RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 23, making a Rate for 1922.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the district of the Kerang Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water, sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in the cases of special agreement.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if in the absence of a contract, on the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1922, and shall be due and payable on the first day of July, 1922.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the rates and charges hereby made.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT IN THE EAST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby revoke (in so far as such Regulations relate to the east riding of the municipal district of the shire of Dunmunkle) the Regulations made on the eighteenth day of September, 1917, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the shire of Dunmunkle shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE EAST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE.

BY-LAWS OF THE ROYAL VICTORIAN INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND,
ST. KILDA-ROAD AND MOUBRAY-STREET, PRAHRAN.

Name and Objects.

1. *Name*.—The Institute shall continue to be called the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind.

2. *Objects*.—The objects of the Institute shall be to provide a home at the Institute for and to educate the youthful blind of the State of Victoria and give teaching in its school or schools and afterwards to train them in trades and professions suitable for blind people and to afford them and the adult blind means of employment in such trades and professions and for those purposes to carry on schools, classes, factories, trading and mercantile operations and any other activities which may be considered by the Board of Management conducive to the attainment of those objects.

The Institute is not intended to be an asylum for those unfitted to become wage or salary earners, nor is it intended for a hospital or institution for the infirm or for senile cases or for persons entitled to admission into Benevolent Asylums.

3. *Place*.—Such activities shall be carried on upon the lands of the Institute at the corner of St. Kilda-road and Moubray-street, Prahran, and at such places as the Board shall from time to time determine.

Interpretation.

4. *Interpretation*.—In these By-laws unless inconsistent with the context the words:—

"Board" shall mean the Board of Management for the time being of the Institute constituted as hereinafter provided.

"Contributor" shall have the meaning given to it in Part I. of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915* or in any Act repealing re-enacting or amending the same and shall so far as consistent with such Act or Acts include a life governor within the meaning of these By-laws also a person who at any time within the 12 months next preceding the date of any meeting or election or any other date in respect of which the question of his being a contributor arises has on his own behalf contributed to the Institute at least One pound in one donation and a person nominated as a contributor by any municipality club company or corporation or partnership firm which at any time within the twelve months aforesaid has contributed to the Institute at least One pound.

"Institute" shall mean the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind.

And where the context permits words importing the singular shall include the plural and *vice versa* and words importing the masculine shall include the feminine.

Contributors.

5. *Contributors*.—The persons now constituting the Institute shall remain contributors for the same periods respectively as they would have remained had these By-laws not been made.

6. *Life Governors*.—The following shall be qualifications of a life governor of the Institute:—

- (a) A person who has been elected by the Board a life governor on the ground that he has conferred a signal benefit on the Institute or on blind people other than by contributing to the Institute.
- (b) A person who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the Institute money or property of the net value of at least £20 in one gift.
- (c) A person nominated as a life governor by any municipality club company or corporation or partnership firm which has out of its funds or property contributed to the Institute money or property of the net value of at least £20 in one gift.
- (d) The executor or trustee of a will which gives money or property of the net value of £20 or more to the Institute but so that not more than one executor or trustee shall become a life governor in respect of any one sum of £20 and the life governorship shall begin from the date of payment or delivery of the gift.
- (e) A person nominated as a life governor in such will or by such executor or trustee.
- (f) A person nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any will who have allocated and paid at least £20 to the Institute in one donation out of any moneys of the testator not specifically directed to be paid to the Institute under the will.

(g) An honorary treasurer or secretary of any concert or entertainment given in aid or partly in aid of the funds of the Institute and yielding to such funds a net profit of £20 or more.

7. *Votes*.—Every contributor shall be entitled to one vote at all meetings of contributors of the Institute.

8. *Qualification for Board*.—Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained every contributor shall be eligible for election or appointment as a member of the Board.

Meetings of Contributors.

9. *Annual Meeting*.—An ordinary general meeting of the contributors (hereinafter called "the annual meeting") shall be held in the month of July or August in each year. At such meetings a report of the proceedings and affairs of the Institute and audited balance-sheets of all departments of its work made up to the end of the preceding financial year of the Institute shall be presented by the Board for adoption and contributors shall be elected to fill vacancies on the Board occasioned by retirement or otherwise, and thereafter the meeting shall elect from the Board a President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Treasurer who shall hold office for one year, and thereafter until the election of their successors respectively, but shall be eligible for re-election.

10. *Special Meetings*.—Special meetings of contributors may be convened at any time by the Board and shall be convened by the Superintendent and Secretary on the requisition in writing of not less than twenty contributors specifying briefly the object of the meeting.

No business shall be submitted to such special meeting other than that specified or indicated in the requisition.

11. *Convening of Meetings*.—Ordinary and special meetings of contributors shall be convened by a notice thereof briefly stating the objects and signed by the Superintendent and Secretary posted in the public office of the Institute seven days before the date of such proposed meeting and at the same time published in at least one Melbourne daily newspaper.

12. *Quorum*.—At all meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum.

13. *Chairman*.—At every meeting of contributors the chair shall unless otherwise decided by the meeting be taken by the President or in his absence by one of the Vice-Presidents.

14. *Minutes*.—Minutes shall be kept by the Superintendent and Secretary of all business transacted at such meetings.

15. *Voting*.—The voting shall be by show of hands but any contributor present may require a poll which shall be taken immediately. The chairman shall in the event of there being an equality of votes on any question have a second or casting vote in addition to his own vote.

Board of Management.

16. *The Board*.—The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and other persons now constituting the Board of Management shall continue in office until the next annual meeting or until the election of their successors but shall be eligible for re-election. Thereafter the Board shall consist of twelve persons that is to say the President, two Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer and eight other members.

17. *Nomination*.—No contributor shall be elected a member of the Board and no member of the Board shall be elected President, Vice-President or Treasurer unless at least two other contributors nominate him in writing for such election stating that such nomination has the consent of the nominee. Such nomination paper shall in each case be delivered to the Superintendent and Secretary not less than three days before the annual meeting or Board meeting as the case may be.

18. *Rotation of Members of Board*.—On the day of the annual meeting in each year four of the members of the Board shall retire from office but may nevertheless be re-elected and the persons who shall so retire shall be—

- (a) all members temporarily appointed by the Board as provided by the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915* or any Act repealing or amending the same.
- (b) the members who have been longest in office without re-election. When two or more persons have been in office for the same length of time then those who shall so retire shall be determined by lot.

19. *Disabilities*.—(a) No person shall become or remain a member of the Board who is not a contributor.

(b) No member of the Board shall vote upon any matter in or before a Board meeting in which such member has directly or indirectly by himself or his partners any pecuniary interest.

20. *Vacancies on Board*.—If the President or Vice-President or the Treasurer dies or resigns such office by letter addressed to the Board or ceases to be a member of the Board such office shall become vacant and the remaining members of the Board may temporarily appoint thereto some member of the Board until the next annual meeting of contributors when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.

21. *Board Meetings*.—The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at least once a month and every alternative monthly meeting at least shall be held at the Institute. Four members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

22. *Appointment of Committees.*—The Board shall at its first meeting after every annual meeting elect a House Committee a Finance Committee a Buying Committee and a Buildings Committee and except as hereinafter provided such committees shall consist of members of the Board. The Board shall from time to time elect persons to fill vacancies on such committees. The President, Vice-Presidents and Treasurer shall *ex officio* be members of all committees.

23. *Functions of Board.*—Subject to these By-laws the Board shall have the entire control and management of the Institute and its property and affairs and shall appoint and prescribe the duties of and may dismiss at its discretion all or any of the officers, teachers and other employees of the Institute and may at any time constitute any officers or teachers in addition to those provided for by these By-laws and may make vary and repeal regulations for the management of the Institute, the conduct of meetings, of contributors, and of the Board and of elections and the conduct of the business of the Board.

Committees.

24. *Committees.*—(a) The House Committee shall consist of three members of the Board or of five persons of whom three shall be members of the Board and two may be ladies not members of the Board. It shall investigate and control the internal conduct and general economy of the Institute. It shall meet from time to time as necessity may occur. Provided that the duties of such two ladies shall be confined to the social welfare of the blind children blind apprentices and blind soldiers connected with the Institute.

(b) The Finance Committee shall consist of three members of the Board including the Treasurer. It shall meet before the monthly Board meeting to examine all accounts to recommend liabilities for payment and it shall keep the Board regularly informed as to the financial position of the Institute.

(c) The Buying Committee shall consist of three members of the Board and shall report to the Board upon all proposals to buy goods exceeding in any one instance £200 in value.

(d) The Buildings Committee shall consist of three members of the Board and shall advise the Board upon the repair, condition and suitability of the buildings on the lands of the Institute and as to the necessity or otherwise of new buildings.

(e) Two shall constitute a quorum of any committee.

Notices.

25. *Notices of Meetings.*—Meetings of the Board and of committees shall be convened by a notice thereof briefly stating the objects and signed by the Superintendent and Secretary and except in urgent cases such notices shall be posted or sent at least twenty-four hours before the time for holding such meeting.

Treasurer.

26. *Treasurer.*—The Treasurer shall supervise the finances of the Institute and cause its moneys to be deposited to the credit of the Institute in such bank as the Board may direct. He shall report to the Board upon all liabilities submitted for payment.

27. *Cheques.*—Cheques upon the bank account of the Institute shall be signed by the Treasurer or in his absence by the President or a Vice-President but shall first be signed by the Superintendent and Secretary or his deputy appointed by the Board.

Honorary Medical Officers, &c.

28. *Medical Officers, &c.*—Honorary oculists, medical officers and dentists, the number of whom shall be fixed by the Board shall be elected at each annual meeting and shall hold office until the next annual meeting or until the election or appointment of their successors. They shall be eligible for re-election. Vacancies occurring during the year shall be filled by appointments made by the Board.

Auditors.

29. *Auditors.*—At each annual meeting two public accountants practising in Melbourne shall be elected by contributors as auditors for the current financial year. Intending candidates other than the retiring auditors shall give notice thereof in writing to the Superintendent and Secretary three days before the date of the annual meeting.

30. *Duties of Auditors.*—The auditors shall make a quarterly examination of the books and accounts of the Institute and shall after the close of each financial year examine all accounts vouchers and reports relating to the finances of the Institute and shall report thereon to the annual meeting.

Superintendent and Secretary.

31. *Superintendent and Secretary.*—The Superintendent and Secretary shall, unless and until the Board shall otherwise determine reside at the Institute and be responsible to the Board for its entire management. Subject to the approval of the Board, he shall engage and dismiss the staff of the industrial and manufacturing departments and all servants, and direct and control all other paid officers and teachers and have power in cases of misconduct or neglect of duty to suspend, and if necessary remove from the Institute any officer or teacher pending the decision of the Board and to employ temporary substitutes for those suspended.

32. *His General Duties.*—He shall see that the buildings and grounds of the Institute are kept in a state of cleanliness and order, shall have all minor repairs effected when needed and shall inspect the food of the inmates and see that it is properly prepared, and of good quality, and shall keep an inventory of the property of the Institute and be held responsible for the whole.

33. *His Office Duties.*—He shall conduct the correspondence, clerical and financial business of the Institute and shall cause proper and detailed accounts of its business to be kept, together with such accounts and books as shall show the state of the various industrial and manufacturing departments, and all details relating thereto, and such other books and forms as may be from time to time required by the Board. He shall have power to appoint any officer of the Institute to take temporary charge during his illness or absence, either in or after business hours, and to remove such officer and appoint others from time to time and he shall record and report to the House Committee every exercise of this power.

Schoolmaster.

34. *Schoolmaster.*—The schoolmaster shall in all matters act under the direction of the Superintendent and Secretary and report to him as occasion may require upon all matters connected with the school. Assistant teachers shall act under the direction of the schoolmaster.

Matron.

35. *Matron.*—The Matron shall live at the Institute and attend to the directions of the Superintendent and Secretary. She shall have the superintendence of the female domestics and inmates, and enforce personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders on their part; she shall see that the girls are properly washed and clothed; daily inspect all beds, and see that they are properly made and kept clean; and also superintend the proper cooking of the food.

Assistant Secretary.

36. *Assistant Secretary.*—The Assistant Secretary shall in all matters act under the direction of the Superintendent and Secretary. He shall keep all books and accounts, and have charge of all moneys received at the Institute, which he shall cause to be banked to its credit as directed by the Superintendent and Secretary.

Liability of Officers.

37. *Guarantees.*—The Superintendent and Secretary and other paid officials who handle moneys shall be guaranteed by a policy of an approved insurance company, securing the Institute against loss of moneys passing through their hands. The premiums for such policy shall be paid by the Institute.

Seal.

38. *Seal.*—The seal of the Institute shall be that now in use. It shall not be affixed to any instrument except by the authority of a resolution of the Board and in the presence of at least two of the Board and of the Superintendent and Secretary or such other person as the Board may appoint for the purpose and such three persons shall attest by signature every instrument to which the seal is so affixed in their presence.

Paid Officers, Teachers and other Employees.

39. *The Staff.*—The teachers and staff generally shall carry out such duties as may from time to time be specified in regulations, or by the Superintendent and Secretary, or the officer in charge in his absence, and report to him at once any cases of sickness, accident, or irregularity of any kind and generally assist him in maintaining efficiency, order and discipline in the Institute.

Pupils.

40. *Pupils.*—Applications for reception of pupils shall be made on forms supplied by the Institute and no pupil shall be admitted unless such forms have been completed to the satisfaction of the Board.

41. *Their Ages.*—No pupil shall be admitted to reside in the Institute under the age of 6 or over the age of 16 years unless otherwise expressly decided by the Board in individual cases but pupils between the ages of 16 and 21 years undergoing trade or other training and who should in the judgment of the Superintendent and Secretary live at the Institute may be required to live there until such age not exceeding 21 years as the Board may deem beneficial to them.

42. *Music.*—Pupils who display special aptitude shall be trained for the purpose of entering the musical or tuning professions and after passing the age of 17 years may be boarded out at the expense of the parents or guardians, but in appropriate cases, the Board may contribute to such cost at its discretion, for a period to be specified.

43. *Discipline.*—Pupils shall be under the control of the Superintendent and Secretary and be amenable to discipline.

44. *Power to Dismiss Pupils.*—Pupils shall be retained only during good behaviour. Disorderly, disobedient and unmanageable pupils, and those who are or may become mentally or physically deficient shall be returned to their parents or guardians or transferred to a benevolent asylum.

Industrial and Manufacturing Department.

45. *Factory Pupils.*—Non-resident pupils above the age of 16 years may be received for training in the factories of the Institute.

46. *Their Trades.*—The trades at which pupils are to be employed shall be decided by the Superintendent and Secretary.

47. *Duration of Trade Teaching.*—After a term of training fixed in each case by the Superintendent and Secretary workers shall be assumed to have learnt their trades or professions, and may be required to leave the Institute to make room for new applicants. The Board may, however, retain them as employees at piece wages provided the demand for the manufactures of the Institute warrants such a course.

48. *Unsuitable Trade Pupils.*—If at any time it shall appear that a pupil is unsuitable for work and incapable of acquiring a trade or profession the Board may require him to leave the Institute.

49. *Persons with Musical Ability.*—Any pupil, journeyman or woman engaged in the industrial or manufacturing department who is able to sing or play any instrument shall, if so required by the Superintendent and Secretary join any choir or band of the Institute and attend the necessary rehearsals.

Investment of Funds.

50. *Special Bequests.*—(a) Bequests or donations to or for the benefit of the Institute with a direction that only the income thereof is to be used for the purposes of the Institute shall be placed to the credit of the No. 1 Endowment Account.

Bequests of £100 or More.—(b) Other bequests or donations of £100 or upwards shall be placed to the credit of the No. 2 Endowment Account.

Mode of Investment.—(c) Where no form of investment has been specified by the testator or donor the moneys to the credit of the Endowment Accounts may be invested in any form of investment permitted by law in Victoria to trustees and also in fixed deposits at a bank.

Income No. 1 Account.—(d) The income but not the capital of such amounts as are to the credit of the No. 1 Endowment Account shall subject to the conditions on which the bequests or donations were received be used for the general purposes of the Institute.

Income No. 2 Account.—(e) The income of such amounts as are to the credit of the No. 2 Endowment Account shall be used for the general purposes of the Institute but the capital shall not be so used except by the authority of a resolution of the Board specifying the amount of such capital so to be used.

Pledge Prohibited.—(f) No pledge or deposit by way of security for any loan, overdraft or advance shall be made in respect of the moneys or investments of either of the Endowment Accounts or of any deposit receipt or any other document representing the same or any part thereof.

Repeal.

51. *Repeal.*—All By-laws made prior to the date when these By-laws shall have come into force are hereby repealed saving all existing rights. 7179

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the city of Prahran.
