By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1919, and all other power thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of St. Kilda, in the name of and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the said city, for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with into execution within its jurisdiction, orders as follows:—

1. The following fees shall be payable for granting or annual renewal of registration of the following premises respectively:—

- (a) Offensive trade premises—Five pounds (£5).
- (b) Boarding-houses—Ten shillings (10s.).
- (c) Common lodging-houses—Ten shillings (10s.).
- (d) Eating-houses—Ten shillings (10s.).
- (e) Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings (5s.).
- (f) For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the city of St. Kilda.

BOROUGH OF QUEENSCLIFFE.

BY-LAW No. 17.

NOTICE is hereby given that By-law No. 17 of the Borough of Queenscliffe, made and passed by the Council of the Borough of Queenscliffe and sealed, has been approved by the Governor in Council.

The By-law is made under section 198 of Local Government Act 1915 for—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within ten (10) feet of any street or road.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within ten (10) feet of any street or road.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings, or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences, and in paying into the Municipal Fund, fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Regulating, restricting, or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner, or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade, or to disfigure the natural beauty of the landscape.
- (e) Regulating and controlling all advertisements attached or fixed to or painted on any hoarding or any building or on any fence, rock, cliff, or tree.
- (f) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

SHIRE OF NARRACAN.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Narracan made under section 108 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 9, for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections in certain portions of the shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Narracan order as follows:—

(1) No builder shall commence any building erection or structure or any addition or alteration to any building erection or structure without first delivering at the office of the shire building surveyor a written notice of such intention three days before so commencing and until the plans have been approved in writing by the said building surveyor and producing to the said building surveyor properly prepared plans and specifications of such building erection structure addition or alteration with a tracing or copy of the plans of such building erection structure addition or alteration and also details and dimensions sizes and qualities of all materials and enumerating any old materials to be used in the construction of same: Also block plan to show the relation of building to adjoining buildings and boundaries, also to kerb line of channel or street or street building line where no kerb exists. Approval shall not be issued for the erection enlargement or alteration of any building until the land has been subdivided so that each building or premises will be located on a separate and distinct allotment. A copy of the plan of subdivision shall be lodged with the application and the owner or applicant shall show upon such plan all buildings and additions located or to be located thereon. The original plans and specifications when approved shall be returned to the owner or his agent but the tracing or copy of the plans and details of materials shall be retained by the said building surveyor.

(2) No builder shall commence any building erection or structure or any addition or alteration to any building erection or structure without first having obtained from the shire building surveyor a written permit for the commencement of same and having paid to the shire secretary such sum as is demanded by him on account of fees in respect thereof which fees are hereby fixed according to the following scale:—Where the contract price does not exceed £300 a fee of Ten shillings £500 a fee of One pound, £1,000 a fee of One pound ten shillings and over £1,000 a fee of Two pounds.

(3) All materials shall be of good quality and no materials shall be used in the construction of any building or any addition to or alteration of any building if the same have been disapproved by the shire building surveyor on the ground of their not being of good quality. Any material so objected to shall be immediately removed from the site of the work by the builder. The cost of all test of materials shall be borne by the builder.

(4) The lowest floor level of any building shall not be less than 12 inches above the ground level. The ground level shall mean the mean level of the ground as determined by the shire building surveyor. Where necessary the ground under any building shall be filled with suitable filling to prevent the lodgment of water.

(5) No building shall be either erected (or adapted to be used) as a dwelling-house upon any land, the surface of which is so situate as not to admit of being efficiently drained at all times by gravitation into an existing storm-water sewer or channel.

(6) No wooden building shall be hereafter erected unless the same has a clear frontage to a street or road of at least 33 feet but such a building may be erected upon a lesser frontage than 33 feet provided the exterior walls shall consist of brick to be approved of by the shire building surveyor and no two or more wooden buildings shall be hereafter erected upon a frontage as aforesaid of less than 33 feet closer to one another than 4 feet unless with at least one brick wall (to be approved as aforesaid) between them. In the case of a new wooden building being hereafter erected closer to an adjoining building or buildings already erected with wooden walls than 4 feet then such new building shall have a brick wall or walls (to be approved as aforesaid) on side or sides adjoining such building or buildings already erected as aforesaid.

(7) The shire building surveyor shall upon receipt of any such notice as aforesaid and also upon any work being observed or made known to him which is affected by the provisions of this By-law but in respect of which no notice has been given and also from time to time during the progress of any work affected by such provisions as often as may be necessary for securing the due performance of such provisions survey any such building structure erection or work and cause all such provisions to be duly observed.

(8) The shire building surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and during thirty days next after the completion of any building structure erection or work affected by any of the provisions of this By-law or by any terms or conditions on which the observance of any such provisions may have been dispensed with may enter and inspect such building structure or work.

(9) The shire building surveyor may for the purpose of ascertaining whether any building structure or erection is in such a situation or possesses such characteristics as are required in order to exempt it from the operation of any of the provisions of this By-law at all reasonable times and after reasonable notice enter any premises and he may do such things as are reasonably necessary for that purpose.

(10) Any person who is guilty of any act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Council.

(11) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that portion of the shire of Narracan consisting of the township areas of Trafalgar Yarragon Moe Coalville Narracan Thorpdale Childers Erica and Wallhalla as shown on the Crown Lands Department lithograph plans or plan or plans of subdivision as lodged in the Office of Titles.

The foregoing By-law was adopted by the Council of the Shire of Narracan on the tenth day of May, 1920, and confirmed and sealed by the Council on the fourteenth day of June, 1920, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the nineteenth day of January, 1921.

SHIRE OF TRARALGON.

BY-LAW No. 18.

A By-law of the Shire of Traralgon made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, for the purpose of prescribing the fees for the registration of premises, and the renewal or transfer of such registration.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and the Ratepayers of the Shire of Traralgon order as follows:—

1. That from and after the passing of this By-law, the fees to be paid for the registration, renewal or transfer of registration shall be as hereunder:—

- (a) Cattle sale yards—Three pounds.
- (b) Offensive trades—One pound.
- (c) Boarding-houses—Five shillings.
- (d) Common lodging-houses—Five shillings.
- (e) For premises on which are manufactured or prepared for sale, ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any other artificially aerated water.—Five shillings.
- (f) For the transfer of any registration—Two shillings and sixpence.
