### Regulations.

REGULATIONS as to the issue of Certificates of Competency and Qualification, made under section 169 of the Local Government Act 1915.

### CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

1. Examinations of candidates desirous of obtaining certificates of competency to exercise the office of Municipal Clerk will be held in Melbourne, in the months of February and August in each year, at a place and times to be hereafter appointed, and at such other places and times as the Board may deem advisable. deem advisable.

deem advisable.

2. Every intending candidate must give at least twenty-one clear days' notice in writing to the Secretary of the Board of his intention to present himself for examination.

3. Satisfactory evidence must be produced of the age and respectability of character of any candidate, and no candidate shall be eligible for examination under the age of twenty-one (21) years, or who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

4. Should the evidence supplied in compliance with the foregoing Regulation be deemed satisfactory, the candidate, on receipt of notice to that effect, will be required to remit to the Secretary of the Board the sum of £2 2s. as fee for examination. tion.

.5. Candidates for a certificate of competency will be examined in-

6. The examination will occupy the space of one day of seven hours, that is, from 9.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m., and from 2.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.

7. After the distribution of any set of questions candidates in attendance will not be allowed to leave the examination room until the expiration of half-an-hour from the time of cominencement, and at the termination of that half-hour no candidate will be admitted.

8. In answering the questions set, one side only of each sheet of paper may be written upon. The different sheets are be each signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, pinned together, and handed in punctually at the expiration of the time allowed.

9. Any candidate detected in the act of using books of reference or notes, or engaging in conversation with any other candidate during the progress of the examination, may be summarily dismissed from the room.

10. Candidates who pass the prescribed examination will be granted a certificate of competency, to be issued by the Board.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SUR-VEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
- 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.

(b) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to
- (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other 5. (4) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession. profession.

Note.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

- (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision. Engingering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

### Use of Instruments.

(c) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tacheometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, com-pilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

### Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikic's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such provision as may be deemed necessary.

No. 8. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 9. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1923.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

  (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.

  (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

- pence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

  (f) For water supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic purposes, not including garden use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

  (g) Water supplied by meter and consumed for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate due for the year in rospect of the premises supplied, and for all water used in excess the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

  (h) For water supplied by meter solely for purposes other than domestic, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per half-year. The Trust may, in cases where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.

  (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

  (j) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1923, and the first day of July, 1923, respectively.

- 2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

(22) Bathe wade or wash or wash clothes or other articles in any lake pond stream or other ornamental water in the Reserve or foul or pollute any such water or take injure or destroy or attempt to take injure or destroy or wilfully disturb any fish in any such water or wilfully disturb or worry or illtreat any fowl in any such water or elsewhere in the Reserve.

### Dogs.

(23) Cause of suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the reserve unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from worrying or disturbing any beast and from entering any ornamental water and from injuring or destroying worrying or disturbing any fowl in the Reserve.
