Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SUGAR REFINERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 1st September, 1922, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st September, 1922, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination. (2)

(3) Definition of Juvenile Workers.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed turning bags, sweeping trucks, receiving and placing sacks, driving friction winch, sewing mouths of bags, trucking sugar, sheathing bags, collecting samples, labelling, filling golden syrup and treache tins.

(4) Overtine.—All work done in excess of 48 hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(5) Special Rate for Sundays and Public Holidays.—All time worked excepting between 10 p.m. and midnight on Sundays, on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), King's Birthday, and Boxing Day above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) Piece-work.—The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer minimum wage, provided that such employer shall be seen piece-work prices to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at any work for which the Board has fixed the conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
