SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS.

BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Shire of Broadmeadows, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 14, for—

- (a) Prescribing the minimum area, and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house may hereafter be erected.
- (b) Providing that every dwelling house, hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof a prescribed area of open land.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadmeadows order as follows:—

Introductory.

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

2. All Government Buildings shall be exempted from the provisions of this By-law.

PART 1.

Subdivision of Land.

1. For the purposes of this By-law, the excision or transfer of one or more pieces of land from an existing Title to land, shall be deemed a subdivision.

2. Before any subdivision is effected or registered, a copy of the plan of subdivision, together with two tracings or copies thereof shall be submitted to the Council for approval, accompanied by an application in the form prescribed under the 23rd Schedule *Local Government Act 1915*, and enclosing such fee as the Council may direct.

3. In any subdivision of land the minimum size of any allotment shall be 6,000 (six thousand) square feet, and the minimum frontage of any allotment shall be 50 feet, and the minimum depth of any allotment shall be 120 feet, it is further provided that the buildings to be erected on any one allotment shall cover not more than one-third of the area, whilst on corner sites with frontages to two streets or roads not more than one-half of the area.

4. There shall be provided in connexion with every dwelling house an open space at rear of same and exclusively belonging to such dwelling of an aggregate extent of not less than 600 square feet free of any erection above the level of the adjoining pavement.

5. Notwithstanding anything herein contained it shall be permissible to excise or transfer portions of land which have a less superficial area than 6,000 square feet, for each or any of the following purposes:—

- (a) Creation of easements for drainage, light or traffic.
- (b) Adjustment of existing boundaries of occupation.
- (c) Transfer of land to adjoining owners for the purpose of increasing the superficial area of existing allotments, provided such transfers do not reduce the allotment from which the transfer is being made to a less area than 6,000 square feet.

All dealings with land which come under the provisions of this clause shall be submitted to and approved by the Council before they are registered.

PART 2.

Erection of Buildings.

1. Upon any allotment of land which complies with the provisions as regards minimum area, depth and frontage it shall be permissible to erect only one dwelling.

2. In such areas or streets as are included in Schedule A to this By-law, and in such other streets as may from time to time be included by the Council in such Schedule A, it shall be permissible to erect two houses on any one allotment of 6,000 square feet minimum area, when such houses are separated by a brick wall 9 inches in thickness, and built in conformity with the Building By-law. In the case of such buildings they shall be so erected that the land is equally divided between the two tenements when the allotment is only 6,000 square feet in area, and when the allotment is of greater area than 6,000 square feet, then the minimum area, occupied by any one of the tenements shall be 3,000 square feet.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in any of the foregoing clauses, it shall be permissible to erect business premises, shops, or factories whether dwellings are combined with or attached to such business premises, shops or factories or not, upon allotments of less area, frontage or depth than provided in this By-law, but there shall be provided in connexion with every business premises an open space at rear of same and exclusively belonging to such premises of an aggregate extent to not less than 600 square feet free of any erection above the level of the adjoining pavement. In the case of shops combined with dwellings being erected upon land facing streets which are in the opinion of the Council residential streets the Council shall have power to insist upon the minimum area of 6,000 square feet being provided.

PART 3.

Allotments Subdivided Prior to Adoption of By-law.

1. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, in the case of allotments subdivided prior to the date of adoption of this By-law, where in the opinion of the Council it is impossible to comply with the provisions of the By-law, the Council shall at its discretion waive the provisions of the By-law in regard to any particular allotment, but such action on the part of the Council shall not create a precedent for any other case, nor shall the Council be bound in any way to waive the provisions of the By-law should such action be deemed inexpedient.

PART 4.

Enforcement of By-law and Penalties.

1. Where any land has been subdivided in such manner as to be in contravention of the requirements of this By-law:—

(a) The Council may give to the owner or owners of such land fourteen days' notice in writing (which notice may be signed by the municipal clerk on behalf of the Council) to bring such subdivision into accord with the requirements of this By-law.

(b) If default is made in complying with such notice then the Council shall take steps as are necessary to prevent the execution of any transfer in respect to such land, or registration of any plan of subdivision.

(c) In addition to penalties imposed by this By-law all costs and expenses incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law shall be paid by the person committing such breach and may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

2. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The resolution passing By-law No. 14 was agreed to at a meeting of Council held on 30th March, 1922, and confirmed on 27th April, 1922.

9. Owner or Agent to furnish Market Inspector with name of Auctioneer selling for him.
10. Auctioneers to furnish monthly statement of all sales and pay amount of dues owing.
11. Classification for sales in the Market.
12. Time limit for selling and penalties for breach of same.
13. Sale of land under certain conditions.
14. Penalty of breach or non-observance of provisions of foregoing By-law.

By-law No. 3 of the Shire of Cranbourne, having the same object as this By-law, is hereby repealed. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the area of the Townships of Cranbourne, Koo-wee-rup, and Lang Lang, within the Shire of Cranbourne, and shall come into operation on its confirmation, or as soon as legally possible thereafter.
