## STONECUTTERS BOARD.

.Note.—This Determination on the 14th March, 1921, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN THE COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS.

In the matter of the Factories and Shops Acts

and

In the matter of an Appeal by a majority of the representatives of the employers on the Stonecutters Board against the Determination of the said Board, dated the 14th December, 1920.

MONDAY, the 14th day of March, 1921.

(Before His Honour Mr. Justice Mann, Mr. George Henry Henderson, and Mr. John Mount.)

The above-mentioned Appeal coming on for hearing by this Court on the 7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th March, 1921; and this day. Ufon-reading the Notice of Appeal and Ufon Hearing what was alleged by Mr. Stanley Lewis of Counsel, and various employers in support of the Appeal and by Mr. Frederick John Steabben and various employees on behalf of the employees.

This Court doth order and determine:

(1) That on the 14th day of March, 1921, the Determination of the Stonecutters Board dated the 14th December, 1920, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination as to the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of cutting, carving, polishing, and letter cutting in marble and stone.

(6) RATES WHERE TOOLS NOT SUARPENED BY EMPLOYER.—That 2d. per hour in addition to above rates shall be paid in all cases mentioned above unless all tools are sharpened by the employer.

(7) DEFINITION.—Wherever occurring in this Determination, the term "Monumental" shall mean pertaining to monuments erected in cometeries or in churches.
