### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VII. of the *Public Service Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2713), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays and Public Half-Holidays respectively at the places specified, viz. :—

**CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.  
PROPOSED SEVERANCE AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW  
MUNICIPALITY.**

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the city of Williamstown which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the city of Williamstown and constituted a new municipality under the name and title of "The Borough of Newport."

**Area described in petition—**

Commencing at a point in the middle of the Strand-road at the steam ferry; thence by a line running southerly along the middle of the Strand-road to its junction with the North-road; thence by a line running west along the middle of the North-road and across the Melbourne-road to the eastern fence of the Melbourne and Williamstown railway; thence north to the crossing at the Newport Railway Station; thence west across the railway line and along the northern fence of the Melbourne and Geelong railway to the western boundary of the municipality; thence north by the said western boundary to the Stony Creek; thence east by the Stony Creek to the River Yarra; thence south by the River Yarra to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the proposed new borough at present forms the Victoria Ward of the City of Williamstown, and has an area of about one-third of the said city.

That out of an amount of £73,000 raised by the Council on loans since 1914, only £13,000 has been expended in the Victoria Ward, which has during that time been compelled to contribute to the repayment of the principal and interest on the whole amount of such loans.

That while the rates from Victoria Ward for the past three years have increased, the expenditure of such rates in that ward has not increased in the said proportion to revenue as has the expenditure in other wards.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Borough of Newport," such municipality to be un-subdivided.

**TRENTHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.**

**RATING BY-LAW.**

THE chairman and Commissioners of the Trentham Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law :—

By-law No. 11.

The following rates are those which all occupiers or owners of land or tenements situated in reticulated streets within the Urban District of the above Trust shall pay in respect of the year 1923 :—

1. (a) For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds (£13) annual municipal valuation and under, the sum of One pound ten shillings.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds (£13) annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings and fourpence in the pound sterling on the amount of such municipal valuation.
2. For each vacant allotment or piece of land facing a street wherein a water main is laid, rated for the ordinary municipal rates separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings and fourpence in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of same.
3. Such rates shall be due and payable in two equal instalments, and each half of such instalment shall be due respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July in the year 1923.
4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby duly authorized to demand, collect and receive the said rate.

A By-law of the City of Caulfield made under sub-section (22) of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 45 for regulating traffic and processions.

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. No person shall at any one and the same time act as driver or have the sole charge of more than one horse-drawn cart dray or other vehicle on any public road or street of the city of Caulfield.

2. No person in charge of any horse-drawn cart dray or other vehicle in the city of Caulfield shall during the time he is in charge of and while such horse-drawn cart dray or other vehicle is in motion ride in any horse-drawn cart dray or vehicle other than the one he is in charge of, or be at such time more than 12 feet away from the last referred to vehicle.

3. No person under the age of 14 years shall act as the driver of any horse-drawn vehicle within the city of Caulfield driven within the said city for business or trade purposes.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Caulfield.

5. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than £1.

**CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.**  
 BATHING REGULATION.

A Regulation of the City of Williamstown, numbered Twelve (12) and made under section one of Part IX. of the Thirtieth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force by virtue of a By-law of the City of Williamstown numbered Fifty-eight (58) for regulating bathing at a public bathing place.

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Williamstown make the following Regulation which shall apply to that portion of the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay, extending from the east side of Garden-street to the east side of Victoria-street within the municipality of the city of Williamstown:—

1. Bathing Regulation, number Eleven (XI.) is hereby repealed.

2. No person shall bathe in the open sea at any part of the foreshore aforesaid unless effectively and decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume with kilt and similar

to that known as the Canadian costume, and any constable or officer of police or any officer or employee of the Council may require any person who, in his opinion, is not sufficiently or decently dressed, to at once resume his ordinary attire.

3. No person over the age of ten years shall bathe within 50 feet of the baths of the Williamstown Bathing Company.

4. No person over the age of ten years clothed in a bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter or play games on, or run along the foreshore aforesaid, but shall on leaving the dressing sheds to enter the water proceed in a direct line and on leaving the water shall return in a direct line to the dressing sheds.

5. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, riotous or noisy manner, or use profane or obscene language in or upon any part of the foreshore aforesaid or whilst bathing in the open sea.

6. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume on any portion of the foreshore aforesaid except within the dressing sheds provided on the foreshore for that purpose.

7. No male over the age of eight years shall enter any dressing shed provided and reserved for the use of females, and no female over the age of eight years shall enter any dressing shed provided and reserved for males.

8. No person shall play any game or loiter or deposit any rubbish or filth or other offensive matter in the dressing sheds aforesaid nor damage, disfigure, or write upon the same.

9. No person shall bathe any horse or other animal at any portion of the foreshore or beach other than that set apart for the purpose and indicated by finger posts painted red with white lettering thereon to this effect:—"Horses and other animals to be bathed between these posts only," and no horse or other animal shall enter or leave the foreshore or beach by any other way than the one provided for the purpose near the west end of the asphalt footpath or promenade on the south side of the Esplanade, and no horse or other animal shall be taken across or along such asphalt, footpath or promenade.

10. No person shall bathe any horse or other animal on the foreshore or beach on week days after the hour of Ten o'clock in the forenoon, or on Sundays and gazetted public holidays for the State of Victoria after the hour of half-past Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and no person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal upon or along the beach or foreshore except at a walking pace, and no person shall bathe any horse or other animal upon the foreshore or beach unless such horse or other animal is properly reined and in charge of an attendant, who shall be effectively and decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume kilted or similar to that known as the Canadian costume, and every such horse or other animal shall, immediately upon leaving the water, be taken off the foreshore or beach.
