Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE QUARRY BOARD.

Norg.-This Determination on the 27th August, 1923, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of quarrying, not including agriculture," has made the following Determination, namely:—

Note.—The powers of the Board were extended by the Governor in Council on the 14th July, 1911, and 23rd November, 1920, respectively, to enable it to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed (a) in carting or driving, or assisting in carting or driving, in connexion with or incidental to the trade or business of quarrying (not including agriculture), and (b) in the trade of crushing quarried stone."

(1) That on the 27th August, 1923, the previous Determinations of the Quarry Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (4) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Time and a half-shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Good Friday, or Easter Monday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

All stone for pitchers or cubes shall be plugged and placed on the banker ready for persons engaged knocking out and dressing.



- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette. - (b) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF KANUMBRA, KNOWN AS THE "YARCK RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, John Thomas Murray, Percival Vaughan Chapman, John Marshall Halligan, and Samuel Peter Drysdale Johnston, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the township of Kanumbra, known as the "Yarck Recreation Reserve," having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land. Act 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

ments, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall be publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
