Hospitals and Charities Act 1922, No. 3260. REGULATION.

T is recommended to His Excellency the Governor in Council that the following additional Regulation be made under the provisions of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1922, No. 3260:-

5. Conditions for the Payment to Subsidized Institutions or Benevolent Societies of any Sums out of the Fund-

(a) That all forms of returns (financial, statistical, claims for grant, &c.) as may be prescribed be properly completed and verified as set out on each form, and lodged at the office of the Charities Board

claims for grant, &c.) as may be prescribed be properly completed and verified as set out on each form, and lodged at the office of the Charities Board of Victoria, on or before the dates indicated on such forms. That the form of ticket of admission of patients to be prescribed shall be used, and that in each published annual report issued to subscribers a comparative return be included covering the last preceding five years, and setting out an abstract of receipts and expenditure, and general statistics.

(b) That accounts and records of transactions be kept as in the forms formerly prescribed by the Treasurer of Victoria, compiled under what is known as the Burdett system, subject to such alterations, additions or amendments as from time to time may be directed by the Board, and shall be subject to such additations or amendments as from time to time may be directed by the Board, and shall be subject to such additions or amendments as from time to time may be directed by the Board may direct.

(c) That the Board shall, in case of necessity, have power to transfer to any suitable institution in which there is available accommodation any destitute aged or infirm person who has been sent to good merely for medical treatment or shelter, and not for crime; or any destitute aged or infirm person confined in a hospital for the insane who has regained sanity; or to send to any such institution any destitute person whose case may, after due inquiry, be certified by a Police Magistrate to be that of a person who should be maintained in a charitable institution; or transfer persons more suitable for a benevolent asylum from a hospital to a benevolent asylum from a hospital to a benevolent asylum where there is available accommodation.

(d) That all amounts under fl00 received as legacies or bequests without any condition attached shall not be placed to endowment account, but shall be utilized towards the maintenance of the institution at any place where there is no public morgue may be utilized by the Government for the

(g) That no payment by way of retiring allowance or gratuity shall be made from the funds of any institution.

(h) No medical or other officer attached to any institution shall be allowed to accept from patients either directly or indirectly any fee for his own use for services rendered at the institution. This must be made clear to patients who receive treatment or relief.

(i) That the erection of new buildings or alterations to existing buildings involving an expenditure of more than £300 be not undertaken without the approval of the Charities Board, to whom all plans and speci-

of the Charities noard, to whom an plans and specifications must be submitted.

(j) That in computing the number of days a patient has been in an institution the day of admission and the day of discharge must be counted as only one day.

A case admitted and discharged on the same day

must not be counted as an in-patient. A case admitted within a month of discharge is not to be counted as a new case; but if the institution be a hospital, and the patient is re-admitted suffering from an ailment other than that for which he was first treated, he may be counted as a new case.

- (k) That no member of Committee of an institution shall directly or indirectly supply goods to the institu-tion when such goods can be satisfactorily obtained elsewhere locally.
- (1) That no hospital shall make any agreement or arrive at any understanding with any municipality or group of municipalities in respect, to the treatment of infectious diseases cases without having first obtained the concurrence of the Treasurer of Vic-

BY-LAWS-PART 2.

(Defining the Duties of the Board's Officers.)

A LL By-laws heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.

Duties of the Secretary.

The Secretary shall-

- (1) Conevene and attend the meetings of the Board, and act as Secretary thereto, and furnish all information in his power on any subject under discussion, and be responsible for the correct record of all proceedings thereat.
- (2) Keep all books and accounts in the manner and style prescribed by the Board, and be responsible for their safety and custody.
- (3) Conduct the correspondence and all other clerical business of the sanatorium, and shall file all letters received, and keep copies of all letters despatched on the business of the Sanatorium.
- (4) Receive all moneys paid and enter in the cash book, and pay same into the Board's banking account.
- (5) Be supplied with sums not exceeding £10 at a time to meet petty expenses, and shall keep a petty cash book showing how and when such money has been disbursed.
- (6) Furnish reports in such form and at such periods as the Board may prescribe.
- (7) Order supplies of any kind as required, and see that all such supplies are of the quality and description ordered.
- (8) Carefully examine all tradesmen's bills, make up accounts, and initial them as correct, and present them to the Board.
- (9) Visit the wards and all other buildings as occasion may require, and see that all the property of the Sanatorium is carefully kept, preserved, and economically used.

- (10) Promptly report to the Board any defect or deficiency in any of the buildings, drainage, water supply, furniture, &c. (11) Take steps to see that all rules affecting any person shall be brought under the notice of the person concerned. (12) Receive, take charge, and be responsible for any property taken from patients on admission, and shall enter an inventory in a book kept for that purpose.
- (13) Prepare annually a report on the work of the Sanatorium up to and including 30th June.
- (14) Generally attend to all secretarial work.
- (15) Obtain a guarantee policy in some recognised society for the sum of £500.

Duties of the Matron.

The Matron shali-

- (1) Reside at the Sanatorium, and shall have full control over all the nursing and domestic staff, and be responsible for their efficiency.
- (2) Engage, suspend, and dismiss all nurses (except the staff nurse) and servants, and report all such engagements, suspensions and dismissals to the Board.
- (3) Select for approval by the Board a suitable person for the position of staff nurso who shall act as Deputy Matron. Report to the House Committee any breach of discipline by the staff nurse.

(4) Apportion the duties of nurses and probationers, and shall be responsible for the proper and efficient performance to such duties and also the duties imposed by the medical

officer.

(5) Keep a "Discipline Book" wherein shall be recorded any gross misconduct of any servant of the Sanatorium, or any infraction of any important regulation or rule, or any neglect of duty by any person whatsoever, and shall lay the same on table at each meeting of the House Committee, and shall call attention to all fresh entries therein.

(6) Apportion the duties of the staff, and be responsible for their efficient performance.

(7) Instruct the nurses and probationers in all branches of

(7) Instruct the nurses and probationers in all branches of nursing and in the hygienic discipline of patients, and shall be responsible for their practical training in the preparation of invalid discourse.

of invalid dietary.

(8) Wear a distinctive dress, and shall see that the nurses and probationers shall wear the style of dress prescribed by the Board.

(9) Employ nurses and probationers when not attending on patients in doing such other work as she may consider appro-

patients in doing such other work as she may consider appropriate.

(10) Not permit any nurse or probationer to absent herself from duty unless she is satisfied that such absence is not detrimental to the interests of the Sanatorium or the patients.

(11) Visit the wards frequently during the day and occasionally at night and take steps to maintain good order and hygienic cleanliness in wards and all other buildings under her

hygicant creatmess in wards and the supervision.

(12) Be responsible for the proper serving of meals in the dining rooms and wards, and, when any cause of complaint arises, she shall report same as soon as may be convenient to

the Secretary.

(13) Attend strictly to and carry out the directions of the

(13) Attend strictly to and carry out the directions of the medical officer, and be responsible for their due performance by the nursing and domestic staff.
(14) Prevent by every means in her power the introduction of liquors and improper provisions to the patients.
(15) Take such steps as may be necessary to insure that every patient on arrival shall have a bath, and that the clothing is iumigated, packed, marked, and stored, and that any valuables are handed to the Secretary for safe custody.
(16) Cause the rules to be brought under the notice of those interested or concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SUR-VEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the mouths of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
 - 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
 - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette. Gazette.
 - (b) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.
- 5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other o. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession

Note.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- (d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time profusionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as , in the practice of land surveying, for viz., from

the period of , or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of years (of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by those Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a watercourse or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

- 8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.
- 9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plandrawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:-

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sex-tant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, baro-meter, thermometer and steel band.

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(a), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.
