Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 2 (BOOT REPAIRERS).

NOTE.—This Determination on the 16th October, 1922, applied to the following parts of Victoria, viz.:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Sandringham and Geelong West, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of a Boot Repairer" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That this Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 16th October, 1922.

⁽³⁾ OVERTIME.—Any employee who works in excess of 44 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

⁽⁴⁾ Casual Labour.—Any person casually employed during any week for not more than half the number of hours fixed as a week's work shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 4d. per hour.

⁽⁵⁾ SPECIAL RATES:—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April, King's Birthday (3rd June), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day: but if any other day done on the day so substituted.
