Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE (WIRE MATTRESS) BOARD.

Noze.—This Determination on the 29th January, 1924, applied to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; the boroughs of Raglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the previsions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the manufacturing of wire mattresses has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on 29th January, 1924, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- The following rates shall be paid for all work done:-
 - (a) Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work ..

 (b) Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 44 hours in any week } Time and a half.
- (5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (6) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 22 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of forty per centum.
