Friendly Societies Act 1915.

4. The Court or a Judge may at any stage give directions for the hearing of the motion on affidavit or with witnesses or otherwise, and generally may give such special directions relating to any such appeal as may be just and convenient.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 1296.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban System of Waterworks for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £13 6s. 8d.—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (2) Of any such tenement the valuation whereof exceeds £13 6s. 8d.—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation not exceeding £300; Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation exceeding £300, and not exceeding £700; and Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation exceeding £700.
- (3) Of lands on which there is no building—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1923, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1924, and shall be payable on the first day of October, 1923, at the office of the Commission at Bendigo or Castlemaine.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said district, the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

By-LAW No. 101.

Scaffolding Inspection.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda, numbered 101, made under the *Scaffolding Inspection Act 1922*, for appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any inspection or service made or performed by any inspector under such By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Scaffolding Inspection Act 1922*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

That the fees payable for an inspection of scaffolding to any building shall be as follows:—

A. For swinging stages	5s.
B. For scaffolding not exceeding 15 feet in height where the area of the building does not exceed 16 squares	10s.
C. For scaffolding not exceeding 15 feet in height where the building exceeds in area 16 squares	20s.
D. For scaffolding over 15 feet in height, but not exceeding 30 feet in height, where the building does not exceed an area of 16 squares	20s.
E. For scaffolding over 15 feet in height, but not exceeding 30 feet in height, where the building exceeds in area 16 squares	30s.
F. For all other scaffolding	40s.

Such fees shall be paid to the treasurer or acting treasurer of the City of St. Kilda for the time being.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of St. Kilda.

A By-law of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and under section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921*, and numbered 12, for altering By-law No. 9 and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and fences and for requiring the pulling down of same, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and for appointing fees which may be charged for any permit issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

At the end of Part 1—Definitions—there shall be inserted "square" applied to the measurement of any area means the space of 100 square feet.

In Part 2, clause 1, after the word "intention" shall be inserted "two days," and in clause 4, after the word "structure," for the words "or without first having paid to the treasurer such sum as shall be demanded by him" shall be substituted the words "and without first having paid to the Town Clerk such sum as shall be provided for in this By-law."

For clauses 6, 7 (a) and (b), shall be substituted the following:—

Clause 6. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house except in conformity with the following:—

(a) The site or curtilage of such dwelling-house shall have a superficial area of at least 5,000 feet, and have a frontage of not less than 50 lineal feet to a street or road, provided that with the consent of the Council where the depth of the land is not less than 112 feet the frontage may be reduced to 45 lineal feet. Except in the cases of corner sites, the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than two-fifths of the superficial area of such site.

(b) Every dwelling-house and out-building shall be at a minimum distance of 15 feet from the building line of the street the building is to front, such front to be determined by the Council, and 5 feet from the land of any adjoining owner, or where the land is the property of the same owner 5 feet from the dividing fence line of the adjoining tenement, but this provision shall not be held to apply to residential shops which may be built up to the boundary of the allotment, provided that there is on one side a clear open passage not less than 5 feet in width between the external wall of the dwelling portion and the boundary of land not in the same occupation.

(c) The dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any corner site having a frontage to two streets or roads shall cover not more than one-half of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

7. The dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any site or curtilage included in any subdivision of land made with the approval of the Council prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and not provided for in clause 6, shall, except in the cases of corner sites, cover not more than two-fifths of the superficial area of such site or curtilage. The dwelling-houses and other buildings to be erected on such sites shall be at a minimum distance of 10 feet from the building line of the street the building is to front and 3 feet from the land of any adjoining owner, or where the land is the property of the same owner 3 feet from the dividing fence line of the adjoining tenement.

The position of garages shall be as determined by the surveyor.

Clause 8 is hereby repealed and the following substituted:—

Clause 8. Not more than two dwelling-houses shall be attached together. In every such case the buildings shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, or other fire-proof or incombustible material, and each house shall itself stand on land having a width of not less than 30 feet and a depth of not less than 120 feet, or upon an area of land consisting of not less than 3,600 square feet, and each house shall have a clear space of not less than 8 feet in width along the side thereof, save as aforesaid the erection of any semi-detached dwelling-house is hereby prohibited.

In clause 10, for "or" after "removed" shall be substituted "and."

In clause 11, for "on" after "removed into" shall be substituted "and," and after "Borough" shall be added "or removed from one part of the Borough to another."

After clause 11 shall be added the following clause:—

Clause 11A. The interior of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used or shall or may be used as a dwelling-house shall be constructed of lath and plaster or of approved wood or fire-resisting materials.

After clause 13 (d) shall be added:—

(e) The surveyor shall have the right to restrict the erection and facing of any stable, shed, or outbuilding at a distance from any road or street which, in his opinion, may depreciate the frontages as residential or business sites.

In clause 14, for "twenty" feet shall be substituted "sixteen."

After clause 14 shall be added the following clause:—

Clause 14A.—Where required by the Council, closets, urinals, wood-sheds, fowl-houses, manure bins, and similar structures shall be suitably screened from the public view and the view of adjoining residents.

In clause 18, for "two rooms each containing 100 sq. feet" shall be substituted "three rooms and a bathroom."

At the end of Part 2 shall be added the following clauses:—

Clause 21. In all new dwellings and in dwellings that are being sewerod provision shall be made for a bathroom.

22. When in the opinion of the Council any fence abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road is in a dangerous or unsightly state, the Council may by notice in writing to be served on the owner of such fence, require such owner forthwith to take down, secure, or repair such fence as the case may require.

Clause 6 of Part 7 is hereby repealed, and the following clause substituted:—

Clause 6. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or structure which is intended to be used or which shall or may be used as a shop unless the external walls thereof are brick, masonry, or concrete.

Clause 6A. Residential Streets.—No building, except buildings for dwelling or residential purposes, will in future be allowed to be built in the following streets:—

Aberdeen-street, south side, from Latrobe-terrace to Pakington-street,
Pakington-street, west side, from Aberdeen-street to Prospect-road,
Austin-street, north side,
Latrobe-terrace, west side, from Austin-street to Aberdeen-street.

nor in the area bounded by these streets.

In clause 7—

(a) For "2s. 6d. for each living room" shall be substituted "2s. for each square or part thereof."

(c) For "2s. 6d." shall be substituted "2s."; the words "square . . . room" shall be deleted and the following added:—"The maximum fee shall be £3 10s. for dwellings and £5 for factories."

(d) "In any case the minimum fee shall not be less than 5s." is hereby repealed.

(e) After "and" and before "for the issue" shall be inserted "after approval."

(f) Boardings and street verandahs, 5s.; other verandahs, 2s. 6d.

(g) Additions and alterations, 2s. per square or part thereof.

Part 8, Angle Studs.—For "4 in. x 4 in." shall be substituted "4 in. x 2 in."

At the end of clause 8 of Part 7 shall be added clause 9—

Clause 9. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Council may, under special circumstances and for special causes, and at a meeting of which due notice of the business has been given to each councillor, declare that the provisions of this By-law, either in whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular property.

BY-LAW NUMBER 37.

A By-law of the Shire of Braybrook made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 37, for regulating traffic and processions.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Braybrook order as follows:—

1. The expression "machine" in this By-law shall mean and include any bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon or along any footway set apart for the use of pedestrians.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine and so constructed and placed as to exhibit a bright white light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine and shall also show a red light at the back or rear thereof.

4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he or she shall overtake with such machine any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden or foot passenger proceeding or standing on the street or carriage-way he shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden or foot passenger give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his or her machine by sounding a bell or whistle.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden or foot passenger shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle, animal, or foot passenger, and shall give audible and sufficient warning of his or her approach by sounding a bell or whistle.

6. In every case where a person riding, driving, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by a horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden on such meeting or overtaking becomes restive or alarmed or ceases to be under the due control of the person in charge of same, the person riding, driving, or impelling such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF ELTHAM.

BY-LAW No. 14.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Eltham made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 14, for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said section, viz.:—Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections, and for requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and for selling the materials and applying the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and any fees and penalties due by the owner thereof, and appointing fees to be charged and received by the Council of the Shire of Eltham for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council for repealing all By-laws and Regulations incompatible herewith, and for other purposes in connexion with the foregoing.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Eltham order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the South Riding of the Shire of Eltham, except where a different intention is expressed herein.

3. Clause 5 of Part VIII. of By-law 13 and Part XVI. of By-law 13 are hereby expressly repealed in so far as they apply to buildings of the domestic class.

Minimum Area.

4. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection except in conformity with the following:—

- (a) The site or curtilage of any dwelling house or other building erected within the area defined in schedule A hereto shall have a superficial area of at least 7,500 square feet, and have a frontage of not less than 50 lineal feet to a street or road, and that except in the case of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site.
- (b) The site or curtilage of any dwelling house or other building erected outside the area defined in schedule A hereto shall have a superficial area of at least one quarter of an acre, and have a frontage of not less than 50 feet to a street or road, and that except in the case of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site.
- (c) The dwelling house and other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any site or curtilage included in any subdivision of land made with the approval of the Council, prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and not provided for in sub-clause (a) or sub-clause (b) shall, except in the case of corner sites, cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site or curtilage fronting a street or road.
- (d) The dwelling house and other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any corner site or curtilage fronting to two streets or roads shall not cover more than one-third of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

Building Line.

5. No building which is intended to be used as a dwelling house, and no addition to any such building shall be erected within a distance of 15 feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.

Space at Side of Wood Dwellings.

6. Except as hereinafter provided no building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling house shall be built, constructed, or erected:—

- (a) within a distance of 4 feet measured horizontally of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of any such building.
- (b) within a distance of 5 feet measured horizontally of land not in the same possession or occupation.
- (c) within a distance of 10 feet measured horizontally of another building with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation.

Combined Shops and Dwellings.

7. Clauses 4, 5, and 6 hereof shall apply to any building which is intended to be, or shall be, used as a combined shop and dwelling, provided nevertheless that, with the consent of the Council, the said clauses may be modified in the case of any such building by permitting the same to abut wholly or partially on the building line of the street or road, or to be less than the prescribed distance therefrom.

Quality of Materials.

8. All materials used in buildings of the domestic class must comply with the requirements of Part III. of By-law 13.

Spacing and Size of Timbers.

9. The following conditions shall apply to spacing and scantlings of timber:—

- (a) Stumps to be not less than 4 inches x 4 inches red gum, jarrah, or other approved hardwood, and to be sunk not less than 15 inches in the ground, the spacing thereof being not more than 4 feet.
- (a1.) Sole plates under each block to be 9 in. x 6 in. x 1 in. jarrah or red gum.
- (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches spaced not more than 18 inches apart centre to centre, and properly braced.
- (c) Rafters to be not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches spaced 3 feet centre to centre, in the case of iron roofs, and 18 inches centre to centre in the case of slate, tile, or other similar roofs, securely braced with purlins and collar ties.
(Every room more than 12 feet at its maximum width shall have a ceiling larder of oregon or hardwood not less than 8 inches x 1 inch.)
- (d) Floor joists to be not less than 4 inches x 2 inches spaced 18 inches apart centre to centre on 4-inch x 3-inch bearers spaced 4 feet apart. Floors to be in no part less than 9 inches above the surface of the ground.

Size of Buildings.

10. No dwelling house or other building shall be erected within the area defined in schedule A hereto unless the same shall consist of at least four rooms, each room having an area of not less than 100 square feet.

11. No dwelling house shall be erected outside the area defined in schedule A hereto unless the same shall consist of at least three rooms, each room having an area of not less than 100 square feet, excepting when special permission is granted by the Council.

Height of Walls.

12. The main rooms in every dwelling house hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling. For the purposes of this clause the expression "main rooms" shall be deemed to mean rooms used or intended to be used as bedrooms, dining-rooms, and ordinary living rooms, but not kitchens. The decision of the Council or of the Building Surveyor, subject to review by the Council, as to whether a particular room comes within the scope of this clause or not shall be final and conclusive.

Roofs.

13. The roof of every building which is used or intended to be used as a dwelling shall be covered on the outside with incombustible material.

Interior Linings.

14. The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used, or shall or may be used as a dwelling house shall be constructed of lath and plaster, fibro-cement, stamped steel, lining boards, or other approved material. No combination of hessian paper or like material will be permitted.

Lighting.

15. Every main room and kitchen in a dwelling house shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies of glass clear of sash frames, free from obstruction to light, equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room, and so constructed that at least one-half of the window can be opened for ventilation.

Space under Floors.

16. The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

Exterior Walls.

17. The exterior walls of buildings used or intended to be used as dwellings may be constructed of brick, stone, reinforced concrete, cement blocks, weatherboards (hardwood, jarrah, or Baltic), cement rough-cast, or fibro-cement.

Chimneys.

18. Chimneys must be built in a workmanlike manner to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

Fowlhouses and Stables.

19. No fowlhouse or stable shall be erected or allowed to remain on any allotment within the area described in schedule A hereto, except with the express permission in writing of the Council. No fowlhouse or stable shall be erected or allowed to remain outside the said area unless the same is 50 feet from any building used as a dwelling on the same allotment or allotments adjoining.

Closets.

20. No privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected or allowed to remain at a less distance than 30 feet from the door or window of any dwelling house on the same allotment, or any allotment adjoining, or a less distance than 12 feet from any street, and shall in each case be effectively screened from public view. Provided that in case there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment the privy, closet, or urinal may be erected to the boundary between such allotment and the right-of-way. No closet or urinal shall be erected or remain in front of any building facing a public highway. Every closet shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

Fences.

21. Within the area defined in schedule A, all residential blocks upon which a dwelling house is erected shall be enclosed with a substantial fence. Such fence along dividing lines shall be at least 5 feet high, and shall be constructed of split or sawn palings, or galvanized corrugated iron attached to rails of 3-inch x 2-inch hardwood fixed to posts of 5-inch x 3-inch jarrah or red gum, properly struted, and spaced not more than 9 feet from centre to centre. Palings or corrugated iron to meet a 6-inch x 1-inch jarrah or hardwood plinth.

Ventilation.

22. Each room to have at least one ventilator of approved pattern, the dimensions of which are not less than 50 square inches.

Plumbing.

23. All plumbing work must be carried out to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor. Down pipes must be arranged so that no water is distributed over adjoining property or allowed to run under a building. Drain pipes or outlet channels must not be carried under the floor of any building.

Old Buildings.

24. Before any building or erection is removed into the Shire of Eltham from any part outside the said shire, or from any part of the said shire to another part thereof, the owner or person carrying out the removal shall give to the Council not less than fourteen clear days' notice in writing of his intention to remove and re-erect such building, and shall with such notice supply the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.
- (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, particulars of any alteration to be made thereto, and a tracing or copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.
- (d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of such building and of the alterations which it is intended to make thereto when the building is re-erected, and shall at the same time produce satisfactory evidence that the building has not been condemned by any authority as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice the Council shall instruct the Building Surveyor to inspect such building or erection before removal, and he shall report to the Council whether in his opinion such building when removed and re-erected will be in compliance with the provisions of the By-law and the Building Regulations of the Council or not. If the Building Surveyor certifies that such building when removed and re-erected will be in accordance with this By-law and the Building Regulations, then the Council shall grant a permit for its removal and re-erection, but not otherwise.

25. No building that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be erected.

26. No building or erection in which a case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding six months shall be removed into or re-erected within the shire.

27. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling house shall be removed to or re-erected within the shire unless the same when re-erected shall cover an area of 600 square feet at the least, and shall comply with the requirements of this By-law as to spacings and scantlings of timbers.

28. Every old building re-erected in the shire must be thoroughly cleaned down inside and outside, and coated on the exterior with three coats of oil and white lead.

Insanitary Buildings.

29. When it is made known to the Council that any building, erection, or structure is in an insanitary condition, the Council shall cause an inspection to be made by the Medical Officer of Health, who shall have power to enter any premises for the purpose of making such inspection. If such officer reports that the building, erection, or structure is in an insanitary condition the Council may cause a notice in writing to be served upon the owner of such building, erection, or structure requiring such owner to forthwith cleanse, alter, repair, or take down such building, erection, or structure as

the Council may require. If such owner does not within three days after service of such notice begin to carry out the works as directed by the Council, and complete same as speedily as the nature of the case will permit, the Council may carry out such work, and recover from the owner the cost of so doing.

Tents.

30. No tent shall be erected within the area described in schedule A hereto except with the permission of the Council.

31. No tent shall be erected unless and until proper and sufficient provision has been made for all garbage removal and sanitary requirements, and such provision as the Surveyor may direct as to temporary stone or iron fire-places for the safe use of fire.

Notice and Fees.

32. No person shall build, or cause, or permit to be built, any building or addition to any building, without first submitting to the Council a plan and tracing thereof, and specifications of the proposed building or addition, and without first obtaining a permit in writing from the Council, which permit the Council may revoke after three months from the date thereof if the building be not proceeded with.

33. All plans and specifications of any building, or of any addition to any building, submitted to the Council must show or state the purpose for which the building or addition is intended to be used, as well as all details of construction, including sizes and qualities of all materials proposed to be used, the position of the building relative to contiguous buildings, erections, fences, or hoardings (if any), or to cross streets, lanes, right-of-ways, to street alignment, and to the boundary lines of land not in the same occupation, the name and address of the owner of the land upon which it is proposed to build, and an estimate of the cost of the building.

34. No person shall commence any building, or any addition to any building without having first paid to the Council such fees as are set out in schedule B hereto.

35. No building shall be erected (or adapted to be used) as a dwelling house upon any land, the surface of which is so situated as not to admit of being sufficiently drained at all times by gravitation into an adjoining stormwater sewer or channel.
