## GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 14th day of November, 1922, directed that the following alterations be made in the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts which were made under the provisions of the *Audit Act 1915* by Order in Council dated the 23rd December, 1915:—

At the end of clause 29 the following sub-clause to be added:—

"(g) The State Electricity Commission, as regards the purchase of goods, &c., in connexion with the Commission's general store at Yallourn."

At the end of clause 67 the following words to be added:—

"The provisions of this clause shall not apply to the State Electricity Commission as regards the sale of packing cases and other unserviceable articles from the Commission's stores."

## Marine Act 1915.

THE Marine Board of Victoria, under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by section 79 of the *Marine Act 1915*, to reduce with the approval of the Governor in Council the rates of pilotage on ships arriving at or departing from any of the ports of Victoria, hereby ordains as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of the coming into force of these presents the pilotage from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, in the case of steam-ships up to 5,000 tons of the vessel's burthen, shall be at the rate of one penny three farthings (1½d.) per ton, calculated on the net registered tonnage, which rate is hereby fixed in substitution for that of twopence and one-third of a penny (2½d.) expressed as payable for the service in the amending Order passed by the Board on the 4th day of May last passed.

2. These presents when approved by the Governor in Council shall come into force on and from the first day of January, 1923.

The foregoing reduction was fixed and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

SHIRE OF BET BET.

RATING BY-LAW NO. 1 MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF BET BET UNDER THE POWERS CONFERRED BY THE WATER ACTS.

THE following are the rates which owners and occupiers of houses and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year ending 30th September, 1923, in respect of water supplied by the Bet Bet Shire Council within the township of Tarnagulla, that is to say:—

On every occupied private tenement connected by pipe with the Council's main and on all stores and business places where one horse only is kept, a sum of One pound sterling.

On every tenement not connected with the main and on every unoccupied tenement, Ten shillings sterling.

On every store-room, Five shillings sterling.

On every store or business place where two or more horses are kept, on all butchers' premises, and all bank premises, Two pounds sterling.

On all hotels, including attached stables and domiciles, Two pounds ten shillings sterling.

On all Government buildings, including quarters, Three pounds sterling.

In all the above cases water shall be for domestic purposes only.

For every boiler used to generate steam for milling or other industrial purposes, a charge of Ten pounds shall be made, the Council reserving the right to discontinue the supply when necessary to conserve a domestic supply for householders.

No person shall attach a hose to any tap or pipe for the purpose of watering gardens. Any person so using water without written permission from the Council will be liable to be prosecuted.

The above rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1923, and such person as the Bet Bet Shire Council may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the above said rates.

9. Victorian railways, requiring water, a charge of 1s. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

10. On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 5s. per annum.

11. The rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance, namely, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1923, and the charges for the supply of water shall also be payable in like manner, or as may be demanded in the case of the service being by meter.

12. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1923:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such landowners, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements if not on such street are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1923, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1923, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

(a) On every house or tenement of £20 annual municipal valuation or under, Twenty shillings per annum.

(b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of £20, at the rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.

(c) On all vacant allotments of land, at the rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of municipal value thereof, except where there is a water service to the allotment, when the minimum charge shall be One pound.

(d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of .6d. per hundred gallons, or 6d. for any fractional part thereof, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

(e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under the terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per one thousand gallons.

(f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, and butchers, livery and coach horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by agreement or measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(h) Private water troughs shall be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed Twenty pounds. Such trough charge of Twenty shillings shall mean to include the rate of valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary.

(i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of 1s. per thousand gallons, by measurement at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.

(j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of 1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

(k) The service for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust to the Premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

(1) For domestic supply of premises with annual municipal value of £40 or over, a three quarter-inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust. For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal valuation, half-inch diameter.

(2) For the supply of water other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall order in each case.

(l) Each house or tenement must be provided with separate service from the main.

(m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for domestic supply may be allowed for at the discretion of the Trust.

2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and all charges for water supplied otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1923, and the first day of July, 1923.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when owner or occupier shall become liable to pay rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Lorne Waterworks Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Winchelsea, in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1923, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1923, provided that the sum of Ten shillings shall be the minimum of rates to be paid annually by every occupier or owner of unoccupied land, and provided that £2 shall be the minimum of rates to be paid annually by every occupier or owner of every house and tenement.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in one moiety of Two shillings, and shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1923. Interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum from 1st January, 1923, shall be chargeable on any rate not paid on or before 1st September, 1923.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Lorne Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

#### MORWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1923.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1923 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Morwell Waterworks Trust which District has for the purposes of the Water Acts been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be made on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Morwell, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Five pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

3. For every public water trough, the sum of One pound (£1).

4. For every livery, coach, and carriers' stables the sum of Five shillings per annum for the first stall, and Five shillings per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds and for stabling, each six feet is to be considered one stall.

5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would equal the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

7. The Trust may by notice in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon, such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

8. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of January, 1923.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

## RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923, No. 28.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to, and in exercise of, the powers conferred by the said Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the Trust:—

(1) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Forty shillings.

(2) For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound sterling, but the minimum rate shall in no case be less than Forty shillings.

(3) For every unoccupied allotment of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land. Provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Fifteen shillings be charged.

(4) For all the lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one quarter of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one-eighth of the full rate shall be paid.

(5) For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling; and all water used in excess of 95,000 gallons shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(6) All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be at the following rates:—30,000 for the first Forty shillings of the assessed water rate, and for each additional Twenty shillings of assessed rate or portion thereof at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons; all excess water shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.

(7) Water supplied to the Government Department, religious denominations, public parks, bowling greens, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

(8) The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1923. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

(9) Such person or persons as the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

(10) No person without previously having affixed a water meter to his service pipe, shall use for other than domestic purposes, water supplied by the Trust. Domestic purposes shall not extend to the supply of water for horses or cows.

(11) No meter shall be affixed until it has been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being, that such meter is in proper order.

(12) Any person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

(13) Every meter shall be fixed truly level with connexions above the ground, approved by the Trust's supervising officer, which must, wherever practicable, be level with the ground, and within three feet of the building line of the property. Two wrought-iron bends must be affixed on each side of the meter or lead connexions used. The use of elbows will not be permitted.

(14) The Trust will, on application, supply a meter at cost price for cash on delivery or on time payment on the following terms:—Ten shillings cash deposit, and the balance bearing interest of eight per centum per annum by annual payments of Ten shillings.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the shire of Upper Yarra as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

“It shall be lawful for any tobacconist's shop within the municipal district of the shire of Upper Yarra to be kept open until the hour of Eight o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in every week.”

REGULATIONS FOR STORAGE OF PETROLEUM, ETC.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Local Government Act 1921 (No. 3167) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the city of Melbourne and the city of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping or storage of petroleum or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable fluids and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Melbourne, and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by the Council of the City of Melbourne for the purposes for which these Regulations are now made, and shall take effect from the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette:—

REGULATIONS.

Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

1. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all buildings shall be first approved of by the Council.
- (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron or other non-inflammable material except that in the case of a galvanized-iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
- (3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
- (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored or retained in any such buildings.

Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

2. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits stairways or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.

- (2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass earthenware or metal and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, railways or adjoining premises.

Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers.

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.

4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—

- (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade where practicable.
- (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the premises.
- (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale.

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—"Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away."

Regulations not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits.

6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.

Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.

7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
- (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank but such opening shall contain a liquid tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

**Power to Enter and Inspect.**

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

**Offence.**

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

**Penalty.**

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

**Definitions.**

11. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context "approved" means approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said city or any deputy appointed by the Council to act for him. "Council" means the Council of the city of Melbourne. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

**SCHEDULE.**

Methylated spirits, benzine, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test.
