## EXEMPTIONS.

## THE COUNCIL OF PUBLIC EDUCATION.

## REGULATIONS.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by section 103 of the *Education Act 1915* upon the Council of Public Education, enabling the Council to make regulations (with the approval of the Governor in Council) "for determining the courses of study and training and the examinations entitling persons to be registered as teachers; regulating the granting by the Council of certificates of registration of teachers or of schools and the form of such certificates; providing for the keeping of the registers and mode of registering and making additions or revisions defining what schools shall for the purposes of this Act respectively be sub-primary schools, primary schools, or secondary schools (as the case may be); regarding the reciprocal admission of teachers from other States; for or relating to the time and place of meetings of the Registration Committee and the management and conduct of business thereat; and generally for carrying these Acts into effect", the Council doth hereby rescind Regulation II. (19) approved by the Governor in Council on the 21st September, 1914, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulation:—

## Secondary Schools.

19. Any school, in which not less than 30 per cent. of the teachers engaged in instruction of pupils over 12 years of age are registered secondary teachers, or are registered teachers of special subjects whose qualifications are in the opinion of the Registration Committee equal to those required of Secondary teachers, and in which, in the opinion of the Registration Committee, a complete progressive course of education is provided for pupils between the ages of twelve and eighteen years, may be registered as a secondary school. Where in the opinion of the Committee such course of education is a distinctly commercial or technical course the words Secondary (Commercial) or Secondary (Technical) (as the case may be) may be inserted in the Classification column of the Register. The Committee must, however, be satisfied that the building, staff, and equipment of such schools are adequate for the purposes of a secondary school.

## II. Register of Schools.

No alteration shall be made in the name of a school as recorded in the Register of Schools unless the sanction of the Council to such alteration shall have been first obtained.

No entry shall be made in the Register of Schools of any school name which is identical with, or a colourable imitation of, the name of a school already on such Register.

## III. Register of Teachers.

Before registration as a teacher every applicant shall be required to furnish evidence satisfactory to the Council that he is of good moral character and is free from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the City of Hawthorn, does by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the Local Government Act 1918 (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

*The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.*

## COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

## (Part V.—Division 14.)

*How Votes to be Marked by Voter.*

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the Local Government Act 1915 shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
  - (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
  - (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
  - (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
  - (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall—
- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the Local Government Act 1915.
- (3) The returning officer shall—
- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

*Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.*

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

(a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and

(b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.*

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

#### *Deposit Moneys.*

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

#### *Voting by Post.*

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

(a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and

(b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

#### REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the city of Hawthorn of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

## DECLARATION OF A NEW MAIN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF KARKAROO.

WHEREAS by section 21 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Acts has taken the land necessary for constructing a road or deviation it shall as soon as it thinks such road or deviation is fit to be used as a public highway by Resolution declare the road or deviation to be a main road or part thereof and that upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order of the Governor in Council confirming such Resolution such road or deviation shall thereupon be a main road or part thereof within the meaning of the said Acts: And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the road on the land described in the schedule to such Resolution to be part of a main road: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.  
*Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring a Road on a Site taken for a New Main Road fit for use.*

Whereas the land the site of the road the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Acts for the purpose of constructing such new road which new road has now been laid out and formed on the same: And whereas the said Board (being the Country Roads Board incorporated under the said Acts) thinks that the road aforesaid is fit to be used as a public highway such Board at a meeting now holden acting under the authority conferred upon it by section 21 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* doth by this present Resolution hereby declare the said new road the course of which is described in the schedule hereto with the commencing and terminating points thereof respectively specified to be part of a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the Country Roads Acts.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the fourth day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule to the same are of

sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land (whether alienated from the Crown or not) by providing access to railway stations or to main roads leading to railway stations and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) declared such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*. And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road or part thereof mentioned in such Resolution shall be a development road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*.

## RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land by providing access to railway stations or to main roads leading to railway stations acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* (No. 2944) doth by this Resolution hereby declare such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*.

## ORDER APPROVING OF A DEVIATION FROM A DEVELOPMENTAL ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF COLAC.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Colac-Forrest road in the shire of Colac (declared to be a developmental road under the *Developmental Roads Act* which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th August, 1921, on page 2965) should be made by the said Board. And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said first cited Act has



caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

All that piece of land in the parish of Yeo, and being a roadway generally one chain wide the eastern boundary of which commences at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 109A of the said parish, distant 299 deg. 18 min. 2,754.6 links from the north-easterly angle of the said allotment; thence south-easterly and south-westerly through that allotment, generally southerly through allotment 109B, across a one-chain road generally southerly and easterly through allotment 115, across a one-chain road, north-easterly and generally southerly through allotment 50A, south-easterly through allotment 50C and south-easterly and north-easterly through allotment 50A1 to a point on the eastern boundary thereof, distant 154 deg. 4 min. 253.8 links from the north-easterly angle of that allotment.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Education Act 1915*, doth hereby rescind clause 1 (a) and (b) of Regulation XX.—Religious Instruction in State Schools—of the Regulations under the aforesaid Act, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

1. (a) With the view of affording facilities for giving religious instruction in State Schools by persons other than State school teachers, half-an-hour may, by order of the Minister, or on the recommendation of the School Committee, and with the approval of the Minister, be set apart for the purpose on one or two school days in each week. The time for such instruction, when it is to be given in the morning, shall be from 9.15 to 9.45, or from 11.45 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. When such instruction is to be given in the afternoon, the time shall be—
  - (a) From 1.15 to 1.45 or from 3.15 to 3.45 where the afternoon meeting begins at 1.15.
  - (b) From 1.30 to 2 or from 3.30 to 4 where the afternoon meeting begins at 1.30.
- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation XIII., in schools in which religious instruction is given the hours of ordinary instruction shall be fixed at such times as will allow of not less than two hours being devoted to secular instruction in the morning or afternoon, as the case may be.

## REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS, CLAUSE 8 OF CHAPTER X. (FIRST-AID AMBULANCE CHEST) REVOKED AND RE-MADE.

**W**HEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order revoke Clause 8 of Chapter X. of the Regulations made on the third day of February, 1920, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

## FIRST-AID AMBULANCE CHEST.

8. Every occupier of a factory or shop where steam, electrical, water, or other power-driven machinery is running shall at all times keep, for the use of the employees therein, a first-aid ambulance chest in some accessible place upon the premises, such chest to be equipped and supplied with the following articles, namely:—

## BY-LAW NUMBER 73.

## Obstructions, &amp;c., to Streets, &amp;c., by Cattle, &amp;c.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under sections 228 and 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 73 repealing By-law numbered 65 of the said shire of Heidelberg and adopting clauses 41, 42 and 43 of sub-part (9) of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915* relating to obstructions &cetera to streets &cetera by cattle &cetera.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. That By-law numbered 65 of the shire of Heidelberg made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* for prohibiting and regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon land not enclosed by a substantial fence be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. That clauses 41, 42 and 43 of sub-part (9) of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915* be and the same are hereby adopted in and for the municipality of the shire of Heidelberg, namely:—

41. If any cattle are found without any person having charge of them—

(a) in any street, or

(b) upon any land (not being a common) which is not enclosed or fenced with some sufficient fence within the meaning of the *Fences Act 1915* or any amendment thereof and the openings (if any) in which fence are not secured and barred with gates or other fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with the fence,

the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and impound them or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody and any person rescuing or attempting to rescue or interfering with cattle placed at any such place of safe custody or seized for the purpose of being placed at any such place shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds or to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months.

42. The owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle or if such cattle are so found in any area declared by the Council to be a populous or residential area (which declaration the Council is hereby authorized to make) such owner shall forfeit a sum of not less than Five or more than Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and any justice if such owner be not known upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual

form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected or if such owner appear then as in other cases and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses to be estimated and assessed by the justice of seizing keeping and selling the said cattle shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

43. If such cattle by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

3. That this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Heidelberg.

## SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.

## BY-LAW No. 47.

A By-law of the Shire of Shepparton, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 47, for regulating and providing for lighting of vehicles.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Shepparton order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 43 of the shire of Shepparton is hereby repealed.

2. No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, drive, ride, propel, or hold or leave unattended any carriage, cart, vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede on any road within the said shire unless there is attached thereto at least one lighted lamp showing a bright white light, visible within a reasonable distance in the direction towards which such carriage, cart, vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede is travelling or facing, such light or lights being sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such carriage, cart, vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede.



3. Every person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions contained in this By-law forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
