SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

BY-LAW No. 29.

A, By-law making rates and charges for water supplied within the water supply district of the Shire of Chiltern.

THE Council of the Shire of Chiltern, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts Nos. 2747 and 2852, do hereby make the following rates upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district of Chiltern, for the year ending 31st December, 1922, and to come into operation on the 1st January, and to be due and payable half-yearly in advance on 1st January, 1922, and 1st July, 1922.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, 10 per cent. per annum on the amount of the 1915 valuation.
2. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds, One pound per annum.
3. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds but not exceeding Thirty, One pound five shillings per annum.
4. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Thirty pounds but not exceeding Forty, One pound ten shillings per annum.
5. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Forty pounds but not exceeding Fifty, One pound fifteen shillings per annum.
6. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Fifty pounds but not exceeding Sixty, Two pounds per annum.
7. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Sixty pounds but not exceeding Eighty, Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
8. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Eighty pounds but not exceeding One hundred, Three pounds per annum.
9. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds but not exceeding One hundred and Fifty, Four pounds per annum.
10. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred and fifty pounds but not exceeding Two hundred and Fifty, Five pounds per annum.
11. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Two hundred and fifty pounds, Six pounds per annum.
12. Water from the stand pipes and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—
Licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand pipes, One pound per annum.
Licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for use of licensee only, Ten shillings per annum.
Licence to cart away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray, Five shillings per annum.
13. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.
14. Water troughs, Five shillings per annum (providing ball regulating taps are used).
15. Livery stables, Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).
16. Hotel with stabling, not being a livery stable, Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

Fixed by the Commissioners in accordance with the powers conferred on them under the Water Acts.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1922 in respect of water supplied to them by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

- (1) Upon all rateable property except vacant allotments of the annual municipal value of £15 and under, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).
- (2) Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of £16 and upwards, Two shillings (2s.) in the £1 shall be paid.
- (3) The rate to be paid in respect to vacant lands shall be 2s. in the £1, according to municipal valuation, provided that in no case the rate shall be less than One pound (£1) per annum.

(4) For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of £2 per annum shall be paid.

(5) The water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid for by meter or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and persons requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

(6) For water supplied by meter a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1000 gallons shall be made; provided that no person shall pay an amount other than that based upon 2s. in the £1 on the municipal valuation, or less than the minimum rate; any quantity over the foregoing amounts to be charged in excess.

(7) The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1922.

(8) Water must not be used for other than strictly household purposes during the hours of 12 noon and 8 p.m. on Sundays during the months of January, February, March, October, November, and December.

For the purpose of conserving the water supply during dry weather the Trust in its discretion may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

Such persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges, and enforce regulations.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:-

By-law No. 19.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated or other persons shall pay for the year 1922 in respect of water supplied by the Trust in the said Urban District:-

1. For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement, and the land (if any) valued therewith shall be paid; the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings. In cases where water is supplied to land upon which there is no building, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound, according to the municipal valuation of such land. In no case however shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be paid.

2. For land upon which there is no building, and to which water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be Two shillings (2s.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof. In no case however shall a rate of less than Ten shillings (10s.) be paid.

3. For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the rate per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied but in no case shall the rate be less than Thirteen shillings.

4. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the first January, 1922, and one moiety on the 1st July, 1922.

5. For water supplied for domestic or other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure, the charge shall (except where otherwise agreed by the Trust, and save as is hereinafter provided in this By-law) be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to such quantity as would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable in respect of the premises so supplied; and for all water consumed in excess of such quantity a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

6. The charge for private water troughs shall be Twenty shillings each per annum (to include the water rate payable when the value of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed Ten pounds). When such rate exceeds Ten pounds there shall be no charge additional to the rate assessed on the property except where in the opinion of the Trust a meter is necessary or advisable, in which case the consumer will be charged and must pay at the rate charged for water supplied by measure. The minimum charge will be Twenty shillings.

7. Water supplied to public gardens and parks shall be charged for by measurement at Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons; and water supplied to show grounds, old cricket

ground and bowling green shall be charged for by measurement at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of the full measure of a unit of 1,000 gallons shall be charged as for 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter and paid for half-yearly.

8. The charge for water supplied from any stand-pipe or hydrant shall be Sixpence (6d.) for any quantity up to 200 gallons, and Sixpence (6d.) for each additional 200 gallons or portion of 200 gallons.

9. For a supply of water during the erection of a new building or alterations to, or additions to existing buildings the charge shall be for a stone or brick building Five shillings per centum on the cost of the stone or brick building including plastering or the same shall be fixed by agreement with the Trust. For a supply of water for the erection of wooden buildings with plastered walls the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence for each room or passage and Five shillings for each chimney. For a supply of water for wooden buildings where no plaster is used the charge shall be Five shillings for each chimney in such building. All payments shall be made in advance. No person shall take or use any water for or in connexion with the erection of any new buildings or alterations to or additions to existing buildings till he has obtained the receipt of the Trust's officer for payment of the amount payable for the use of such water, or the consent in writing of the Trust or its officer. Any person offending against the provisions hereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence. All charges shall be additional to all rates or other charges payable by the owner or occupier of the premises upon which the building is being erected, and shall in the first instance be payable by the builder, or contractor and if unpaid by the builder or contractor, shall be charged to and paid by the owner of the premises whereon such building is being erected, but such charge to the owner shall not prejudice the right of the Trust to proceed at its option against either the builder or contractor or the owner or the occupier for the amount payable.

10. The occupier of two or more tenements liable to be rated, one of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled on the payment of the rates of such tenements respectively, to use without further charge such a quantity of water by meter as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure the amount of such rates; provided that the tenement or tenements not supplied by measure shall not be connected with the pipes of the Trust.

The occupier of two or more tenements, each of which is supplied with water by measure shall be entitled to use without further charge such a quantity of water at either or both such tenements as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure, the total amount at which such tenements, if not supplied by measure, would be rated.

11. The water used or supplied for gas engines, oil engines, and steam boilers the charge shall be by measure; the minimum amount to be charged and paid shall be Twenty shillings, to be paid and payable in advance in each case. No water shall be supplied to any such engine or boiler until a meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe of such engine or boiler to the satisfaction of the Engineer of the Trust; and no water will be supplied to any engine unless such engine is fitted with mechanical appliances to circulate and reuse the water to the satisfaction of the Trust's officer.

12. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly in each case where water is supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes shall (except where otherwise implied or provided in this By-law) be 10,000 gallons, and such water shall (where it is not otherwise provided herein in this By-law or otherwise specially agreed by the Trust) be charged at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons.

13. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charges as the Trust shall in each case determine and the preliminary payments appointed by the Trust on account of such charge shall be made at the office of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the rates and charges aforesaid and each of them.

15. In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Hamilton Waterworks Trust."

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1922 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Melvor but no rate in any case shall be less than Two pounds.

2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged half of the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter but not exceeding one-half a mile distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and the first of July, 1922.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1922.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts:—

1. That the water rate for the year 1922 on all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the borough of Horsham for the year 1921-22, with a minimum of One (1) pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under £13 6s. 8d. (Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence) except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 237 of the above-mentioned Acts.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements within the Trust District, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Trust by measure, in excess of such aforesaid quantity, shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

3. For the water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of Ninepence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) and for water supplied for railway purposes, which shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount payable under the assessed rate as specified in clause 1 hereof.

4. All rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance on the first day of January, 1922, at the office of the Trust, Wilson-street, Horsham, where payments will be received during office hours.

5. Such officers as the Trust may from time to time, appoint for the purpose, are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

LEONGATHA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Leongatha Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 18.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate.

(I.) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partially as a domicile, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement shall be paid, provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to any tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building.

(II.) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(III.) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

The rates herein made are for the year ending 31st December, 1922, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 31st March, 1922.

Such person as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District under the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1922 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust and dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being on all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Bulla the minimum amount to be paid in respect to any tenement to be not less than Twenty-five shillings.

2. For all unoccupied allotments a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For all water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable

for the premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence for every thousand gallons except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of 200 (two hundred) gallons or under the sum of One shilling shall be charged.

The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of April, 1922, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive and recover the said rates.

TALLANGATTA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

THE Commissioners of the Tallangatta Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 15.

1. General Rate.—A general rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year 1922 upon the annual value of all properties liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Trust, and such rate shall be based on the municipal valuation of such property by the Council of the shire of Towong for the year 1921-1922.

2. Minimum Rate.—The minimum rate payable on any property on which is erected any dwelling, house, shop, office, stable, or other building where, in the opinion of the Trust, water is likely to be required, shall be Two pounds. The minimum rate on any other rateable property whatsoever shall be Ten shillings.

3. For all house properties built during the year 1922, a proportion of such general rate or minimum rate shall be paid from the beginning of the month after commencement of the building to the end of December.

4. For water supplied from the works of the Trust by measure, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity charged for shall be 27,000 gallons per annum.

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January and the second on the first day of July, 1922.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Tallangatta Waterworks Trust on the 12th day of December, 1921.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. The rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling (£24) and upwards (except in cases of meters and special arrangements with the Trust) situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Waterworks Urban Trust is hereby made for the year 1922.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds sterling (£17) and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling (£24) a rate of One pound fifteen shillings (35s.) per annum shall be payable.

3. Upon properties valued at Thirteen pounds (£13) to Sixteen pounds sterling (£16) a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable according to the municipal value of such properties, and on properties valued under Thirteen pounds sterling (£13) municipal value per annum a uniform rate of Twenty-five shillings sterling (25s.) shall be payable.

4. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling (£10) per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

5. For any public water trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangements with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also in case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust for domestic and garden purposes will be charged for at One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand gallons up to the amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises and at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

8. For water supplied for other than domestic purposes a rate not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons may be charged by the Trust or the Trust may make special arrangements as required.

9. Ratepayers supplied with meters by the Trust shall pay an annual rental for such meters at Nine shillings (9s.) per annum.

10. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.

11. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of 200 gallons or under the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* on the above scale.

12. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs or additions, Twenty shillings per centum of the amount of the contract for stone work, brickwork, or plastering; or in the absence of a contract of the sum paid for stone work, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, according to clause 9 of this By-law.

13. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental, garden or other like purposes, and any owner or occupier using more water than in the opinion of the Trust or its officers they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatever other than purely domestic use except between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Nine o'clock p.m. or such other times as the Trust may by resolution determine.

14. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust for the purpose of cooling houses or other like purpose the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable in addition to the charges under any previous clause of this By-law provided such spray shall only be used between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

15. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5).

16. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1922 and are payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on 1st day of January and 1st day of July in the year or in one payment in full on or before 1st day of July, excepting those by measure and special arrangements which shall be paid quarterly or as the Trust may direct.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the vote of Three thousand pounds (£3,000) for fencing and improving Public Parks, Gardens, and other Reserves, under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

A SUM of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:-

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any Public Park, Garden, or other Reserve, having a claim on the vote, for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such Park, Garden, or other Reserve, between 1st January, 1921, and 31st December, 1921, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1922. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form "A" and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form "B".

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any Public Park, Garden, or other Reserve, from its own funds, for the fencing and planting of such Park, Garden, or other Reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1921, and 31st December, 1921; but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to 1st January, 1921.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any Public Park, Garden, or other Reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1921 (*vide* form "A"), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to Parks, Gardens, and other Reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), or to the Albert Park, South Melbourne, and St. Kilda.

SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the shire of Hampden for fixing fees for registration and renewal or transfer of registration of certain premises made under section 286(2) of the *Health Act 1919*, No. 3041.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, No. 3041, and all other powers thereunto it enabling the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Hampden (hereinafter called the Council) orders as follows:-

1. The following fees shall be paid to the Council for registration, or renewal or transfer of registration of the under-mentioned premises within the municipal district of the shire of Hampden.

(A) For granting or annual renewal of registration of premises-

Offensive trades premises—One pound.

Cattle sale-yards—One pound.

Boardinghouses—Five shillings.

Common lodginghouses—Five shillings.

Eating houses—Five shillings.

Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice-cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.

(B) For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence.

Fees for registration and renewal of registration shall be for the period of twelve months expiring on the 31st day of December in each year and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January in each year provided that in respect of any registration granted after the 31st day of March in any year the fee shall be calculated at the rate of one-quarter of the fee prescribed by this By-law for each full three months or part thereof between the date of such registration and the 31st day of December following.

2. This By-law shall be read in conjunction with the *Health Act 1919*, No. 3041, and regulations made thereunder.
