to which they are entitled and the transfers thereof are entered.

"The Registrar"—The officer or person appointed by the Bank or other the attorney under power of the Board to that office.

"Stock"—Inscribed stock created issued or registered by the Board or the Bank or other the attorney on its behalf under the provisions of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts.

"Stockholder"—The person or persons whose name or names is or are inscribed in the stock ledger in respect of any stock.

"Stock ledger"—The ledger or ledgers or other books kept on behalf of the Board at the London register in which the stock held is recorded or inscribed.

Words importing the singular shall include the plural and *vice versa*.

Words importing the masculine shall include the feminine.

2. That a branch register shall be established in London in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland for the inscription and transfer in books to be kept there for the purpose of the Board's stock.

3. London County Westminster and Parr's Bank Limited of London England is hereby appointed to create and establish the said London register and to do all things necessary to be done for that purpose including the power to appoint from time to time one of its officers as a registrar and remove such person so appointed and until this Regulation is repealed or revoked to operate carry on and maintain such London register.

4. Except with the approval of the registrar to the contrary stock shall be inscribed or remain inscribed only in sums of £100 or in sums which are multiples of £50 where the sum inscribed is in excess of £100.

5. All present and future holders in the United Kingdom of the Board's debentures payable in London shall be at liberty to convert the same and to exchange and obtain in lieu thereof inscribed stock.

6. The request to inscribe stock in lieu of allotment letters, scrip, or debentures must be made on forms supplied by the Bank, and must be signed by all the intended stockholders.

7. Any amount of stock may be inscribed in one or more names not exceeding four and the full name, address and description of each such person must be given. Notices however need only be sent to the first of such names and addresses in which stock is so inscribed and the receipt of such first-named stockholder or of his attorney or agent in the case of stock inscribed in more than one name for any interest or for any document relating to such stock shall be a sufficient discharge to the Board in respect thereof but with regard to the repayment of principal the discharge must be given by all stockholders in a joint account.

8. Stock may be inscribed in the name of a corporation but the Bank must first be furnished with a copy of the certificate of incorporation or special Act of Parliament or letters patent under which such corporation is established together with a certified specimen of the seal of the corporation and a duly authenticated copy of any regulations governing the mode of affixing the seal.

9. Stock may be inscribed in the name of the Paymaster-General for and on behalf of the Supreme Court of Judicature in accordance with 35 and 36 Victoria, Cap. 44 and 46 and 47 Victoria, Cap. 29 on receipt of the necessary order of Court but stock will not otherwise be inscribed in official names except where specially authorized by Act of Parliament.

10. Stock may be inscribed in the sole name of a married woman or in her name jointly with any other person without the consent of her husband but she should be described as "wife of" and in all cases where a married woman is in a joint account with her husband both must sign all necessary documents in connexion with the stock.

11. Stock may be inscribed in the name of a minor jointly with one or more persons of mature age but when so inscribed it cannot be transferred until the maturity or decease of the minor but in the event of stock so standing or in the case of stock standing in the name of a person of unsound mind in a joint account with others not under legal disability a power of attorney for receipt of interest or dividends may be given by such other stockholders in the account without the concurrence of the minor or person of unsound mind upon sufficient proof being lodged with the Bank of their legal disability.

12. In the event of stock being inscribed incorrectly owing to mistakes in the requests for inscription or transfer the account may be amended by a letter or declaration and/or such other proofs as the Registrar may require stating how the error arose and in the event of alteration of any name or names a request from the transferrer in the original transfer will be required.

13. Save as herein or by statute otherwise provided no entry of any trust shall be made in the stock ledger and the Board or the Bank on its behalf shall be entitled to treat the person or persons whose name or names is or are inscribed in the stock ledger in respect of any stock as the absolute owner or owners thereof and accordingly shall not except as ordered by a Court of competent jurisdiction or as by Statute required be bound to recognise any equitable or other claim to or interest in such stock on the part of any other person.

14. (a) The executors or administrators of a deceased stockholder (not being one of several joint holders) shall be the only persons recognised by the Board or the Bank on its behalf as having any title to the stock inscribed in the name of such deceased stockholder and

(b) In the case of the death of any one or more of the joint holders of any stock the survivor shall be the only person recognised by the Board as having any title to or interest in such stock.

(i) The death may be proved by the production of probate of will, letters of administration or certificate of death, and, if required by the Registrar, by a declaration by some disinterested person as to the identity of deceased as the owner.

(ii) On completion of the proof of death in a joint account, the stock and interest or dividends thereon will be registered in the name of the survivor or survivors.

(iii) On the decease of the last survivor in a joint account, the death must be proved as in the case of an owner on sole account and steps taken to inscribe the stock in the name of the executor or administrator of the last survivor.

15. If any stock has become transmitted in consequence of the death or bankruptcy or insolvency of any stockholder or by any lawful means other than by a transfer under these Regulations such transmission shall be authenticated by a declaration in writing as hereinafter mentioned and in such other manner (if any) as the Registrar shall require and every such declaration shall state the manner in which and the name of the said party to whom such stock shall have been so transmitted and shall be made and signed by some credible person and also by such party before a justice of the peace magistrate or some person authorized to take or administer oaths declarations or affirmations or before such other person as the Registrar shall decide and shall be delivered to the Registrar and shall be numbered by him in such manner as he shall determine. Every application for transmission shall be made on a form to be supplied by the Bank.

16. If such transmission shall have taken place by virtue of any testamentary instrument or by intestacy the probate of the will or the letters of administration or an office copy thereof shall, together with such declaration, be produced to

the Registrar and if such transmission shall have taken place by virtue of any bankruptcy or insolvency the adjudication or order of sequestration or an office copy thereof respectively shall together with such declaration be produced to the Registrar.

17. The person becoming entitled on transmission in manner aforesaid may either himself be registered as the holder of the stock so transmitted or instead of being himself registered may make such transfer of the stock as the stockholder from whom the same was transmitted could have made and any such transfer shall be accompanied by such evidence in proof of the title of the transferee as the Registrar may reasonably require and such person as aforesaid shall be entitled to receive the interest on such stock and to all other advantages he would be entitled to if he were the registered holder of the stock.

18. In the event of the marriage of a female stockholder such stockholder may apply in writing on a form to be supplied by the Bank to have such stock inscribed in her married name or jointly with any other name and shall lodge therewith the certificate of inscription of such stock and a copy of the certificate of registration of her marriage under the hand of the proper Government officer and such other proofs as the Registrar may reasonably require and the Registrar shall thereupon have such stock inscribed as required and shall issue a new certificate of inscription in that name and shall cancel and retain the old certificate.

19. Transfers of stock can only be effected by the stockholders personally or by their attorneys in the transfer-books at the London register during the ordinary hours of business. Transfers must be signed by all the persons out of whose names the stock is transferred or by their registered attorney or attorneys and the transferees must in all cases be identified by a stock broker or other person known to and approved by the Bank. Applications for transfers of stock must be made on forms to be obtained at the Bank.

20. The Registrar will cause the stock ledger and transfer books to be closed for a period of fourteen days next before any of the days on which interest on the stock is payable and shall cause the amount of the stock respectively standing to the credit of the several holders thereof to be ascertained and the balances to be struck and carried forward in the proper ledger and the persons who on the day such books are so closed are inscribed as holders of stock shall be entitled to receive the interest next payable thereon.

21. Powers of attorney must be on special forms prepared by the Bank and must be signed by all the stockholders in the account and the execution duly attested in accordance with the instructions printed on the power of attorney. Those for sale or transfer must be for specified amounts of stock and if not acted upon within five years of the date thereof must be confirmed in writing by the stockholders. Powers of attorney become void by the stockholders acting personally and the registration of a subsequent power of attorney will cancel any previous power of attorney empowering sale or transfer that may have been granted although not fully acted upon.

22. Powers of attorney for sale or transfer can be made to include the receipt of interest or dividends if required.

23. When any dealings or transactions are taking place under a power of attorney there shall be supplied if so requested by the Registrar a declaration duly made and declared that such power of attorney has not been altered or revoked and/or if thought necessary that the donor of the power is alive.

24. Requests for powers of attorney must be made on forms supplied by the Bank. The cost of the power is only the amount of the stamp duty thereon.

25. General powers of attorney for sale and transfer of stocks will be granted to bankers and stock dealers in such form and on such conditions as may from time to time be specially arranged.

26. Interest or dividends will be paid to the stockholder or to the stockholder whose name is first inscribed on a joint account on personal application to and at the office of London register, or dividend warrants will be transmitted by post at the stockholder's risk either to the stockholder or to the bankers or others at an address in the United Kingdom on receipt by the said bankers of the requisite authority on a form issued by the bankers signed by the stockholder or by all the stockholders in a joint account.

27. Interest cheques or dividend warrants transmitted by post will be crossed "Not negotiable" and will only be payable through a banker but the Board's bankers will not undertake to cross them to any particular banker and the stockholders must themselves instruct bankers and others to whom cheques or warrants are sent as to their disposal.

28. The stocks registered at the Bank are inscribed in accordance with the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia.

29. Subject to the above Regulations the Bank is authorized to carry out the Board's Regulations with reference to inscribed stock dated the 24th day of February 1920 and which

were approved by the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria on the 30th day of March 1920 and every amendment thereof so far as any such last-mentioned Regulations can reasonably be made applicable to a branch register and be used in aid of these Regulations and to exercise the powers conferred by the said Regulations of the 24th day of February 1920 and any amendment thereof and to comply with and do and perform all things in connexion therewith and particularly to carry out the powers and duties of the Board, the Chairman, the Registrar and of any officer of the Board in connexion with the said Regulations of the 24th day of February 1920 and the operation thereof in regard to the London register.

30. The Board may from time to time grant a power of attorney authorizing the Bank or any other corporation or person to carry out these Regulations and to do all things necessary for that purpose and to effectively achieve the objects sought to be attained thereby with power also to the Bank or such other corporation or person to appoint a sub-delegate or substitute to exercise and do all or any of the powers conferred or things to be done thereby.

31. The Board may from time to time fix the remuneration to be paid to the Bank and/or the attorney or attorneys or any of them.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed the 23rd day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, in the presence of—

**MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST.****RATING BY-LAW No. 8.**

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Maffra Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied within the Urban District of the Trust:—

2. For every house or tenement of an annual value of £14 or over, at the rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of a less annual value than £14, a minimum charge of £1 5s.

4. For every vacant allotment of land of an annual value of £5 or under, a charge of 5s. For each additional allotment of land rated together with the first allotment, One shilling. Where the annual value of an allotment is over £5, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of the annual value thereof.

5. For every water trough supplied with water, £1. On vacant lands the rate of payment shall be considered as part payment of this charge of £1. In cases where a large quantity of water is consumed by the use of a trough, as in a paddock where a number of stock are kept, the Trust in its discretion may insist on a meter being installed.

6. For water supplied by measure, Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons; provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate, except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements. In cases where the occupier quits without paying for the excess water, the owner will be held liable for same.

7. For using a hose for stable watering during the year, Twenty shillings. This payment will entitle the user to an additional 10,000 gallons of water.

8. For water supplied to new buildings being erected, £1 per centum on the contract price of all brick, stone, cement,

or other work where water is used. In every case where a new building is erected a minimum charge of Ten shillings shall be paid by the owner.

9. Water supplied to manufactories, railways, livery-stables, or paddocks, or for other than domestic purposes, may be charged at a special rate, or by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust.

10. The Trust may, by notice in writing, require any owner or occupier using water through a hose or for other than domestic purposes to provide a meter within two weeks from the date of such notice; the expense of providing the meter is to be borne by such owner or occupier.

11. No person shall use water by means of a hose for watering gardens, washing cars or buggies, cleaning windows, or for any other purpose, nor use water for irrigating or for other than domestic purposes unless such water is registered by some approved meter.

12. Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner, or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises the owner or occupier must pay the sum of One pound to be re-connected with the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of 8 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m. For the purpose of conserving water during dry weather, or for extensions or repairs, the Trust in its discretion may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

13. For water supplied through any stand-pipe or hydrant, a charge of One shilling for each 200 gallons.

14. For all lands or tenements in the said district situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and in which tenements are not supplied with water from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe or hydrant for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are more than a quarter of a mile and less than half a mile from such stand-pipe or hydrant, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

15. For every plumber's licence, £1 per year, ending the 31st December.

16. The foregoing rates and charges are payable in two moieties, in advance, on the 1st day of February, 1921, and 1st day of August, 1921. Interest at the rate of Six pounds per centum per annum will be charged on amounts six months overdue. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum, in advance, on the 1st day of February, 1921. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint shall be authorized to collect the said rates and charges.

Every person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Ten shillings, and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Ten shillings for every day such breach is committed or continued.
