PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY OF VICTORIA.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by section 7 of the Libraries Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2682), the Trustees for the time being of the body politic and corporate, named the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria, do hereby repeal all the Rules and Regulations which have heretofore been made by the said Trustees, and which have not previously been repealed, and do make the following Rules and Regulations, to date from the 17th December, 1920:—

REGULATIONS OF THE GENERAL BODY OF TRUSTEES.

1. *Ordinary Meetings.*

The Trustees shall meet monthly, unless the President direct to the contrary.

2. *Special Meetings.*

A special meeting shall be convened by the secretary to the Trustees on the direction of the President, or on the requisition of any two Trustees.

3. *Quorums and Adjourned Meetings.*

Three Trustees shall form a quorum. If a quorum be not formed within half-an-hour of the time named, the meeting, whether ordinary or special, shall be called for a day to be named by the Trustee or Trustees then present; but if no Trustee be present, the business shall be adjourned until the next monthly meeting.

4. *Notice of Meetings.*

The Trustees shall be duly supplied by the secretary to the Trustees with at least three days' notice of the day, hour, and place of every monthly meeting, and of motions of which notice has been given and other special matters to be considered thereat; and any Trustee may hand to the secretary to the Trustees a notice of motion, in writing, which it shall be the duty of the secretary to the Trustees to insert in such notice-paper, and also in a book to be called the Notice of Motion Book.

5. *Sections.*

For the more convenient and effectual performance of the duties imposed upon the Trustees, there shall be three Committees, dealing respectively with—

1. The Library.
2. The Industrial and Technological Museum.
3. The National Museum.

6. *Office Bearers.*

1. There shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Treasurer, and a Chairman of each of the sectional Committees elected annually in the month of April, and each shall remain in office until his successor be appointed.
2. The President shall preside at the meetings of the Trustees; in his absence, the Vice-President; in the absence of both the meeting shall elect its Chairman.
3. The Treasurer shall sign all vouchers and financial documents.
4. The Chairman of any meeting of Trustees or of any Committee meeting shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of an equality of votes shall give a casting vote.

7. *Committees.*

Each Sectional Committee shall meet monthly, unless the President or Chairman of the Committee direct to the contrary. Three members shall form a quorum. A special meeting for the consideration of business shall be convened on the requisition, in writing, of any two members.

The President, Vice-President, and Treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of every Committee.

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY.

1. The Museum and Galleries shall be open daily, during such hours as may be appointed, except on Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such other days as the President or the Trustees may by special order direct.
2. The Library shall be open on week days (Christmas Day and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. until Ten p.m.
3. The Lending Library shall be open on week days (public holidays excepted), from Twelve noon until Eight p.m.
4. The Industrial and Technological Museum shall be open on week days from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., and on Sundays during such hours as the Trustees may from time to time direct.
5. The National Museum shall be open on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday in each week from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., and on Sundays during such hours as the Trustees may from time to time direct. The National Museum shall also be open on Thursday if a public holiday fall on that day.
6. The National Gallery shall be open on week days from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., and on Sundays during such hours as the Trustees may from time to time direct.

7. Any visitor behaving in an unbecoming manner, or being, in the opinion of the officer in charge, unfit to remain in the institution, shall be excluded therefrom.

8. No person under the age of fifteen years shall be admitted to any part of the institution (except the Children's Museum) unless accompanied by an adult.

THE PUBLIC LIBRARY.

The Reference Library.

1. No book is to be taken out of the Library except by special permission of the Trustees.

2. In making extracts from books no person shall lay the paper upon which he is writing on the book he is using.

3. Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, or otherwise injuring any book is strictly prohibited. Ink is not to be used except by special permission.

4. Books removed from the shelves, must not be replaced by readers.

5. Newspapers and unbound periodicals must be returned by readers to the delivery counter.

The Lending Library.

1. The Lending Library shall be open on week days (public holidays excepted) from Twelve noon until Eight p.m.

2. Any person satisfying the Librarian that he is a ratepayer of any municipality within the State of Victoria may borrow books from the Lending Library.

3. Any other person having reached the age of fifteen years, who shall deliver to the Librarian a guaranty signed by a ratepayer, may borrow books from the Lending Library.

4. Every application for the loan of books, and the guaranty required by the next preceding regulation, shall be in the form provided from time to time by the Trustees.

5. The Librarian may issue to any person entitled to borrow, on his or her personal application, a Borrower's Ticket, the production of which shall authorize its holder for twelve months to borrow books subject to the regulations of the Lending Library.

6. A Borrower's Ticket may be issued to any person who is physically incapable of applying personally, or to any person who resides more than ten miles from Melbourne, without personal application, on receipt of the necessary forms duly filled in and signed, provided that a statement, in writing, of the reason for not attending in person be given to the Librarian and a reference given to some local magistrate, clergyman, or ratepayer.

7. Except under Rule 24, borrowers must return books personally or by messenger, and the Trustees will not undertake either to receive or to issue books by post.

8. All books borrowed must be returned to the Librarian within a fortnight, and for every failure to comply with this condition the borrower shall incur a fine, to be paid to the Librarian, of Threepence for each day, or portion of a day.

9. No book can be obtained from the Lending Library by a borrower who has not paid all fines incurred, and made full compensation for any loss, damage, or cost of repair.

10. There shall be no obligation to send notice of any fine incurred by a borrower, and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of fines.

11. Borrowers must see that books are in good order before taking them from the Library. If any book be found to be written on, or otherwise injured, borrowers are required to report the fact to the Librarian.

12. Any borrower returning a book which has been written upon, marked, or otherwise injured, shall, within one week of the date upon which the injury has been notified to him, replace such book, or pay to the Librarian the value of any book, set, or series injured, or shall pay such sum for the cost of repair as may be assessed by the Librarian. The borrower shall be entitled to the injured book, set, or series on depositing with the Librarian its full value, or a new and satisfactory copy.

13. Borrowers ceasing to use the Library are required to return their tickets to the Librarian in order to have them cancelled, as, until the tickets are returned, borrowers and their guarantors remain responsible for any book taken out in their names.

14. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify, on forms supplied for the purpose, the change to the Librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets. The right to borrow may be forfeited for failure to comply with this condition.

15. Borrowers losing their tickets, are required to give immediate notice, in writing, to the Librarian, and until they have done so shall be liable for any books taken out in their names.

16. If a borrower's ticket be lost, a second ticket may be issued, after two days from the date on which the loss is notified, in the manner provided in the case of the issue of the ticket in the first instance. If the second ticket be lost, one month must elapse from the time of the notification of the fact to the Librarian before a third ticket shall be issued.

17. Borrowers must under no circumstances transfer their tickets for use to any other person.

18. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the Library, nor exchange them with each other.

19. No borrower shall be allowed to have more than one volume at the same time. When, however, the connexion of two or more volumes of one work makes the use of the whole work necessary, several volumes may be issued together.

20. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book be required by another borrower.

21. The Librarian has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the Lending Library, or who is, in his opinion, for other reasons not to be intrusted with books.

22. Every book must, under a penalty of Five shillings, be returned to the Librarian at such times as shall be publicly announced.

23. Books will not be issued to any person suffering from an infectious disease, nor to any person living in the same house as one suffering from an infectious disease. Borrowers are required to report at once to the Librarian in the event of the outbreak of any such disease in the house in which he or she may be dwelling.

24. Residents of Victoria, who live more than 10 miles from the Town Hall, Melbourne, may, by signing a special undertaking, and agreeing otherwise to comply with the regulations, arrange with the Librarian to have books posted or otherwise forwarded to them, and may return such books by post, or in such other manner as may be arranged with the Librarian. The cost of returning books so borrowed shall be borne by the borrower.

Travelling Libraries.

Conditions upon which Cases of Books will be lent by the Trustees.

1. Books may be lent to the Trustees of committees of Mechanics' and Literary Institutes, or to the Councils of municipalities.

2. The borrowers shall place the books lent in a suitable apartment to be approved by the Trustees, and shall admit the public to the use of the books therein for such hours as may be appointed by the local committee.

3. Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book is strictly prohibited.

4. The local committee shall pay all the expenses of taking the books from, and returning them to, the Public Library, Melbourne.

5. The local committee shall give security to the satisfaction of the Trustees in an amount equal to the value of the books, book case, and cover lent to them, that such books, book case, and cover will be returned at the expiration of the period of the loan in good condition, regard being had to reasonable wear.

6. The local committees and sureties are to be liable for—

1. The value of any volume not returned, or where a work consists of more than one volume, the value of the work, set, or series to which the volume belongs.

2. The estimated value of the injury done to any volume, work, set, or series, book case, or book case cover.

7. When any work, set, or series, rendered imperfect is replaced by the local committee, the imperfect work, set, or series shall be handed over to such committee.

8. The Trustees shall be the sole judges of the value of, or injury done to, any volume, work, set, or series, or book case.

THE NATIONAL GALLERY.

Rules for Students in the Schools of Drawing and Painting and Fine Arts.

1. The period of studentship in the School of Painting is limited to four years, and in the School of Drawing to three years, but such periods may be extended from time to time by the permission of the Trustees in favour of meritorious students on report from the Director. But, except by permission of the Trustees, a student to whom such an extension has been granted shall not compete for any prize or scholarship.

2. The year shall consist of 42 weeks, divided into two terms. There shall be a vacation of eight weeks commencing on a day to be fixed by the Director in the week preceding Christmas Day; and also a vacation of two weeks, commencing on the second Monday in July.

3. An applicant for admission as a student shall be admitted on probation, and shall prepare drawings within the School of Drawing; and on the same being approved by the Director, the applicant shall, on payment of fees, be registered as a student.

4. No person under fourteen years of age shall be admitted as a student, except by special permission of the Trustees.

5. Any student not making due progress shall be reported by the Director to the Trustees, who shall decide whether such student shall be allowed to continue to attend the classes.

6. Before admission to the School of Painting, a student shall submit to the Trustees a drawing of a figure from the antique, a drawing of a head from the antique, a drawing of an anatomical figure, drawings of hands or feet, and a perspective drawing; and all these drawings shall be done in the school at the National Gallery.

7. Once in every three years a Travelling Scholarship to the value of Two hundred and twenty-five pounds (£225) per annum, tenable for two years, may, if the Trustees deem the works submitted for competition of sufficient merit, be awarded for the highest number of marks attained in a competition for—

- (a) a figure drawing from life,
- (b) a half figure life-sized painting from the nude, and
- (c) An original painting as described in Rule 10.

For the original painting a maximum of one hundred and fifty (150) marks may be awarded, and for each of the other subjects a maximum of fifty (50) marks may be awarded. No competitor shall exhibit more than one painting or drawing in any of the above sections.

8. The Trustees may, in their absolute discretion, determine the time at which the first instalment of the scholarship money for the first year shall be paid, and the two years during which such scholarship is tenable shall be deemed to begin on the date of such payment, or at such later date as the Trustees may, in their absolute discretion, determine. The Trustees may, in their absolute discretion, determine the amount of the first or any subsequent instalment of the scholarship money for either the first or second year.

9. Except under Rule 12, no student shall be eligible to compete for the Travelling Scholarship unless he or she has passed through the full course in the schools, or otherwise satisfied the Director.

10. The title of the original painting intended for competition shall be submitted by each candidate to the Trustees for their approval. The outside measurement of the canvas of such painting shall be at least 18 feet, but the proportions shall be left to the competing student. Such original painting shall contain not less than two whole human figures, and shall (under the supervision of the Director) be painted in the school at the National Gallery, during any one term, by a student who, for not less than eighteen months or more than four years, has attended the painting class at the National Gallery, or at any School of Art subsidized by the Government of Victoria.

11. A student shall not be eligible to compete unless at the time of entering for such competition such student is under twenty-eight years of age, and has been domiciled in the Commonwealth of Australia or New Zealand for the previous seven years.

12. Any intending competitor for the Travelling Scholarship who has not attended the painting classes at the National Gallery for at least three terms shall submit to the Trustees a figure drawing from the life and a half-figure, life sized painting from the nude, accompanied by a certificate from the Director of some School of Art subsidized by the Government of Victoria, at which he or she is at the time attending, that such works are the unaided (and) original production of such intending competitor, and if the Trustees decide that such works are of sufficient merit to qualify the student to compete, such works may be considered as two of the subjects required for the final competition for the Travelling Scholarship; but a competitor at such competition may substitute therefor any figure drawing from the life or painting from the nude (as the case may be) made while he or she is a student at the National Gallery.

13. During the tenure of the Travelling Scholarship the holder shall, for the purpose of study, reside mainly in some art centre in Europe to be approved by the Trustees, and shall forward a quarterly report as to the work upon which he or she is engaged.

14. During the period of three years following the payment of the first instalment of the scholarship money the holder of the Travelling Scholarship shall paint and present to the Trustees, and deliver at the National Gallery, Melbourne, an original figure painting; and, notwithstanding anything in Rule 7 or Rule 8, an amount of £50, portion of the scholarship money, shall not be payable to the holder unless such painting has been so delivered and approved by the Trustees.

15. Notwithstanding anything contained in Rule 7 or Rule 8, or any other of the foregoing rules—

- (a) The Trustees may, in their absolute discretion, and on such information as appears satisfactory to them, determine whether the provisions of Rule 13 are being complied with, and may, if they determine that such provisions are not being complied with, withhold either altogether or for such period as the Trustees think right, the payment of any further part or parts of the scholarship money.
- (b) In case of the death of the student to whom the Travelling Scholarship has been awarded before the payment of the first instalment of the scholarship money for the first year the Trustees shall be under no liability whatever to any person whatever.
- (c) In case of the death of the holder of the Travelling Scholarship at any time after the payment of the first instalment of the scholarship money for the first year, the Trustees shall be under no liability whatever to any person whatever, but may pay such further amount or amounts to such person or persons as they in their absolute discretion may determine.

(d) The Trustees may, in their absolute discretion, and on such information as appears satisfactory to them, determine whether the student to whom the Travelling Scholarship has been awarded, or the holder of the Travelling Scholarship (as the case may be), has by reason of illness or other causes, become incapacitated from taking advantage thereof, or from taking further advantage thereof (as the case may be), and if they so determine, shall be under no liability whatever to any person whatever, but may pay such amount or amounts, or such further amounts or amount (as the case may be), to such person or persons as they in their absolute discretion may determine.

(e) The scholarship money, and every part thereof, shall in all cases in which it is payable, be regarded as a purely personal provision, and the Trustees shall in no case whatever be under any liability to any person claiming as assignee, or trustee, or as representative of the student to whom the Travelling Scholarship has been awarded, or of the holder of the Travelling Scholarship (as the case may be); but the foregoing provisions of this paragraph shall not affect the power of the Trustees to make payments to such person or persons as they, in their absolute discretion, may determine, as provided in paragraphs (c) and (d).

(f) Whenever under the foregoing provisions of this or any other rule the Trustees are empowered to determine any matter or thing, they may do so if they think fit without hearing or giving any opportunity of being heard to any person interested, or at any time alleged or claiming to be interested, in the result of such determination.

16. An exhibition of the students' work shall be held annually.

17. No work done by students in the schools shall be taken away from the schools without the permission of the Director before it has been submitted for competition and exhibition at the Students' Annual Exhibition.

18. No student shall be eligible to receive a first prize or a second prize twice in the same section, except in the life-figure class, in which class a first or second prize may be won twice only. The student to whom the Travelling Scholarship has been awarded shall be ineligible for any other prize in the same year.

19. If any place in the prize list be awarded to a student who is ineligible to receive a prize, the student next in order of merit may receive such prize at the discretion of the Trustees, but no student shall receive two prizes in any one class except as provided in the preceding rule.

20. Students shall pay in advance to the Librarian the term fee fixed by the Trustees, and shall not be admitted to the class-rooms except upon production of the receipt.

21. No student who has been absent from the classes for a term, or who has been irregular in attendance, except on account of actual illness, or from such cause as shall be deemed sufficient by the Trustees, shall be permitted to compete for the Travelling Scholarship or to rejoin the classes except after application to the Director and by permission of the Trustees.

22. No person shall be allowed to copy any picture, drawing, or work of art in the Galleries of Painting and Sculpture without having first obtained permission, in writing, from the Trustees, and such permission shall specify the part or parts, if any, of any such picture or work of art not to be included in the copy.

23. All students shall sign the students' book on every day they attend before entering the gallery.

24. All students shall, when leaving the gallery, remove or carefully put away all materials used by them in drawing or painting.

25. The Trustees shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to property which any student may have left in the gallery.

26. Any irregularity or unbecoming conduct on the part of any student will subject such student to suspension by the Director. The matter shall be forthwith reported by the Director to the Trustees, and the offence, if proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees, shall subject such student to exclusion for such period as they may think fit.

APPOINTMENT OF A SHOPS BOARD No. 18
(MISCELLANEOUS SHOPS).

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

(1) declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in any shop other than shops of the following classes, that is to say:—

- (a) a Butcher's shop, a Bookseller's and News Agent's shop, a Confectionery and Pastry shop, a Cooked Meat Dealer's shop, a Fish and Oyster shop, a Flower shop, a Fruit and Vegetable shop, a Hair-dresser's shop, a Tobacconist's shop;
- (b) a Boot Dealer's shop, a Boot Repairer's shop, a Chemist's shop, a Dairy Produce Dealer's shop, a Draper's shop, a Dyers and Clothes Cleaner's shop, a Fuel and Fodder Dealer's shop, a Furniture Dealer's shop, a Grocer's shop, a Haberdasher's shop, a Hardware shop, a Hatter's shop, a Men's Clothing shop, a Mercer's shop, a Milliner's shop, an Underclothing shop.

(2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of ten Members and a Chairman, five of such Members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in any shop other than shops of the following classes, that is to say:—

- (a) a Butcher's shop, a Bookseller's and News Agent's shop, a Confectionery and Pastry shop, a Cooked Meat Dealer's shop, a Fish and Oyster shop, a Flower shop, a Fruit and Vegetable shop, a Hair-dresser's shop, a Tobacconist's shop;

- (b) a Boot Dealer's shop, a Boot Repairer's shop, a Chemist's shop, a Dairy Produce Dealer's shop, a Draper's shop, a Dyers and Clothes Cleaner's shop, a Fuel and Fodder Dealer's shop, a Furniture Dealer's shop, a Grocer's shop, a Haberdasher's shop, a Hardware shop, a Hatter's shop, a Men's Clothing shop, a Mercer's shop, a Milliner's shop, an Underclothing shop.

Also that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order or instrument or legal proceedings, be described for all purposes as the Shops Board No. 18 (Miscellaneous Shops), and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the metropolitan district as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, all cities and towns, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS
TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST DETERMINATION
OF THE GROCERS BOARD.

WHEREAS the Wages Board (herein referred to as the Grocers Board) appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons whosoever employed in the business of a grocer, including a seller of tea, did by a certain Determination made on the twenty-sixth day of January, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the fourth day of February, 1921, following, determine the lowest prices or rates to be so paid: And whereas the representatives of the employers on the said Board have in the prescribed manner appealed against the said Determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the Factories and Shops Acts: Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts that a Court of Industrial Appeals consisting of the President His Honor Mr. Justice Mann and Abraham Willis of 296 High-street, St. Kilda, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in the trade concerned for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employers on the Grocers Board to represent the employers and George Frederick Roberts of 19 Royal-avenue, Glen Huntly, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in such trade for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination nominated by the representatives of the employees on the said Board to represent the employees be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the Determination of the Grocers Board and to revise or alter the said Court's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NATHALIA.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by the majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the thirtieth day of November, 1915, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the township of Nathalia, within the municipal district of the shire of Numurkah, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday and fixing the closing hours of all shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NATHALIA.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by the majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the township of Nathalia, within the municipal district of the shire of Numurkah, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the thirtieth day of November, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hair-dressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the township of Nathalia, within the municipal district of the shire of Numurkah, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

COMMISSION OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

Regulations relating to the qualifications required by and the examination of Inspectors and persons desirous of obtaining Certificates of Competency as Inspectors, and to the appointment, duties, and remuneration of Examiners.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of April, 1921.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Robinson | Mr. Clarke.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919 (No. 3041), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the "Regulations relating to the Qualifications of Inspectors" and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter "The Act" means the *Health Act 1919*.

(3) Every person desiring to obtain an Inspector's Certificate of Competency as provided by the Act and these Regulations shall satisfy the Examiners by testimonials or in such other manner as the said Examiners deem expedient that he has had at least twelve months' continuous practical experience of sanitary work in relation to public health and that he has undergone a course of instruction approved by the Commission in the following subjects as far as the same relates to public health:—

Building construction.
Drainage,
Food inspection.
Infectious diseases and disinfection.
Offensive trades.
Sanitary law,
Scavenging (including the disposal of night-soil).
Ventilation, lighting and warming of buildings.
Water supply.

(4) A candidate for an Inspector's Certificate of Competency will be examined as to his knowledge of the Health Acts and the Regulations and By-laws thereunder and more particularly as to his knowledge of the provisions contained in the said Acts, Regulations and By-laws relating to the powers and duties of an inspector.

(5) Examinations shall be held at such place or places and at such intervals as may be determined upon by the Commission.

(6) Application for examination must be in the candidate's own handwriting, shall be accompanied by the testimonials or other evidence on which he relies to prove his practical experience, and that he has undergone the course of instruction prescribed by these Regulations.

Such application shall be in the form prescribed in the Schedule and together with a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence shall be lodged with the secretary of the Commission fourteen days before the date of the examination at which the candidate wishes to present himself.

(7) The Commission shall appoint three examiners to carry out the provisions of these Regulations relating to the examination of candidates for certificates of competency.

Every such examiner shall be skilled in at least one branch of sanitary science.

(8) It shall be the duty of the examiners to ascertain by written practical and oral tests whether a candidate is competent to carry out the duties of an inspector under the Health Acts.

(9) The examiners shall as soon as practicable after any examination forward to the Commission a return signed by each examiner showing the names of the candidates who have passed.

(10) Every such examiner shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 6d. for each candidate examined, provided that no examiner shall for any one examination including all work connected therewith be paid a fee less than Two guineas.

(11) Every certificate of competency granted in pursuance of the Act and these Regulations shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto.

(12) Any person may be appointed an inspector or continue to be an inspector provided he holds the certificate of competency of an Inspector of Nuisances granted by the Royal Sanitary Institute (London, England), or with the approval of the Commission any other certificate of competency granted by an authority in the British Dominions.

Provided that in such last-mentioned case such certificate is granted after a course of training and examination substantially equivalent to the course and examination prescribed in these Regulations.

(13) A register shall be kept by the secretary of the Commission of the name, address, and occupation of every person—

(a) to whom a certificate of competency has been granted by the Commission after examination;

(b) who has held office as an inspector for five years immediately prior to the commencement of the Act;

(c) who by reason of his holding any certificate referred to in the next preceding Regulation may be appointed as or may continue to be an inspector.

Provided that in such last-mentioned case no such entry shall be made until the Commission after examination has expressed its approval of the said certificate.

The entry in the register shall in each case indicate whether the certificate of competency was granted by the Commission or recognised in pursuance of section 33 (2) (c) of the Act.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST.
 DISTRICT OF THE TRUST DIVIDED INTO DIVISIONS FOR RATING PURPOSES.

BY-LAW No. 85.

A By-law of the City of Richmond made under sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 85, for carrying out the purposes provided for in the Thirteenth Schedule to the Act aforesaid, relating to the breaking, displacing, or removing the surface of soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the Council and the laying of temporary crossings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

1. An authority or a permit may be issued by the proper officer of the Council to plumbers, builders, or other persons or firms requiring to break, displace or remove the surface or soil of any street, road or footway belonging to or under the control or management of the Council subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) All new or replaced pipes for water, gas, and other services shall be laid at least eighteen inches below the surface level of the road or footway.
 - (2) The person requiring a permit shall deposit with the proper officer a sum of Twenty shillings which shall be retained for a period of at least fourteen days.
 - (3) After a permit has been issued to break displace or remove the surface or soil of any road or footway the work shall be proceeded with and completed without any unnecessary delay.
2. The licensee shall complete to the satisfaction of the proper officer the following work:—
- (1) The earth used for filling excavations or trenches shall in all cases be thoroughly wetted and filled in in 6-in. layers and thoroughly rammed with a heavy rammer.
 - (2) In relaying pitchers they are to be set on at least three inches of good sand, with close joints, properly flushed up with sand and well rammed and back rammed with a fifty-six pounds weight pavior's rammer.
 - (3) All holes required in kerb are to be neatly cut to the size of the pipe or shoot and to come through at the joints, one half of the opening being in each stone.

(4) Whenever a metalled roadway is disturbed the trench or excavation shall be filled as described in sub-clause 1 of sub-clause 2 of this By-law and afterwards covered with six inches of good clean metal, properly spread and left clear of all obstructions.

3. A minimum fee of 2s. 6d. shall be made and deducted out of the deposit (even when no repairs have been found necessary) to cover the cost of inspection.

4. The following minimum charges for repairs when a trench or excavation has been left in good order to the satisfaction of the proper officer shall be made and deducted out of the deposit lodged, viz.:—

- 6d. per square foot on metalled roads.
- 8d. per square foot on tar-paved footpaths.

Such charges to be in addition to the fee of 2s. 6d. mentioned in clause 3 hereof.

In all cases where the cost of repairs exceeds the said minimum charge a charge to be fixed by the proper officer shall be deducted out of the deposit lodged.

5. In the event of the charges for repairs being in excess of the deposit of Twenty shillings lodged the licensee shall pay such charges within seven days from the date of demand for payment and if not so paid the same shall be recoverable as a debt due to the Council.

6. An authority or a permit for a period not exceeding 30 days may be issued by the proper officer to any person desiring to cart across a footway subject to the following conditions:—The licensee shall form a temporary crossing by placing a bridge over the channel and covering the footway with boards not less than 1 inch thick backed up with feather-edged pieces, lying close on the footpath and securely bound with wire or hoop-iron so as not to present any obstruction to traffic and the licensee shall not cart along the footpath.

7. At the expiration of the said period of 30 days the licensee shall pay for any necessary repairs to the footway and the cost and expense of such repair shall be recoverable from the licensee as a debt due to the Council.
