At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentyninth day of August, 1922.

WIEREAS by Royal Proclamation dated the 28th day of July, 1916, the Royal Proclamation of the 17th day of September, 1900, was amended so as to provide that during the continuance of the then War, and for a period of one year thereafter, instead of delivering out coin to persons bringing gold bullion to the Melbourne Branch Mint, the Deputy Master might make payment for the bullion in such manner as might be provided by Regulations to be made under proviso D of sub-section (1) of Article 5 of the said Royal Proclamation dated the 17th day of September, 1900, and whereas by the Australian Branch Mints (Amendment) Proclamation 1922, dated the 20th day of June, 1922, it is provided that the Royal Proclamation made on the 28th day of July, 1916, shall have effect as though the words "during the period ending the thirty-first day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four" were substituted for the words "during the continuance of the present war and a period of one year thereafter": Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council doth by this Order direct that the portion of the Mint Regulations made on the 20th day of September, 1904, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the 21st day of September, 1904, relating to the mode of payment for gold bullion brought to the Melbourne Branch Mint, be further suspended for the period ending the 31st day of August, 1924, and that the following Regulation which was by Order in Council of the 14th day of August, 1916, temporarily substituted therefor, be continued in force until the said 31st day of August, 1924:—

"All payments for gold bullion brought to the Melbourne Branch Mint shall be made by the Deputy Master by cheque in such manner as may be determined by him."
