Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE MOTOR DRIVERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 17th March, 1922, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to persons employed—

- (1) driving mechanically propelled vehicles hired or plying for hire;
- (2) cleaning or attending to the running requirements (not including repairs) of mechanically propelled vehicles which are—
 - (a) hired, plying for hire, or used in connexion with a trade or business;
 - (b) stalled in a public garage or in an engineer's workshop."

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 17th March, 1922, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) **OVERTIME.**—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the hours fixed as a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

(4) **CASUAL LABOUR.**—Casual employees, i.e., persons who are employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(5) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Time and a quarter shall be the special rate for all work done on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, 28th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April); but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
