CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY AND QUALIFICATION.

Regulations.

REGULATIONS as to the issue of Certificates of Competency and Qualification, made under section 169 of the Local Government Act 1915.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

- Examinations of candidates desirous of obtaining certificates of competency to exercise the office of Municipal Clerk will be held in Melbourne, in the months of February and August in each year, at a place and times to be hereafter appointed, and at such other places and times as the Board may deem advisable.
- Every intending candidate must give at least twenty-one clear days' notice in writing to the Secretary of the Board of his intention to present himself for examination.
- Satisfactory evidence must be produced of the age and respectability of character of any candidate, and no candidate shall be eligible for examination under the age of twenty-one (21) years, or who has been convicted of a breach of trust.
- Should the evidence supplied in compliance with the foregoing Regulation be deemed satisfactory, the candidate, on receipt of notice to that effect, will be required to remit to the Secretary of the Board the sum of £2 2s. as fee for examination.
- Candidates for a certificate of competency will be examined in—

Municipal and Mercantile Bookkeeping, and
The Laws relating to Local Government in Victoria.

- The examination will occupy the space of one day of seven hours, that is, from 9.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m., and from 2.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.
- After the distribution of any set of questions candidates in attendance will not be allowed to leave the examination room until the expiration of half-an-hour from the time of commencement, and at the termination of that half-hour no candidate will be admitted.
- In answering the questions set, one side only of each sheet of paper may be written upon. The different sheets are to be each signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, pinned together, and handed in punctually at the expiration of the time allowed.
- Any candidate detected in the act of using books of reference or notes, or engaging in conversation with any other candidate during the progress of the examination, may be summarily dismissed from the room.
- Candidates who pass the prescribed examination will be granted a certificate of competency, to be issued by the Board.

CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION.

The Board will grant certificates of qualification—

- To any person proving to the satisfaction of the Board that he has held the office of Municipal Clerk in any municipality or municipalities in Victoria, including the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong, for five years at least, either before or after the passing of the Local Government Act of 24th December, 1903, or was at the time of the passing of the said Act acting or officiating as Municipal Clerk in any municipality, including the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong, and has for ten (10) years, at least, been employed in a municipal office.
- Every applicant for a certificate of qualification must forward to the Secretary of the Board—
 - A copy of the minute of his appointment under seal of the municipality by which he has been employed, and certified to by the Chairman thereof.

Land Surveyors Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]
(Signed) _____ A.B.

(Date.) _____

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £3 3s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £3 3s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1915*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Rating By-law:

OMELO WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1923 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

No. 1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

No. 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Ten shillings.

No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds, a rate of Ten per centum shall be charged on the amount of the valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.

No. 4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be made.

No. 5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such provision as may be deemed necessary.

No. 8. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 9. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1923.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

WANGARATTA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.

THE Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

- (a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no buildings), the sum of One pound sterling (£1).
- (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of Five pounds (£5) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) For water supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic purposes, not including garden use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) Water supplied by meter and consumed for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate due for the year in respect of the premises supplied, and for all water used in excess the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (h) For water supplied by meter solely for purposes other than domestic, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per half-year. The Trust may, in cases where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1923, and the first day of July, 1923, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

having framed the following Regulations for the care protection and management thereof and the preservation of good order and decency therein submits the said Regulations to the Board of Land and works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction of these Rules and Regulations—unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“The Reserve” shall mean the reserves hereinbefore specified and each of them or any part or parts thereof.

“The Board” shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

“The Council” shall mean the Council of the Borough of Queenscliffe or other the Committee of Management for the time being of the Reserve appointed pursuant to the above Act.

“Unauthorized person” means any person other than a person for the time, being duly authorized in writing by the Council or the Board or an officer of or a person or a servant of a person employed by the Council or the Board in or about any work in connexion with laying out planting improving or maintaining the Reserve.

2. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

3. No unauthorized person shall do any of the following acts matters or things on the Reserve:—

- (1) On any day on which the Reserve may be open to the public enter the Reserve before the time hereinbefore appointed for the opening thereof or enter the Reserve or remain therein after the time hereinbefore appointed for the closing thereof.

Injuring Trees or Flowers.

- (2) Cut pluck injure or destroy any tree bush or flower growing thereon.

Cutting Turf, &c.

- (3) Dig cut or remove any sod turf loam sand gravel or other substance thereon or therefrom.

Causing Fire.

- (4) Light any fire or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being thereon.

Leaving Rubbish.

- (5) Deposit or leave thereon or on any part thereof any rubbish bricks manure timber or other substance or material whatsoever.

Drying.

- (6) Bleach or place out to dry any article or thing.

Carpet Beating.

- (7) Beat shake sweep brush or cleanse any carpet rug or mat or any other fabric retaining dust or dirt.

Interference with Birds or Game.

- (8) Catch or trap any bird or lay or place any trap for the taking of birds or take any bird's egg or nest or shoot or chase or disturb any game or other animal.

Allowing Animals to Stray.

- (9) Cause or suffer any horse pony mule ass bull ox cow calf heifer steer sheep lamb goat hog or sow belonging to him or in his charge to enter or go thereupon.

Making Erection or Obstruction.

- (10) Encamp thereon or erect or place thereon any booth tent shed stand screen post rail fence swing chair or seat (other than a camp-stool or other portable chair of seat) or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever or make any inclosure of any part thereof.

Defacing Notices, &c.

- (11) Injure deface or remove any seat notice or notice board post chair railing fence barrier or other thing which may be from time to time erected or placed thereon by or by the authority of the Council or the Board.

Bill-posting.

- (12) Post or paint any bill placard or notice thereon or on any fence erection or tree thereon.

Carving Names, &c.

- (13) Paint write cut carve or in any manner inscribe letters figures or marks upon or otherwise disfigure any rock or tree or any wall or fence or other structure or erection on the reserve.

Beasts of Draught or Burden not to be Brought into Ground.

- (14) Ride drive or bring or cause or suffer to be ridden driven or brought into the Reserve any beast of draught or burden.

Prohibition of Vehicles—Except Perambulators and Wheeled Chairs.

- (15) Drive or wheel or cause or suffer to be driven or wheeled into the Reserve any barrow truck or machine or any vehicle other than a wheeled chair drawn or propelled by hand or a perambulator or a chaise drawn or propelled by hand and used solely for the conveyance of a child or children or an invalid. Provided that this and the last preceding rule shall not be deemed to prohibit the riding or driving of any horse pony ass or mule or the driving or wheeling of any bicycle tricycle or other similar machine or of any other vehicle in any part of the Reserve which is for the time being appointed or intended or adapted to be used as a horse-ride bicycle-track or carriage road subject to such conditions as the Council may prescribe and may be indicated in a notice or notices affixed or set up in a conspicuous position at or near to the several entrances to the Reserve.

Brawling, &c.

- (16) Brawl fight use indecent language or act in an indecent disorderly or offensive manner or sell distribute or exhibit any indecent or infamous book picture or representation to the obstruction annoyance or danger of persons resorting to the Reserve.

Firearms.

- (17) Fire or discharge any firearm or throw or discharge any missile.

Climbing.

- (18) Climb any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve or any tree or any barrier railing or post in the Reserve.

Selling &c., without Licence.

- (19) Sell or let or ply for hire with any article animal and/or cart or distribute any bill or like thing or place any chair or seat for hire.

Collection of Money.

- (20) Solicit or gather money or other thing.

Public Addresses.

- (21) Deliver or read any public address speech lecture prayer or sermon or address of any kind or sing any song or enter into any public discussion or play any musical instrument.

Wading and Bathing: Pollution of Water: Fishing: Disturbing Fowl.

- (22) Bathe wade or wash or wash clothes or other articles in any lake pond stream or other ornamental water in the Reserve or foul or pollute any such water or take injure or destroy or attempt to take injure or destroy or wilfully disturb any fish in any such water or wilfully disturb or worry or illtreat any fowl in any such water or elsewhere in the Reserve.

Dogs.

- (23) Cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the reserve unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from worrying or disturbing any beast and from entering any ornamental water and from injuring or destroying worrying or disturbing any fowl in the Reserve.

Smoking.

- (24) Smoke tobacco or any like substance in any building in the reserve where by a notice or notices affixed or set up in some conspicuous position the Council may prohibit smoking in such building.

Betting.

- (25) Frequent or use the Reserve for the purpose of betting or wagering or of agreeing to make any bet or wager.

Playing Games.

- (28) Play practise or engage in any game or sport on Sunday or (except as is hereinafter provided) play or take part in any game of football quoits bowls hockey, cricket or any other game which by reason of the rules or manner of playing or for the prevention of damage danger or discomfort to any person in the Reserve may necessitate at any time during the continuance of the game the exclusive use by the player or players of any space in the Reserve Provided that where by a notice or notices which shall be affixed or set up in some conspicuous position in the Reserve and at or near to each of the principal entrances thereto the Council may from time to time set apart for the playing of any such game or games as may be specified in such notice or notices such space or spaces in the Reserve as shall be defined or described in such notice or notices this rule shall not be taken to prohibit any person from playing or taking part in any game or games which may be played in such space or spaces and in accordance with the following regulations:—

Interference with Other Players.

- (i) Every person resorting to any such space for the purpose of playing or taking part in any such game shall, in making preparation for the playing of such game and in the manner of playing, use reasonable and proper care to prevent undue interference with the reasonable and proper use of such space by any other person engaged in making preparation for playing or in playing therein or thereafter resorting to such space for the purpose of making preparation for playing or of playing therein.

Over-crowding Playground.

- (ii) A person resorting to any such space for the purpose of playing or taking part in any such game shall not begin to play at any time when such space is already occupied by such a number of players and in such a manner as to render any addition to the number of players incompatible with the safe and convenient use of such space by the players already in occupation.

Matches: Monopolizing Ground.

- (iii) Except in any case where the exclusive use of any such space or of any part thereof may have been granted by the Council for the playing of any match of which the occasion and character shall be such as to render expedient an extension of the time hereinafter specified a player or company of players shall not in making preparation for playing and in playing any game use any part of such space for a longer time than two hours continuously if at the expiration of that time any other player or company of players for whose use no other part of such space or no part of any other space set apart for the purpose may be available shall make known to such first-mentioned player or company of players an intention to use for the purpose of playing such part of such space as shall have been previously used by such player or company of players.

Trample on Plants or Flower-beds.

- (27) Walk or run over or stand sit or lie upon any part of any flower-bed or any shrub underwood gorse furze fern or plant or any ground in course of preparation or cultivation as a flower-bed or for the reception or growth of any shrub underwood gorse furze fern or plant.

Obstruction of Officers: Disturbance or Interruption.

- (25) Obstruct disturb interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or obstruct disturb or interrupt any officer of the Council or the Board in the proper execution of his duty or any person or servant of any person employed by the Council or the Board in the proper execution of any work in connexion with laying out planting improvement or maintenance of the Reserve.

General Clause.

- (29) Do aid in or abet any act or thing which may not in these rules be specifically mentioned and which may tend to the injury or disfigurement of the Reserve or to interfere with the use thereof by the public for the purposes of exercise and recreation.

Acts Forbidden on Portions Set Apart for Games.

4. Where by a notice or notices which shall be conspicuously exhibited on the Reserve the Council shall from time to time set apart any portion of the Reserve for any game or athletic sport or generally for the assemblage of persons for any purpose no person shall on any portion of the Reserve so set apart as aforesaid—

Driving, &c.

- (a) Drive ride or pass over the ground with any vehicle or upon horseback.

Driving to Public Danger.

- (b) Drive or ride among or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled for any of the purposes aforesaid.

Games.

- (c) Take part in any such game or assemblage as aforesaid except at such time and under such regulations as are hereinafter contained or as the Council may from time to time prescribe.

Obstruction of Games.

- (d) Obstruct interfere with or annoy any person who is taking part or has made preparation to take part in or is lawfully present at any gathering for any of the purposes aforesaid.

Movable Erections.

- (e) Place any chair seat band-stand or other movable erection on such portion of the Reserve without the consent of the Council under the hand of the Town Clerk.

Addresses and Disorderly Meetings.

- (f) Deliver or take part in the delivery of any address whatsoever or remain with any assemblage of persons after having been informed by a Justice of the Peace and an officer of the Council or the Board that they anticipate that the continuance of such an address or assemblage would lead to scenes of disorder and having been requested by them to desist and to leave the assemblage.

Improper Intrusion.

5. A male person other than a boy under the age of seven years shall not enter or use any play-ground place room or building set apart for the use of females and a female person shall not enter or use any play-ground place room or building set apart for the use of males.

Penalties.

6. Every person offending against any of the foregoing rules or regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

7. Every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any of the foregoing rules or regulations and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

8. The Regulations framed by the Borough of Queenscliffe the fifth day of January One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven and passed by the Board of Land and Works on the twelfth day of February One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven and gazetted the nineteenth day of February One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven at page 729 of the *Government Gazette* shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
