By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to amend the Law relating to Contracts or Agreements by way of Gaming or Wagering."
"An Act to provide for the Registration of Architects."

No. 137.—18156.—Price 6d.; Quarterly, 7s. 7d.; Half-Yearly, 15s. 2d.; Yearly, 30s. 4d.

"An Act to amend the Law of Libel with respect to Reports of Proceedings of Meetings of Municipal Councils."

"An Act relating to certain Unexpended Balances under certain Surplus Revenue Acts."

"An Act to amend Section Ninety of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915*."

CONDITIONS.—SERVICE "A."

1. The successful tenderer (hereinafter called the "Contractor") shall provide a service of motor cars having a carrying capacity of at least twenty-three (23) passengers, and an auxiliary service of coaches having a carrying capacity of at least forty (40) passengers for a service during the months September to May inclusive, and a service of coaches having a carrying capacity of at least 63 passengers during the months June to August inclusive, suitable and efficient in the opinion of the superintending officer of the Board of Land and Works (hereinafter called the "Board"), for the purposes of carrying passengers between the railway stations at Bright or Porepunkah, and the houses of accommodation thereat, and the Government Chalet, Mount Buffalo, making at least four trips each way weekly, if required, during the months September to May both inclusive, and at least three trips each way weekly, if required, during the months June to August, both inclusive, at times suitable to the train service between Melbourne and Bright or Porepunkah, provided that it shall not be obligatory on the Contractor to provide a coach service during the months September to May inclusive unless and until the carrying capacity of the motor service hereinbefore prescribed is exceeded on any occasion.

1. The successful tenderer (hereinafter called the "Contractor") shall provide a sufficient number of horses and horse vehicles, together with an auxiliary service of motor cars having a carrying capacity of at least twelve passengers, suitable and efficient in the opinion of the superintending officer of the Board of Land and Works (hereinafter called the "Board"), for the purpose of conveying passengers between the Railway Stations at Bright or Porepunkah and the houses of accommodation thereat, and the Government Chalet, Mount Buffalo, making at least three trips each way weekly, if required, at times suitable to the train service between Melbourne and Bright or Porepunkah, provided that it shall not

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. The horses, vehicles, motor cars, and drivers shall be subject to the approval of the superintending officer, and the Contractor shall, on demand, immediately withdraw any horse vehicle, motor car, or driver who may be considered by the superintending officer as unsuitable for the service.

(Motor cars shall be subject to expert examination and the Contractor shall facilitate such examinations.)

2. The Contractor shall not demand or exact from any passenger a fare or charge in excess of the rates stipulated by him in his tender.

3. The Contractor shall be bound to carry and give preference to any passengers who may hold combined rail and coach tickets at the fares stipulated by him in his tender, and shall enter into an agreement with the Victorian Railways Commissioners to that effect.

4. The Contractor shall carry free of charge passengers' personal luggage not exceeding 23 lbs. in weight for each adult and not exceeding 14 lbs. in weight for each child between four and fourteen years of age, and may impose and collect from any passenger the prescribed charges for the conveyance of any luggage in excess of the stipulated free allowance.

5. The Contractor and his servants shall observe, comply with, and be bound by all regulations issued by the proper authorities in respect of the National Park, Mount Buffalo, and shall conform to the current time-table for the regulation of motor and other vehicular traffic on the Government road between Bright and Mount Buffalo, or any subsequent additions to or amendments thereof which the Board may consider it expedient to make.

6. Each driver of a horse vehicle used for the purpose of this contract shall remain within such distance of the horse attached thereto as will enable him to effectively control such horse.

7. The Contractor shall not employ any chauffeur not properly qualified, or who does not hold the necessary authority to drive a motor car.

11. The Contractor shall not assign, transfer, or sublet the contract without the written permission of the Board.

12. The contract may be cancelled by the Board or the Contractor at the termination of six calendar months' notice in writing.

13. RATING BY-LAW.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, do make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 23.

By-law for the making of a rate on all rateable property comprised within the boundaries of the District of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust, such District having been proclaimed an Urban District.

(1) A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust District according to the valuation for the time being of all tenements for the municipal rates of the shire of Swan Hill, with a minimum payment of One pound sterling.

(2) A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of all unoccupied land within the Trust District, in all cases where a main is laid, serves or passes such land, or within two chains of such land whether connected with such main or not—with a minimum charge of One pound sterling on each allotment, having an area of a quarter of an acre, and not exceeding half an acre, and for every additional similar acre, One pound sterling, or, having an area less than a quarter of an acre, Ten shillings.

(3) A rate of Fifteen shillings (15s.) on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre, and not exceeding half an acre on all unoccupied land within the Trust District not previously rated under this By-law.

(4) A rate of Ten shillings (10s.) on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre, and not exceeding half an acre, on all unoccupied land within the Trust District not previously rated under this By-law, and being situated more than five chains but not exceeding ten chains from a Trust main.

(5) A rate of Six shillings (6s.) on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre and not exceeding half an acre, on all unoccupied land within the Trust District not previously rated under this By-law and being situated more than ten chains from a Trust main.

The foregoing rate is hereby made for the year 1923, commencing on the first day of January and ending the thirty-first day of December, 1923.

(6) Such rate is hereby made payable in two half-yearly instalments, one half on the first day of January and the other half on the first day of July, 1923.

(7) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, or sue for the said rate.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers and owners of the lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1923 in respect to the water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of Seventeen pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of One pound five shillings and sixpence sterling.
2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land, of an annual valuation exceeding Seventeen pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.
3. For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charges shall be Five shillings for each stall or loosebox. In open sheds used for stabling each space of 5 (five) feet shall be charged as a stall.
4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1923.
5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 24.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authority conferred upon it by the Water Acts, and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Three shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sixteen shillings.
- (b) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Five shillings.
- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) Occupied or unoccupied land where water is supplied from a stand-pipe shall be charged Sixpence for every 100 gallons.
- (e) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse power for each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) On buildings in course of erection when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of such work or by special agreement, wooden houses shall be charged half rate, payment to be made before supply is given.
- (g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be made before a supply can be taken or used. In each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be taken or used.
- (h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or for land supplied otherwise than by measure.

- (j) The rate hereby made shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1923.
- (k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1923 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Melvor but no rate in any case shall be less than Two pounds.
2. A rate of ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.
3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged half of the amount of the assessed rate.
4. Tenements exceeding one quarter but not exceeding one half a mile from a stand-pipe shall be charged one quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.
5. For water supplied by measure a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.
6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum to be charged for shall be the quantity which at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.
7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and the first of July, 1923.
8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1923, No. 5.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Hepburn Waterworks Trust do hereby pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for the year 1923, upon all the lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say:—

The rates and charges shall be payable by the occupiers and owners of the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Hepburn Waterworks District as follows:—

1. On all properties of an annual valuation of £16 or over, the sum equivalent to a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling per annum.
2. On all properties of an annual valuation of and under £16, the sum of £2 minimum per annum.
3. Vacant lands shall be rated at Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the annual valuation provided the sum paid shall not be less than Ten shillings.

On properties within a quarter of a mile of any main, one half of the above rate.

6. Such before-mentioned rates and charges shall be based on the municipal valuation of the shire of Glenlyon, for the time being and shall be payable half yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1923.

MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Mortlake Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust, and with the minimum charges, and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust.

(1) For every house, including not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ acre of land, and of annual municipal value of £20 and under, the maximum charge shall be Thirty shillings.

(2) For every house, &c., of annual municipal value of £21 to £60 inclusive, a rate of Two shillings in the £ shall be paid, and any such properties exceeding £60 annual municipal value, shall pay a rate of One shilling in the £ for every £ over and above £60 annual valuation.

(3) All shops and places of business, with an annual municipal value below £20, shall be rated at Two shillings in the £.

(4) Land adjoining house properties of value not exceeding £20, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for each $\frac{1}{2}$ acre over and above the $\frac{1}{2}$ acre allowed with the house, up to a maximum of Ten shillings.

(5) Detached allotments shall be charged for as follows:—Not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre Five shillings; not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre Seven shillings and sixpence, not exceeding 1 acre Ten shillings, not exceeding $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres Twelve shillings and sixpence, not exceeding 2 acres Fifteen shillings, and if more than 2 acres Twenty shillings.

(6) The charge for water supplied by the Trust, by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(7) For water supplied to public buildings, and other similar properties, the charge shall be as follows:—Police Station, State School, Post Office, Railway Station, and Stationmaster's Residence, £2. Mechanics' Institute and Recreation Reserve, £1 10s. Masonic Hall and Temperance Hall, £1 per annum. The water for church and Sunday school grounds shall not be charged for.

(8) For every public water trough, with or without stand-pipe, the charge shall be £4 per annum.

(9) The Trust may, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier, using water for domestic or other purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within 21 days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, and at his own expense, provide and fix an approved meter, failing which the property shall be disconnected until such meter is installed.

(10) Provided that where any person desires to have the service pipe of the Trust extended to his property, and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have the power to make a special arrangement with him regarding the payment of the water supplied.

(11) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

(12) In the event of any dispute which may arise, regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special charge.

(13) The beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the first day of February, 1923, except in the cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be annual and payable on the first day of December in each year.

(14) For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge of 1s. for every 200 gallons or under.

(15) Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law, the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Mortlake Waterworks Trust.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fourteen pounds and not exceeding the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds, the sum of One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence per annum (£1 17s. 6d.).

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds, the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling upon the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

On every unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated from the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district separately from any buildings, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling upon the amount of the municipal valuation.

On every house, tenement, or land situated otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which house or tenement is not supplied with the water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any standpipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such house, tenement, or land is over a quarter of a mile of such standpipe and within a half of a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance in one amount on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three.

In construction of this By-law the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK IN THE PARISH OF TARWIN (POINT SMYTHE).

WE, Charles Clarence Kelly, Thomas Henderson, jun., Arthur Dodgshun Brown, Alfred Harvey, Reuben Woodhouse, Joseph David Holmes, and Albert J. Ruttle, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park in the parish of Tarwin (Point Smythe) having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind thereon.
5. No person shall damage or interfere with the water supply in the Reserve.
6. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect thereon any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.
10. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
12. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 71.

Alterations to By-laws Nos. 62 and 70.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 71, for altering and amending By-laws 62 and 70 regulating the construction and erection of buildings, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

- (1) That By-law 62, Part 2, clause 1, be amended by adding after the words "50 feet" "and a minimum depth of 100 feet," and after the words "or such other frontage" "and depth."
- (2) That By-law No. 62, Part 2, be amended by adding "that owners of 66-feet allotments in Fairfield Riding on which one house was erected prior to 29th day of August, 1917, in such a position that 38 feet or more ground remains unbuilt upon, may erect another house upon 35 feet provided new house complies otherwise with all conditions and limitation of By-laws in regard to buildings."
- (3) That By-law No. 70, clause 3, be amended by adding—"also on a shopping allotment, outbuildings built in brick with parapet boundary wall may abut on neighbouring allotments."
- (4) That clause 9 of By-law 70 be repealed and the following clause substituted:—"Every building to be used as a shop, office, hotel, warehouse, factory or for similar purposes or any other building included in Classes B and C any part of which is used or intended to be used as a dwelling, shall have a separate entrance to dwelling portion, except where sewerage is already connected or available at once or there is a right-of-way at rear of premises, and no wall of such dwelling-house portion shall be nearer than 5 feet to land not in the same occupation unless such wall be a blind and parapet wall of brick, stone or concrete."
- (5) That the following words be added to clause 7 of By-law 70:—"This clause shall only apply to shops erected prior to 2nd day of November, 1921."

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 16th day of May, 1922, and confirmed on the 20th day of June, 1922.

4. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purposes for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

5. Should a business or trade, &c., established in a building prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and contrary to its provisions, be removed, become defunct or closed down, the Council may on receipt of an application in writing grant permission for the building to be used for such other purposes as the Council think reasonable in the circumstances.

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SHIRE OF STRATHFIELDSAYE.

BY-LAW No. 53.

Regulation of Traction Engine Traffic.

The Council of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye, at a meeting held on the 18th day of August, 1921, passed a resolution adopting By-law No. 53 for the regulation of Traction Engine Traffic, and on the 15th day of December, 1921, such resolution was confirmed, and the By-law, as published below, sealed:—

A By-law of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye, made under subsection 30, section 197, of *Local Government Act 1915*, for Prohibiting or Regulating the use on any public highway of Traction Engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions of which Traction Engines may proceed over any public highway within the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors and Rate-payers of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips or Other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any Traction Engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any Traction Engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such machine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width, and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any Traction Engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross-bars, not exceeding three inches provided in such last-mentioned case.

(I) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council, duly authorized in that behalf, a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

(II) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert, by such engine, or any vehicle, drawn by it, or by any building or other material upon such vehicle or being drawn by such engine.

(III) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf), to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(IV) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(V) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) conforms to the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and the *Country Roads Act 1915*, as regards the width of the tires.

Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine Contains in Itself Sufficient Motive Power to move it.

2. So long as the fires of a Traction Engine are alight or the Traction Engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to use it, one person shall remain in attendance, whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

Taking Engine Across or Along Bridges, Embankments, Etc.

3. No person shall take any Traction Engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

Engine Not to Halt on Certain Parts of Highway.

4. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances, or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

Engines Not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.

5. No person shall permit any Traction Engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby, to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water or for any other purpose whatever.

Driving Engine Between Sunset and Sunrise.

6. No person shall drive any Traction Engine between sunset and sunrise unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side on the front, and one on the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine, Etc.

7. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any Traction Engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks at least twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine or no vehicle of five tons or over shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks. The weight of such vehicle shall be ascertained by measurement in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1915*, and *Country Roads Act 1915*, or the regulations thereunder.

Skidding of Wheels of Engine.

8. The driver of a Traction Engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all the necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

Penalties.

9. Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

(a) For the first offence a fine not exceeding Three Pounds.

(b) For the second offence a fine not exceeding Five Pounds.

(c) For any subsequent offence a fine not exceeding Ten Pounds.

Extent of Operations of By-law.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye.

BY-LAW No. 18.

A By-law of the Shire of Upper Yarra made under the *Health Act 1919* and numbered 18.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Upper Yarra, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the area prescribed in the first schedule hereto.

3. The occupier of every house, building or premises within the prescribed area shall cause to be provided and cause to be kept within the fences or walls enclosing such house, building or premises a receptacle with a close-fitting cover not exceeding four cubic feet in contents, constructed of 24-gauge galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight with handle thereto so that the same may be water-tight when there are any be readily and conveniently removable by such person or persons as the said Council may appoint for the purpose.

4. Every such occupier shall cause all dust, ashes or other house refuse produced, collected or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

6. The occupier of every house, building or premises within the area set out in the first schedule hereto shall on the days from time to time appointed for the removal of garbage cause such receptacle to be placed and kept between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. in the yard of such house, building or premises at a distance not exceeding ten feet from the entrance to such yard from a street, lane or right-of-way so that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the person or persons appointed by the Council for the purpose, and no such occupier shall place any such receptacle or permit same to be placed in or on any street, lane or right-of-way.

7. No person shall place or deposit any house refuse or garden refuse in any street, road, right-of-way, or river reserve.

8. Every stable within the area prescribed by the first schedule hereto shall be paved with impervious material which shall be either concrete, brick, or stone, and such stable shall be kept clean and in an inoffensive condition.

9. At every stable within the area prescribed by the first schedule hereto there shall be provided a manure pit constructed of concrete or brickwork in cement and the walls thereof shall be not less than nine inches in thickness and the floor shall be paved with brick or concrete to a thickness of not less than three inches and the capacity of each such pit shall be not less than one and a half cubic yards.

10. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Schedule 1.

The area bounded on the East by the bridge over the River Yarra, on the Donna Buang-road; on the West by the bridge over Scotchman's Creek on the Main Warburton-road; on the North by the River Yarra; and on the South by the Main Warburton-road.

Resolution adopting the above By-law No. 18 was passed at a meeting of the Council on the 4th day of September, 1922, and confirmed on the 2nd day of October, 1922.
