MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

STORES REGULATIONS.

1. All business appertaining to the receipt, custody, and delivery of stores, plant, and material shall be under the management of the Controller of Stores.

2. The Controller of Stores shall be directly responsible to the Secretary, to whom he must address all reports, and from whom he will receive his instructions.

3. It will be the duty of the Controller of Stores to see that the prices of supplies that are not provided for under authorized contracts are fair and legitimate.

4. All stores, plant, and material, except the articles on issue to district and other officers (see clause 45) shall be under the supervision of the Controller of Stores, who must keep a clear and exact record of all receipts, issues, and payments, and be responsible that all articles placed in his charge are constantly under observation and in proper condition.

5. The Controller of Stores shall receive and prepare for payment, in the manner hereinafter provided, all accounts for stores, plant, and material ordered for the Board through the Stores Branch, and for all materials received by the district officers direct from contractors.

6. The Controller of Stores shall direct the work of the officers and men of the Stores Branch, maintain discipline in the branch, and be responsible that the business is conducted in an economical, expeditious, and correct manner, and also see that all officers in receipt and custody of the Board's materials are supplied with a copy of the stores regulations, and obtain from such officers a receipt therefor.

7. The Controller of Stores must report to the Secretary any irregularities on the part of the staff working under him, and any neglect in carrying out stores regulations. He must suspend any workman guilty of insubordination or incapable of performing his duties.

Receipt of Stores.

8. All supplies (stationery, printing and printed books excepted) must be obtained through the Controller of Stores on supply order forms (Form A).

9. Orders for supplies shall be prepared by the Controller of Stores, but, before issuing such orders, the Controller of Stores must have first received a stores order for such supplies signed by the Chairman, Engineer of Sewerage, Engineer of Water Supply, or Secretary (see clause 30). A copy of each order shall be retained for reference by the engineers' or secretary's branches in book of the respective order books.

10. Order books shall be supplied by the Controller of Stores to the engineers' and secretary's branches, also to all district officers who require them, for the purpose of forwarding their requisitions for materials.

11. As far as possible, stores shall be obtained for and be forwarded direct to "works," so as to avoid all unnecessary handling, bookkeeping, and extra cost in cartage.

12. Officers receiving articles direct from contractors and others, and not from the Controller of Stores, shall be held responsible for the quality and quantity of such articles, and any irregularities must be immediately reported to the Controller of Stores, whose duty it shall be to have such irregularities rectified.

13. The Controller of Stores must see that all stores, plant, and material purchased for the Board are accompanied by a bill of parcels or invoice (Form B), on which all particulars are to be furnished. If not forwarded with the goods the invoice must be obtained within forty-eight (48) hours from the time of delivery.

14. When goods are received, the invoice must be signed by the officer receiving them, and he shall make any necessary corrections on face of same, and on the duplicate and triplicate cartage tickets.

15. It will be the duty of the Controller of Stores to check rates and values.

16. Invoices, when signed by the officer receiving the articles, must be sent to the Controller of Stores, who shall check them with order, and, if correct, file them in invoice book (Form C) to the credit of the person supplying the articles.

17. From invoices the Controller of Stores shall debit the "stock" or "works," as the case may be.

18. Invoice forms (Form B) will be supplied to contractors and others by the Controller of Stores.

19. All accounts for payment must be rendered on the forms provided by the Board for that purpose (Form O).

20. Each account must be numbered by the Controller of Stores and compared with invoices.

21. When an account is certified for payment, the account number must be inserted in the place provided on the right-hand top corner of invoice, to indicate that such invoice has been passed.

22. When satisfied of the correctness of the account, the Controller of Stores shall certify same. He shall also state on the account, for the information of the treasurer, to what "work" or "service" the account is chargeable, and forward same for counter certificate by the responsible officer; the requisition or stores order shall be retained by the Controller of Stores to file for reference. (See clause 9.)

23. Accounts, when certified for payment, must be entered into the "Register of Accounts Certified Book" (Form H), and no certified account is, under any circumstances, to leave the office of the Controller of Stores until so entered.

24. The amount of an account, when certified, shall be entered to the debit of the person in whose favour it has been certified, on the left-hand side of the invoice book in the portion of the book allotted to such person.

25. If articles that have been procured for a "work" or "service" are not used thereon, and are taken into stock by the district officer concerned, they must be entered in the district ledger, and a return stores form (Form D) containing all particulars and with triplicate part signed in full must be forwarded to the Controller of Stores.

26. When stores are returned to the Controller of Stores, they must be accompanied or preceded by the Form D, with full and separate details of articles. The Controller of Stores shall fill in rates and values in the space set apart for same, which must not be written on by the officer forwarding, and the said officer must state from what "work" or "service" the articles are returned, so as to permit of the "works" or "services" being credited with value, and the stock debited with the various articles.

27. The duplicate part of the Return Stores Form, when returned by cartage contractor duly signed, shall be filed by the Controller of Stores, and shall be his authority for certifying account for cartage on same.

28. When articles are procured for a certain "work" or "service," and the whole or a portion of such articles are transferred to and used for some other "service" (but not sent into store), the officer so transferring must advise the Controller of Stores of the transaction by previously obtaining an order from the Engineer of Sewerage or Engineer of Water Supply, which must be forwarded to the Controller of Stores. The Return Stores Form D, with full particulars, must accompany the articles. The triplicate part must be signed by the transferor and also by the transferee, and the latter must forward triplicate to the Controller of Stores for credit and debit of "works" or "service."

29. All transactions under clauses 25 to 28 must be reported to the Engineer of Sewerage or Engineer of Water Supply by the officer desirous of returning or transferring stores, plant, or material, and no goods purchased for a "service" shall be used on any other "service" without the approval of the Engineer of Sewerage or Engineer of Water Supply being first obtained in writing.

Issue of Stores.

30. Except in cases of great emergency such as burst pipes, &c. (and then only upon written interim order from the officer in charge), stores, plant, and material shall be issued only on written orders or requisitions bearing the signature or initials of the Chairman, Engineer of Sewerage, Engineer of Water Supply, or Secretary.

31. Stores must be ordered or requisitioned from the Controller of Stores on the forms provided for the purpose (Form E), books of which will be supplied by the Controller of Stores. Officers ordering must retain copies of orders in butts of order books.

32. The orders must be forwarded to the Controller of Stores sufficiently early to enable him to supply the stores by the time they are required, and, if materials be obtained otherwise under pressure of requirement, the order must state from whom received, and, if procured outside of contract schedule, the price agreed on.

33. In the event of stores having, through unforeseen emergency, to be issued without the usual order having been first obtained, the officer drawing the stores must, at the earliest possible moment, furnish the Controller of Stores with the usual documents to cover the transaction, and any neglect to do this must be reported by the Controller of Stores to the Secretary.

34. Under the number of all official orders the Controller of Stores must quote the number of the order issued to contractors or otherwise, and file the official order for reference.

35. When stores are supplied from stock a receipt must be obtained for same on the Delivery Receipt Form (Form F), and the Controller of Stores shall be held responsible that nothing leaves his custody without a receipt on the proper form being obtained.

36. The delivery receipt shall be in triplicate. The carter or person who takes away the goods shall sign the butt of Delivery Receipt Book, and shall take with him the duplicate and triplicate. On the duplicate the carter or other person shall obtain the signature of the person authorized to receive the articles, and the triplicate he shall leave with the articles for the information of the officer receiving them.

37. If the cartage be by time, the officer issuing the articles must insert on the block, duplicate, and triplicate of Delivery Receipt Book, in the space set apart for that purpose, the hour or time the cart arrives for loading, and initial same in ink. The officer receiving must insert on the duplicate and triplicate the hour or time delivery is made and accepted, and initial same in ink, with full particulars of arrival if he considers delay has taken place during transit. The carter shall return the duplicate duly completed to the Controller of Stores within forty-eight hours after delivery of material; the latter shall file same as a voucher for the stores, and his authority to pay cartage.

38. When goods have to be sent by rail, a Railway Consignment Note (Form N) must be used in triplicate. The butt of consignment book shall contain all particulars; the duplicate and triplicate shall show the number of actual packages or

items with marks, or address to whom consigned, and name of railway station. The railway receipt shall be obtained on the duplicate, which shall be returned by carter, merchant, or district officer to Controller of Stores for checking railway freight. The triplicate shall be handed over to the Railway Department as the instruction and authority for carriage.

39. The consignment note or triplicate should be attached to railway account when sent in for payment, but, if not so attached, the number of the note must be quoted on railway account for reference.

40. When goods have to be delivered by rail, the duplicate and triplicate of delivery receipt book must be forwarded to the officer to whom the goods have been consigned, and the latter, after signing the duplicate, shall return it to the Controller of Stores, who shall paste same in delivery receipt book.

41. The accounts for cartage on articles supplied from or returned to stock, and for all articles supplied through the Stores Branch, shall be dealt with and certified for payment by the Controller of Stores.

42. District officers having lodged official covering order for materials to be issued as required must forward by the carter to the storeman, as each separate delivery takes place, a printed interim order fully signed and dated in ink or indelible pencil, stating details of articles required. District officers must forward to the Controller of Stores a list of the foremen, inspectors, &c., they may from time to time authorize to sign for goods, or issue interim orders, and direct the persons so authorized to carefully check the nature and quantity of the articles sent, and, if any alteration be made, to initial the entry and sign the form.

Ledgers.

43. Articles procured for "stock" shall be posted to the left-hand or debit side of the various accounts in the Stock Ledger (Form L), quantity, rate, and value being shown. The postings to debit side shall be made from the invoices and return stores forms. (See clauses 17 and 25.)

44. The issues shall be entered up from the delivery receipts, and shall be put on the right-hand or credit side of the various accounts, quantity, rate, and value being shown. (See clause 35.)

45. District officers having stores, plant, or material in their charge shall be held responsible for them.

46. The Controller of Stores must keep district stock ledgers, with money values, which shall show the articles in each separate charge. District officers must keep delivery receipt books for daily entry of issues, stating "service" or "work" concerned, and whether articles are used for construction or maintenance. All entries must be initialed by the district officer in charge. These books must be forwarded to the stores office not later than the 5th of the following month. Two delivery receipt books must be used by the district officer, so as to have one in use while the second is being dealt with by the stores office.

47. The district officers must keep a stock book or ledger for debit and credit of material in their charge, same to be posted monthly from delivery receipt book summary, or at intervals during month if convenient.

48. District officers must sign an inventory (Form K) of all articles in their charge at the end of each financial year, or at such times as they may be required to do so.

49. The "Works and Balance Ledger" (Form M) shall contain accounts for the various "works" or "services," and in these accounts, on the debit side, shall be shown the value of all articles drawn from stock, and on the credit side the value of all articles returned to store, or transferred to other "services."

50. The "Works and Balance Ledger" shall contain the "Profit and Loss" account, and also show at the end of the financial year a summary of all excesses and deficiencies from the various stock accounts.

51. All ledger entries must have the folios and voucher numbers quoted for reference.

Miscellaneous.

52. As often as may be deemed necessary, the Controller of Stores may average prices of articles identical in description, so as to reduce such articles to a uniform price, and he may convert articles that may be bought by weight to a price per number, so as to save repeated weighings and labour when such articles are issued from stock.

53. As often as may be found necessary, and at least once in each year, viz., on the 30th June, the stock shall be taken and all accounts balanced. All officers having charge of stores and materials must afford every facility for the preparation of inventories by the stocktaker.

54. At the end of the financial year, the various stock and district ledgers must be closed and balances brought down for preparation of balance-sheet. Details of distribution of stock showing various "services" must be supplied to the treasurer prior to 27th July in each year. Any excess or deficit found to exist by stocktaker must be adjusted in ledgers for following year upon authority being duly obtained from the Board. A record of excesses and deficiencies when prepared by stocktaker must be forwarded to the secretary for attachment to balance-sheet.

55. A priced inventory or stock book shall be compiled, which must show the actual stock of stores, plant, and material in custody of each responsible officer at the close of the financial year, together with "inventory sheets" duly signed, showing excesses and deficiencies in each charge.

56. The Controller of Stores shall from the various ledger accounts prepare and submit a general balance-sheet, which shall be a summary of receipts, issues, and stock on hand, making allowance for profit and loss (if any) on stock sales, deficiencies written off, &c.

57. The Controller of Stores shall be held responsible for any discrepancies that may be disclosed by the "profit and loss" account, until such time as the Board determines how such discrepancies are to be finally dealt with.

58. When materials not included in contract schedules are required, and the estimated value does not exceed One hundred pounds, the Controller of Stores must arrange for offers to be forwarded in writing direct to the secretary, and, when the estimated value exceeds One hundred pounds, the transaction must not be dealt with by the issue of more than one order, with the object of reducing each account to or under One hundred pounds, but public tenders must be invited by advertisement.

59. When an officer in charge of material changes or vacates his position, he must obtain an order from the Engineer of Sewerage, Engineer of Water Supply, or Secretary to transfer the material in his charge to another officer, and the order must be sent to the Controller of Stores advising him of the transaction, so that he may obtain a list of the transferred materials, duly signed by the officer accepting, for the purpose of altering the name of the officer in the stores office books.

60. The Controller of Stores must keep the time of all workmen employed at the stores dépôts within the metropolitan area.

61. The yard superintendent of the South Melbourne yard or the storeman of each store dépôt shall have the control of all teams, motor lorries, and vehicles entering in and proceeding out with material, for the purpose of dealing with such teams, lorries, or vehicles, and shall sign cartage receipts for all goods coming into the storeyard. If the goods are received in transit for testing or otherwise, he shall give a receipt, subject to test or examination, and shall then hand over the triplicate carters' ticket to the officer in charge of testing the goods.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the Board was herewith affixed this 22nd day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, in the presence of—

A GLUE AND GELATINE BOARD TO BE APPOINTED.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, the Honorable Sir Leo Finn Bernard Cussen, as Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of manufacturing glue or gelatine.
- (2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of four members and a chairman, two of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and two as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of manufacturing glue or gelatine.

Also that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Glue and Gelatine Board, and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS.

CLAUSE RESPECTING FEES AND EXPENSES PAYABLE TO CHAIRMEN AND MEMBERS OF WAGES BOARDS REVOKED AND RE-MADE.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time, make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now, therefore, the Honorable Sir Leo Finn Bernard Cussen, Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order revoke clause 27 of chapter III. of the Regulations made on the 20th February, 1923, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu of the said clause (that is to say):—

FEES AND EXPENSES.

27. The chairmen and members of Boards shall be paid as follows:—

- Three hours' attendance or less—Chairman, 15s.; member, 7s. 6d.
Over three hours' attendance—Chairman, 30s.; member, 15s.

Any member residing 10 miles or more from Melbourne shall be paid, in addition, train fares and 15s. a day expenses.

Provided that members shall not be paid fees, or expenses for more than—

(a) Ten meetings in the first twelve months after the constitution of the Board.

(b) Six meetings in any subsequent year.

When computing the time occupied in attendance, intervals for meals shall not be counted.

And the Honorable John Lemmon, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood are not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____" as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, and will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence of permit from the State Forestry Department.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small; when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks, for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 5 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
