4. In clause 4, for the word "Board" shall be substituted the word "Committee," and whenever the word "Board" occurs in the By-laws unless the context precludes the word "Committee" shall be substituted.

After the words in clause 4 "contributor shall have the meaning given to it in," all the words in such clause shall be deleted and the following words inserted:—"Section four of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922* or any Act repealing or amending the same."

5. In clause 5 there shall be added before the words "The persons," the words "Subject to the definition of contributors as set out in clause 4."

8. Clause 8 shall be deleted and the following shall be substituted therefor:—"8. Qualifications for Committee and Auditor.—Any contributor to the Institute may be elected to any elective office of the Institution; and any person (whether a contributor or not) may be elected to the office of auditor."

11. In clause 11 the word "seven" shall be deleted, and the word "fourteen" shall be inserted therefor.

16. In clause 16 the words "The Board" shall be deleted, and there shall be substituted therefor the words "The Committee," and in the fifth line the same amendments shall be made.

17. Clause 17 shall be deleted, and there shall be substituted therefor:—"17. Nominators.—No person shall be elected to any elective office in the Institute unless at least seven days before the day of the annual general meeting there has been delivered to the Superintendent and Secretary thereof a written nomination of such person to such office signed by at least two contributors thereto, and also a written consent of such person to act in such office."

12. Clause 12 shall be deleted, and there shall be substituted therefor:—"12. Quorum.—If at any annual or special general meeting of the contributors to the Institute at least ten contributors do not assemble and proceed to business within one hour from the time fixed for the meeting, no election shall be made, nor shall any business be done at that meeting. In such event there shall be another meeting of the contributors to the Institute at the same place and at the same hour of the same day in the following week, and at this meeting any number of contributors exceeding seven shall constitute a meeting."

15. Clause 15 shall be deleted, and there shall be substituted therefor the following:—

"15. Voting.—A contributor to the Institute may at any meeting of contributors or at any election by contributors give his vote either in person or through the post, but not by proxy."

"The time for taking the poll at such election shall, in the case of contributors who vote in person, be from eight o'clock in the morning to seven o'clock in the evening, and the poll shall be taken accordingly."

Voting, whether by post or in person, shall be recorded only on ballot-papers issued by the Committee and containing the names of candidates for the elective offices, and in the case of contributors wishing to vote by post, ballot-papers shall be posted or handed to them on application by letter or in person to the Superintendent and Secretary; ballot-papers to be available for posting or personal application twenty-four hours after closing of nominations. Votes by post must be addressed to the Returning Officer at the Institute and marked "Ballot-paper only," so as to reach him not later than the day of the election.

18. In clause 18 the words "1915" shall be deleted, and the words "1922" substituted therefor, and at the end of clause 18 shall be added the words "in the presence of a quorum of the Committee."

28. In clause 28 there shall be inserted after the words "Honorary Oculists" the words "Honorary Solicitors."

Factories and Shops Acts.

### DETERMINATION OF THE STOREMEN, PACKERS, AND SORTERS BOARD.

*Note.*—(a) The Storemen, Packers, and Sorters Board, when first constituted, had power to fix rates for any person employed as storeman, packer, or sorter in connexion with the trade or business of—

- making biscuits;
- manufacturing or preparing for sale milk, cream, butter, or cheese;
- making nails;
- preserving meat, or preparing food products from animal fat;
- making paper, cardboard, carpet felt, or any similar products.

These powers were taken away by Orders in Council dated 21st June, 1913, 19th August, 1913, 11th November, 1913, and 4th July, 1916, respectively.

(b) The Storemen, Packers, and Sorters Board was, by an Order in Council dated the 28th September, 1920, given exclusive power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed as a storeman, packer, or sorter in the business of a seller of hardware, wholesale or retail.

(c) On the 24th April, 1923, the Storemen, Packers, and Sorters Board, was by Order in Council deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons who are employed in the business of a seller of hardware—wholesale or retail—in assembling ordered goods (other than goods kept in a bulk store or iron yard) and such power was conferred exclusively on the Shops Board No. 16 (Hardware).

(d) This Determination on the 4th May, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

**I**n accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person, not already provided for by any existing Wages Board, employed as a Storeman, Packer, or Sorter in connexion with any trade or business,” has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 4th May, 1923, the last and all previous Determinations of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday (3rd June), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the days so substituted.

(6) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual hands, i.e., persons (other than those in Potato or Onion Stores, on Wharfs, or in Wharf Sheds or Customs Railway Sheds) who are employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.

(7) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1916*, No. 2650, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices for wholly or partly packing or sorting any articles for which wages rates are fixed, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
