## WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.

## BY-LAW No. 3.

THE Woodend Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "The Trust") in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

1. All former By-laws and Regulations, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall permit or suffer the same to run to waste.

3. The Trust may, by notice in writing, require any person—

- (a) being a consumer supplied with water whether for domestic purposes solely or not;
- (b) supplied with or desiring to be supplied with water;
- (c) whose premises are directly or indirectly connected with the mains or pipes of the Trust, or are about to be so connected,

to be supplied by measure, and to fix a meter in a position or place to be approved of by the proper officer of the Trust, to register the quantity of water so supplied.

Any person so required who shall not within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice duly and properly fix a meter shall be guilty of an offence.

4. Any person who does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, shall be guilty of an offence, and for every such offence the offender shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

## EUROA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following regulations:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual value and under, the minimum amount of rate payable in respect of such house or tenement for the year.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such annual value at the rate levied for the year.

3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, except the water for such trough passes through a meter and is charged for with the water supplied by meter.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in case of special agreement with the Trust, One shilling for every thousand gallons.

6. That for a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. shall be charged on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract, Twenty shillings per cent. upon the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise.
- (2) No hose or pipe is to be supplied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

8. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take away or carry any water from any drinking tap, trough, or public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. No person shall lay any pipe or communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

11. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case. The Trust may contract with any occupier or owner of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works or who is desirous of being so supplied for the provision and laying of the service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

12. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall permit or suffer water to run to waste shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every breach of this Regulation.

14. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

15. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously and that not more than ten gallons can escape at each flush.

16. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million gallons. Save where in these regulations otherwise specially provided, no tap shall be placed in any garden or yard or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the Trust unless a water meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service.

18. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be paid annually. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Acts or of this By-law. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust and with the sections of the Water Acts affecting his work, but the Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence will be One pound.

19. Any person being dissatisfied with the dial reading of the meter registration of the consumption of water on his premises, shall make complaint, in writing, to the secretary of the Trust within fourteen days after the date of such reading, and such person shall be entitled, at his own expense, to have the meter tested by the Trust's plumber, and the result of such test shall be binding and conclusive on such person and on the Trust.

20. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations of the Trust ought to be done, or permits or suffers water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.



21. The water supply in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

22. For the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Euroa Waterworks Trust.

23. The Regulations made by the Trust on the 19th day of September, 1916, are hereby repealed.

#### CITY OF PRAHRAN.

##### By-Law No. 151.

##### Children's Playgrounds.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the City of Prahran, made under the provisions of Part XXXI. of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 151, for the purpose of regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation provided, or in any public reserve (Children's Playground) established by the Council of the said Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Council of the Municipality and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran, with the consent of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of clause 1 of By-law No. 114 of the City of Prahran, the Children's Playgrounds shall be open on week days from 8 o'clock a.m. until sunset, and closed on Sundays.

2. Any person found within a Children's Playground except during the hours the same is open to the public shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

3. No male person above the age of 12 years shall be in the vicinity of the swings or other appliances set apart for females.

4. No person above the age of 16 years shall use any of the swings or other appliances erected in a Children's Playground. Such swings or other appliances shall not be used by the same child for a longer period than five minutes at any one time if any other child is waiting to use them.

5. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in a Children's Playground except in the ordinary way.

6. No person shall play cricket or football in a Children's Playground.

7. Every person in a Children's Playground shall obey the directions of the caretaker or other person in charge thereof.

8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in a Children's Playground.

9. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council may remove or exclude from a Children's Playground any person who commits an offence against this By-law or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or any property in a Children's Playground.

10. In this By-law "the Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Prahran. "Children's Playground" shall mean each and every piece of land provided and set apart by the Council for the use and enjoyment of the citizens as a Children's Playground.

11. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE UNDERBOOL PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1915, the Trustees of the Underbool Public Cemetery make the following rules and regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day; and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

## REGULATIONS FOR STORAGE OF PETROLEUM, ETC.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Local Government Act 1921* (No. 3167), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the city of Melbourne and the city of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping and storage of petroleum, or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable fluids, and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal districts of the city of St. Kilda and the shire of Mansfield; and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by either of the said Councils of the said municipalities for the purpose for which these Regulations are now made, and shall take effect from the 1st day of July, 1923:—

## REGULATIONS.

*Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.*

1. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all buildings shall be first approved of by the Council.
- (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron or other non-inflammable material except that in the case of a galvanized-iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
- (3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
- (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored or retained in any such buildings.

*Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.*

2. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits stairways or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.

- (2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass earthenware or metal and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways or adjoining premises.

*Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers.*

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

*Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.*

4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—

- (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade or the Country Fire Brigade where practicable.
- (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the premises.
- (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

*Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale.*

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—“Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away.”

*Regulations not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits.*

6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.

*Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.*

7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
- (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank but such opening shall contain a liquid tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

*Power to Enter and Inspect.*

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

*Offence.*

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

*Penalty.*

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

*Definitions.*

11. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "approved" means approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said city of St. Kilda and the shire of Mansfield or any deputy appointed by either of the said Councils of the said municipalities to act for him. "Council" means the Council of either of the said municipalities. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapor at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

*SCHEDULE.*

Methylated spirits, benzine, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test.

## CITY OF CAULFIELD.

## BY-LAW No. 47.

A By-law of the City of Caulfield made under Part 7, Division 1, section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 47, for regulating traffic and to regulate the heavy motor vehicles used in the said city and for other purposes.

**WHEREAS** by the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 George V. No. 2686) it is amongst other things enacted that By-laws may be made for any municipality for suppressing nuisances and for regulating traffic, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. *Definitions*.—In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“City” means the City of Caulfield.

“Council” means the Council of the City of Caulfield.

“Heavy Motor Vehicle” means a self-propelled vehicle weighing over two tons and five hundredweights and under five tons unladen and not used for the purpose of drawing more than one trailer (such trailer and its locomotive together not exceeding six and a half tons in weight unladen) but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails or a traction engine as defined by the *Local Government Act 1915*.

“Trailer” means a vehicle drawn by a heavy motor vehicle.

“Weight” in relation to a heavy motor vehicle when unladen means the weight of such heavy motor vehicle or trailer exclusive of the weight of any water fuel or accumulators special body or fittings which are not essential for the running of the vehicle.

“Axle Weight” means in relation to the axle of a heavy motor vehicle or of a trailer the aggregate weight transmitted to the surface of the road or other base whereon the heavy motor vehicle or trailer moves or rests by the several wheels attached to that axle when the heavy motor vehicle or the trailer is loaded.

“Width” means in relation to the tyre of a vehicle the distance measured horizontally and in a straight line across the circumference of the wheel and between the two points in the outer surface of the tyre which are farthest apart.

“Diameter” means in relation to a wheel the distance measured between the two opposite points in the outer surface of the tyre which are farthest apart.

2. *Markings to be Made on Heavy Motor Vehicle*.—The owner of every heavy motor vehicle shall cause—

- (1) the weight of such heavy motor vehicle unladen,
- (2) the weight of each axle thereof,
- (3) the highest rate of speed at which in conformity with the provisions of this By-law such heavy motor vehicle may be driven without a trailer to be painted or otherwise plainly marked—

(a) in some permanent manner in the first and second cases upon some conspicuous part of the right or off side of the heavy motor vehicle and in the third case in some conspicuous part of the left or near side of the heavy motor vehicle; and

(b) in letters or figures of not less than one inch in height and of such shape and colour as to be clearly legible and easily distinguishable from the colour of the ground whereon the letters and figures are marked out.

- (4) From time to time all the paint and markings to be repaired and renewed so as to at all times keep the letters and figures clearly legible and easily distinguishable.

3. *Axle Weights*.—The axle weight of any axle of a heavy motor vehicle shall not exceed eight tons and the sum of the axle weights of all axles of a heavy motor vehicle shall not exceed twelve tons.

4. *Tyres*.—(1) The tyre of each wheel of a heavy motor vehicle shall be smooth and shall where the tyre touches the surface of the road or other base whereon the heavy motor vehicle moves or rests be flat provided however—

- (a) that the edges of the tyres may be bevelled or rounded to the extent in the case of each edge of not more than half an inch; or

(b) that if the tyre is constructed of separate plates the plates may be separated by parallel spaces which shall be disposed throughout the outer surface of the tyre so that nowhere shall the aggregate extent of the space or spaces in the course of a straight line drawn horizontally across the circumference of the wheel exceed one-eighth part of the width of the tyre.

(2) The width of the tyre of each wheel of a heavy motor vehicle shall be determined by such of the following conditions as may apply to the circumstances of the case, that is to say—

- (a) The width shall in every case be not less than six inches.

(b) The width shall not be less than that number of half inches which is equal to the number of units of axle weight of the axle to which the wheel is attached.

(3) The unit of axle weight shall vary according to the diameter of the wheel and the rules set forth in the subjoined scale that is to say—

- (a) If the wheel is three feet in diameter the unit of registered axle weight shall be seven and a-half hundredweights.

(b) If the wheel exceeds three feet in diameter the unit of axle weight shall be seven and a-half hundredweights with an addition of weight in the proportion of one hundredweight for every twelve inches by which the diameter is increased beyond three feet and in the same proportion for any increase greater or less than twelve inches; and

- (c) If the wheel is less than three feet in diameter the unit of axle weight shall be seven and a-half hundredweights with a deduction of weight in the proportion of one hundredweight for every six inches by which the diameter is reduced below three feet and in the same proportion for a reduction which is greater or less than six inches. This clause shall not apply to any tyre which is pneumatic or which is made of a soft or elastic material.

5. *Smoke*.—A heavy motor vehicle propelled by steam shall not emit therefrom any smoke or visible vapour except from any temporary or accidental cause.

6. *Speed*.—The speed at which any heavy vehicle is driven on any street shall not (except as herein provided) exceed ten miles an hour provided that—

- (a) if the weight of the heavy motor vehicle unladen exceeds three tons; or

- (b) if the axle weight of any axle thereof exceeds six tons; or

- (c) if the heavy motor vehicle draws a trailer;

its speed shall not exceed six miles per hour provided also that—

If the heavy motor vehicle has all its wheels fitted with pneumatic tyres or with tyres made of soft and elastic material the speed at which the same may be driven on any street shall not exceed—

- (a) Fifteen miles an hour where the axle weight of any axle does not exceed six tons; and

- (b) Twelve miles an hour where the axle weight of any axle exceeds six tons.

7. *Width of Vehicle and Trailer*.—A heavy motor vehicle if its weight unladen is three tons or exceeds three tons and any trailer drawn by any such heavy motor vehicle may when measured between its extreme projecting points be of any width not exceeding seven feet six inches.

8. *Size of Wheels*.—The diameter of a wheel of a heavy motor vehicle unless the same is fitted with a tyre which is pneumatic or made of a soft elastic material shall not be less than two feet.

9. *Springs*.—Every heavy motor vehicle shall be constructed with suitable and sufficient springs between each axle and the frame of the heavy motor vehicle.

10. *Brakes*.—Every heavy motor vehicle shall be provided with two independent brakes the reversing gear of such vehicle being counted as one brake.

11. *Trailers*.—(1) The owner of a trailer shall—

- (a) Cause to be painted or otherwise plainly marked upon some conspicuous part of the right or off side of the trailer in letters and figures not less than one inch in height and of such shape and colour as to be clearly legible and easily distinguishable from the colour of the ground whereon the letters and figures are painted or marked—

- (i) The weight of the trailer unladen and if the weight of the trailer exceeds one ton;

- (ii) The axle weight of each axle of the trailer; and

- (b) Cause the paint or marking to be from time to time repaired or renewed as often as may be necessary to keep the said letters and figures clearly legible and easily distinguishable.

(2) The provisions of this By-law relating to the width of the tyres and the sizes of the wheels of a heavy motor vehicle which are not pneumatic or are not made of a soft or elastic material shall with the necessary modifications apply and have effect with respect to a trailer exceeding one ton in weight unladen with the substitution therein of three inches for six inches as the minimum width of the tyres and of references to the axle weight painted or marked on the trailer in pursuance of this section for reference to axle weights contained in such provisions as aforesaid respectively.

(3) Every trailer shall be constructed with suitable and sufficient springs between each axle and the frame of the trailer.

(4) Every trailer drawn by a heavy motor vehicle shall be provided with a brake in such a manner that such brake may be operated either from the driver's footplate or by a com-

petent person carried on the trailer. Provided however that this provision shall not apply when the trailer is connected to the heavy motor vehicle by a rigid coupling.

(5) A heavy motor vehicle which is used as a stage carriage or otherwise for the conveyance of passengers for gain or hire shall not be used to draw a trailer.

(6) Not more than one trailer shall be drawn by a heavy motor vehicle and any such trailer shall be properly and securely fixed to the heavy motor vehicle in such a manner that the distance between the front of the trailer and the rear of the heavy motor vehicle shall not exceed seven feet.

12. No person shall cause or permit to be used on any street or stand on any street drive or have charge of a heavy motor vehicle whether as defined by this By-law or otherwise or a trailer which is not in every respect in accordance with the provisions of this By-law or shall so use or drive the same respectively as to contravene any of the provisions of this By-law.

13. If any officer of the Council or of the police have reason to suspect that any of the provisions of this By-law have not been complied with or are then not being complied with by any person in respect of any heavy motor vehicle he may require the same to be submitted for examination and the owner or driver of such heavy motor vehicle shall for the purposes of this clause cause the same to be drawn or brought to such place and at such time as such officer shall appoint.

14. Offence.—Any wilful contravention of the provisions of the foregoing clause by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

15. Penalty.—Any person or company who shall by wilful act or default contrary hereto be guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

16. Application.—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.

##### BY-LAW No. 75

##### Altering and Amending By-law No. 74.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under section 10 of the Local Government Act 1921, and numbered 75, for altering and amending By-law No. 74 for prescribing areas and regulating erection, &c., of building to be constructed therein, and the use of such buildings for the purpose of trade, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

That the following alteration and amendment be made in By-law No. 74:—

1. That in clause 1 the words "Waterdale-road from Beatty-street to Banksia-street" be deleted from Residential Area No. 2 and added to Residential Area No. 3.

2. Nothing contained in By-law 74 or this By-law shall apply to the poultry farming industry when the aggregate floor area of all the buildings, sheds, covered yards and covered passages to be used in the business does not exceed 150 square feet. But no person shall erect, cause to be erected, or use in any residential area any building or buildings when such floor area does exceed 150 square feet without first obtaining the approval of the Council in writing. Such approval may be unconditional or given for a definite term, or may be cancelled at the Council's discretion.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 17th day of April, 1923, and confirmed on the 15th day of May, 1923.

#### SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

##### BY-LAW No. 76.

##### Altering and Amending By-laws Nos. 62, 70, and 71.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under sections 198 and 223 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 76, for altering and amending By-laws Nos. 62, 70, and 71 regulating the construction and erection of buildings, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. That in By-law 62, Part 1, the following Clause be added to the definition of Fire-resisting:—

(c) Only such other material or combination of materials that the Council may, on receipt of an application in writing, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of the members of the Council at a meeting of which seven clear days' notice has been given, permit to be used.

2. The following Clause be added to Part 2 of By-law 62:—

(6) That the allotments of land in the Fairfield Riding existing on the 29th day of August, 1917, with a frontage of 80 feet and between 80 feet and 100 feet with an area of not less than 9,800 square feet may be subdivided on the following conditions:—

(a) That vacant allotments are evenly divided.

(b) That allotments having one house on at present are evenly divided if possible to do so, leaving at least 5 feet clearance between existing house and new division fence.

(c) That where not possible to evenly subdivide an allotment with a house on and leave the necessary 5 feet clearance after allowing not more nor less than 5 feet clearance, the minimum balance of land available that may be built upon shall have a frontage of 40 feet by a depth of 120 feet.

(d) That in cases 2 and 3 a block plan of allotment showing existing house and its distance from fences be submitted.

(e) That a special application be made to the Council in each case.

3. That sub-clause (e) be added to Clause 8, Part 3, By-law No. 62:—

(e) Any dwelling-house on land abutting on any of the streets set out in Schedule BB of this By-law unless all the walls are constructed of brick, stone or concrete, and the minimum ground floor area of such dwelling-house is 1,200 square feet or unless the ground floor area is 1,600 square feet if the dwelling-house is constructed of other material in conformity with all the conditions and limitations of By-law 62 in regard to buildings.

4. That Clause 20 (a) of Part 3 of By-law 62 be amended by adding after the word "observed"—

"And then only when such garage is behind the general line of the front of the buildings, such general line of buildings to be determined by the building surveyor."



5. That By-law 62, Part 3, Clause 20 (d) be amended by adding the following words:—

"When within 100 feet of the street and with all the conditions and limitations in regard to outbuildings when 100 feet or more from the street."

6. That Clause 23, Part 3, of By-law be amended by adding the following words:—

"But a separate privy must be provided for every residence, residential shop, lock-up shop, office, warehouse and factory, and for each shop, office and residence in a set of chambers and for any rooms or buildings used for similar purposes."

7. That the following sub-clauses be added to Clause 23, Part 7, By-law 62:—

(a) The floors of the second, fourth and sixth stories, &c., shall be constructed of fire-resisting material.

(b) The open yard space for such buildings shall be 300 square feet for the use of all the non-residential sets of offices, rooms, &c., in the building; and a 500 square feet separate yard space each for every residence therein.

8. That the following sub-clauses be added to Clause 21, Part 9, By-law 62:—

(g) That when gas and portable coppers are provided the adjacent walls shall be constructed of, or be covered with fire-resisting materials for a height of 3 feet from the floor, and for a distance of 3 feet along each wall from the corner, to the satisfaction of the building surveyor.

(h) That the flue of portable copper shall be of double construction, the outer flue being 3 inches larger diameter than the inner flue and fixed to give a uniform air space all round it of 1½ inches.

(i) That the floor under and for a distance of 12 inches in front of gas coppers shall be covered with flat sheet iron of not less than 24 gauge, or be constructed of brick, stone or concrete at least 4 inches thick.

9. That Clause 1 (c), Part 10, By-law 62, be repealed and the following Clause substituted:—

(c) All such buildings shall be distant from the building line of any street or road as hereinbefore provided and 10 feet from any other building, and shall be and continue to be 5 feet from the boundaries of the land of an adjoining owner or from boundaries of land not in the same occupation, but in no case shall the distance between any two buildings constructed wholly or partly in wood be less than 10 feet unless such buildings are semi-detached and divided by party walls as provided for in Parts 6 and 7 of By-law 62. Every such party wall shall project at least 1 inch beyond all front and back walls and beyond all verandahs. No openings to be allowed through any such dividing wall.

10. That Schedule BB of the streets to which Clause 3 of this By-law applies be added to By-law 62 as follows:—

11. That between the words "occupation" and "but" in Clause 3 of By-law 70 the following shall be inserted:—

"Unless the walls of such outbuilding are wholly constructed in brick, stone or concrete, and the boundary wall is a parapet wall without window, door or other opening, and such outbuilding is at least 25 feet behind the general line of the rear of the neighbour's dwellings, such general line to be determined by the building surveyor."

12. That Clause 5 of By-law 70 shall be deleted and the following substituted:—

"That sub-clause (a) of Clause 17 of Part III. of By-law 62 be amended by deleting therefrom the words "Except Clause 8 (b) of Part III."

13. That Clause 3 of By-law No. 71 be rescinded.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 17th day of April, 1923, and confirmed on the 19th day of June, 1923.
