WARRNAMBOOL BREAKWATER COMMISSION.

APPOINTMENT OF A ROYAL COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO CERTAIN CHARGES MADE IN RESPECT TO THE LETTING AND CARRYING OUT OF A CERTAIN CONTRACT FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE MAIN WARRNAMBOOL BREAKWATER.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 21st day of August, 1923, appointed

LOUIS JAMES FITZGERALD PIGOTT, Esq., LL.B.,

to be a Royal Commission to inquire into and report relative to the instability of the public work hereinafter mentioned, and into certain alleged acts and omissions incidental to the letting and carrying out of a certain contract for the extension of the main Warrnambool Breakwater (being the work referred to) entered into by the Board of Land and Works with one Robert Oswald Law on or about the 5th December, 1913, and more especially

- (a) As to whether the requirements of the specifications of the said contract were faithfully and properly observed and performed.
- (b) As to whether any benefit, money, or other valuable consideration was unlawfully, corruptly, or improperly expended, paid, given, or promised by the contractor or any one on his behalf to any public official or any employee of the Board of Land and Works having any supervising duties or controlling powers in connexion with the work or the letting of the contract incidental thereto as a consideration, inducement, or reward for refraining or for having refrained from performing his duty, more particularly in respect of the case of one Alexander Stewart Moutat, a clerk of works employed under the contract aforesaid.
- (c) As to whether the tender of the said Robert Oswald Law was corruptly or improperly accepted.
- (d) As to whether, in the preparation of the concrete blocks required for the work, the contractor improperly omitted or dishonestly refrained from including in their composition the proper proportion of cement stipulated for by the contract.
- (e) As to whether the sand intended for the construction of the concrete blocks provided for in the contract was used without its being first washed, and whether such washing was a reasonable requirement, having regard to the circumstances of the case; and, if so, on whom does the blame rest that it was not observed.
- (f) As to whether the unstable condition of the breakwater extension is in any way due, from an engineering point of view, to defective designing or setting out of the work by those responsible for planning it, having regard to the natural features and conditions obtaining in the locality.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Date.) (Signed) A.B.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £3 3s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* as may be in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. A fee of £2 2s. for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. An application for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the applicant having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five Shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to passing a special examination prescribed by the Board, candidates shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1915, or
or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1915, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the Land Surveyors Act 1915, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

WHEREAS by section 192 of the *Land Act 1915* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations made under the *Land Act 1915* (that is to say):—

Land Act 1915.

ADDITION TO REGULATIONS MADE ON 10TH OCTOBER, 1915.—PART II., CHAPTER VIII.—CROWN LANDS OTHER THAN MALLEE LANDS.—LICENCES WHICH DO NOT CONFER ANY EXCLUSIVE RIGHT TO ENTER ON CROWN LANDS.

In Schedule 53, from and after the 1st June, 1923, the fee to be paid for removal of sand from the Crown lands area between Inglis-street and Boundary-street, Port Melbourne; shall be 3s. per load for first grade, and 2s. per load for second grade, payable in advance, provided that a full load of approved filling material be brought into the area for each load of sand removed.

And the Honorable D. S. Oman, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE TRAINING,
QUALIFICATION, AND REGISTRATION OF
MASSEURS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Masseurs Registration Act 1922*, No. 3254, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Masseurs Registration Board doth, with the approval of the Governor in Council, hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

DIVISION 1.—INTRODUCTORY.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Masseurs Regulations, 1923*, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be divided as follows:—

Division 1.—Introductory, 1-3.
Division 2.—Registration of Masseurs, 4-10.
Division 3.—Training and Training Schools, 11-14.
Division 4.—Examinations, 15-24.
Division 5.—Fees, 25-26.

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Approved” means approved by the Masseurs Registration Board.
“Act” means the *Masseurs Registration Act 1922*, No. 3254.
“School of Massage” means the University of Melbourne, the Melbourne Hospital, or any other approved public hospital where massage or any branch of massage is taught.

REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

3. The proceedings of the Board shall be conducted as follows:—

- (1) *Meetings*.—The Board shall meet for the transaction of business from time to time on such days and at such hours as the Board shall appoint, and the Registrar shall convene a meeting at any time when so directed by the Chairman.
- (2) *Notice*.—Not less than three days' notice of any meeting shall be given to any member of the Board, directed to such address as he may from time to time furnish to the Registrar.
- (3) *Voting*.—Every question before the Board shall be decided by a majority of the members present and voting, and the Chairman, in the event of an equality of votes, shall have a casting vote.
- (4) *Order of Business*.—The order of business shall be as follows:—
 - (a) Minutes of last meeting;
 - (b) Correspondence;
 - (c) Consideration of applications for Certificates of Registration;
 - (d) Consideration of reports and recommendations of Board of Examiners for Certificates of Registration;
 - (e) Miscellaneous business.

Provided that the Board may at any time vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

- (5) *Conduct of Business*.—Business shall be transacted in the manner provided for Councils in Part XI. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (6) *Cheques*.—Cheques shall be signed by the Registrar and one member of the Board.

DIVISION 2.—REGISTRATION OF MASSEURS.

4. Every person claiming to be entitled to be registered shall make application in the prescribed form (Form A).

5. No person shall be registered unless he—

- (1) is at least 21 years of age;
- (2) has paid the prescribed fee of £1 1s.; and
- (3) has produced two certificates of good character in the prescribed form (Form B).

Provided that in the case of any person who at the date of the commencement of the Act was a member of either the Associations known respectively as the Victorian Massage Association and the Victorian Branch of the Australasian Massage Association, such certificates of good character shall not be required.

6. Every applicant for registration under the provisions of section 6 (a) and section 7 (d) of the Act shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has complied with the provisions of the Act and the Regulations thereunder.

7. In the case of any person applying for registration under the provisions of section 7 (a) (ii) of the Act a certificate of *bonâ fide* practice, signed by the President and Secretary of either of the Associations known respectively as the Victorian Massage Association and the Victorian Branch of the Australasian Massage Association, shall be sufficient evidence of such practice.

8. Every person applying for registration under the provisions of section 7 (b) of the Act shall send with his application evidence of *bonâ fide* practice in the prescribed form (Form C).

CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

9. Every person who is entitled to be registered, and has complied with the requirements, shall receive a Certificate of Registration in the prescribed form (Form D), and his name shall be entered in the Register.

THE REGISTER.

10. The Register shall be kept in the following form, and shall contain the particulars hereunder set forth:—

- (a) Number of Certificate of Registration;
- (b) Date of Registration;
- (c) File Number;
- (d) Name in full;
- (e) Address;
- (f) Qualification, *i.e.*, particular provision of Act under which registered;
- (g) Remarks.

DIVISION 3.—TRAINING AND TRAINING SCHOOLS.

11. No person shall be eligible to enter for the prescribed course of training unless he—

- (a) has attained the full age of eighteen years;
- (b) has passed the Leaving Examination at the University of Melbourne, or some other examination which is, in the opinion of the Board, substantially equivalent thereto; and
- (c) is certified by a medical examiner specially or generally appointed by the Board to be physically fit to satisfactorily carry out the professional duties of a Masseur.

12. No person shall be permitted to begin the course of training until he has produced evidence satisfactory to the Board that he is of good character, and has fulfilled the conditions prescribed in the last preceding clause.

13. All courses of training shall be carried out at a School of Massage, and all instruction and demonstrations shall be given by teachers approved by the Board.

14. The curriculum for the prescribed courses of training shall include—

First Year.

- (i) A course of at least twelve lectures and demonstrations on Introductory Science, comprising the elementary principles of Physics, Chemistry, and Biology. Introductory Science.
- (ii) A course of at least 90 lectures and 60 demonstrations on Junior Anatomy, in accordance with the details as prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne. Junior Anatomy.
- (iii) A course of practical dissections as prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne. Practical Anatomy.

- Physiology. (iv) A course of at least 30 lectures and demonstrations on Physiology as prescribed by the Professor of Physiology at the University of Melbourne.
- Medical Gymnastics. (v) A course of at least twenty lectures and demonstrations on Medical Gymnastics, comprising definitions of terms, principles of movements, physiological effects of movements, normal movements and therapeutic application of movements in the treatment of disease.
- Practical Medical Gymnastics. (vi) A course of practical instruction on practical Medical Gymnastics for not less than 100 hours, extending over a period of not less than six months.
- Second Year.*
- Senior Anatomy. (vii) A course of at least 90 lectures and demonstrations on Senior Anatomy in accordance with the details prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.
- Practical Anatomy. (viii) A course of dissections in accordance with the details prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.
- Theory of Massage. (ix) A course of at least fifteen lectures on the Theory of Massage, comprising History of Massage, Classification, and Definition of Procedures, Physiological Effects of Massage, and its Therapeutic application.
- Practice of Massage. (x) A course of at least twenty lectures and demonstrations on the Practice of Massage, comprising instruction in regional massage and practice on models, and requiring attendance for practical work for at least 300 hours during twelve months.
- Bandaging. (xi) A course of at least twelve demonstrations, each being at least of one hour's duration, on bandaging. The student is required to attain proficiency in the application of the roller bandage and in the removal and replacement of splints.
- Medical Electricity. (xii) A course of at least fifteen lectures and demonstrations on medical electricity, extending over a period of at least six months, and comprising a description of Faradic, Galvanic, and Static Electricity, and the apparatus required, their use, care, and maintenance, and their applications in cases of disease.
- Pathology and Therapeutics. (xiii) A course of at least fifteen lectures and demonstrations on Elementary Pathology and Therapeutics, comprising a description of the Cause, Pathology, Symptoms, and Treatment of such diseases as are susceptible to treatment by Massage and its allied arts.

DIVISION 4.—EXAMINATIONS.

15. There shall be held an annual examination in November and a supplementary examination in February in the prescribed subjects of each year.

16. If a candidate fails at the annual examination he may present himself at the supplementary examination for any subject in which he has failed. Provided that, if he fails in all subjects at the annual examination, he shall not be allowed to enter for the supplementary examination except with the special permission of the Board.

17. No person shall be allowed to proceed to the second year unless he has passed in all subjects of the first year.

18. In the case of persons who were being trained at the commencement of the Act, the Board may hold qualifying examinations at such times as it deems fit.

19. Application for permission to sit at any examination shall be made in the prescribed form (Form E).

20. Each examination shall include such written, oral, and practical tests as the examiners think necessary or convenient in each subject.

21. Every person who applies for permission to sit at an examination under the provisions of section 6 (a) or section 7 (d) of the Act shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has completed the several courses of training, and complied with the provisions of the Act and the Regulations thereunder.

22. Any person who was being trained at the commencement of the Act, and who has complied with the provisions of section 7 (d) of the Act, is entitled to present himself for examination.

23. Every candidate for examination under the preceding clause shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has completed courses substantially equivalent to those prescribed under Division 3 of these Regulations.

24. The examination under section 7 (d) of the Act shall include the subjects as prescribed under Division 3.

DIVISION 5.—FEES.

25. There shall be paid to the Board—

- (a) a fee of Three guineas by every candidate who presents himself for examination at any Annual or Supplementary or other examination;
- (b) a fee of One guinea by every applicant for registration; and
- (c) a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence for any certificate.

26. The remuneration which shall be paid to each examiner shall be such reasonable sum as may be determined by the Board after consideration of the circumstances of each examination.



REGULATIONS RELATING TO BOARDING-HOUSES AND LICENSED VICTUALLERS' PREMISES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of August, 1923.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919, No. 3041*, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

Short title.
Commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Boarding-house Regulations 1923" and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be separated into divisions as follow:—

- Division 1.—Introductory.
- Division 2.—Accommodation.
- Division 3.—Natural lighting.
- Division 4.—Artificial lighting.
- Division 5.—Ventilation.
- Division 6.—Water supply.
- Division 7.—Baths, lavatories, &c.
- Division 8.—Closets and urinals.
- Division 9.—Fire prevention and extinction.
- Division 10.—General sanitary provisions.
- Division 11.—Classification.
- Division 12.—Enforcement of regulations—penalties.

DIVISION 1.—INTRODUCTORY.

Repeal.

2. All regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.

Interpretation.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Approved."
"Boarding-house."

"Approved" means approved in writing by the Council.
"Boarding-house" means any house, tent, or edifice, building, or other structure, permanent or otherwise, and any part of such premises in which more than five persons exclusive of the family of the proprietor thereof are lodged or boarded for hire or reward from week to week, or for more than a week, and includes the premises of a licensed victualler.

"Inmate."

"Inmate" includes boarder, lodger, and every person who is resident either temporarily or permanently on the premises of a boarding-house.

- "Proprietor means the proprietor of a boarding-house, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof." "Proprietor."
 - "Room" includes tent and a compartment of a tent. "Room."
 - "Tent" includes every structure of whatsoever shape the covering of which is composed mainly of textile fabric. "Tent."
 - "Flat" means and includes every self-contained suite of apartments containing living-room, bedroom, bathroom, and sanitary conveniences whether provided with a separate kitchen or not, and whether the inmates take their meals within such apartment rooms, or in a common dining-room. "Flat."
4. The provisions of these Regulations shall not apply to flats. Application of Regulations.

DIVISION 2.—ACCOMMODATION.

5. In every bedroom the proprietor shall provide for every person to be accommodated therein floor area of not less than the following dimensions:—

- (a) In the case of a boarding-house in use as such at the coming into operation of these Regulations, 54 square feet;
- (b) in the case of a building coming into use as a boarding-house after the coming into operation of these Regulations, 60 square feet:

Provided that it shall only be necessary to provide 30 square feet for each child under the age of six years, and provided, further, that two children whose combined ages do not exceed twelve years shall be reckoned as one person.

6. At every boarding-house where removable or temporary tents are provided as sleeping places the floor area per person shall be at the discretion of the Council, which shall, in the exercise of such discretion, give due consideration in every case to the amount of natural lighting and ventilation, and to the advice of the Medical Officer of Health.

Every such tent shall be pitched on a dry and well-drained site, and shall be provided with a floor raised above the level of the ground.

7. The proprietor shall not accommodate more persons than the floor space of the bedrooms allows when calculated in accordance with the provisions of this division.

DIVISION 3.—NATURAL LIGHTING.

8. The proprietor shall—
- (a) cause every room to be properly lighted with a surface of clear glass in a window or windows equivalent to not less than one-tenth of the floor area of the room; provided that in the case of a boarding-house used as such at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations and every tent whether in use as part of the premises of a boarding-house at such date or not the requirements concerning the natural lighting of such premises shall be at the discretion of the Council;
 - (b) not permit any room to be used as a bedroom unless it is lighted by an approved window in an external wall.

Provide as to boarding-house in use at date of Regulations.

DIVISION 4.—ARTIFICIAL LIGHTING.

9. The proprietor shall—
- (a) cause all gas pipes laid after the coming into operation of these Regulations to be of iron or other metal of equivalent pressure-resisting power; Gas pipes, precautions against fire.
 - (b) cause every gas generator provided on the premises to be of an approved design and placed in an approved position; Gas generators.
 - (c) cause all pendent lights to be at least 6 feet 8 inches above the level of the floor of the compartment, and every gas, oil, and electric light wall bracket to be rigidly fixed, and all wooden walls, wooden ceilings, or other inflammable material of a fixed character situated within 4 feet vertically or 18 inches horizontally of any gaslight or oil lamp to be protected from excessive heat by a hanging shield, or a fixed metallic shield, or other means as may be approved; Pendent lights, Gas brackets, etc.
 - (d) not cause, suffer, or permit—
 - (i) oil-lamps other than those having metal fonts or receivers to be used on the premises; nor Oil-lamps, &c., precautions against fire.

- (ii) any lamp other than a lamp supported on and securely fixed to a metal bracket, or suspended by metal chains or rods to be used in any public room or passage.

DIVISION 5.—VENTILATION.

10. The proprietor shall cause—

- (a) every compartment of the building to be provided with outlet ventilators corresponding with an allowance of not less than 1 square inch of airway for every 40 cubic feet of gross air space of such compartment.
- (b) the air space between the ground surface and the floor to be efficiently ventilated to the approval of the Council:

Provided that in the case of existing buildings the ventilation shall be to the approval of the Council.

DIVISION 6.—WATER SUPPLY.

11. The proprietor shall cause—

Water supply.
From main.

From well or
spring.

- (a) the premises at all times to be provided with an adequate supply of wholesome water for all domestic requirements, including baths; and whenever a public water supply is available, to be connected therewith. If the supply is derived from a well or spring or other source, such well or spring or other source to be protected against pollution;
- (b) every pipe used for drawing water from a well or spring or other source to be provided with an approved strainer at the intake end of such pipe, and the pump to be so placed as to discharge outside such well spring or other source. All suction and delivery pipes and pump barrels and parts shall be free from lead;
- (c) all wells, cisterns, and storage tanks used in connexion with such premises to be at all times maintained in a clean and wholesome state.

DIVISION 7.—BATHS, LAVATORIES, ETC.

12. The proprietor shall provide on the premises properly constructed bathrooms with impervious floors in number and equipment as follows:—

Baths where
public water
supply is
available.

Baths where
public water
supply not
available.

Lavatory
basins.

- (a) In cases where there is a public water supply, when the number of inmates does not exceed ten, one bathroom with combined plunge and shower-bath, and for every subsequent ten inmates, or fraction thereof, one additional bathroom fitted with either plunge or shower-bath;
- (b) in cases where there is no public water supply, when the number of inmates does not exceed ten, one combined plunge and shower-bath, and for every subsequent twenty inmates, or fraction thereof, one additional plunge or shower-bath;
- (c) except in cases where boarding-houses have bedrooms fitted with wash-basins connected with a drainage system, one lavatory basin in each bathroom:

Provided that the Council may in lieu of basins in bathrooms accept or require the provision of separate and conveniently situated lavatories for common use containing a number of basins not less than the number of bathrooms herein required.

For the purpose of this regulation "impervious floor" means any floor impervious to water, and constructed of concrete, brick and cement, granolithic tiles, asphalt, tar paving, or other approved impervious composition or any floor constructed of wood and rendered impervious or any floor covered with material presenting a durable and impervious surface such as lead, zinc, galvanized iron, malthoid, linoleum, or other approved impervious material.

DIVISION 8.—CLOSETS AND URINALS.

13. The proprietor shall provide on the premises properly constructed and conveniently situated—

- (a) one urinal for any number of male inmates up to ten, and one additional urinal for every twenty or fraction of twenty beyond ten: Provided that where the premises are sewered one urinal will suffice when the number of male inmates exceeds ten, but does not exceed twenty, and thereafter as prescribed above;

- (b) one closet for any number of male inmates up to ten, and an additional closet for every subsequent ten or fraction of ten;
- (c) one closet for any number of females up to seven, and an additional closet for every subsequent ten or fraction of ten: Provided that where the premises are sewered one closet will suffice for every ten females; Prohibition of pan closets.
- (d) one closet when the number of inmates of both sexes does not exceed ten.

In this regulation "urinal" means a crock, bowl, or stall capable of accommodating one individual user at a time: Provided that where in the absence of a sewerage system conveniences in the form of troughs are in use, every complete 18 inches of available length thereof shall be deemed to be one urinal.

14. No pan closet shall be situated within any boarding-house unless it is completely air disconnected from every room used for residential or living purposes, or for the storage of food.

15. The proprietor of every boarding-house not connected with a sewerage system controlled by a sewerage authority shall for the satisfactory disposal of the night-soil provide on the premises—

- (a) an approved septic tank system;
- (b) an approved chemical treatment system; or
- (c) a sealed double pan or other approved system;

and shall cause all pan closets to be so constructed as to prevent access of flies to the pan contents.

DIVISION 9.—FIRE PREVENTION AND EXTINCTION.

16. The proprietor of every boarding-house in which more than twenty-five persons usually reside shall— Fire extinction.

- (1) In the case of boarding-houses not used as such until after the coming into operation of these Regulations, and where a public water supply is available, cause water for the purpose of fire extinction to be conducted inside the premises by means of pipes and taps to such points as may be directed by the Council, and cause hose of approved dimensions with the necessary appliances for attachment to such taps to be provided; Water inside building.
- (2) In the case of boarding-houses in use as such at the coming into operation of these Regulations, or where no public water supply is available, cause hand fire buckets, or alternatively an equal number of such buckets and of approved hand chemical fire extinguishers to be provided in number and position as shall be required by the Council, but not less than one bucket or extinguisher for each 600 feet of floor area; and Hose.
Fire buckets, &c.
- (3) Where such premises consist of two or more stories, and are not provided with alternative escape stairs from every floor above the ground floor to the ground level provide and maintain in effective condition approved, fixed, or portable fire escapes, or such other effective means of escape as shall be directed by the Council. Fire escapes.

17. The proprietor shall—

- (a) cause the hand fire buckets referred to in the next preceding regulation to be kept filled with clean water ready for instant use for extinction of fire; and Proprietor's duty in regard to water and appliances for fire extinction.
- (b) maintain in proper order and condition to the satisfaction of the Council the appliances required by these Regulations to be provided for the control or extinction of fire, or for the saving of life at fires. In regard to maintenance of appliances.

18. No person shall, after the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations, use any premises of more than one story as a boarding-house unless they are constructed of fire-resisting materials: Restriction on use of wooden buildings.

Provided that any boarding-house of more than one story which was in use as a boarding-house at the said date may continue to be so used if the other requirements of these Regulations are complied with.

Fire-resisting materials include brick, stone, concrete, jarrah, redgum, fibro-cement, plasterboard, asbestos sheets, galvanized iron, and any similar material.

DIVISION 10.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

- Collection and disposal of fumes, &c.**
19. The proprietor shall make provision to the approval of the Council for the collection, conveyance, and discharge into the open air of vapour from washing boilers, of fumes from gas stoves, or other gas-cooking or heating appliances, and from bath-heaters of every description from which products of combustion are given off.
- Restriction on use of verandahs, &c.**
20. The proprietor shall not suffer or permit—
- (a) any verandah, balcony, balconette, portico, or stair landing to be used as a kitchen, or for cooking purposes; nor
 - (b) any verandah, balcony, balconette, or portico to be enclosed or used so as to permanently interfere (directly or indirectly) with the lighting or ventilation of the premises.
- Prohibition of use of certain linings.**
21. No premises which were not at the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations registered as a boarding-house shall be so registered if any wall or ceiling of any compartment thereof is lined with hessian or with hessian and paper, or any similar material, unless such hessian or paper is closely adherent to solid boarding, or other approved material.
- Loose linings to be removed.**
22. The proprietor shall cause all paper, hessian, and other similar linings which have become loose, filthy, or verminous to be removed from all walls and ceilings, and destroyed, and to be replaced with fibro-cement, wood, metal, plaster, or similar material.
23. The proprietor shall—
- (a) provide that spaces under sinks and baths shall not be boxed in or otherwise enclosed: Provided that where, in the case of boarding-houses used as such before the coming into operation of these Regulations, such spaces have been enclosed, such enclosures may remain unless the Council shall otherwise order;
 - (b) provide a properly-equipped kitchen and scullery approved by the Council;
 - (c) provide a suitable larder or larders for the keeping and storage of food of sufficient capacity and suitably constructed, lighted, and ventilated, and not in direct communication with any living room, bedroom, bathroom, laundry, wash-house, or sanitary convenience, or under a stairway, and shall cause the same at all times to be maintained in a clean and wholesome condition, and to be protected from the admission of steam fumes, or offensive or unwholesome vapours and gases, and shall not have therein at any time any unsound, stale, or mouldy article of food, or offensive substance.
 - (d) cause the premises to be properly drained by means of drains firmly founded, properly formed, constructed, graded, and maintained, and capable of being readily cleansed;
 - (e) cause foul-water drains to be covered when so required by the Council, and to be suitably trapped and effectually ventilated;
 - (f) cause all waste and overflow pipes from baths, lavatories, sinks, water-tanks, and like fittings to be air-disconnected from covered drains in an approved manner;
 - (g) cause all drainage from the premises to be disposed of in such a manner as not to be a nuisance, or dangerous to health, or offensive; and
 - (h) cause the roofs, skylights, rain-water spouting and down pipes to be kept in a condition of good repair so that the rain-water shall not enter or lodge under the building;
 - (i) cause the premises to be kept at all times in a clean and sanitary condition, and in a proper state of repair.
- Baths and sinks not to be enclosed.**
- Kitchens.**
- Larder.**
- Duty of proprietor as to drainage, &c.**
- Proprietor to keep premises clean and sanitary.**

DIVISION 11.—CLASSIFICATION.

24. Boarding-houses shall be divided into two classes,—A and B.

No boarding-house shall be classed in A class unless there are provided thereat—

- (a) an approved septic-tank system or a sewerage system controlled by a sewerage authority; or an approved system for the chemical treatment of sewage;
- (b) electric lighting or an approved system of gas lighting;

(c) an adequate supply of hot water for baths; and
nor unless the premises and its general equipment accommodation and sanitary-fittings and management in the opinion of the Council justify such classification.

25. The Town Clerk or other officer of the Council charged with the duty of registration shall upon the completion of the registration give or send to the proprietor of every registered boarding-house a certificate of such registration, setting out the classification of such boarding-house, and the proprietor shall cause such classification to be indicated in type of not less than 4 inches in height in a conspicuous place in a common room.

In this Regulation "common room" means a dining-room, sitting-room, lounge, or main entrance hall or passage to which the boarders have at all reasonable hours unrestricted access.

26. The proprietor shall keep a copy of these Regulations, which on demand by any boarder, at any reasonable hour, shall be produced for such boarder's perusal.

Copy of these Regulations to be exhibited

DIVISION 12.—ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS— PENALTIES.

27. The Council of every municipality shall superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and shall at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters, and things as are necessary for that purpose, and shall at least once a year cause an inspection, and report to be made by its officers of each and every boarding-house in its district.

Councils to enforce these Regulations.

28. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds; and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

Penalties.

29. Any proprietor may, on the complaint of any officer of the Council or of the Commission, be summoned before a Court of Petty Sessions to show cause why the registration of his boarding-house should not be cancelled, on the ground—

- (a) That his premises do not comply, or have ceased to comply with the requirements of these Regulations;
- (b) That the manner in which such boarding-house has been conducted is such as to render it undesirable that such registration be continued.

Upon being satisfied of the truth of any of the grounds aforesaid such Court may order the registration of the boarding-house kept by such proprietor to be cancelled.
