RULES OF COURT AS TO THE STATUTORY COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS by Section 25 of the *Supreme Court Act* 1915 the Judges of the Supreme Court may make rules of Court for the purposes therein mentioned and whereas by Section 23 of the *Law Institute Act* 1917 any two Judges of the Supreme Court may make rules of Court for the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore we the undersigned being Judges of the said Court do in pursuance of the said powers make the following rules of Court.

PRELIMINARY.

INTERPRETATION.

1. In these rules unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“ Act ” means the *Law Institute Act* 1917.

“ Chairman ” means the Chairman appointed pursuant to subsection (7) of Section 15 of the Act and includes an Acting Chairman.

“ Charge ” includes a charge made under Section 16 of the Act and any question referred to the Statutory Committee pursuant to the Act.

“ Committee ” means the Statutory Committee for the time being appointed pursuant to the Act.

“ Complainant ” means a person feeling aggrieved within the meaning of Section 16 of the Act and making a charge thereunder.

“ Court ” means the Supreme Court of Victoria.

“ Declaration ” means a statutory declaration.

“ Institute ” means the Law Institute of Victoria.

“ Respondent ” means a practitioner in respect of whose alleged misconduct a charge has been made or a question or matter has been referred.

“ Party ” means complainant or respondent as above defined and includes the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria.

“ Secretary ” means the person from time to time appointed by the Statutory Committee to be or to act as its secretary.

Words importing the singular number only shall include the plural and *vice versa* and words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender, and words importing persons shall include corporations.

All other terms and expressions contained in the Act shall in these rules have the same meanings respectively as they have in the Act.

PART I.

ENQUIRIES AND REPORTS OF STATUTORY COMMITTEE.

Charge of Misconduct and Summons and Notice Thereon.

2. (a) A charge pursuant to Section 16 of the Act shall be in the form numbered 1 in the Schedule or to the like effect and shall be signed by the complainant or his agent and shall be verified by a declaration of the complainant or of some person having knowledge of the facts and such declaration shall be in the form No. 2 in the Schedule, or to the like effect.

(b) A declaration of the complainant shall relate only to such of the facts as are within his own knowledge, and he shall cause any other facts to be verified by the declaration of some person having knowledge thereof.

(c) A form of summons in the form No. 3 in the Schedule or to the like effect together with such charge and such declarations and every exhibit thereto and copies thereof respectively shall be lodged by the complainant with the Secretary.

(d) The Committee may require that further particulars of the charge shall be given and may require them to be verified by declaration in the same manner as in sub-clause (a) and shall fix a time within which such particulars shall be given.

(e) The complainant shall thereupon lodge such further particulars and declaration, if any, together with copies thereof with the Secretary within the time aforesaid.

(f) Whenever the Committee determines to summon any practitioner it shall fix a time and place for the hearing of the charge and shall cause the summons and copies of the charge declarations and exhibits lodged by the complainant to be served on the respondent and shall cause notice in the form No. 4 in the Schedule or to the like effect to be served on the complainant or his agent.

(g) The Committee may dispense with any of the requirements of this Rule.

List of Documents.

3. Each party shall furnish the Secretary and also each other with a list of all documents which they respectively propose to adduce in evidence.

Such lists must, unless otherwise ordered by the Committee; be furnished by the complainant at least fourteen days before the day of hearing and by the respondent within seven days after he has received the list furnished by the complainant.

Inspection of Documents.

4. Either party may inspect the documents included in the list furnished by the other, and a copy of any document mentioned in the list of either party shall on the application and at the expense of the party requiring it, be furnished to him by the other within three days after receipt of the application.

Appearance at Inquiry.

5. At the hearing of any charge either party may appear in person or by his practitioner. The Committee may request the Council of the Institute to appoint a practitioner to present the charge, and thereupon such Council shall either make such an appointment, or give written notice to the Committee that, having investigated the facts, it does not desire to present the charge. But nothing in these rules shall be taken to prevent the Committee from proceeding in the absence of either party (although not represented), if, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, it is thought just so to do.

Adjournments.

The Committee may from time to time adjourn the hearing of any charge.

Representation in Special Cases.

6. (a) When the complainant is not represented by a practitioner and the Council of the Institute appoints a practitioner under Section 17 of the Act, such practitioner shall for all purposes be deemed to represent the complainant.

(b) When a complainant does not in the opinion of the Committee duly prosecute a charge the Committee may at any stage of the inquiry request the Council of the Institute to appoint a practitioner to present the same to the Committee, and thereupon such Council shall either make such an appointment or give written notice to the Committee that, having investigated the facts, it does not desire to present the charge.

Procedure on References of Questions.

7. When any question is referred to the Committee pursuant to Section 16 of the Act the following provisions shall have effect:—

(a) The question shall be in the form No. 5 in the Schedule or to the like effect.

(b) The procedure relating to a charge, save as otherwise expressly provided, shall apply with such modifications (if any) as the Committee may deem expedient.

(c) In any question referred by the Council of the Institute, the matters therein alleged shall be verified in such manner as the Committee may deem expedient.

(d) In any question referred by the Court or a Judge thereof, no verifying Statutory declaration shall be required.

Evidence by Declaration.

8. In any case in which the respondent having been duly summoned does not appear and the Committee proceeds in his absence, and in any other case with the consent in writing of the respondent or the complainant as the case may be the Committee, may, either as to the whole case or as to any particular fact or facts, receive and act upon evidence given by declaration, including the declaration verifying the charge. In this and the next succeeding rule "Complainant" includes a practitioner appointed under Section 16 or Section 17 of the Act by the Council of the Law Institute.

Procedure.

9. The complainant or his practitioner shall open his case by stating concisely the facts upon which he intends to rely and the respondent or his practitioner shall, on the conclusion of the evidence submitted on behalf of the complainant, state concisely his defence, but save as aforesaid all arguments shall be heard upon the conclusion of all the evidence as in a civil action in Court.

The procedure for the time being in force in Court with reference to the hearing of civil actions shall so far as the same is applicable regulate the hearing of charges under the Act.

Cross-examination of Declarant.

10. When the evidence or any part thereof is taken by declaration any declarant who has made a declaration may be cross-examined upon his declaration by the party against whom the declaration is used, and such declarant may be summoned to attend the Committee in the manner prescribed by Section 14 of the *Evidence Act 1915*.

Issue of Summons.

11. A summons to a witness including a person summoned as a declarant shall be issued by the Chairman of the Committee at the instance of the complainant or the respondent with or without a clause requiring the production of books or documents in his custody, possession, or control. Such summons shall be in the form No. 6 in the Schedule or to the like effect, and shall be served either personally or as the Committee shall direct.

Exclusion of Witnesses from Inquiry.

12. On the application of any party the Committee may direct that all or any witnesses including persons summoned as declarants leave the place where the charge is being heard and thereupon they shall leave such place until called on to give evidence.

Transmission of Report to Prothonotary.

13. (a) The Committee shall cause its report, together with a copy of the evidence taken with the exhibits or copies thereof, to be transmitted to the Prothonotary of the Court with all reasonable dispatch.

(b) On receipt of the report and evidence, or copy thereof, the Prothonotary shall forthwith file the same in his office under the name of the Act and the respondent, and give notice thereof to the Secretary of the Institute, and to the respondent.

(c) Where a report and evidence, or copy thereof, is so transmitted as aforesaid, the Court or a Judge may direct that any letter, instrument, or book accompanying the same shall be delivered to any person entitled thereto, and thereupon the Prothonotary shall deliver it to such person or his solicitor.

Procedure under Section 21 (2) (c).

14. When the Court requires the Committee to transmit a report under Section 21 (2) (c) of the Act, the procedure and steps to be taken in transmitting and filing such report shall be the same as is hereinbefore provided in respect of a report on a charge.

Upon such a report being so filed, the Prothonotary shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Chief Justice and to the Secretary of the Institute.

Procedure under Section 20.

15. (a) When, pursuant to Section 20 of the Act, a report of the Committee has been transmitted to the Court, the Institute or the complainant or respondent may, by motion, apply to the Court to make an order under the said section.

(b) When, pursuant to Rule 14, a report of the Committee has been so transmitted to the Court, the Institute may apply to the Court, by motion, as if the matter arose under Section 20 of the Act; and, if such application be granted, the Court may give such directions as it may think fit.

(c) A motion pursuant to Section 20 (5) of the Act may be made by the Institute or the complainant or respondent.

(d) A notice of such motion shall be served on the respondent not less than ten clear days before the day fixed by the notice for the hearing thereof.

(e) If on the hearing of the motion the Court is of opinion that any person to whom notice has not been given ought to have had such notice, the Court may, upon such terms as it may think fit, adjourn the hearing in order that such notice may be given.

Custody of Evidence.

16. (a) The evidence taken or received by the Committee on any inquiry in which a report is not made and transmitted to the Court shall be delivered by the Committee to the Secretary of the Institute, who shall indorse such evidence with the name of the respondent and the day of the month and year the same was delivered to him as aforesaid, and such evidence shall thereupon remain in the custody of the Institute.

(b) Such evidence shall on no account be produced to or delivered out to any person except by order of the Court or a Judge, or by direction of the Committee, and any such evidence may, by order of a Judge, or by direction of the Committee, be destroyed after the expiration of six years from the time it was so delivered to the Secretary of the Institute as aforesaid.

Forms.

17. The forms in the schedule to these rules shall be used in all cases, as far as practicable, with such variations as the Committee may from time to time determine or the circumstances require.

Service of Notices.

18. Subject to these rules, any documents, except notices of motion required by such rules, may be served by prepaid registered letter addressed to the person to be served at his last-known place of business or abode, or at his last address recorded in the roll of members of the Institute, and in proving service it shall be sufficient to prove that the document was properly addressed, stamped, and posted, and service thereof shall be deemed to have been effected at the time at which the letter would be received in the ordinary course of post. Any notice required to be given, or other document required to be signed by or on behalf of the Committee, may be signed by the Chairman or Secretary, or by any person duly authorized by it in that behalf.

Application of Rules of Court.

19. In any case not provided for by these rules the practice and the rules of Court shall apply to any proceedings taken under the Act or these rules, with such modifications (if any) as the Court or a Judge shall think fit.

PART II.

PROCEDURE OF THE COMMITTEE.

Attendances of Members.

20. (a) In the absence of the Chairman, the Committee may appoint one of its other members Acting Chairman, who shall during such absence have all the powers and authorities of the Chairman.

(b) The Committee shall cause the Chief Justice to be notified in every case where a member thereof fails to attend half the number of its meetings held during any period of three months and of which meetings he shall have been given written notice, provided that there shall have been at least four such meetings during such period.

(c) The Secretary shall, upon a vacancy in the Committee arising from whatever cause, immediately notify the Chief Justice and the Council of the Institute.

Secretary and Other Officers.

25. The Committee may appoint any person to be its Secretary or other officer upon such terms as shall be thought fit, and may remove him from time to time and appoint another in his place, and such Secretary or officer shall perform the duties prescribed in that behalf by the Committee, and he may be the Secretary, Acting Secretary, or other officer of the Institute.

Mode of Decision.

26. Every question at a meeting of the Committee shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present voting on such question, and in case of an equal division of votes the Chairman shall give a second or casting vote.

Meetings of Committee.

27. The Committee shall meet as often as it may deem necessary, and minutes of the proceedings shall be entered in a book and be read and confirmed at the same or next meetings, and shall be signed by the Chairman. The names of the members present, as well as those voting on each question, shall be recorded, so as to show whether each vote given was for or against the question.

Register of Charges.

28. The Committee shall cause a register in the form No. 7 in the schedule to be kept, in which shall be entered all charges made or referred to the Committee, with the names of the complainant and respondent, and every one of such charges shall be numbered in every year according to the order in which it shall be received.

ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SHOPS BOARD No. 19 (CONFECTIONERY, PASTRY, FRUIT AND VEGETABLE) AND OF THE RESTAURANT BOARD.

WHEREAS by section 570 of the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for declaring the weight of any specified descriptions or classes of goods by management: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation to apply within the shire of Upper Murray, viz:—

The weight by measurement in the aforesaid shire of the descriptions or classes of goods specified in the Schedule hereunder shall be as set out in such Schedule, that is to say:—

NETTING, ETC., PERMITTED IN CERTAIN PORTIONS OF WARANGA RESERVOIR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation permit, for the purpose of taking fish in Waranga Reservoir, the use of long lines or cross lines, and mesh or gill nets, from the first day of December in each year to the thirtieth day of September next following, under the following conditions and restrictions:—

(1) No person shall use more than four hundred (400) yards of net nor any net any of the meshes of which measure less than four (4) inches.

(2) The use of long lines or cross lines and nets is prohibited within the two areas of Waranga Reservoir described hereunder:—

- (a) The waters eastward of an imaginary line running due south from a point on the northern bank distant 800 yards from the inlet works.
- (b) The waters westward of an imaginary line running north-easterly from a point on the southern bank at the site of the original Tatura road to a point on the opposite shore.

(N.B.—As a guide to fishermen and others posts have been erected at the points mentioned in (a) and (b). As, however, posts are liable to be affected by climatic and other causes the absence or invisibility of a post or posts will not be accepted as an excuse for any infringement of this Proclamation.)

A JOINT REGULATION OF THE SHIRES OF KARA KARA AND AVOCA, NUMBERED 1, FOR THE REGULATING THE MANAGEMENT OF CLOSETS AND PRIVIES, &c., AND FOR DEODORIZING NIGHTSOIL, AND PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL THEREOF.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Acts 1910 and 1915* and every other power enabling in this behalf and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Kara Kara in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, and the Council of the Shire of Avoca in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire, doth hereby make the following Joint Regulation, being Joint Regulation No. 1 of the said Councils, that is to say—

1. All former Joint Regulations on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this Joint Regulation coming into operation.
2. This Joint Regulation shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This Joint Regulation shall apply to and have operation in and within the boundaries of the township of Navarre in the South Riding of the Shire of Kara Kara and the West Riding of the Shire of Avoca.

DEFINITIONS.

4. In the construction and for the purpose of the Joint Regulation the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned them, that is to say—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public houses, factories, workrooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspools” shall mean any receptacle for night soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground, and “earth closet” shall include a pan closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

“Councils” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Kara Kara and the Council of the Shire of Avoca.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include a corporation.
5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three (3) inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and

shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for the night soil, the contents thereof not to exceed three (3) cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford an easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof and emptying and cleansing same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public house, factory, workrooms, or common lodging house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-inch to the foot.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth closet a sufficient quantity of deodorizing material, ashes, lime, charcoal, or dry powdered earth to effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle, and shall cause all night soil which may be deposited in the pan or other receptacle to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a sufficient quantity of the deodorizing material to effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.
7. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron or other material to be approved of by the councils, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, with handles thereto, and a tight fitting cover, the capacity of the pan not to exceed three (3) cubic feet. These pans to be provided by the councils.
8. The service shall be that known as a double pan service and the removals will be carried out in the day-time.
9. Once each week the person contracted with by the councils shall remove the pans in use and shall leave a thoroughly cleansed one in their place.

10. No person shall empty any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or conveyance properly constructed, furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or effluvia therefrom.
11. When any man is licensed by the councils such man shall be employed by the occupiers of the premises for the removal of night soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same, and no such occupier or person shall contract for the removal of night soil therefrom with any man or person who is not licensed on that behalf by the councils.

12. All night soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the councils from time to time for the final reception of the same.
13. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain, sewer, or water-course.
14. The occupier of any house or tenement within the aforesaid township of Navarre in which any night soil pan is in use shall pay to the councils, or such person or persons as the councils may by resolution appoint to receive the same, the sum of One pound fourteen shillings and sixpence per annum, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the councils for the emptying and removing of the contents of each pan, such sum to be paid in quarterly instalments of 11s. 6d. each, commencing on the 1st day of October, or on such other day or days as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the councils.
15. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Ten shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than One pound for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
