KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR 1924.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said acts, make the following By-law:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of under Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not be in any case less than One pound four shillings per annum.

(2) For any house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

(3) The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Six shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre; Twelve shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre; Eighteen shillings if more than half an acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre; with a maximum charge of One pound four shillings sterling for any parcel of land within the urban district.

(4) Where any horses or cows are wholly or partially kept on, or at, any land or tenement not supplied by the Trust with water by measurement there shall be payable for every such animal (exceeding one in number) wholly or partially kept as aforesaid (in addition to the assessment rate) a special rate of Six shillings per head per annum.

(5) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust) One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons.

(6) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1924.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW 1924.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities contained by Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law number 43, fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust district, such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1924.

The rates and charges shall be payable by the occupiers and owners of the lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust district who are supplied with water by the Trust, as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of £20 or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £20 and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being a hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of £30 or under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £30, the sum of £6 per cent. on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands and lands on which there is no tenement erected nor water laid on, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings. Should the water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this By-law for tenements.

7. On every livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling each 6 feet to be considered one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept and 7s. 6d. for each additional horse kept. Cows to be paid at the rate of 1s. per annum for each. Water troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter is to be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per one thousand (1,000) gallons, except to manufacturers, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied by meter separate from house connexions for irrigation, for gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering, or should the Trust require a meter to be put on, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam boilers the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. The rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1924, except in cases where the Trust has made special agreement regarding the time of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, or recover such rates and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in case of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST DETERMINATION OF THE PLUMBERS BOARD.

(hereinafter referred to as the Plumbers Board) did by a certain determination, made on the eighteenth day of January, 1924, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of January, 1924, determine the lowest prices and rates to be so paid: And whereas a group of employers who employ not less than twenty-five per centum of the total number of the workers in the trade to which the determination aforesaid applies has in the prescribed manner appealed against the said determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the *Factories and Shops Acts*: Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts, that a Court of Industrial Appeals, consisting of the President, His Honour Mr. Justice Macfarlan, and William Henry Middleton, of 416 Sturt-street, Ballarat, a person who has been bona fide and actually engaged in the trade concerned for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination, duly nominated by the Minister of Labour in accordance with the provisions of section 174 (6) of the *Factories and Shops Act*

1915, to represent the employers, and Alfred C. Mitchell, of 9 Hosie-street, Richmond, a person who has been bona fide and actually engaged in such trade for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination, duly nominated by the Minister of Labour in accordance with the provisions of section 174 (6) of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* to represent the employees, he and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the determination of the said Plumbers Board and to revise or alter the said court's own determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and tobacconists' shops and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within a radius of half a mile of the Yanac Railway Station within the municipal district of the Shire of Lowan, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday,
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday,
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF ECHUCA.

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King: Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2688) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs; and that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following addition to the Rules and Regulations for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

MINERAL SPIRITS.

117A. The following special conditions shall apply to mineral spirits in addition to the regulations regarding dangerous cargoes:—

- (a) The term "mineral spirits" shall be deemed to mean and include all mineral oils and all productions therefrom, and all admixtures containing mineral oil which have a flashing point of under 73 degrees Fahrenheit, and such other mineral oils and productions therefrom and admixtures containing mineral oil as may from time to time be defined as "mineral spirits" under the provisions of the *Customs Act 1901* of the Commonwealth of Australia or any amendment thereof.
- (b) No mineral spirits shall be shipped or unshipped except at a wharf or anchorage which may from time to time be set apart for the purpose by the harbour master or wharf manager.
- (c) No mineral spirits shall be shipped or unshipped until the master of the vessel concerned shall have given to the harbour master or wharf manager twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his intention so to do.
- (d) No mineral spirits contained in casks, barrels, tins, or other containers shall be shipped or unshipped until the hold or holds of the vessel has or have been thoroughly ventilated to the satisfaction of the harbour master or wharf manager.
- (e) No mineral spirits contained in casks, barrels, tins, or other containers shall be shipped or unshipped unless such casks, barrels, tins, or other containers are staunch and free from leakage and are of such strength and construction as will prevent breakage or leakage.
- (f) No mineral spirits shall be shipped or unshipped except between sunrise and sunset (unless such spirit is pumped through pipe lines at a berth and in a manner approved by the Port Officer).
- (g) No mineral spirits shall be unshipped until the trucks or other vehicles into which such mineral spirits are to be loaded shall be placed in readiness to receive the same, and no truck or other vehicle carrying mineral spirits shall be taken on any wharf until the vessel into which such spirits are to be shipped has moored alongside such wharf and is ready to receive such spirits.
- (h) During the time from which the holds or tanks of any vessel carrying mineral spirits are first unsealed or opened for the purpose of shipping or unshipping mineral spirits until such time as all such mineral spirits have been shipped or unshipped and all tank heads or hatches have been closed and sealed down, no fire or light other than a fire or light approved by the Port Officer shall be lit or used either on board the vessel, or on any locomotive or motor vehicle, or on shore within one hundred (100) feet of any place at which such mineral spirits are being shipped or unshipped, but this shall not prevent vessels whose construction shall have been approved by the Port Officer from heating their main boilers for the purpose of supplying power necessary for the working of machinery or appliances for the shipping or unshipping of such mineral spirits.
- (i) No person shall while mineral spirits are in the course of being shipped into or unshipped from any vessel smoke thereon or within one hundred (100) feet

thereof or of any place at which any such mineral spirits shall be, and no person engaged in such operations shall carry any fusee match or other appliance whatsoever which might produce ignition.

- (j) No mineral spirits shall be allowed to discharge or escape on to any wharf or into the waters of the port.
- (k) The master, agent, and owner of every vessel engaged in shipping or unshipping mineral spirits shall take every precaution to ensure safety during the progress of the operations of shipping or unshipping, and shall be liable to the Commissioner of Public Works for any loss of or damage to any property of the Public Works Department occasioned by fire in connexion with the shipping or unshipping of mineral spirits into or from such vessel. The master of every such vessel shall—

(1) Display on the wharf adjacent to and on the gangways of the vessel into or from which mineral spirits are being shipped or unshipped notices of a size approved by the harbour master or wharf manager bearing the words—

“No Admittance Except on Business.”
“No Smoking Allowed.”

(2) Have a competent person on the wharf to watch pipe lines and shut down valves whenever necessary to prevent the escape of any mineral spirits.

- (l) No vessel carrying or shipping mineral spirits shall, except for the purpose of transshipment, lie at any wharf within one hundred (100) feet of any other vessel carrying or shipping mineral spirits at any wharf unless, in the opinion of the harbour master or wharf manager, it is impracticable to maintain such distance. A vessel carrying in tanks with properly secured tank heads mineral spirits for use as fuel on board only shall not be regarded as carrying mineral spirits for the purpose of this sub-clause or sub-clauses (m) or (n) hereof, as carrying mineral spirits.

- (m) The master of every vessel engaged in shipping or unshipping mineral spirits shall not permit any repair work of any nature to be done to such vessel whilst so engaged.
- (n) The master of every vessel carrying mineral spirits shall, immediately on the vessel being berthed, have a steel wire hawser sufficiently strong to enable the vessel to be hauled away from the wharf thereby placed over the fore and after ends of such vessel, and such hawser shall so remain during the whole of the time the vessel remains alongside the wharf.
- (o) Every vessel from which mineral spirits are being shipped or unshipped shall have a competent person on board in charge of the operations until the whole of the mineral spirits have been shipped or unshipped, and every such vessel shall at all times have a responsible person on board to carry out and give effect to the provisions of these Regulations.
- (p) The master of any vessel shall when required so to do by the harbour master afford him every reasonable facility to inspect and examine the mineral spirits on such vessel and all appliances in connexion therewith, so as to ascertain whether the provisions of these Regulations have been and are being observed.

This Regulation shall not apply to shipments of less than 50 tons in measurement.

6. All members using the Courts shall have equal rights with regard to playing tennis thereon.

7. Players, upon arrival, shall register their names upon the notice boards at the Courts.

8. The right to play shall be in order of registration on the board.

9. Should other players be waiting to play in their turn, the players using the Courts shall make way for them at the conclusion of the set then being played.

10. Tennis shoes shall be worn by all persons using the Courts.

11. Onlookers shall not trespass on the Courts nor interfere with persons playing on the Courts.

12. No other game or pastime than tennis shall be played on the Courts.

13. Dressing rooms are provided for males and females, and these must be used only by players of the sex for which they are set apart.

14. Every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
