ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1924.

THE following rates and charges are those which all house-holders, or occupiers, or owners of land and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water for the said Trust for the year 1924:—

(a) For every house or tonement of Eleven pounds amount municipal valuation and under, a rate of Two pounds two shillings sterling per annum.

(b) For every house or tenement of more than Eleven pounds and not exceeding Thirty-two pounds annual numicipal valuation, a rate of Two pounds eight shillings per annum.

nunicipal valuation, a rate of Two pounds eight similings per annum.

(c) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Thirty-two pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling on the amount of such valuation.

(d) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.

[e) A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings sterling and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every

person using a hose for gardening or stable purposes during the year, in addition to the rate of the annual municipal valuation.

(f) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of Two pounds sterling per annum. Provided that the trough or other receptacle is situated within the Trust District, a rate of One pound sterling per annum will be charged. charged.

(y) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity. Provided that the water used be for manufacturing purposes, the quantity used in excess shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(h) For the temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for brick and plastering shall be made; or, if there is no contract, then upon the value or on the amount charged or paid for brickwork or plastering. Persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention to do so.

(i) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's standpipe shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.

(j) In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1924, and 1st day of July, 1924.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges, and that Mr. Wm. Matthews is hereby appointed to demand, collect, and sue for and recover the said rates and charges.

ARTICLES DEEMED TO BE POISONS.—AMENDED SECOND SCHEDULE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Com-monwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Poisons Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2707) it is among other things enacted that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the Poisons Act; and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the Government Hazette, amend the said Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article specified in such Proclamation: Now therefore 1, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and pursuant to section 4 of the above-named Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said Second Schedule shall be amended as herein set forth, and that the articles set forth hereunder shall be deemed to be poisons under the first and second part of the Second Schedule, namely:—

PART I.

1. The item "Chloral hydrate and solutions and preparations thereof"—after the word "thereof" add the words "containing five per centum or more of chloral hydrate."

2. The item "Corrosive sublimate"—in place of "corrosive sublimate and tablets containing corrosive sublimate" insert the words "mercuric chloride (corrosive sublimate) and all preparations or admixtures thereof not specifically included in the second part of this Schedule."

PART II.

1. Add new item—"Chloral hydrate in preparations or admixtures containing less than five per centum of chloral hydrate."

2. The item "Lead-medicinal salts and compounds of lead"

2. The item "Lead—medicinal salts and compounds of lead" —add the words "and medicinal preparations or admixtures containing lead or its salts or compounds."

3. Add new item—"Mercuric chloride (corrosive sublimate) in all preparations or admixtures containing less than 0.1 per centum of mercuric chloride."

The foregoing amendments of the Second Schedule of the Poisons Act 1915 were recommended by resolution of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria at its meeting held on the 18th day of June, 1924, at Melbourne.

8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.

9. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.

Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.

11. Every person who by act or omission shall contravene any of the foregoing provisions shall be guilty of an offence.
