ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1924.

THE following rates and charges are those which all householders, or occupiers, or owners of land and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water for the said Trust for the year 1924:—

- For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of Two pounds two shillings sterling per annum.
- For every house or tenement of more than Eleven pounds and not exceeding Thirty-two pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two pounds eight shillings per annum.
- For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Thirty-two pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling on the amount of such valuation.
- For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.
- A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings sterling and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every

person using a hose for gardening or stable purposes during the year, in addition to the rate of the annual municipal valuation.

- For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of Two pounds sterling per annum. Provided that the trough or other receptacle is situated within the Trust District, a rate of One pound sterling per annum will be charged.
- The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity. Provided that the water used be for manufacturing purposes, the quantity used in excess shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- For the temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for brick and plastering shall be made; or, if there is no contract, then upon the value or on the amount charged or paid for brickwork or plastering. Persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention to do so.
- The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipe shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.
- In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1924, and 1st day of July, 1924.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges, and that Mr. Wm. Matthews is hereby appointed to demand, collect, and sue for and recover the said rates and charges.

ARTICLES DEEMED TO BE POISONS.—AMENDED
SECOND SCHEDULE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Poisons Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2707) it is among other things enacted that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the *Poisons Act*; and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, amend the said Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article specified in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and pursuant to section 4 of the above-named Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said Second Schedule shall be amended as herein set forth, and that the articles set forth hereunder shall be deemed to be poisons under the first and second part of the Second Schedule, namely:—

PART I.

1. The item "Chloral hydrate and solutions and preparations thereof"—after the word "thereof" add the words "containing five per centum or more of chloral hydrate."
2. The item "Corrosive sublimate"—in place of "corrosive sublimate and tablets containing corrosive sublimate" insert the words "mercuric chloride (corrosive sublimate) and all preparations or admixtures thereof not specifically included in the second part of this Schedule."

PART II.

1. Add new item—"Chloral hydrate in preparations or admixtures containing less than five per centum of chloral hydrate."
2. The item "Lead—medicinal salts and compounds of lead"—add the words "and medicinal preparations or admixtures containing lead or its salts or compounds."
3. Add new item—"Mercuric chloride (corrosive sublimate) in all preparations or admixtures containing less than 0.1 per centum of mercuric chloride."

The foregoing amendments of the Second Schedule of the *Poisons Act 1915* were recommended by resolution of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria at its meeting held on the 18th day of June, 1924, at Melbourne.

- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings or of fences abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road.
- (c) Authorizing the council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings or fences erected or constructed contrary to any such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof. (For the purpose of this paragraph and paragraphs (a) and (b) "hoarding" means structure used for the exhibition of advertisements and includes sky-sign.)
- (d) Regulating, restricting or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape.
- (e) Regulating and controlling all advertisements attached or fixed to or painted on any hoarding or on any building or on any fence, rock, cliff or tree.

- (f) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the council for any act done, or to be done, by any of the officers under such by-laws and for any permit or licence to be issued by the council.
- (g) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house may thereafter be erected.
- (h) Providing that every dwelling house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land.
- (i) Providing, with respect to buildings thereafter erected for:—
 - (i) regulating or limiting the height of buildings;
 - (ii) means of escape from buildings in case of fire, and the prevention of fire in buildings;
 - (iii) the ventilation and lighting of buildings;
 - (iv) exits from and stairways in buildings other than private dwelling houses; and
 - (v) the minimum size of any dwelling rooms or shops for foodstuffs.
- (j) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials within such time or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council; and
- (k) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with or regulated by the Council, by resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case.
- (l) Appointing fees which may be charged and received on account of the municipal fund by the service made or performed by an inspector under the Scaffolding Act or any regulations under the said Act.
- (m) Prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of any such residential areas the erection, adaptation for use, or the use of any building for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under the provisions of section 652 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 George V., No. 2686), and numbered 173, for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in the Children's Playground in "Raisbeck Reserve."

WHEREAS by section 652 of the *Local Government Act 1915* power is given to the Council of the City of Melbourne, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make By-laws or Regulations (*inter alia*) for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in such grounds or places as have been purchased or otherwise provided by the Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation. And whereas the said Council has provided the land known as "Raisbeck Reserve," being part of the land comprised in certificate of title, volume 1844, folio 368720, as a pleasure ground or place of public recreation. Now therefore the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the Council), in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby in respect of such part of the said land as is set apart for and hereinafter designated "Children's Playground" make the following By-law:—

1. The Children's Playground shall not be used after sunset.
2. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Playground or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or other attendants shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over children who are in their charge.
3. The swings or other appliances erected in the playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
4. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
5. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playground.
6. All paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council for the purpose.
7. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the direction of any officer of the Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.
8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.
9. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.
10. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.
11. Every person who by act or omission shall contravene any of the foregoing provisions shall be guilty of an offence.
12. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Building Regulations.

The By-law will operate within the boundaries of the Phillip Island Riding, the Township of Cowes and environs, and the following is a summary of the provisions it contains, viz.—Part I provides:—

That the plans of every new building must be first submitted to the Council for approval and how such plans are to be submitted and the requirements respecting the same and what fees are payable.

That the site upon which a building is to be erected must be in a healthy condition, graded and properly drained.

That buildings removed to the area defined or from one place to another within the area must be re-erected to comply with the By-law.

That all buildings with certain exceptions must be erected a defined distance from the building line and back line of the allotment intended to be built upon.

That wooden buildings shall be erected a defined distance from side streets or from other wooden buildings.

That roofs shall be of incombustible coverings.

That the interior of such buildings must be constructed of approved fire-resisting materials.

For the minimum area to be covered by buildings.

That the allotment upon which the dwelling is to be erected shall have a superficial area of not less than 5,200 feet, and a frontage to the street or road of not less than 40 lineal feet, except in the case of existing subdivisions having a frontage of not less than 33 feet and a depth of 150 feet, and that the dwelling house and other buildings to be erected on each such allotment shall cover not more than a certain area of the land.

That the By-law shall apply to alterations and additions to existing buildings.

For the height of the habitable rooms, the ventilation and lighting of buildings and the thickness of walls and the construction of staircases of buildings.

That petroleum and other oils must be stored in properly constructed buildings.

That bath heaters and stoves must be properly constructed and set.

Part II. provides:—

For the height of buildings.

Part III. provides:—

For the construction of public buildings, and for the stairs, egress space, accommodation, exit from stage, kind of doors, internal approaches, ventilation, fire-extinguishing appliances and sanitary accommodation for same.

Part IV. provides:—

For security against fire in public buildings, hotels and lodging houses.

Part V. provides:—

For seclusion of privies and distance of fowlhouses, stables, &c., from dwellings.

For the removal of any dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe building and for the enforcement of the By-law. Also fixes fees and gives interpretation of works.
