I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to ratify an Agreement for the Variation of the Agreement entered into between the Prime Minister of the Commonwealth and the Premiers of the States of New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia respecting the River Murray and Lake Victoria and other Waters and to amend the River Murray Waters Acts."

"An Act relating to the Handling of Fruit and Vegetables and for other purposes."

## DIRECTOR OF MELBOURNE BOTANIC GARDENS AND GOVERNMENT BOTANIST.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 1380.—GENERAL RATE.—CARWARP WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Carwarp Waterworks District, except within any Urban District thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands, and for watering cattle or other stock—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the Post-Office at Yatpool, and the Post-Office at Carwarp—a rate of Forty-six pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands, with a minimum amount of rate in respect of such lands of Ten pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence for each holding of six hundred and forty acres in extent, with a proportionate sum as a minimum for any holding of a greater or less area.

- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Twenty-three pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Eleven and one-half pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1923, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1924, and shall be payable on the ninth day of November, 1923, at the office of the said Commission, at Red Cliffs.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the value of the lands set out in the valuation made, in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1915*, by Alfred Stephen Kenyon, valuer, returned on the 11th day of September, 1922, and adopted by the said Commission on the 11th day of September, 1922, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, unless altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act 1915*, and if so altered or amended, then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

FOR THE PERIOD 1ST DECEMBER, 1923, TO 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1924, EXCEPT WHERE OTHERWISE STATED.

Tender Forms can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Land Offices in the country.

Tenders should be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box on or before Noon on Friday, 30th November, 1923.

NOTE.—No tender will be accepted unless the fee for the full period and fee of Five shillings for licence are forwarded.

TENDERS will be received on or before Noon on Friday, 30th November, 1923, for the right to depasture stock on the following unappropriated portions of land subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined Special Conditions.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the Land Act 1915 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

## CONDITIONS.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the Land Acts, except under the 121st section of the Land Act 1915, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council.

2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Land Acts may think fit.

3. 4. Subject to these conditions the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the Land Act 1915 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the Government Gazette, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling or other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act 1890 in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

16. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Mount Evelyn in the area set out in clause 12 hereto, but it shall cease to apply to any portion or portions of the said area that may from time to time be exempted from its operation by special order of the Council.
4. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause a space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double pan services hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
5. The Council shall cause each closet or privy to be supplied or kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil deposited in the pan of such closet or privy to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and another pan to be left in its place.
8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam, and tar painted inside or by some equally efficient means.
9. The occupier aforesaid or other persons shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises, except in accordance with this By-law.
10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.
11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of the By-law, he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or commenced.
12. The Sanitary Area for Mount Evelyn shall be as follows:—Commencing at the south-eastern corner of allotment 29A, Parish of Mooroolbark; thence southerly for about 40 chains into allotment 29, Parish of Mooroolbark; thence easterly for about 100 chains along southern boundary of allotment 28B and through allotment 31A, Parish of Mooroolbark, also easterly through allotment 141C, Parish of Wandin Yallock, to the eastern boundary of the Monbulk-road; thence northerly for a distance of about 45 chains through allotment 81, Parish of Wandin Yallock, to a point in allotment 32A, Parish of Mooroolbark; thence westerly and southerly along the northern boundaries of allotments 31C and 31B and 30B to the western boundary of allotment 29A, Parish of Mooroolbark; thence southerly to commencing point.
