REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR THE RECREATION, CONVENIENCE, AND AMUSEMENT OF THE PEOPLE IN THE PARISH OF BOCHARA, KNOWN AS THE "NIGRETТА PARK RESERVE."

WE, Edward James White, Alfred Peter MacKenzie, John Richard Moodie, Isaac Holt Short, James Garland, William Falkenberg, and Thomas Francis O'Neill, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the twenty-third January, 1912, as a site for the Recreation, Convenience, and Amusement of the people in the parish of Bochara, and known as the "Nigretta Park Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and for collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, chattels, or other property in and around the Reserve, or pollute any water in the Reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, plants, or trees.
4. No person shall interfere with or injure the trees, shrubs, flowers, or other property in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles therein, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, rubbish, or any litter in the Reserve.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without permission in writing of the Committee of Management, first obtained, and no person shall light any fires in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management save and except in fire-places erected or set apart for such purpose.
6. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or flowers.
7. Public betting in any part of the Reserve (including all buildings and enclosures) shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the buildings or enclosures and the Reserve.
8. No person shall bring any dog into the Reserve unless held by a chain or cord.
9. No person shall bring or drive into the Reserve any sheep, cattle, horses, goats, or any live stock and any pigs, geese, or goats trespassing thereon shall be liable to be destroyed.
10. Any horses ridden or driven into the Reserve shall be securely fastened or tethered at the place set apart for that purpose by the person riding or driving the same into the Reserve.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any fire-arm or other lethal weapon, and no person shall discharge any fire-arms or air-gun projectiles therefrom in the Reserve.

12. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve—

- (a) being drunk, or using profane, indecent, or abusive language;
- (b) assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Security.—10 per cent. on total amount of tender accepted, except when otherwise specified in the tender form, but in no case will security of less than £5 be received.

Schedules as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information afforded to persons tendering.

In certain schedules where doubt exists as to whether the articles enumerated may or may not be manufactured within the Commonwealth, double columns are inserted for the rates, "A" for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, and "B" for articles manufactured elsewhere.

Under column "B," the country of origin of the article tendered for must be stated.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board, provided the quality of the articles offered is satisfactory, and the rates charged are considered reasonable—

- (a) to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth;
- (b) to tenders for articles manufactured within any other part of the British Empire.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Each tender must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 2½ per cent. of total of tender submitted.

Tenders to be addressed to "The Government Printer, Melbourne," and indorsed "Tender for Paper, &c."

CONDITIONS OF TENDERING.

Contract for Supply of Stores at Scheduled Rates.

1. Interpretation.—In these conditions and in the tender the word "Government" shall mean The Victorian Government, and where the circumstances require, the word "Tenderer" shall be deemed to include two or more persons or a company; and the word "his" to include "her," "their," "its"; and the word "he" to include "she," "they," "it"; and the word "him" to include "them," "it." The words "Government Printer" shall mean the officer bearing that title or the officer for the time being performing the duties of Government Printer of Victoria. The word "Schedule" shall mean and include the Schedule or Schedules and Supplementary schedule or schedules (if any) hereto annexed.

2. *Official Form to be Used.*—Each tenderer must send in his tender on the printed form of tender, having attached thereto the Conditions of Tendering, Conditions of Contract, and Schedule, having such schedule filled up IN INK, with the rates at which he tenders. Except where provided to the contrary in the schedule the tenderer may tender to supply any one or more items specified in the schedule. Tenders must in all cases be for the stores as specified, without any alterations or additions (except where otherwise provided for in the schedule, or where the tenderer offers to supply stores as specified by him in some supplementary schedule as hereinafter provided for).

The tenderer must insert in the schedule opposite to every item thereof tendered for in the appropriate column the rate or rates at which he tenders. Except where indicated to the contrary in the schedule the Government shall have the option and full power to accept any tender or tenders in respect of any item or items in any schedule tendered for.

3. *Envelopes to Indicate Service Tendered for.*—Tenders, enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for Supplies to the Government Printer" written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, they must be prepaid, and addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

4. *Preliminary Deposit.*—On application, the tenderer will be furnished with a "List of Schedules, &c.", and he will require to lodge with his tender the amount of preliminary deposit required in respect of the item or items tendered for, and such deposit is to be made in—

- (a) Cash
- (b) Post office money order, in favour of the Tender Board;
- (c) Postal note, in favour of the Tender Board;
- (d) Cheque issued by a bank in favour of the Tender Board;
- (e) Bank draft in favour of the Tender Board;
- (f) Bank order, in favour of the Tender Board;
- (g) A cheque bearing the date of the last day for receiving tenders marked by a bank in favour of the Tender Board;
- (h) Government debentures; or by
- (i) War Bonds or War Certificates;

and must accompany each tender as a guarantee of good faith, otherwise such tenderer will be liable to rejection.

5. *Deposit Security.*—In the event of the tenderer's offer being accepted for the supply of items in the schedule the whole of the items comprised in such acceptance shall be embodied in one contract; any tenderer whose tender may be so accepted must, after having been called upon so to do, deposit with the Government in respect of the total of each and every such item a sum to be computed on a percentage basis, as set out in paragraphs marked respectively "b" and "c" hereunder, on the amount arrived at as provided in paragraph marked "a" hereunder, that is to say—

- (a) The amount on which the percentage as aforesaid is to be computed will be arrived at by computing the "Requirements" for such items at the rate set opposite to the same respectively and totalling the resulting sums.
- (b) If the amount arrived at as aforesaid is £1,000 or over, then in every such case the deposit security required in connexion with the particular contract shall be 5 per centum on such amount.
- (c) If the amount arrived at as aforesaid is less than £1,000, then in every such case the deposit security required in connexion with the particular contract shall be 10 per centum on such amount, provided that no such deposit security shall be less than £5.

The sum to be lodged as a deposit shall in every case be calculated to the nearest pound, and such deposit is to be made in—

- (a) Cash;
- (b) Victorian Government debentures;
- (c) Approved bank deposit receipt in favour of the Tender Board;
- (d) Post office money order, in favour of the Tender Board;
- (e) Postal note, in favour of the Tender Board;

6. *Preliminary deposits may be credited to successful tenderers as part payment of deposit security if so desired.*

Deposits will be returned to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Preliminary deposits will, however, be forfeited in the event of the tenderer withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender after the time fixed for closing of tenders, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

7. *Samples.*—The tenderer shall forward, in connexion with his tender, any sample or samples that may be required to be furnished by him in accordance with any schedule, and the said sample or samples shall be duly marked, so as to properly connect them with the tender to the satisfaction of the Government Printer, and shall be deposited by the tenderer with the Tender Board at or before the time stated in the advertisement calling for tenders.

8. *Government not bound to accept any Tender, &c.*—The Government shall not be bound to accept the lowest or any tender, and no tender shall be deemed to have been accepted unless such acceptance shall be notified to the contractor by a notice in writing from the Tender Board.

9. *Notice to Tenderers.*—Every notice to be given to the tenderer may, if the Government think fit, be posted to the tenderer's address given in the tender, and such posting will be deemed good service of such notice, and the time mentioned in these conditions for doing any act after notice shall be reckoned from the time of posting the same.

10. *Additional Conditions of Tendering.*—Any Conditions of Tendering or directions to the tenderer embodied in the advertisement inviting tenders or in any note appearing in the schedule hereto annexed shall be deemed to be Conditions of Tendering the same as if they were included in these Conditions of Tendering.

(A) The tenderer is to insert in the appropriate column of this schedule, and opposite the items to which the particulars refer, the following information, viz. :—

1. The name of the country or State and the name of the mill in which the stores tendered for will be manufactured or produced.
2. Whether, in the case of stores of Australian manufacture or production, the whole of such manufacture or production will take place in Australia.
3. As regards stores which will be only partly manufactured or produced in Australia (if any), the parts which will be so manufactured or produced are to be named where provided for in the schedule.
4. The descriptions of, and extent to which, raw materials of Australian manufacture or production (if any) will be contained in the stores tendered for are to be shown.

(B) Except where otherwise provided for in the schedule, items are to be supplied (subject to the Conditions of Contract) to sample or samples exhibited by the Government, and which sample or samples may be seen on application to the Tender Board, or to the Government Printer, Melbourne.

(C) In cases where stores of a particular manufacture are specified (if any), the tenderer may tender for the supply of similar stores of Australian manufacture.

(D) The tenderer may attach hereto a supplementary offer of any item or items or stores similar to any item or items specified in the schedule below, but of a different material, quality, manufacture, brand, or make.

(E) The tenderer may tender for any item or items in the schedule, and the Government may, in its absolute discretion, accept any tender or tenders in respect of any item or items so tendered for.

(F) The envelopes supplied under Items Nos. 249 to 261 to be banded in twenty-fives, to be packed in strong paper in parcels of 250, with label specifying item number, description, and size.

Pure gum arabic is to be used in the manufacture of the envelopes.

The envelopes must be equal in quality, make, and in every other respect to, and of the same colour as, the sample.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. As regards supplies of Commonwealth manufacture no subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor.

3. *Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

4. The Government will order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules.

5. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one-half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 14th November, 1921, and the remainder to be made not later than 31st December, 1921. Should the contractor so desire, the whole quantity contracted for may be delivered on the first date specified.

6. The supplies are to be the same as sample and in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

7. The value of all packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, all wharfage fees and duty of Customs must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, wrappings, &c. The net weight or quality only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

8. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores tendered by him.

9. All papers supplied, except Item No. 37, must be supplied in reams, and must be equal in quality, weight, and colour to the samples furnished by the Government, and must be cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (not folded). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

Item 37 to be supplied in reels 39 inches wide, and to be wound on cores with a diameter of 2½ inches. Substance 22½ x 35—40 lbs., 500 sheets. Reels to be wholly enclosed in wooden crates. No creased or damaged paper will be accepted. Reels not to exceed 560 lbs.

10. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 11.

11. In the event of the goods not being delivered within the time stated, the Government Printer may, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

12. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Printer to the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, for each and every default as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as set out in clauses 3 and 11. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

14. In the event of any alteration in the duties of Customs which may affect any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, provided that the duty on such item at the altered rate has actually been paid.

15. Each package shall be branded "O.H.M.S., The Government of Victoria, the Government Printer, Melbourne," and numbered consecutively; and each package shall also be marked with the number of the contract and contents of same for identification purposes.

16. Every account must be in prescribed form, including the number of this contract and the number of item in same, and must show full details of how the same is made up.

17. After delivery of supplies accepted in Melbourne, payment may be made in London if contractor so desires.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the *Land Act* 1915 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

CONDITIONS.

1. 4. 5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act* 1915 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act* 1890 in like manner as holders of freehold lands.
