Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CHAFF-CUTTERS BOARD.

Norz.--(a) This Determination on the 11th May, 1923, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) When the Order in Council appointing this Board was passed, the words printed below in italics were not included.

The Governor in Council, by order dated 3rd August, 1921, added to the Board's powers and for convenience of reference these powers are printed in this form.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages-Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the process, trade, or business of chaff-cutting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder; or in the trade of corn cleaning or corn grading;
- (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the trade or business of chaff-cutting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder,"

has made the following Determination, namely :-

(1) That on the 11th day of May, 1923, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (6) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (7) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty three and a third per centum.
- (8) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.
 - (9) PIECE-WORK.—The lowest piece-work prices payable to any person employed on a travelling plant shall be Hay chaff-cutting, on machines with mouthpieces over 11 inches 2d. per ton 8d. " Straw ** .. ls. ,, Hay 11 inches or under 5d. Straw 11 ,, ٠. ٠. •• .. ls. 10d. Baling hay by Dederick press straw .. ls. 5d.
