MARYSVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Marysville Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1924 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Trust, that is to say:—

- On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound twelve shillings sterling.
- On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Four pounds or under, the sum of Fifteen shillings sterling.
- On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, a rate of 17½ per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.
- For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be charged.
- For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.
- For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.
- No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.
- Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the thirtieth day of April, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

The Minister may allow members of any such Inquiry Boards when visiting the country in the discharge of their duties as members of Inquiry Boards such reasonable travelling allowances as shall be fixed by him.

Appellants with respect to matters to be dealt with by the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Inquiry Board* appointed on 2nd June, 1924, must lodge their appeals with the Private Secretary to the Minister for Lands, Lands Department, Melbourne, and must clearly set forth, in writing, the grounds of their appeal. The recommendations of such Board shall be subject to confirmation by the Director of Land Settlement or the Chairman of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, as the case may be, according to whether the holdings of the settlers concerned are in the dry or the irrigable areas of the State.

RE ROYAL PARK RAILWAY ACCIDENT.

REPORT OF BOARD OF INQUIRY.

(Appointed by Order in Council of 20th May, 1924.)

We have the honour to report that we have heard the evidence and have visited the scene of the accident.

The circumstances surrounding the accident were that at about 2.15 p.m. on Saturday, 10th May, a goods train was standing short of the Home Signal near Royal Park station, and an electric train came along from North Carlton Railway Station on the same set of rails and ran into the rear of the goods train.

As to the causes of the accident, we find—

1. That the starting signal at North Carlton station indicated "road clear," and therefore justified the despatch of the electric train from that station.

2. That no "road clear" signal was despatched from Royal Park signal-box or received at North Carlton (Lygon-street) signal-box.

3. That although it was submitted that the signalling apparatus at North Carlton might have been interfered with, no evidence was brought forward in support of this theory, nor did an examination upon the ground support the probability of such interference.

4. That the primary cause of the accident was that the signalman at North Carlton signal-box had given the starting signal which justified the despatch of the electric train from North Carlton station.

5. That although the motorman in charge of the electric train stated that he had not strictly adhered to Regulation 49 (d), which provides safeguards in circumstances such as arose in the present case, he should not be held as seriously blameable for the results, having regard to all the conditions existing on the section of road involved, and the length of the goods train which had been held up near the Home Signal at Royal Park.

6. That although it was disclosed by evidence that installation of track-lock on the section of line concerned would have prevented the error of the signalman at North Carlton, evidence was submitted that the installation of this system is being proceeded with throughout the Victorian Railways with all reasonable speed.

TOWN OF MORDIALLOC.

By-Law No. 55.

A By-law of the Town of Mordialloc and numbered 55 for providing that every closet other than a closet connected with a sewerage system or with an approved septic tank or chemical closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919* and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Town of Mordialloc, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said town, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the municipal district of the Town of Mordialloc.
4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or more of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, or charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.
8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by steam and tar painting inside or by some equally efficient means.
9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
10. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to closets connected with a public sewerage system or with an approved septic tank or chemical closet installed in accordance with the provisions of section 58 of the *Health Act 1919*.
11. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.
12. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

SHIRE OF KARKAROO.

By-law No. 12.

A By-law of the Shire of Karkaroo, made under the provisions of the *Land Act 1915*, and of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 12, for prohibiting following on land near any public highway whereby drift sand is likely to accumulate on the highway.

WHEREAS the municipal district of the Shire of Karkaroo is in whole or in part within the Mallee country as defined in the *Land Act 1915*, now therefore, in pursuance of the power contained in the *Land Act 1915*, and of the powers contained in section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Karkaroo order as follows:—

1. That no person shall follow, cause or permit to be followed, any land within a distance of 2 chains from a public highway and from whence by such following drift sand is likely to accumulate on such highway and of which land such person is the owner, occupier, or lessee.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Karkaroo.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds or more than Twenty pounds.

4. In addition to any penalty as provided for in the last preceding clause any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law shall be paid by the person or persons committing such breach.

1. No person or persons shall obstruct any carriage way footway or public place within the Shire of Mount Rouse by standing loitering or assembling thereon.

2. Any person or persons obstructing any carriage way footway or public place within the Shire of Mount Rouse by standing or loitering therein or thereon shall on being required to do so by any member of the police force discontinue such standing or loitering.

3. All persons walking along the footways shall in passing each other keep on their respective right hand side of the footway.

4. The driver of any cart carriage or vehicle shall give way if he conveniently can do so to any other cart carriage or vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other cart carriage or vehicle.

5. The driver of any hackney carriage or other vehicle shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street except as near as may be to the left or near side of the street.

6. The driver of any cart carriage or vehicle of whatsoever kind whether public or private before stopping the same in any carriage way for any purpose shall give notice of intention so to do if riding upon or driving such cart carriage or vehicle by holding up his hand or his whip so that the same may be seen by the driver of any cart carriage or other vehicle in the rear of his and upon stopping he shall place his cart carriage or vehicle so as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic and if the stoppage prevents the passing of any other cart carriage or vehicle or interrupt or delay traffic he shall immediately on being requested by the driver of such other cart carriage or vehicle or by any member of the police force remove his vehicle so as to permit such other cart carriage or vehicle to pass or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

Subdivision eleven.—Miscellaneous, section forty-nine.

Part II.—Waterworks, Drains, &c.

Sections one, two, three, four, five, and six.

Part IV.—Places of Improvement and Recreation, &c.

Subdivision two.—Public gardens, sections three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, and twelve.

Part V.—Regulation of Buildings.

Sections one, two, three, and four.

Subdivision two.—Ruinous or dangerous buildings, &c., sections five, six, seven, and eight.

Part VII.—Fire Prevention.

Subdivision one.—Foul chimneys, &c., sections one and two.

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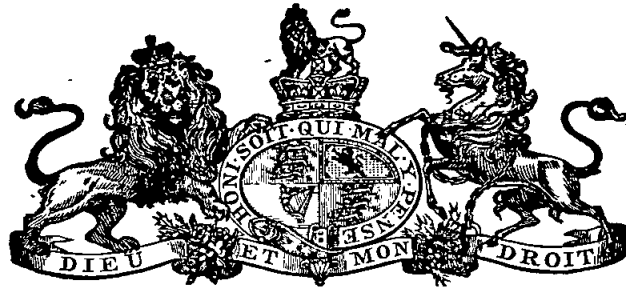

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE HAIRDRESSERS BOARD.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination, on the 30th June, 1924, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

(b) Section 192 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* prohibits the acceptance of any consideration, premium, or bonus for engaging an apprentice or improver in connexion with the business of a hairdresser or barber.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid "to any person or persons or classes of persons whosoever employed in the business of a Hairdresser or Barber, or Wig Maker, or other Workers of Hair," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 30th June, 1924, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.

(6) DAY AND LATEST HOUR FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Fifteen minutes before the time of ceasing work on Friday shall be the day and latest hour for payment of wages.

(7) SPECIAL RATES.—Treble time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
