## DETERMINATION OF THE CEMENT BOARD.

Note. -This Determination on the 15th April, 1921, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of —

(1) Making Portland Cement,

(2) Quarrying or preparing the raw materials therefor."

has made the following Determination, namely:--

(1) That, on the 15th April, 1921, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<sup>(4)</sup> Special Rates.—Time and a half shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sundays. New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday). Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
