Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE GARDENERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 6th February, 1922, applied to the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; and the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed by a nurseryman or master gardener, other than a market gardener, in the business or occupation of a nurseryman or master gardener, other than a market gardener," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 6th February, 1922, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK { 7.30 a.m. .. 12 noon on Saturday (or the day on which the half-holiday is locally observed).
7.30 a.m. .. 6 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done—
Outside the times of beginning and ending work
Within the times of beginning and ending work, in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed as a week's work in any week } Time and a half

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
