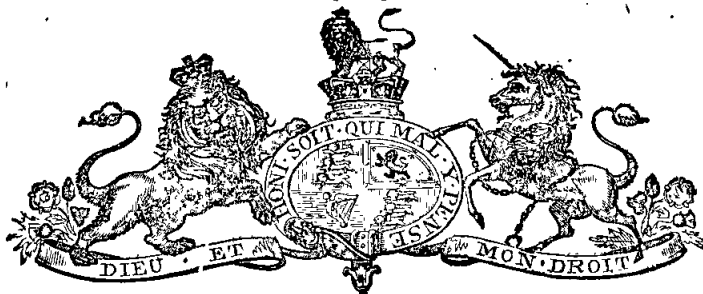

ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three hundred and eighty-five thousand seven hundred and sixty-two pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at the Law Courts, Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and in the fourteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 1285.—BITTERN URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE MORNINGTON PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Bittern Urban District within the Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon/pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meter, or meter of smaller size, Ten shillings.
For any meter of larger size than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and together with such notice shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him. But if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead

thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

11. Meters other than such as are hired from the Commission will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commission at Frankston, and a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may at any time after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer, and may for such purpose enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence, and in the event of continuing the same shall be guilty of a further offence for each day after notice from the Commission on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Twelvence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

- (1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Twelvence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Twenty shillings for any continuous period of three months.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 1286.—SOMERVILLE URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE MORNINGTON PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Somerville Urban District within the Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, or meter of smaller size, Ten shillings;
For any meter of larger size than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission,

and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commission, at Frankston, and a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS ORDERING OIL.

In ordering Oils under this schedule care must be taken by officers requiring same to ascertain for what purpose the Oil is to be applied.

If required, a sample of not less than 2 pints, properly labelled with Item No. and purpose for which the Oil is required, must be forwarded to the Tender Board by officers receiving the supply, for analytical and testing purposes.

Where safe storage capacity admits, Oils must be ordered for 12 months', 6 months', or 3 months' supply, as the case may be, so as to reduce the cost of testing to a minimum amount.

Care must be exercised to insure economy with efficiency, and with this object in view, Oils once used on bearings and no longer suitable for the purpose for which it was ordered, where practicable, must be filtered and again used for less important lubrications, and in case such Oil cannot be used again it must be collected and arrangements made with the Tender Board for its sale at reasonable periods.

Should an officer requiring a supply for special purposes find that a suitable Oil is not included in the schedule, he may in such case apply to the Tender Board to purchase such Oil under Clause 4 of the Stores and Transport Regulations, and shall submit to the Board full reasons for so doing.

Special attention is drawn to clauses 7, 9, and 16 of the General Conditions of Contract.

SUPERVISION.*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

(1) CITATION.

These Regulations may be cited as the "Meat Supervision Regulations 1923", and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) REPEAL.

All Regulations heretofore made touching the matters herein provided for are hereby repealed.

(3) INTERPRETATION.

For the purpose of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Brand" means a brand authorized by the Commission in accordance with these Regulations and "to brand" has a corresponding interpretation.

"Communicable disease" means any disease which may be conveyed directly or indirectly—

- (a) from a carcass to an animal or to man; or
- (b) from an animal to any other animal or to man.

"Inspector" means a meat inspector appointed under Part XIII. of the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041) or any Act thereby repealed.

"Lamb" means the carcass of a sheep up to but not including the age known as "two toothed".

"Large cattle" includes bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, or calf.

"Meat" means all parts of an animal such as are ordinarily used for human consumption.

"Pluck" means the heart, liver, and lungs attached to the trachea.

"Proprietor" includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control of an abattoir or a meat inspection depôt.

"Small cattle" includes ram, ewe, wether, lamb, goat, or kid.

"The Act" means the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041).

(4) RECORD BOOK.

The owner of every abattoir and of every meat inspection depôt shall cause to be entered in the Record Book required by Section 273 of the Act to be kept at every such abattoir and meat inspection depôt the following particulars:—

(1) In respect of every abattoir as to the animals supplied thereto, removed therefrom, or examined or slaughtered thereat—

- (a) date of slaughter;
- (b) number and kind slaughtered;
- (c) locality or district from which diseased animals were brought.

(2) In respect of every meat inspection depôt as to the carcasses and meat dealt with thereat—

- (a) name and address of the owner and consignor;
- (b) date carcasses or meat received;
- (c) number of carcasses and whether of large cattle, small cattle, swine or other animals or the quantity of meat;
- (d) description of carcasses or meat condemned and why;
- (e) how condemned carcasses or meat disposed of; and
- (f) name and address of each person to whom carcasses or meat sold.

(5) ANNUAL REPORT.—SCHEDULES (1) (2).

Every inspector shall in the month of January in each year furnish to the Commission in writing a report in the form in Schedule (1) or (2) (as the case may be) to these Regulations containing such information and particulars as to matters entered in the record book during the preceding year as are by the said Schedule required. Where two or more inspectors are appointed for any abattoir or depôt the inspector in charge shall furnish the report referred to in this Regulation.

(6) INSPECTOR RESPONSIBLE FOR ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS AT ABATTOIRS AND MEAT INSPECTION DEPÔTS.

Every inspector shall see to the enforcement and carrying out of these Regulations at every abattoir and meat inspection depôt for which he is appointed.

(7) EXAMINATION BY INSPECTOR BEFORE SLAUGHTER.

At every abattoir for which an inspector is appointed—

- (a) all animals shall be examined by or under his direction before being driven into the slaughtering pen; and
- (b) all animals showing symptoms or signs of disease shall be marked by or under his direction in some easily-distinguishable manner, and shall be immediately separated and kept apart from the healthy animals.

(8) CERTAIN ANIMALS TO BE STUNNED BEFORE BLEEDING.

No person shall bleed or attempt to bleed any large cattle or pigs unless they have first been effectually stunned or pithed. This Regulation shall not apply to the slaughtering of animals by an authorized member of the Jewish faith for the purpose of providing "Kosher" meat.

(9) SLAUGHTERING SUSPECTED ANIMALS.

Where there is any ground for believing that an animal is wholly or in part unfit for human consumption the proprietor of the abattoir shall cause—

- (a) such animal to be slaughtered in a special killing pen, or
- (b) where no such pen is provided in an ordinary killing pen; and such slaughtering to be done after the ordinary slaughtering has been completed.

(10) DISEASED ANIMALS—DISINFECTION OF PENS.

When any animal known to be suffering from a communicable disease is slaughtered the proprietor of the abattoir shall cause the pen in which such animal has been slaughtered to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected before being again used.

(11) DISEASED ANIMALS—DISINFECTION OF KNIVES, ETC.

The proprietor of every abattoir shall cause all knives, gaiters, and other appliances used in connexion with the slaughter of animals affected with any communicable disease to be thoroughly disinfected by immersion in boiling

water or other effective means, immediately after use, and when such animals have been slaughtered at an abattoir for which an inspector is appointed such disinfection shall be done by or under his direction.

(2) Every person making an examination of any carcass including the viscera shall for such purpose use only a clean or disinfected knife or other instrument. If during the progress of an examination tubercle or other communicable disease is discovered by the incision of a knife or the use of any other instrument such knife or instrument shall not be used for further examination in any part of the carcass (other than that in which the disease was disclosed) without previous disinfection in the manner prescribed by these Regulations.

(12) EXAMINATION—HANDS OF INSPECTOR TO BE CLEAN.

Where in the progress of an examination the hands of an inspector or any other person have come in contact with the diseased part of any carcass including the viscera, such inspector or person shall before touching any other part of a carcass or its viscera or any other carcass thoroughly cleanse and disinfect his hands.

(13) RESTRICTION ON EXAMINATION IN ARTIFICIAL LIGHT.

No inspector and no person acting under his direction shall make an examination of animals or carcasses or meat in an artificial light not previously approved by the Commission.

(14) EXAMINATION AFTER SLAUGHTER.

At every abattoir for which an inspector is appointed—

(1) he shall as soon as practicable after slaughtering examine the carcass and all the viscera, giving special attention to the glandular system; and

(2) if the inspector is not present at or during the evisceration of any carcass the slaughterman, dresser or other person performing the evisceration shall—

(a) leave attached to the carcass by means of the trachea the pluck with lymphatic glands; and

(b) retain the abdominal viscera in such a manner as to preserve its identity with the carcass to which it belongs—

until the completion of the examination.

(15) "STRIPPING"—WHEN PERMITTED.

No person shall perform the operation known as "stripping" of the pleura of peritoneum except the inspector or a person acting under his direction.

(16) BRANDING OF CARCASSES—SCHEDULE (3).

Carcasses or meat passed by an inspector as fit for human consumption shall be branded by or under the direction of an inspector as prescribed in Schedule (3) to these Regulations.

(17) BRANDS TO BE ALLOTTED BY COMMISSION.

(1) The Commission shall as often as may be necessary allot to every Council and body authorized to brand carcasses and meat a brand the form, character and letters of which shall be as required by the Commission.

(2) The Commission may in respect to any existing brand alter the form and character thereof or substitute therefor an entirely new brand.

(3) Notice of every such allotment, alteration and substitution shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, and thereupon such brand, altered brand, or substituted brand shall be deemed to be included in Schedule (3) to these Regulations.

(4) All brands set forth in the said Schedule shall be deemed to have been authorized by the Commission.

(18) CARCASSES IMPROPERLY DRESSED AS LAMB.

No person shall dress the carcass of any animal (other than that of a sheep up to but not including the age known as "two-toothed") so as to resemble lamb or in the manner known as "back setting" or "caul fatting" or in any manner which might suggest that the carcass is that of lamb and no person shall brand or remove from any abattoir or meat inspection depôt any such carcass so dressed.

(19) LAMB-HEAD NOT TO BE DETACHED UNTIL CARCASS EXAMINED.

No person shall at any abattoir for which an inspector is appointed cut off or detach the head from any carcass purporting or alleged to be lamb until such carcass has been examined by the inspector and passed by him as lamb.

The fact that any permanent teeth have erupted in the jaws of any carcass shall be *prima facie* evidence that such carcass is not lamb.

(20) "TROTTERS"—SEVERANCE OF.

No person shall remove any carcass of mutton or lamb from any abattoir or meat inspection depôt until the "trotters" have been severed from such carcass.

(21) CONDEMNED CARCASSES—DISPOSAL OF.

(1) The proprietor of every abattoir for which an inspector is appointed and of every meat inspection depôt shall cause—

- (a) all condemned carcasses, including their viscera and all condemned meat, in the first place to be removed under the supervision of the inspector to a room to be provided for and used exclusively for the purposes of a "condemned room" and there slashed in such manner as to render all edible portions unfit for sale, and then sprayed, sprinkled or drenched with kerosene or other effective liquid approved by the Commission so as to render them unfit for human consumption.
- (b) Thereafter permission may be given by the inspector for the removal of such carcasses and viscera and meat for the purpose of boiling down to a boiling-down establishment approved by the Commission. Such boiling-down establishment shall be so situated as to be easily accessible to the inspector for the purpose of inspection at all times.
- (c) The proprietor of the boiling-down establishment shall cause all boiling down of condemned carcasses, meat and viscera to be carried out in such a manner that there is no possibility of any parts of such carcasses, meat or viscera or the fat derived from the same going into human consumption.

(2) Condemned carcasses, meat or viscera may be destroyed, under the direct supervision of a meat inspector, by fire or other method approved by the Commission.

(22) HANDS OF SLAUGHTERMEN TO BE CLEAN.

Every slaughterman and every person engaged in the slaughter of animals or the dressing cutting up or handling of carcasses shall at all times whilst so engaged have clean hands as far as practicable. When the hands of any such slaughterman or person have come in contact with the diseased part of any carcass including the viscera he shall before touching any other part of the carcass or its viscera thoroughly cleanse and disinfect his hands. He shall also thoroughly wash his hands immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience.

(23) SMALL GOODS.

No person shall use in the manufacture of small goods any meat other than the edible parts of the carcass of a healthy animal:

Provided that where such animal has been slaughtered at an abattoir for which an inspector is appointed the carcass shall only be so used if it has been branded by or under the direction of the said inspector.

(24) REFUSE TO BE DISPOSED OF DAILY.

The proprietor of every abattoir shall cause all blood offal garbage refuse and manure to be removed and disposed of daily in such a manner as to prevent nuisance.

(25) DRESSING APPLIANCES TO BE KEPT CLEAN.

The proprietor of every abattoir shall cause all appliances used by any person in the dressing of carcasses to be kept clean.

(26) ABATTOIR TO BE KEPT CLEAN.

The proprietor shall cause every abattoir and its appurtenances to be kept clean and orderly and all walls floors yards and drains to be thoroughly hosed or flushed daily with clean water immediately after the cessation of work.

(27) PROVISION OF ADEQUATE WATER SUPPLY.

The proprietor shall cause an adequate and wholesome supply of water to be provided to every abattoir and meat inspection depôt.

(28) ABATTOIRS, ETC., TO BE KEPT CLEAN AND FREE FROM FLIES AND VERMIN.

The proprietor of every abattoir and of every meat inspection depôt shall cause—

- (a) the same to be kept clean and free from flies rats mice and other vermin; and
- (b) all meat therein to be kept so as to prevent any contamination which would injuriously affect its wholesomeness or cleanliness.

(29) DOGS AND CATS AT MEAT INSPECTION DEPÔTS.

The proprietor shall not suffer or permit any dog or cat to be upon the premises of any meat inspection depôt whilst meat is stored therein.

(30) CARCASSES FOR EXPORT.

The carcass or meat of an animal which has been examined *ante-mortem* and *post-mortem* by a meat inspector employed by the Commonwealth Government and which has been slaughtered at an abattoir appointed by the Commonwealth Government as an export abattoir or place and passed and branded in accordance with the regulations under the Commonwealth Commerce Act for the time being in force by the said Commonwealth meat inspector as suitable for export, may for the purpose of export be removed from any such abattoir or place to be brought into any meat area without being branded as required by or under the *Health Act 1919*; and any carcasses or meat intended for export beyond Australia may for the purpose of such export be removed from any abattoir in a meat area without being branded as required under the *Health Act 1919*.

(31) ONLY CARCASSES, ETC., FROM ANIMALS SLAUGHTERED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THESE REGULATIONS AND IMPORTED CARCASSES, ETC., TO BE BROUGHT INTO A MEAT AREA.

No unbranded carcass or meat other than that referred to in paragraph (b) of Section 272 of the Act and carcasses or meat imported into Victoria shall be brought into a meat area for the purpose of being branded.

(32) IMPORTED CARCASSES AND MEAT.

When from outside Victoria there has been imported into a meat area any carcass or meat which has been certified as wholesome by an inspector appointed for that purpose by the Government of the State or country from which it has been exported, the person importing such carcass or meat shall produce the certificate of wholesomeness to the Council of the municipality in which the meat inspection depôt to which the carcass or meat is consigned for the purpose of being branded is situated, and an inspector appointed for such depôt shall examine such carcass or meat and if satisfied that it is wholesome shall brand it in accordance with the provisions of Schedule (3) to these Regulations with regard to imported meat.

(33) NAMES OF OWNER AND CONSIGNOR TO ACCOMPANY THE CARCASSES, ETC., REFERRED TO IN SECTION 272 (b) TO A MEAT INSPECTION DEPÔT.

The consignor of every carcass and all meat (to which paragraph (b) of Section 272 of the Act applies) submitted for examination at a meat inspection depôt shall cause to be firmly attached to every such carcass and to all such meat a tag on which shall be legibly and durably printed stencilled or marked the proper full name and address of the owner thereof.

When such consignor is not himself the owner of such carcass or meat his own proper full name and address shall similarly appear in the tag as well as that of the owner. Every such tag shall be so affixed as to remain firmly attached to the carcass or meat after the wrapping or packing has been removed. No person shall remove any such tag until after the carcass or meat to which it is attached has been examined and branded.

(34) AT A MEAT INSPECTION DEPÔT INSPECTOR TO EXAMINE CARCASSES, ETC., AND MAY BRAND SAME.

(1) The inspector shall examine every carcass and all meat (to which paragraph (b) of Section 272 of the Act applies) brought to a meat inspection depôt and if after satisfying himself that such carcass or meat has been derived from healthy animals slaughtered in accordance with the provisions of the *Health Act 1919* and is wholesome and free from disease, he shall brand it as prescribed in these Regulations for branding at meat inspection depôts.

(2) The inspector shall decline to brand any such carcass or meat unless he is satisfied that—

- (a) it was derived from an animal slaughtered in accordance with the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*; and
- (b) it is wholesome and free from disease.

(3) In respect to any such carcass or meat the inspector shall on discovering—

- (a) disease;
- (b) indications of stripping of either the pleura or peritoneum; or
- (c) that lymphatic glands properly pertaining to the carcass or meat have been removed—

condemn the whole.

(4) If the inspector is satisfied that any such carcass or meat is diseased or deleterious to health or unwholesome, he shall seize it under the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*.

(35) CARCASSES AND PARTS REQUIRED FOR EXAMINATION AT A MEAT INSPECTION DEPÔT.

(1) The carcasses and parts of a carcass to be produced for examination at a meat inspection depôt shall be as indicated hereunder :—

In the case of large cattle at least one-quarter of the carcass ;

In the case of small cattle and swine the whole carcass including the head, windpipe and lungs.

(2) Where a whole carcass is required to be produced for examination the lungs shall be left attached to such carcass by means of the windpipe.

(3) All lymphatic glands, whether in a carcass or part of a carcass, shall in every case be left intact for the purpose of examination.

(36) INSPECTOR'S DUTY ON EXAMINATION AT AN ABATTOIR.

In the examination of animals carcasses and meat at an abattoir it shall be the duty of the inspector concerned to act as directed hereunder in the conditions set out :—

Poorness—

If animal young, flesh sets well, and no disease Pass the carcass

If animal old or diseased Condemn the carcass

*Emaciation—*Absence of kidney fat, flesh soft and watery, will not set, results of disease Condemn the carcass

Degeneration—

Fatty—If free from disease Condemn the organs

Cloudy swelling—If associated with disease .. Condemn the carcass

Infiltrations—

Fatty, if organs cirrhotic Condemn the organs

Melanosis Condemn organs and parts

*Post-mortem Discolouration—*If marked .. Condemn the carcass

Calcifications Condemn all parts

Fevered Flesh Condemn the carcass

Tumors—

Benign, free in tissues Condemn the part

Malignant, infiltrating tissues Condemn the carcass

Wound, Fractures—

If recent and localized Condemn the part

If extensive or suppurative Condemn the carcass

*Anæmia—*If marked or from disease Condemn the carcass

*Leucocythæmia—*If spleen and lymphatic glands enlarged Condemn the carcass

*Red Water—*With congestion of internal organs and paleness of flesh Condemn the carcass

Hydræmia Condemn the carcass

*Jaundice—*If marked Condemn the carcass

Uræmia Condemn the carcass

*Pregnancy—*If near parturition Condemn the carcass

*Parturition—*Within ten days Condemn the carcass

Tuberculosis.

Total Condemnation to be ordered in any of the conditions (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), and (i) set out hereunder :—

(a) If fine miliary tubercles be found uniformly distributed along the course of the capillaries of any important organ, such as the lungs, spleen, liver, or kidneys.

(b) If tubercle be found in muscular tissue, or in the glands between the muscles, or in any of the glands draining the muscles, e.g., the axillary, prescapular, inguinal, precrural, iliac, vertebral, &c.

(c) If tubercle exists in the peritoneum and the pleura.

(d) If tubercle be found in an animal known to have been feverish or evidently ailing at time of slaughter.

(e) If tubercle exists in any degree in an emaciated animal.

(f) If in addition to a primary lesion in the respiratory or digestive tracts, tubercle is found in the spleen or kidneys, or bones or joints or glands connected therewith.

(g) If tubercle exists in two or more separate and distinct groups of glands.

(h) If tubercle be extensive, non-capsulated, soft and caseous or pus present and non-encysted.

(i) If tubercle is found in any part of a pig in addition to the head.

Partial Condemnation as indicated hereunder to be ordered in the conditions set out :—

If purely localized, encysted, or calcified tubercular lesions be found in any one organ or part, the whole organ or part affected, including the glands draining it, shall be condemned.

If costal pleura only affected or dorsal thoracic glands, the whole of the forepart of the carcass, including the diaphragm and thoracic wall shall be condemned.

If parietal peritoneum only affected or abdominal glands, other than the visceral glands, the whole carcass, posterior to, and including, the diaphragm, shall be condemned.

If head, or glands draining it, only are affected, the whole head and glands shall be condemned.

If the lymphatic glands only of any organ or part are affected, the whole organ or part, including its glands, shall be condemned.

(37) COUNCILS TO SEE TO THE EXECUTION OF THESE REGULATIONS.

The Council of every municipality shall superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and shall at its own cost do and provide all such acts matters and things as are necessary for that purpose.

(38) PENALTIES.

Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations. Every person guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than £5; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed £100; and all carcasses and meat in regard to which there has been any failure to comply with these Regulations shall be liable to seizure by any person authorized by the Commission or by a Council or by any meat inspector or by any member of the police force.

Modes of Branding.

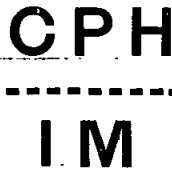
2. (a) Where the animal has been examined prior to slaughter and the carcass including the viscera has been examined after slaughter the outline of the brand shall be in the form of an interrupted circle not less than one inch and a quarter in diameter and within the circle so formed the letters shall be so arranged that the first or first two shall occupy the upper half of the circle and the rest the lower half as shown hereunder :—



(b) Where any carcass or meat has been examined at a meat inspection depot in accordance with the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, the brand shall be in the form of a T of which the horizontal line shall be not less than one and a quarter inches long and the vertical line not less than five-eighths of an inch long. The outline of the T shall be interrupted and the letters shall be so arranged that the first or first two shall be above and the rest below the horizontal line of the T as shown hereunder :—



(c) In the case of a carcass or meat imported into Victoria the brand shall be the letters set forth in this Schedule as indicating the several bodies under whose respective authorities the brands are applied arranged horizontally over an interrupted horizontal line not less than one and a quarter inches long having underneath such horizontal line and centrally situated the letters "I" and "M" as shown hereunder :—



(d) In the case of "Kosher" meat the brand shall be the word "Kosher" in Hebrew characters as shown hereunder :—

*Application of Brand.*

3. The brand shall be applied to not less than the following parts, viz. :—

- (a) In the case of beef and veal, on the upper surface of the tongue, and on each side of the carcass on the—
 (a) buttock;
 (b) flank;
 (c) outside of the ribs; and
 (d) shoulder.
- (b) In the case of an unflayed carcass of veal, on each side of the carcass on the—
 (a) brisket; and
 (b) inner surface of the flank.
- (c) In the case of mutton and lamb, on each side of the carcass on the—
 (a) shoulder; and
 (b) leg.
- (d) In the case of pork, on each side of the carcass on the—
 (a) cheek;
 (b) hand;
 (c) loin; and
 (d) leg.
- (e) In the case of parts of a carcass the brand shall be applied to such places as the meat inspector considers advisable.
- (f) In the case of "Kosher" meat the brand shall be applied to such parts as the Shouchet desires.

And the Honorable Matthew Baird, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SHOPS BOARD No. 16 (HARDWARE).
 VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of a Resolution passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 18th day of October, 1910, and by the Legislative Council on the 9th day of November, 1910, the Hardware Board was, by Order of the Governor in Council made on the 30th day of November, 1910, appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons whatsoever employed in the business of a seller of goods usually sold by ironmongers, including—

- (a) furnishing, household, plumbers' or builders' ironmongery;
- (b) gas fittings, stoves, or tools:

AND WHEREAS the Governor in Council—

- (a) by Order dated the 1st day of June, 1920, extended the powers of the said Board so that it may fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons whatsoever employed in the business of a seller of hardware, wholesale or retail;
- (b) by Order dated the 23th day of September, 1920, deprived the said Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed as a storeman packer or sorter in the business of a seller of hardware, wholesale or retail;
- (c) by Order dated the 10th day of May, 1921, altered the Short Title by which the said Board is described, to read "Shops Board No. 16 (Hardware)";
- (d) by Order dated the 24th day of April, 1923, conferred exclusively on such Shops Board No. 16 (Hardware) the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons who are employed in the business of a seller of hardware—wholesale or retail—in assembling ordered goods (other than goods kept in a bulk store or iron yard).

NOW THEREFORE His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers conferred in that behalf by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Resolution and Orders dated respectively the 30th day of November, 1910, the 1st day of June, 1920, and the 24th day of April, 1923, so that in substitution for the said powers the said Shops Board No. 16 (Hardware) shall be given power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the business of a seller of hardware—wholesale or retail—but not including—

- (a) persons employed in assembling ordered goods kept in a bulk store or iron yard;
- (b) persons employed as Storemen, Packers, or Sorters.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1915* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1915*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1915* aforesaid, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, and 5 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1915* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—
