Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 12 (FUEL AND FODDER).

NOTE.—This Determination on the 16th March, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Sandringham and Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

On the 10th September, 1913, this Board was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in any business or occupation connected with the sale or distribution of coal or coke by any—

- (a) coal importer,
- (b) coal mine owner,
- (c) gas company;

and such power was conferred exclusively on the Coal and Coke Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (c) employed in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of wood, coal, or coke,"

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, and double time shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and a third per centum.

(7) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of under Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not be in any case less than One pound four shillings per annum.

(2) For any house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

(3) The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Six shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre; Twelve shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre; Eighteen shillings if more than half an acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre; with a maximum charge of One pound four shillings sterling for any parcel of land within the Urban District.

(4) Where any horses or cows are wholly or partially kept on, or at, any land or tenement not supplied by the Trust with water by measurement there shall be payable for every such animal (exceeding one in number) wholly or partially kept as aforesaid (in addition to the assessment rate) a special rate of Six shillings per head per annum.

(5) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons.

(6) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1923.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 147.

1. This By-law shall apply to the Urban District of Strathmerton, as such District is proclaimed and defined by any Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of September, 1901.

2. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban District shall pay in respect of the year 1923 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Six pounds or under according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Six pounds and on vacant allotments, a rate of Three shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the municipal valuation for the time being.

4. Such rate shall be paid half-yearly in advance on 1st day of January, 1923, and the 1st day of July, 1923.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW, 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, in pursuance to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 14.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

(a) For every house, building, or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building or tenement, shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound five shillings and sixpence per annum and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer owning or occupying one house, building or tenement only, shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation.

(b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

(c) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings or tenements within the Waterworks District to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of the said houses, buildings or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure), shall for that part or the whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings or tenements, but for no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal valuations of all the said houses, buildings or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantities be exceeded the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(d) For water supplied by measure a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid. Provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 17,000 gallons per annum and that the minimum charge for Government premises supplied with water shall be Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied by measure to all consumers outside the water area and Urban District, a rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid and that the minimum charge shall be Two pounds per annum.

2. The rates and charges herein are made for the year ending on the 31st December, 1923, and shall be payable in one sum on the 15th day of February, 1923.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Real Estate Agents Act 1922* the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same doth make the Regulations following:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Real Estate Agents Licensing Regulations 1923*.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Act” means the *Real Estate Agents Act 1922*.

“Licence” means a licence under the Act.

“Prescribed” means prescribed by the Act or by these Regulations.

3. A party desiring to obtain renew or transfer a licence shall as prescribed by the Act lodge with the Clerk of Petty Sessions of the Court where the application is intended to be made an application in the form or to the effect of the one suitable to the case contained in the First Schedule hereto.

4. The notice of every application for a licence or for the renewal or transfer of a licence required by the Act to be posted by a Clerk of Petty Sessions in a conspicuous place inside and also outside the Court building shall be in the form or to the effect of the one contained in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. A person desiring to object to the grant renewal or transfer of a licence shall lodge with the Clerk of Petty Sessions of the Court where the application for the grant is to be heard a notice in the form or to the effect of the one in the Third Schedule hereto.

6. The fidelity bond required to be lodged on an application for a licence or on the transfer of a licence or on the renewal of a licence when the applicant has not lodged with the Clerk a receipt for the renewal premium on the bond previously lodged by the applicant or a certificate by the insurance company or other surety of the renewal of such bond shall be in the form or to the effect of the one in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

7. The Clerk of Petty Sessions of the Court at which an application for the issue or renewal of a real estate agent's licence is granted shall on payment of the prescribed fee prepare and issue to the person entitled a licence in the form or to the effect of the one applicable to the case contained in the Fifth Schedule.

In the case of the grant of an application for the transfer of a real estate agent's licence such Clerk on payment of the prescribed fee shall indorse the licence transferred with a memorandum in the form in the Sixth Schedule hereto.

8. Every duplicate licence ordered to be issued by a Court of Petty Sessions on the loss or destruction of the original shall before issue be indorsed by the Clerk of Petty Sessions issuing it with the word “Duplicate of licence No. issued by order of the Court of Petty Sessions at this day of 19 .”

9. For each licence the duration of which is for not more than nine months of a year the fees payable according to its currency shall be as follows:—

For a licence for the balance of any year issued in such year between the thirty-first day of March and the first day of July £4 4 0

For a licence for the balance of any year issued in such year between the thirtieth day of June and the thirty-first day of December £3 3 0

10. The Clerk of Petty Sessions at each Court shall forward to the Treasurer with his Revenue Statement of collections a return in the form or to the effect of the one in the Seventh Schedule hereto of all grants renewals transfers and cancellations of real estate agents' licences made allowed or ordered by such Court during the time covered by the Revenue Statement which it accompanies.

41. The register of licences and of renewals transfers or cancellations thereof shall be in the form or to the effect of the one contained in the Eighth Schedule hereto and shall be in index form having such number of the leaves of the constituted volume appropriated to each letter of the alphabet as may be sufficient for recording consecutively under the same letter the case of all persons granted licences the initial letter of whose surnames are the same and the Treasurer on being notified of the grant of a licence whether original or by way of renewal or transfer shall cause the particulars to be recorded in the appropriate section of the register.

In the case of a licence to a person nominated by a corporation to hold a licence on its behalf the Treasurer shall cause a cross-entry to be recorded under the initial letter of the corporation its name with a reference to the name of the licensee so holding.

Hospitals and Charities Act 1922 (No. 3260).
REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of March, 1923.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922 (No. 3260)*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following:—

Hospitals and Charities Act 1922 (No. 3260).

REGULATIONS.

It is recommended to His Excellency the Governor in Council that, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, the following preliminary Regulations be made, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Regulations under the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922*.

2. The nominations of persons for appointment to the Charities Board of Victoria by the Metropolitan Hospitals Association and the Country Hospitals Association respectively shall be forwarded to the Treasurer of Victoria under the hands of the president and the secretary of the Associations concerned.

3. The following procedure shall be followed in the selection of persons for nomination as members of the Board by the subsidized institutions and benevolent societies within the metropolis (other than hospitals) and the subsidized institutions and benevolent societies outside the metropolis (other than hospitals) respectively:—

(a) The committee of each institution or benevolent society may submit to the Treasurer of Victoria, under the hands of its president and its secretary, not later than the 26th day of March, 1923, the names of not more than two persons for appointment. In cases in which there is not a committee, the nomination may be signed by such person or persons who are recognised by the Treasurer as the controlling authority.

(b) Should the total number of names submitted by all the committees or controlling authorities of the various institutions and benevolent societies concerned, within and outside the metropolis respectively, exceed the number of four, the Treasurer shall cause ballot-papers to be prepared with the names of all persons submitted for nomination by the committees and controlling authorities concerned printed thereon in alphabetical order, and cause one of such ballot-papers to be forwarded by registered letter to the committee or controlling authority of each institution and benevolent society.

(c) Upon the receipt of the ballot-paper the committee or controlling authority of each institution or benevolent society will vote for not more than four persons named thereon, indicating its preference by placing the figures 1, 2, 3, and 4 opposite to the names of the persons for whom it desires to vote in order of preference.

(d) Each ballot-paper must be signed by the president and the secretary to the institution or benevolent society concerned (or in cases where there is not a committee, the ballot-paper will be signed by the person or persons referred to in sub-clause (a)), and must be forwarded by registered letter so as to reach the Treasurer not later than the 27th day of April, 1923.

(e) The Treasurer shall appoint some person to count the votes and report the result to him. The four persons whom the officer so appointed reports as having been elected shall be deemed to have been nominated by the subsidized institutions and benevolent societies concerned. If, however, in the case of the institutions and benevolent societies, either within or outside the metropolis, the name of one woman at least is not included in the first four persons who receive the greatest number of votes, then the woman who receives the largest number of votes shall be taken to have been nominated, together with the three men who have received the largest number of votes.

(f) In counting the votes the officer appointed shall, so far as is practicable, follow the procedure laid down under the preferential system for the time being in force for the election of senators for the Commonwealth of Australia.

(g) In the event of two or more candidates obtaining an equal number of votes at an election, the officer counting the votes shall determine by lot which person or persons shall be nominated.

(h) Should any difficulty or dispute arise in regard to the election or nomination of persons nominated as members of the Board, the same shall be submitted to the Treasurer of Victoria for his determination, and his decision shall be final.

A JOINT REGULATION OF THE SHIRES OF KARA KARA AND AVOCA, NUMBERED 1, FOR THE REGULATING AND MANAGEMENT OF CLOSETS AND PRIVIES, &c., AND FOR DEODORIZING NIGHTSOIL, AND PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL THEREOF.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Acts 1919* and *1915* and every other power enabling it in that behalf and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Kara Kara in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, and the Council of the Shire of Avoca in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby make the following Joint Regulation, being Joint Regulation No. 1 of the said Councils, that is to say:—

1. All former Joint Regulations on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this Joint Regulation coming into operation.

2. This Joint Regulation shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This Joint Regulation shall apply to and have operation in and within the boundaries of the township of Navarre in the South Riding of the Shire of Kara Kara and the West Riding of the Shire of Avoca.

DEFINITIONS.

4. In the construction and for the purpose of the Joint Regulation the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned them, that is to say—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public houses, factories, workrooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspools" shall mean any receptacle for night soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground, and "earth closet" shall include a pan closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"Councils" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Kara Kara and the Council of the Shire of Avoca.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include a corporation.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three (3) inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for the night soil, the contents thereof not to exceed three (3) cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford an easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof and emptying and cleansing same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public house, factory, workrooms, or common lodging house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-inch to the foot.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth closet a sufficient quantity of deodorizing material, ashes, lime, charcoal, or dry powdered earth to effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle, and shall cause all night soil which may be deposited in the pan or other receptacle to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a sufficient quantity of the deodorizing material to effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron or other material to be approved of by the councils, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, with handles thereto, and a tight fitting cover, the capacity of the pan not to exceed three (3) cubic feet. These pans to be provided by the councils.

8. The service shall be that known as a double pan service and the removals will be carried out in the day-time.

9. Once each week the person contracted with by the councils shall remove the pans in use and shall leave a thoroughly cleansed one in their place.

10. No person shall empty any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or conveyance properly constructed, furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or effluvia therefrom.

11. When any man is licensed by the councils such man shall be employed by the occupiers of the premises for the removal of night soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same, and no such occupier or person shall contract for the removal of night soil therefrom with any man or person who is not licensed on that behalf by the councils.

12. All night soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the councils from time to time for the final reception of the same.

13. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain, sewer, or water-course.

14. The occupier of any house or tenement within the afore-said township of Navarre in which any night soil pan is in use shall pay to the councils, or such person or persons as the councils may by resolution appoint to receive the same, the sum of One pound fourteen shillings and sixpence per annum, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the councils for the emptying and removing of the contents

of each pan, such sum to be paid in quarterly instalments of 8s. 8d. each, commencing on the 1st day of October, or on such other day or days as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the councils.

15. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Ten shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than One pound for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
