## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Security will be required in cash, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank deposit receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or Government debentures.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit above mentioned in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the tenderer after the time fixed for closing of tenders withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Charcoal must be of the very best description for the purpose for which it is required, and subject to approval of the officer ordering.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.

6. The acceptance of the firewood or charcoal shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood or charcoal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood or charcoal may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the article so rejected or returned.

7. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood or charcoal as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

9. If the board shall decide that the firewood or charcoal is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 3.

10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of firewood or charcoal by the Commonwealth Government.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall be in accordance with those provided for by the Fuel and Fodder Board or the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, as the case may be, under the Factories and Shops Acts, and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be therein determined; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and all other respects.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part XIII. of the Health Act 1919, and numbered 164, to amend the provisions of By-law No. 139 fixing the dues and fees to be charged at the abattoirs of the City of Melbourne.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the provisions of By-law No. 139 with reference to the dues and fees to be charged at the abattoirs of the City of Melbourne: Now therefore the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by Act 10 George V. No. 3041 and by every other act or power enabling it in that behalf make the By-law and order as follows:—

Construction of By-law.

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 139 intituled "A By-law for the regulation and management of the abattoirs of the City of Melbourne and for fixing the dues and fees to be charged thereat."

CITY OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW No. 46.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915 and the Local Government Act 1921, and numbered 46, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential areas the erection (including the adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. The areas within the municipal district herein specified shall be, and are hereby prescribed as residential areas, that is to say, all the properties situate in or having frontages to the several streets named in the schedule hereto.

2. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses or public amusements within such residential areas shall be and is hereby prohibited.

3. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the several parts of the municipal district named in the schedule hereto.

*TOWN OF SANDRINGHAM.*

A By-law of the Town of Sandringham, made under the *Local Government Act 1915*, *Police Offences Act 1915*, *Health Act 1919*, and every other power enabling it in this behalf, and numbered 58, for controlling the management of public buildings within the boundaries of the said town, and under the jurisdiction of the council of the municipality.  
 In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—“Authorized officer” means health officer, or inspector, or acting health officer or inspector, or duly authorized municipal officer. “Public building” means any theatre, opera house, or concert, music or assembly, or cinematograph hall, or skating rink, or any arena, amphitheatre, circus, building, enclosure, gallery, platform, tent, or structure whatsoever, under the control of the council, in round, or upon, which numbers of people are usually or occasionally assembled.  
 IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Statutes and every other power enabling it in this behalf, the council in the name of the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the said town, for the purposes of carrying the said Acts into execution, orders as follows, that is to say—  
 1. No person shall leave in any manner or form in any public building during the progress of any entertainment or any

other time any glass, filth, dirt, shells of nuts, tins, fish, wrappers of confectionery, confetti, or the such like.

2. No person shall smoke tobacco or the such like in any public building, other than an arena, or rooms belonging or adjacent thereto, during the progress of an entertainment or at any other time.

3. It shall not be lawful for the lessee of any public building for the time being to produce any entertainment whatever which has been officially "prohibited."

4. No promoter of any entertainment whatsoever shall make any charge or take up any collection before, during, or after, any entertainment held on Sundays in any public building licensed under the *Theatres Act 1915*, and such entertainment will only be held on the authority of a permit granted by the Chief Secretary after approval by the council.

5. No person shall lead, incite, urge, or otherwise accompany any dog or other animal into any public building during the progress of any entertainment or at any other time.

6. No person shall expectorate in any public building or any room or outhouse adjacent and belonging thereto during the progress of any entertainment or at any other time.

7. No promoter of any entertainment whatsoever held in any public building shall prevent, oppose, or cause to prevent or oppose, the inspection of the said building by any authorized officer, whether before, during, or after the holding of any entertainment whatsoever, or at any other time.

8. No person in or adjacent to any public building before, during, or after the holding of any entertainment whatsoever or at any other time, shall behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening or insulting manner, or use any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.

9. The proprietors of any public building may from time to time make charges for the leasing of the said building for any purposes whatsoever, and may demand, collect, and recover the said amounts, from any such lessee.

10. No person will enter any public building during the period for which such building is leased unless in the proper manner such entrance fees as may be prescribed are duly paid and a ticket or other symbol received and presented.

11. Any failure against any of the aforementioned clauses will be an offence against this By-law.

12. Any person or persons who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### SHIRE OF MILDURA.

##### SHIRE OF MILDURA BUILDING REGULATIONS. BY-LAW No. 36.

###### Introductory.

A BY-LAW of the shire of Mildura (hereinafter referred to as the municipality), made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 8-20 of the *Local Government Act 1918*, and Part V. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 36, for the carrying out of certain of the purposes provided for in the said sections and part, viz.:—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections or hoarding or of fences abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings or of fences abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections or hoardings or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law and to sell the materials and apply proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings or fences and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council of the municipality for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (e) Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair or renewal of buildings, roofs or chimneys, flues, smoke vents or stove pipes.
- (f) Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.
- (g) Regulating the height, thickness, construction or material of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys and the materials for and the mode of enclosing the same.
- (h) Regulating the erection of tents.
- (i) Appointing referees as provided by and exercising all the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1918*.
- (j) Exercising all, any and every, of the powers of the said Council under the *Local Government Act* and the 13th Schedule thereto.
- (k) For repealing all By-laws and Regulations inconsistent therewith.

1. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the shire of Mildura, and shall be applicable to all workmen's allotments, as well as town allotments.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

#### PART I.

##### Definition.

3. In this By-law and the Schedule thereto, save when the context is inconsistent therewith—

"Alteration" means any change in the construction or plan of a building, or any change in the purpose for which any building or erection or any part thereof shall be used.

"Approved" means by the Council in writing (or in the case where the Surveyor is authorized by the Council so to do) approved by the Surveyor.

"Building" shall mean and include erection, structure, hoarding, and every structure of whatever kind and every part of such structure and any addition or alteration thereto.

"Building line" shall be the line which the Surveyor shall certify to be the true boundary line between a street or road and private land abutting thereon.

"Council" means the Council of the municipality.

"Dwelling house" means a building used or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

"Lane" and "Right-of-way" means a street or road less than 33 feet wide.

"Main rooms" shall be deemed to mean and include all rooms used or which in the opinion of the Council or the Surveyor shall be intended to be used as bedrooms, dining room, or ordinary living rooms, including kitchens.

"New building" includes—

(a) any building erected or commenced to be erected after the date of this By-law coming into force;

(b) any building which for more than half its cubical contents has been taken down or destroyed by fire, tempest, or otherwise, and is re-erected or commenced to be re-erected;

(c) any space between walls and/or buildings which is roofed or commenced to be roofed.

"Person" includes corporation.

"Surveyor" means the building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the time being of the municipality or other officer having for the time being the administration of this By-law.

"Shop" means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment, and also includes the saloons or shops of barbers and hairdressers and offices of agents or auctioneers and other businesses or trades.

A *bona fide* private boardinghouse shall not be included in the definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied to persons other than boarders.

"Street or road" means and includes "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.

#### PART 2.

##### *Fees and Permits.*

4. (a) No person shall commence or cause to be commenced any building or erection or any alteration or addition to any building or erection or remove or cause to be removed any building or erection or erect or cause to be erected any tent without first having paid to the Council the necessary fees in accordance with the scale set out in the First Schedule thereto.

(b) The decision of the Surveyor, subject to review by the Council, as to the area of a new building or the value of an addition shall be final and conclusive.

5. No person shall erect, build, construct, remove or make any alteration or additions to or cause to be erected, built, or constructed or removed or made any alteration or addition to any building or erection or tent without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do.

6. No person shall erect, build, construct, remove or make any alteration or addition to or cause to be erected, built, constructed or removed or made any alteration or addition to any building or erection or tent without first submitting to the Council or its Surveyor—

- (a) the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection, alteration or addition or tent, and,
- (b) the particulars required on Forms Nos. 1 and 2 (such form to be provided by the Council and available from the Shire Secretary or Surveyor);
- (c) such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be necessary to enable the Council or its Surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law applicable thereto are being complied with.

7. All plans and specifications approved by the Council shall be kept at the building or erection or tent therein referred to and shall be available for inspection by the Surveyor or the accredited officer of the Council at all reasonable times on demand during the construction or erection or alteration or addition as the case may be and for fourteen days after the completion thereof.

8. A permit obtained pursuant to this By-law shall lapse and be deemed of no effect at the expiration of six months from its grant, unless extended by resolution of the Council or unless the works covered by such permission shall have been duly completed.

##### *Duties of Surveyor.*

9. The surveyor at all reasonable times before or after the completion of any building structure erection or work affected by any of the provisions of this By-law or by any terms or conditions on which the observance of any such provisions may have been dispensed with may enter and inspect such building, structure or work.

10. The Surveyor may for the purpose of ascertaining whether any building structure or erection is in such a situation or possesses such characteristics as are required in order to exempt it from the operation of any of the provisions of this By-law at all reasonable times enter any premises and do therein all such things as are reasonably necessary for that purpose.

#### PART 3.

##### *General Provisions as to Buildings, &c.*

11. No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house and no addition to any such building shall be built, constructed or erected within a distance of fifteen feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road, the building is intended to or shall front.

12. Except as hereinafter provided no building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house and no addition with an external wall of wood to any building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house shall be built, constructed or erected—

- (a) within a distance of four feet measured horizontally of any street, road, lane or right-of-way at the side of any such building or,
- (b) within a distance of four feet measured horizontally of any land not in the same possession or occupation or,

Provided always that any such buildings or addition may abut on the building line of any street, road, lane or right-of-way at the side of such building or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom or from land not in same possession or occupation or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood, provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance such street, road, lane or right-of-way or land or building or erection as the case may be of concrete at least 6 inches in thickness or of brick or stones at least 8½ inches in thickness projecting in all cases at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back and at least 1 foot 6 inches through the roof covering of gutter adjoining the same.

13. The roof of every building shall be covered on the outside with incombustible coverings or with material approved in writing by the Council. No wood, shingle or hessian will be allowed.

14. Stables, coach-houses, garages and outbuildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are imposed in regard to dwelling houses by the last three preceding clauses, except that clause 12 shall not apply to them as far as it relates to distance from any lane or right-of-way.

Manure pits of approved design must be constructed of brick, stone or concrete, with an impervious floor of brick, concrete, tar or other approved materials and must be erected in conjunction with any stable to be erected.

No stable shall be erected or placed within 20 feet measured horizontally of any dwelling house.

15. (a) The main room in every building hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than ten feet from floor to ceiling.

(b) Provided that in the case of buildings of more than one story hereafter built or rebuilt living rooms wholly or partially in the roof may be less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling throughout not more than two-thirds of the area.

(c) No main room shall have less floor area than 100 square feet.

(d) Every main room and kitchen in a building intended to be used or which shall or may be used as a dwelling house shall have one of more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies of glass clear of sash frames free from obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room, and so constructed that a substantial part of the windows equal to at least one-twentieth of the floor area can be opened for ventilation. The requirements of this sub-clause may under special circumstances be dispensed with or modified by the Council, but in such cases other approved provision for lighting or ventilation must be made.

(e) The provisions of this clause in reference to the height, lighting and ventilation of main rooms in dwellings shall as far as applicable be extended and apply to all shops save that the windows need not be constructed so as to open if other approved provision for ventilation be made.

10. (a) The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used or shall or may be used as a dwelling house shall be constructed of lath and plaster or of approved wood or fire-resisting materials. No hessian and paper will be allowed.

(b) The foundations or footings of buildings other than wood shall not be less in width than 8 inches wider than the wall standing thereon; and a full description of foundations proposed shall be supplied with plan for approval, on which the Surveyor may determine the depth of same below the natural surface of the ground.

(c) Bricks used in any buildings shall be good, hard and well burnt, and if old or secondhand shall be thoroughly cleaned and approved of by the Council in writing before being so used.

(d) All brick or stone chimneys shall be constructed of ample flue, to be well plastered or pargetted inside for the full height and no timber of any description will be allowed to be built into the brickwork. The Council may give authority to erect iron chimneys outside the brick area, but in the erection they shall be laid on either stone or concrete base and free from all woodwork.

(e) Hearths of stone, brick or iron of approved dimensions shall be placed in front of all fireplaces.

(f) All timbers used in any buildings shall be of good, sound material, free from rot, free from large and loose knots and free from shakes and free from any imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

(g) The following conditions shall apply as to spacings and scantlings of timber:—

- (i) Stumps shall not be less than 4 inches by 4 inches redgum, jarrah, or other approved timber, spaced to 4-foot centres and fixed on 6-inch by 1½-inch by 12-inch sole plates.
- (ii) Studs and ceiling joists shall not be less than 4 inches by 1½ inch spaced not more than 24 inches apart centre to centre properly secured.

(iii) Rafters shall not be less than 4 inches by 1½ inch spaced not more than three feet centre to centre in the case of iron roofs and 18 inches centre to centre in the case of slate, tile or other similar roofs, securely braced with purlins and collar ties.

(iv) Floor joists shall not be less than 4 inches by 2 inches spaced eighteen inches apart centre to centre on 4-inch by 3-inch bearers spaced 6 feet apart.

(h) Floors shall be fixed level and in all dwellings shall be in no part less than 12 inches above the surface of the ground.

(i) The space under the ground floor of every dwelling shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

(j) Vermin plates shall be provided to all walls other than brick, stone or concrete.

(k) Every wall of brick or stone shall have an approved damp-proof course or courses of asphalt, lead or malthoid or other approved impervious material above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same material.

(l) The Surveyor shall have power to condemn and to order the removal of or to remove at the expense of the owner any material which in his opinion is not suitable for use for the purpose for which he may consider it is intended to use same, and no person shall use material so condemned for any building, erection, tent, alterations or addition.

17. (a) No person shall erect, build, construct or cause to be erected, built or constructed any building or erection which shall or may in the opinion of the Council or the Surveyor be intended to be used as a dwelling house unless the site or curtilage of such building has a superficial area of not less than 6,500 square feet and has a frontage to a street of not less than 50 lineal feet and has a depth of not less than 130 feet.

(b) After the adoption of this By-law all subdivisions or re-subdivisions of workingman's allotments or town allotments must be such as to have a frontage to a street or road of not less than 50 lineal feet and a depth of not less than 130 lineal feet. Such subdivisions or re-subdivisions must be lodged with the Shire Council for approval before commencing to build and shall apply throughout the whole of the shire of Mildura.

(c) Every dwelling house shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an area of open land not less than 2,000 square feet.

18. No shop shall be built except on land having a frontage of not less than 16 feet 6 inches to a street or road, an average depth of not less than 130 feet back access from right-of-way 10 feet in width at the least, and a total area of not less than 2,145 square feet. Provided that in every case where building is used as a shop or dwelling rooms are attached to a shop there shall be an open space or yard free from all buildings of not less than 600 square feet for the exclusive use of the occupiers of such shop and dwelling room.

Provided further that when any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was in the opinion of this Council owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and not part of any allotment of which a portion has been alienated or excised since the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land, or such allotment is shown on any plan of subdivision heretofore approved by the Council. The Council on application in writing may by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of the members of the Council at a meeting of which due notice has been given, permit a shop, which shall comply with the Building Regulations of the town, to be erected upon such land.

19. No land upon which any dwelling house has been erected shall thereafter be reduced in area, below the minimum area prescribed by this By-law. Provided always that notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary the Council may, on application in writing setting forth the grounds of the application, under special circumstances, and for special causes, and at a meeting of which due notice has been given to each councillor declare that the provisions of this By-law either in whole or in part shall not apply to any particular area of land.

20. No building shall be erected in such a position that it shall lie between another building or any part thereof and street unless such other building has a direct and unobstructed access to some other street at least 16 feet wide.

21. Two but not more residences may be erected together in one block provided that they shall be separated from each other by a wall of concrete or of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches in thickness projecting in the case of wooden houses at least one inch through the woodwork front and back and in all cases projecting one foot 6 inches at least through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, whether belonging to the same owner or not. Each building or dwelling

house in a block shall be subject to the provisions of this By-law applicable to its class save that the site or curtilage of each of such buildings shall have a superficial area of at least four thousand square feet and a frontage or at least 33 lineal feet to a street or road.

22. (a) No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure, dimensions and materials as set forth on the plan and specifications for the time adopted by resolution of the Council, and the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than eight feet six inches above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

(b) No openings shall be made in the roof of such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such openings be properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with a fine-mesh wire or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the Council.

23. No fowl house or buildings designed or used for the use of poultry shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any building used as a dwelling, whether on the same allotment or otherwise. No building of the description referred to in this clause shall be erected except to the rear of any building house on the same allotment.

24. Privies, Closets, &c.—Privies, closets, &c., shall be erected in accordance with the design adopted by the Council. They shall be erected with the back of same abutting on the lane or right-of-way—the side of such privies or closets must not be closer than two feet measured horizontally of land not in the same possession.

They shall be built of brick, stone, wood, iron or other approved material and be provided with proper pan doors and fastenings and shall be in accordance with the Council's requirements.

No closet of hessian or bags will be allowed and further no privy or closet built in an unworkmanlike manner of short boards or packing cases will be allowed.

No closet should be erected within 10 feet of any door or window of a building used as a shop or dwelling.

Urinals.—Where required urinals shall be erected to a design approved by the Council. The floor thereof shall be constructed of approved impervious material.

25. If in the opinion of the Council any building has been allowed to fall into an unsafe or insanitary condition, either by faulty construction or any other cause, the Council may give notice in writing to the owner or occupier to repair said building, and in the event of no action being taken within seven days by the said owner or occupier to remedy any defect complained of in the said notice the said owner or occupier shall be liable to a fine as hereinafter provided until such time as the building shall be placed in a safe and sanitary condition and the owner or occupier will be liable for all charges incurred in doing the necessary works, and moreover if in the opinion of the Council any building does not warrant the expense of repairing, the owner after receiving notice shall remove the building within seven (7) days; failing this he will be liable to a fine as hereinafter mentioned, until such time as the building shall be removed or if the owner fails to remove the building after receiving the notice, the Council may remove same and charge the owner with the cost of so doing and recover the same in any Court of competent jurisdiction and/or sell the material to cover the cost of taking down.

26. (a) Proper provision shall be made and maintained for effectively removing water and sanitary and other drainage away from every building. The materials and construction of such drains shall be such as shall be approved by the Council, or its Surveyor.

(a) No dwelling shall consist of less than three main rooms of a total of not less than 300 square feet, and no building or rooms thereof shall be occupied for living purposes, until at least three main rooms thereof shall have been completed according to the plans and specifications submitted to and approved by the Council.

(b) The Council may in special cases grant permission for the erection of a dwelling house containing not less than two rooms.

(c) These classes A and B apply to town allotments but the Council reserve the right to enforce the same in regard to the workingmen's allotments should they consider it necessary.

28. The Surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and after the completion of any building or addition or alteration to any building affected by this By-law may and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition or alteration.

29. The Surveyor may at all times stop the progress of any building and withdraw or suspend any permission given by the Council under this By-law in the event of his not being satisfied that all the provisions of this By-law are being complied with and any person who continues or builds or erects or works on the site after notice from the Surveyor to desist shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

30. Before the erection of any hoarding a plan of position and construction thereof shall be submitted to the Council for approval. In the event of any hoarding being erected without the authority of the Council or not complying with the requirements of the Council the owner shall within one (1) day of receiving notice in writing from the Council remove same.

31. *Drainage.*—No person shall build or erect or cause or permit to be built or erected any building, erection, tent or addition to any building, erection or tent on any land unless and until such building, erection, tent or addition and the site and curtilage thereof can be properly drained, and the Council may refuse permission to build and erect any building, erection or tent or addition unless and until it is satisfied that the proposed building, erection, tent or addition and the site and curtilage thereof can be properly drained.

#### PART IV.

##### Tents.

32. No tent shall be erected or used except for the exclusive use of members of the household of the owner or occupier of the site or curtilage upon which the tent is proposed to be erected and no tent shall be erected except at the rear of the dwelling house on such site or curtilage and no person shall be permitted to erect more than one tent on one allotment. No farmhouse will be allowed to be erected without the consent of the Council.

33. No tent shall be erected within 20 feet of any street or road nor within ten (10) feet from an adjoining allotment.

34. No tent shall be erected or used unless it is proved to the satisfaction of the Surveyor—

(1) That there are proper permanent and sufficient sanitary conveniences for the use of prospective occupiers of the tent and all other occupiers of the property within the same fences.

(2) That there is an open space of at least 500 square feet for each tent within the same fence. This clause does not apply to workmen's allotments—unless the same shall have been subdivided.

35. The proprietors or representatives of all circuses, merry-go-rounds and other travelling shows shall give at least 24 hours' notice of their intention to erect a tent or other structure and also comply with the following:—

(a) Furnish the Surveyor with the approval of the owner of the land upon which they intend erecting same.

(b) Satisfy the Surveyor that satisfactory arrangements have been made for living and sanitary purposes during the period of their stay.

(c) Give guarantee accompanied by a deposit of £1 that the land will be properly cleaned up before they leave the same.

(d) Satisfy the Engineer or other officer appointed by the Council that the seating, lighting and construction is safe to the public. Subject to the compliance with the foregoing provisions the Council may grant a permit for a stipulated time, at the same time the Council retains the right to cancel the permit if any breach of the Council's Regulations is made.

#### PART V.

##### Removal of Buildings.

36. No building or erection shall be removed into and erected or re-erected in the municipality or removed from one part of the municipality to and erected or re-erected in another part thereof unless the owner or person carrying out the removal first obtain written permission from the Council so to do. Before such permission shall be granted not less than seven (7) clear days' notice in writing shall be given to the Council or the Surveyor of the desire to remove and erect or re-erect such building or erection.

Such notice shall contain or be accompanied by the following:—

(a) Particulars of the situation of building which it is proposed to remove.

(b) Particulars of the situation of and a plan of the land upon which it is proposed to erect or re-erect or place such building showing the proposed position thereon and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.

(c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building and any proposed alterations or additions thereto and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.

(d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is erected or re-erected.

(e) Evidence satisfactory to the Council that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary or unfit for human habitation and a certificate from the Health Officer of the municipality from which the building is proposed to be removed that within a reasonable time prior to date of removal no case of disease of an infectious or contagious nature has occurred therein.

(f) Such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be sufficient to enable the Council or its Surveyor to determine if all the provisions of any Act of Parliament By-law or Regulation applicable thereto are or will be complied with.

37. No written permission shall be given unless such removed building when erected or re-erected shall comply with the provisions of this By-law as applicable to new buildings.

38. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated insanitary or unfit for human habitation shall be removed into or re-erected within the municipality.

39. No building or erection in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during preceding six months shall be removed into or re-erected within the municipality.

40. No removed building shall be occupied until the Surveyor shall have certified in writing that all the provisions of this By-law have been observed and complied with in respect of such building.

41. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands, provided that in its altered position it shall comply in all respects with this By-law and that in the progress of such removal the building be not taken on to any street, road or public place.

42. If the Surveyor shall certify in writing to the Council that any building or erection has been removed into, erected or re-erected within the municipality or occupied contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law or that any removed building, erection or structure is in such a dilapidated ruinous or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety the Council or any officer thereof or other authorized agent may give the owner, occupier or builder or leave upon the site of such building or erection a notice in writing requiring such owner to alter or repair to remove or pull down such building, erection or structure within such time as is limited by such notice, and such owner, occupier or builder shall comply with such notice within the time therein limited.

43. If any building erection or tent shall be wholly or partly built or erected, added to or altered contrary to or not in conformity with the provisions of this By-law the Council or any officer thereof or other authorized agent may give to the owner, occupier or builder or leave upon the site of such building, erection or tent notice in writing to bring such building, erection or tent into conformity with the provisions or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, and such owner, occupier or builder shall comply with such notice within the time therein limited.

44. If default shall be made in complying with any notice mentioned in the last two preceding clauses then notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the said Council by its Surveyor, officer or other authorized agent or agents to enter upon any building, erection or tent and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and for that purpose to break down any fence surrounding the land on which building, erection or tent is situate and to demolish and pull down the said building, erection or tent or any part or parts thereof and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose and to remove the material thereof to some convenient place and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Surveyor, officer or other authorized agent or agents in demolishing and pulling down the said building, erection or tent or any part thereof or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same and in doing other acts as aforesaid and all fees and penalties due by the owner occupier or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale and the Council shall restore the surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner, occupier or builder or other person legally entitled thereto on demand and any deficiency shall be made good and paid by the owner, occupier or builder to the Council on demand.

##### Exempted Buildings.

45. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, ferneries, aviary or to outbuildings which outbuildings are on an area of not less than 2½ acres used for horticultural or similar purposes only or to temporary and removable offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding six months.

46. This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria or of the municipality.

##### Special Areas.

47. No person shall erect, build, construct or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building other than in brick, stone concrete or other approved material within 60 feet of any street or road limit, on any of the allotments mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto or added to such Schedule by resolution of the Council.

Where a building of stone, brick or other approved material shall adjoin or be within five (5) feet of a building of wood, iron or other approved material erected upon the same allotment of land—then there shall be erected a parapet of stone, brick or other approved material of at least two feet high between such buildings.

*Referees.*

48. The Council shall appoint a Referee as provided by the *Local Government Act 1918* to act with a referee appointed by the Governor in Council and exercise the powers as provided in the said Act.

49. If any doubt, difference or dissatisfaction in respect of any matter as to which provision is made by or under this By-law arises between any parties concerned or between any party and the Surveyor for the municipality as to—

- (a) any act done or to be done in pursuance of this By-law;
- (b) the effect of the provisions of this By-law;
- (c) the mode in which the provisions and directions of this By-law are or ought to be carried into effect;
- (d) Whether the requirements implied in terms of qualification applied to sites to soils to materials or to workmanship or otherwise and denoting good sound fireproof, fit, proper or sufficient are fulfilled in certain cases;
- (e) the expenses to be borne by the respective owners of premises parted by the same party walls or the proportions thereof;
- (f) the proportions of expense to be borne by the occupiers or by the owner of premises in respect of any works executed;
- (g) any other matter whatever;

Any party concerned may require the referees on appeal to determine such matter upon a requisition by notice in writing to the Shire Secretary setting forth either generally or otherwise the matters in respect of which the determination of the referees is required and the referees shall subject to the *Local Government Act 1918* hear and determine the same.

*Penalties.*

50. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law or shall fail to duly comply with any notice thereunder shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is a continuing one to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

51. No person shall erect, build, or construct, remove or make any alteration or addition to or cause to be erected, built or constructed removed or made any alterations or additions to any building or erection or tent contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

*General.*

## REGULATIONS FOR THE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF LAKE HAWTHORN RESERVES.

## REGULATIONS.

NO vehicle used for hire, or transport of goods, stores, or materials of any description, bearing either name or number shall be allowed within the reserve without permission in writing of the council, and no person shall ride or drive therein except on the carriage roads, and no person shall train horses within the reserve.

2. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, birds, fish, or other property in the reserve, or throw stones or other missiles or commit any nuisance therein, or leave thereon any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences in and around the reserves, or stick bills on the fences or gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, or write on the seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface or injure the same.

4. Any person found in the state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using obscene language or creating or taking part in any disturbance in the reserve shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, and to prosecution.

5. No person except those authorized by or in the employ of the council shall enter any of the enclosed plantations, shrubberies, &c., in the reserve.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog for coursing or other purpose of sport, or for bathing. All goats or poultry found in the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

7. No person shall depasture any horses or cattle in the reserve without permission, in writing, of the council, and then only in such portions thereof as may be specified in such permission.

8. No person shall hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description in the reserve without having obtained permission, written from the council, and no person shall light any fires within the reserve without special permission, in writing, from the council.

9. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports shall not be played or take place within the reserve on Sundays, and on other days shall be played or take place in such places only as the council may direct.

10. No person shall convey into the reserve or place upon the lake therein any boat in respect of which a licence or other authority from the council has not been obtained.

11. All proposed buildings in the reserve and all piers and jetties in connexion with the lake therein shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plans to be submitted to and approved by the council.

12. The council shall be at liberty at any time to require any buildings or erections in the reserve to be altered or removed, and no stakes or posts shall be driven into the bed of the lake without the authority, in writing, of the council having first been obtained.

13. Fishing in the lake shall not be permitted without special permission, in writing, of the council.

14. Permits for the temporary occupation of sites within the reserve and for any special privilege in connexion therewith shall, if issued, be subject to such terms and conditions as may from time to time be approved by the council, and no person shall occupy any site within the reserve or enjoy any special privilege therein, unless the consent of the council has been first obtained.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation no boat of any description shall be placed on Lakes Hawthorn or Ranfurly without first obtaining a certificate in writing from the shire engineer stating the seaworthiness of same, such certificate to be produced to the shire secretary when application is being made for registration.

Every person offending against the Regulations shall, in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1915* on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the council, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
