PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2618), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

Bank Holidays:—

MONDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF APRIL, 1921, at Ballarat;

MONDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MAY, 1921, throughout the State of Victoria.

Bank Half-Holidays from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF APRIL, 1921, at Yea;

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF APRIL, 1921, at Mooroopna and Wycheproof;

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF APRIL, 1921, at Hamilton.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VII. of the *Public Service Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2713); I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays and Public Half-Holidays respectively at the places specified, viz.:—

Public Holidays:—

MONDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF APRIL, 1921, throughout the town of Ballarat East, the borough of Sebastopol, and the shires of Ballarat and Bungaree;

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF APRIL, 1921, throughout the shires of Flinders and Shepparton, the Mokoan and Tatong Ridings of the shire of Benalla, and the North Riding of the shire of Euroa;

FRIDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF APRIL, 1921, throughout the Yallock Riding of the shire of Cranbourne;

MONDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MAY, 1921, throughout the State of Victoria, with the exception of the cities of Ballarat and Geelong, the town of Ballarat East, the boroughs of Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol, and the shires of Ballarat and Bungaree;

TUESDAY, THE 3RD, WEDNESDAY, THE 4TH, AND THURSDAY, THE 5TH DAYS OF MAY, 1921, throughout the shire of Warrnambool*;

THURSDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF MAY, 1921, throughout the borough of Korait and the shire of Minhamite*;

MONDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF MAY, 1921, throughout the city of Geelong, and the boroughs of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell.

Public Half-Holidays from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon:—

TUESDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF APRIL, 1921, throughout the Yallock Riding of the shire of Cranbourne*;

TUESDAY, THE 3RD, AND THURSDAY, THE 5TH DAYS OF MAY, 1921, throughout the city of Warrnambool*.
