No person shall ride or drive any animal or vehicle over or upon any part of the Reserve set apart for the playing of football or cricket, and any person having charge of any animal or vehicle when entering the Reserve by the main gate shall direct such animal or vehicle in a northerly direction, between the playing area referred to and the eastern boundary fence, and shall not allow such animal or vehicle to remain elsewhere than at the northern end of the Reserve, and not less than thirty feet outside the said playing area.

9. No public entertainment of any kind shall be conducted on any part of the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee of Management or by a police constable or Crown lands bailiff.

12. No person except labourers or workmen employed on the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

13. No person, club, or sporting body shall have the exclusive right on any occasion to use, occupy, or control this Reserve except in accordance with the provisions of the *Land Act 1915*, and after having first obtained the permission in writing of the Committee of Management.

14. 17. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 149.

A By-law of the City of Prahran made under section 2 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2) and numbered 149 for—

- (a) regulating the use of streets roads and public places by street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs or flowers and prohibiting any such persons during particular hours from using any streets roads and public places and
- (b) appointing stands in streets roads and public places for such street hawkers and itinerant traders and abolishing enlarging or diminishing such stands and limiting the space to be occupied by each person on any such stand and the time during which each person may remain on any such stand and
- (c) prescribing the charges to be paid for the right to use such stands and the conditions on which and the times during which such stands may be occupied and
- (d) prescribing rules to be observed by persons occupying such stands and with respect to the conduct of such persons and
- (e) prescribing the nature and size of hand trucks barrows or other vehicles to be used on such stands and prohibiting any animal whether attached to any truck barrow or vehicle or not from standing on any such stand during the time fixed for occupation thereof by street hawkers and itinerant traders and
- (f) providing the form of authority to be issued for occupying such stands the conditions upon which such authorities are issued and under which they will be permitted to be transferred and the fee to be paid for a transfer of any such authority; and prohibiting any person who is not named in such an authority or is not a transferee of such an authority duly permitted under the said By-law from occupying any such stand.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts The Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the city of Prahran order as follows:—

1. The places mentioned in the First Schedule hereto and such other places as may from time to time be fixed by the Council of the said Municipality in lieu of or in addition thereto shall be stands for the sale of foodstuffs and/or flowers in the said city.
2. No person shall take up or occupy or sell or attempt to sell or assist in selling from any of such stands unless licensed so to do as hereinafter provided.
3. The Council of the said city may from time to time—
 - (a) Abolish enlarge or diminish any stand or position.
 - (b) Move any stand or position in any direction either temporarily or permanently.
 - (c) Appoint any new stand or stands and fix the number of positions on such stand or stands and the charges to be paid for same.

Notice in writing of the exercise of any of the powers by this clause conferred shall be given to any licensee affected thereby and shall also be published in a newspaper circulating in the Municipal District.

4. Any person desiring to sell or to assist in selling foodstuffs and/or flowers from any such stand shall apply in writing to the Town Clerk in one of the forms or to the effect in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The Town Clerk shall submit such application to the Council which in its absolute discretion may grant refuse or otherwise deal with such application.

6. If such application be granted a licence subject to the conditions of this By-law will be issued to the applicant by the Town Clerk on payment of the prescribed charges and such licence shall state the stand and the position on such stand to be occupied by the licensee and the description of goods to be sold thereat.

7. No person shall hold a licence in respect of more than one position.

8. When a licence is issued pursuant to this By-law to occupy a position on any stand no person other than the person named in such licence or his permitted transferee and/or licensed assistant (if any) shall use or occupy or have the right to use or occupy the position named in such licence.

9. Any such licence may at the discretion of the Council be transferred by the holder thereof to some other person not being the holder of a licence for any other position. Such transfer shall be in writing and in such form as the Council may from time to time prescribe and together with the licence proposed to be transferred shall be lodged with the Town Clerk who when such transfer is approved shall indorse the particulars of such transfer on the licence and deliver it to the transferee upon payment of the charge for such transfer which is hereby fixed at Five shillings.

10. The Council may at any time revoke any licence issued pursuant to this By-law if the holder in the opinion of the Council—

- (a) Has committed any offence against or breach of this By-law.
- (b) Has been guilty of offensive or unbecoming conduct or behaviour on or near his position.
- (c) Has not kept his cart truck barrow or other vehicle clean or has not kept himself cleanly in habits and appearance while on his position.
- (d) Has been convicted of any offence.

11. In the event of any licence being revoked the right thereunder to occupy or act as assistant in the position specified therein shall then cease and any moneys or fees paid in respect of such licence shall be forfeited to the Council and the holder of such licence shall forthwith deliver it to the Town Clerk.

12. The hours within which any position or stand may be occupied shall be between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on Mondays Tuesdays Wednesdays Thursdays and Saturdays and between 8 a.m. and 10 p.m. on Fridays but no person shall occupy any position or sell or attempt to sell or assist in selling from any position on Sundays Christmas Day and Good Friday.

13. The charge for a licence to occupy a stand shall be payable in advance either weekly monthly or quarterly and shall be at the rate of One pound per week in respect of the streets named in the First Schedule hereto except Chatham-street as to which the charge shall be at the rate of One pound ten shillings per week.

14. If a stand or any position thereon be abolished during the currency of a licence in respect thereof the Council may allot to the licensee of the abolished stand or position a new position on any stand in lieu thereof or shall at the option of the licensee repay him a proportionate amount of the charge paid by him in advance for such abolished position in full satisfaction of all claims and demands.

15. Every licensee shall observe the following rules that is to say:—

- (a) He shall keep the position on the stand mentioned in his licence or any other position allotted to him in lieu thereof and also the footway and roadway contiguous thereto clean and free from paper fruit stems peelings refuse and rubbish during all such time as the position is occupied by him or his assistant.
- (b) He shall not at any time cause permit or suffer any nuisance to exist on or contiguous to the position he is in for the time being authorized to occupy.
- (c) He shall not permit or suffer any horse or other animal to be attached to his vehicle while on the position occupied by him or when unattached to be upon the said position or to remain upon any stand in the street in which the said position is situate.
- (d) He shall produce his licence to the Inspector of the Council or to any police constable when demanded.
- (e) He shall (unless licensed as an assistant only) have and keep his name and address legibly painted in a conspicuous place on the right or offside of his vehicle in Roman letters of not less than one and a half inches in the shortest diameter of the same.

(f) He shall not use any flap shelf or device on his vehicle whereby the length or width thereof shall be increased beyond the measurements hereinafter specified.

16. No licensee shall use or permit to be used any cart truck barrow or other vehicle on any position unless the same has been previously approved by the Inspector of the Council and is not greater than 8 feet in length or 4 feet in width.

17. No person shall clean or gut any fish bird or animal at or near any stand or position.

18. Where under this By-law notice in writing is required to be served on any licensee such notice may be served personally or sent through the post by registered letter addressed to such licensee at the address mentioned in his licence in which latter case it shall be deemed to have been served within twenty-four hours from the posting thereof.

19. A licence to be issued under this By-law shall be in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto appropriate to the application made therefor.
